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New courses in the works

Recent years have seen a proliferation of new and renovated golf courses on the Manitoba scene and the trend continues as the 1995 season gets under way.

Construction is in progress on two major new courses and a third is at least on the drawing board and awaiting financial arrangements.

There are also a number of renovation projects recently completed and ready for opening, in progress or in the planning stages to provide Manitoba golfers with improved layouts.

Dave Grant is the golf course architect involved with the two major new layouts currently under construction—the Pelican Beach Golf and Country Club on the north side of Gimli and the Grand Pines development along Highway 59 south of Victoria Beach.

David Wagner is the architect for The Bridges, a

project designed on river property at Starbuck, which is in the fund-raising phase and no actual construction has started.

Though his firm, Grant Golf, has been in operation only since June, 1994, Dave Grant's experience in golf course architecture goes back several years and he has been involved with several other local projects.

Construction began in 1992 on the Pelican Beach project and plans call for the front nine to be open for play late this summer, with the back nine to be ready in the spring of 1996.

Arnason Industries of Gimli is the general contractor for Pelican Beach, a \$3 million project which will feature an 18-hole par-72 layout of 6,856 yards with several ponds and a stream to come into play.

It is located along Distillery Road north of Gimli and the project includes about 150

cottage sites, many with Lake Winnipeg frontage. Most of the lots have been sold and some dwellings are already completed.

The layout will feature open fairways on the first seven holes, south of Distillery road, with woods and mature trees on the 11 holes on the north side.

The ponds and streams were part of the construction process, partly dictated by the requirements of cottage sites and partly to alleviate a lack of natural drainage on part of the property.

Grant noted the wet summer of 1993 presented some problems and slowed some of the construction work, but seeding of the first nine holes was completed last fall and it is expected the nine will be playable this season. The back nine will be seeded and hopefully ready for play early in 1996.

The Grand Pines project is located on the east side of Highway 59, about one mile north of the junction with Highway 11 (Traverse Bay corner).

It's an 18-hole par-72 layout of 6,740 yards being

developed around a subdivision of cottage lots by Grand Pines Development Corporation, with the general contracting under Birds Hill Gravel and Stone.

Grant reported initial earth work was started last summer and construction of the course is under way with a target to complete seeding by the end of July and have the layout ready to open early in 1996.

Because it is situated on a sandy site with good drainage, Grant anticipated the Grand Pines layout will establish quickly to permit opening in '96.

The Grand Pines project has hired Rob Officer as the course superintendent and he will also be involved with the construction work this year. Gary Ellison of Ellison Cartage is involved with the shaping and feature construction. Harry Brotchie has been awarded the management contract for the new course.

Other local golf projects in which Grant has been involved include the Kingswood course at La Salle and the new nine at Pinawa.

He is also involved with a nine-hole expansion of the Joanne Goulet executive-length public course to open in July at Regina and has worked on redevelopment of greens at the Wildewood Club in Winnipeg and the Rec Centre at Brandon.

Wagner, whose firm David Wagner Associates Inc. has several golf projects under way, is enthusiastic about the site for The Bridges at Starbuck and anxious to get started on construction, but financing was still to be completed.

The proposed layout would see the La Salle River come into play extensively and the property also features undulating

terrain and thick woods. The 200-acre site will allow for good separation of fairways, Wagner noted.

He hopes the principal operators will have financing in place to start work later this year or early in

1996, with a goal to be ready for play in 1997.

Wagner's previous architectural involvement around Manitoba courses include the construction of Larters at St. Andrews and several renovations on Winnipeg courses.

Wagner worked on the new nine holes at Killarney, which was opened last summer and is currently involved with the ongoing development of a second nine at Gilbert Plains, still two years or more away, and with a master plan for the redevelopment of the course at Clear Lake, where new tee boxes are now being constructed as part of that redevelopment. ●

Tournament changes for '95

Manitoba golfers will find two major changes in events as the 1995 competition season opens.

The Manitoba Match Play championship for the Jack Blair Memorial Trophy, has been expanded to take in 32 qualifiers, up from the previous 16.

The change will add one extra day to the match-play schedule of the event. The qualifying rounds will be played May 20 at Carman and May 21 at Pine Ridge, with the matches set for May 27, 28, 30, 31 and June 1 at Larters at St. Andrews.

The other change will be noticed by players in the Mid-Amateur championship, 40 years and up, where the makeup of the interprovincial team will be increased to four from three. The tournament will be played June 28-30 at the Teulon Golf and Country Club. ●



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Nearing the completion of his first year of college, Manitoba golf phenom Rob McMillan has clearly defined his priorities and looks forward to a summer of golf competition at home.

McMillan, the Pine Ridge player, who turned 19 in December, has been attending University of New Mexico at Albuquerque on a golf scholarship since last fall and carried a 3.2 grade average into the final semester of his first year.

"It has been a good winter, but it has been a lot of hard work, the three-time Canadian junior champ and co-holder of Manitoba's 1994 Golfer of the Year

honors said in a telephone interview in March.

"There has really been no free time between school and golf," McMillan added. "I've been busy as I've ever been before, but it's fun."

As a member of the University of New Mexico golf team, he has had a good taste of the competitive aspect on the U.S. college golf scene. He was enjoying a spring break in the tournament schedule at the time of this report.

He reported the first tournament of the spring at Tucson had seen his New Mexico team finish seventh and his personal finish was 30th with rounds of 74-73-71.

Next came two events in Hawaii, with the team

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placing eighth in a field of 28 and second in a field of 20. McMillan was 20th in both, scoring 75-73-70 in the first, then 74-71 before the third round was rained out in the second.

At Orlando, Fla., McMillan posted scores of 76-72-68 to finish 11th individually while the New Mexico team placed fifth out of 21.

There were several tournaments to come, not to mention the educational aspects, before McMillan gets a chance to drive home to Winnipeg in May for a short break before flying back south to the NCAA championships in early June.

He enjoyed his first year of college golf competition and said he had no physical changes to his game but has worked extensively on course management aspects to improve scoring.

He reported playing against Tiger Wood, the 19-year-old sensation who won the U.S. Amateur title last season, in the Hawaii tournaments and expects to see more of him in future events. Wood tied for second in the first event in Hawaii and was only two strokes ahead of McMillan.



McMillan wasn't sure how many Manitoba tournaments he will be able to play this summer, but will take part when he is available. He plans to play in the Manitoba Open, Amateur championship and any Manitoba Tour Events he can fit in, but he also plans to take in the Canadian and U.S. Amateur championships and possibly the Western Amateur in the U.S.

He also plans to spend part of the summer working with his brother Darren, who recently was named head professional at the Charleswood Golf Club. Brother Dave, who played on the Canadian tour the past two years, is expected to forego that route this year to continue working in the south as a representative of Johnson Seeds of Arbog.

Rob McMillan is generally pleased with his showing to date on the U.S. College golf scene.

"The first semester down here has been a learning experience," said McMillan. "I'm looking forward to my second year very much."

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Rick Thain, superintendent of municipal golf courses in Winnipeg, is in his 18th year as an MGA Council member, moving into the president's chair this year. He provided a look into the MGA's up-coming season in a brief question-and-answer session this spring:

Q: What was your first major problem as the MGA president?

A: A change in our staff came suddenly in February, but we were fortunate to have Dave Morison available to step in after we lost Kelly Boes. We were sorry to see Kelly go, but having Dave on staff gives us a smooth transition. As past

president and as a chartered accountant he brings a wealth of knowledge to the position. He's a tremendous asset and to have a person of his calibre to join the staff was an easy decision.

Q: Do you have any special programs in mind for the new season?

A: I'm anxious to go ahead with a marketing and promotion package for the MGA. We've been working with P M Associates and Terry Hopkinson, who have been doing a marketing study and we're awaiting a draft report. We had an executive meeting in January when we were able to pin point where we can go with this marketing program and Terry is going to explore all the ideas so we can formulate a plan. We want to make the golf association more visible. We want people to realize they are getting good service from the association and how it impacts with them. We hope to come up with some nice brochures and promotion material so members will know what they are getting. There might even be a possibility of looking into a clothing line down the road.

Q: Do you have other goals for your year as president?

A: I want to see the MGA continue to do the fine job it has done in the past. We've taken steps forward in recent years, such as our conferences every second year, our tournaments are better run each year and we're getting more officials. We're starting to move the tournaments around to various locations and we're looking beyond the Perimeter Highway because we're not a Winnipeg association, but a Manitoba one. In other provinces, tournaments are played at many locations and I guess to a large extent the Winnipeg golfers may have been spoiled over the years. The rural areas want to see more tournaments.

Q: How does Manitoba rank on the national scene regarding the development of golfers?

A: We've probably got the best program of development in Canada. I think we're the envy of the rest of the provinces, particularly in developing junior golfers over the past 10 years. We had Todd Fanning winning two national juniors, then Rob McMillan winning three, as well as other outstanding young players like Scott Parker and Dale Goehring. We hope there may be another Rob McMillan waiting to be found.

Q: Do you have one person who has been an inspiration to yourself in golf administration?

A: Certainly. I believe we have an absolutely outstanding executive director in Don Craig. Don is my mentor. He was my predecessor before I took over this position with the city and I have continued to learn from him. He has the public interest at heart, he has the local experience and international experience. He's a past president

of the MGA and his 12 years of service with the RCGA brings a wealth of knowledge.

Q: Is there a major project for you and the MGA this year?

A: Yes. We will have to work in close co-operation with the MLGA this year because we have to produce a joint sports profile to the Manitoba Sports Federation for funding in 1996. We are into discussions and the two associations already are jointly involved in some projects. We expect both organizations will work out of a mutual office shortly and that will make it easier to work together.

Q: What about a personal goal for the year?

A: I really want to see us complete the institution of the new Public Players Club, which will allow golfers who don't belong to private clubs to join for a fee. A portion would go to the RCGA, a portion to the MGA and a portion to the administration through the public courses. Members will receive a bag tag, a copy of the Manitoba Golf Journal, information on MGA tournament entries and full handicap services. In the past, some golfers were able to pay a fee to join the MGA through the public courses, but that window has been closed since the introduction of the slope rating system, which the USGA would not allow to be made available to the general public. We will have a pilot project under way this spring with Public Players Club memberships available at the Kildonan, Windsor and John Blumberg courses in Winnipeg as well as at Quarry Oaks and the Brandon Rec course. More public courses may be added. It will give public course golfers a chance to benefit from membership in the association.

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A Challenge for Boes

After five years as development co-ordinator, Kelly Boes has parted company with the Manitoba Golf Association, but he's not getting away from golf.

Boes, who also has served as assistant executive director of the MGA for the past three seasons, accepted a position in February as Director of Golf Services for Gull Harbour Resort.

His duties will include the operation of the Hecla Island Golf Course, including responsibilities for green fees, equipment

rentals and merchandising, as well as promotion of the Gull Harbour Resort on a year-round basis.

Boes, 28, started with the MGA in the spring of 1990 as development co-ordinator and his major responsibilities included the development of rural clinics for clubs without professionals and junior development through golf camps at different levels of skill, and at various geographical locations.

"We saw a huge improvement in the rural area, with players from outside Winnipeg proving

that the calibre was equal when they were given the opportunity to improve," Boes noted with justifiable pride.

He noted the accomplishments of two Brandon golfers as proof of the program's success. Mac McLeod won the rural junior in two straight years and Dave Scinocca earned a berth on the 1994 junior men's provincial team.

With the graduation of four-time provincial and three-time national champion Rob McMillan from junior ranks, Boes anticipates there should be a great competition for provincial junior honors this summer.

For the past three years, Boes has also served as assistant to MGA executive director Don Craig, gaining further experience in golf

operations in the province.

"Don and I have worked to have our Manitoba tournaments professionally run at a high level," Boes said. "We tried to provide a good experience for tournament players so there would be no surprises when they went on to national events."

He was also proud of the MGA policy of getting players involved in decision making through meetings which allowed tournament players to express their feeling for a spirit of co-operation between the players and the MGA.

Boes noted that in addition to rural golfers developing to the point they can compete with city players, there has been a trend to move more events to courses outside Winnipeg with the development of more

good layouts in rural centre.

"It has been an enjoyable five years for me," said Boes of his MGA service. "I guess I got to travel to almost every club in the province over the five years and met a lot of great people through golf."

Boes hopes he will continue to meet old friends and make new ones in his position.

"I'll be trying to get people to come back to Hecla Island and trying to get new people to give it a try," he said.

"We'll have some special promotions and we hope to make Gull Harbour a popular place."

As an example, Boes cited a Golf Special for the early season: \$99 will provide two rounds of golf and one night's lodging at the resort for a couple. He'll be happy to fill in the details. ●



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Morison takes on new role

Dave Morison served nine years as a volunteer worker with the Manitoba Golf Association. Today, Morison is an employee of the MGA, taking up duties in February as assistant executive director.

Morison, a chartered accountant, was in the processing of establishing his own business when Kelly Boes made his decision to leave the MGA office, so he put his plans on hold to devote a year to the association.

"We felt with some of the issues facing us this year there was little time to train a new person," said Morison. "I have a good knowledge of the work in the office and I was available, so I am committed at least to end of March next year to work with Don Craig."

Morison and Craig will be working together on the regular MGA business and also on joint preparations with the Manitoba Ladies Golf Association for budget presentations to the Manitoba Sports Federation under the gender sport issue, which will have the two golf bodies under one heading.

"We were sorry to lose Kelly, of course, but he had an opportunity to face a new challenge and we wish him good luck," said Morison. "I hope I will be able to provide Don with all the help he needs for the year." ●

Superintendents

Superintendents set for another busy golf season

As another golf season rolls around, members of the Golf Course Superintendents' association of Manitoba are back in full harness in anticipation of a busy season.

The days when they were known as "greenskeepers" are long since gone and today's course superintendents work together in research and the exchange of information for the betterment of golf courses. Environmental concerns play a large role in the lives of today's superintendents.

Rob Officer, a former superintendent at Elmhurst Golf & Country Club in Winnipeg and more recently at Swan River Golf and Country Club, was elected president of the Manitoba association in December. He also took on a new job this spring as the superintendent for the new Grand Pines course under construction near Grand Beach (see story on page 6 of this issue).

Officer succeeds **Ian Martinusen** of Breezy Bend as head man of the organization and there's a vacancy to be filled at vice-president. Other directors are **Rob Hamm** of Carman,

Dave Oshust of Carberry, **Vince Spliuka** of Ful Flo Industries and **Real Curre** of Rat River (St. Pierre). The association also has a new executive director in **Barb Selanders**, who was appointed in February.

Officer isn't the only Manitoba superintendent on the move this spring. **Dave Turner**, who served as assistant at Southwood last summer, has taken over Officer's duties at Swan River; **Gord Robinson** moves from assistant at Carman to the head position at South Interlake (Warren);

and **Derek Holbrow** moves from assistant at Breezy Bend to head superintendent at Morden, taking over from **Marcel Deneer**, who has moved to Thunder Bay.

The Manitoba superintendents get together monthly during the golf season, usually for a day of golf and educational meetings at various courses around the province. They will often meet at a course where a superintendent has encountered a problem to discuss various solutions.

The members also keep up with news in their trade through seminars. About 60 members attended a two-day seminar held in February when the topics included Disease Identification and Treatment and Common Problems in Golf Course Maintenance.

The GCSAM sponsors an annual Turf Grass golf tournament, with the 1995 edition slated for Aug. 4 at Pine Ridge.

It's Manitoba's turn to serve as host for the biennial Prairie Turfgrass Conference this year and the event, which attracts superintendents from across the prairie provinces, is scheduled for the International Inn in Winnipeg in November. ●

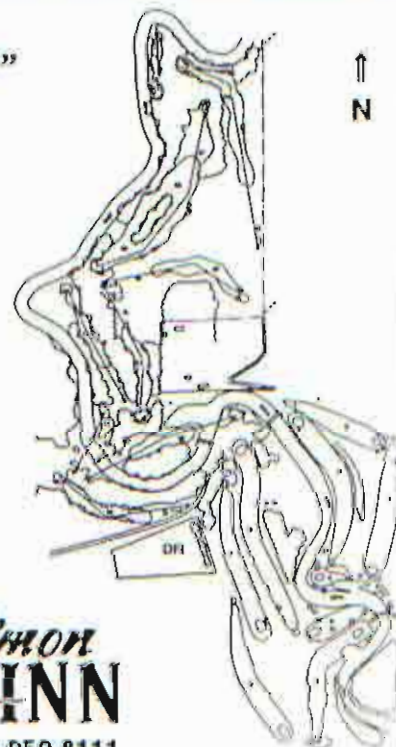
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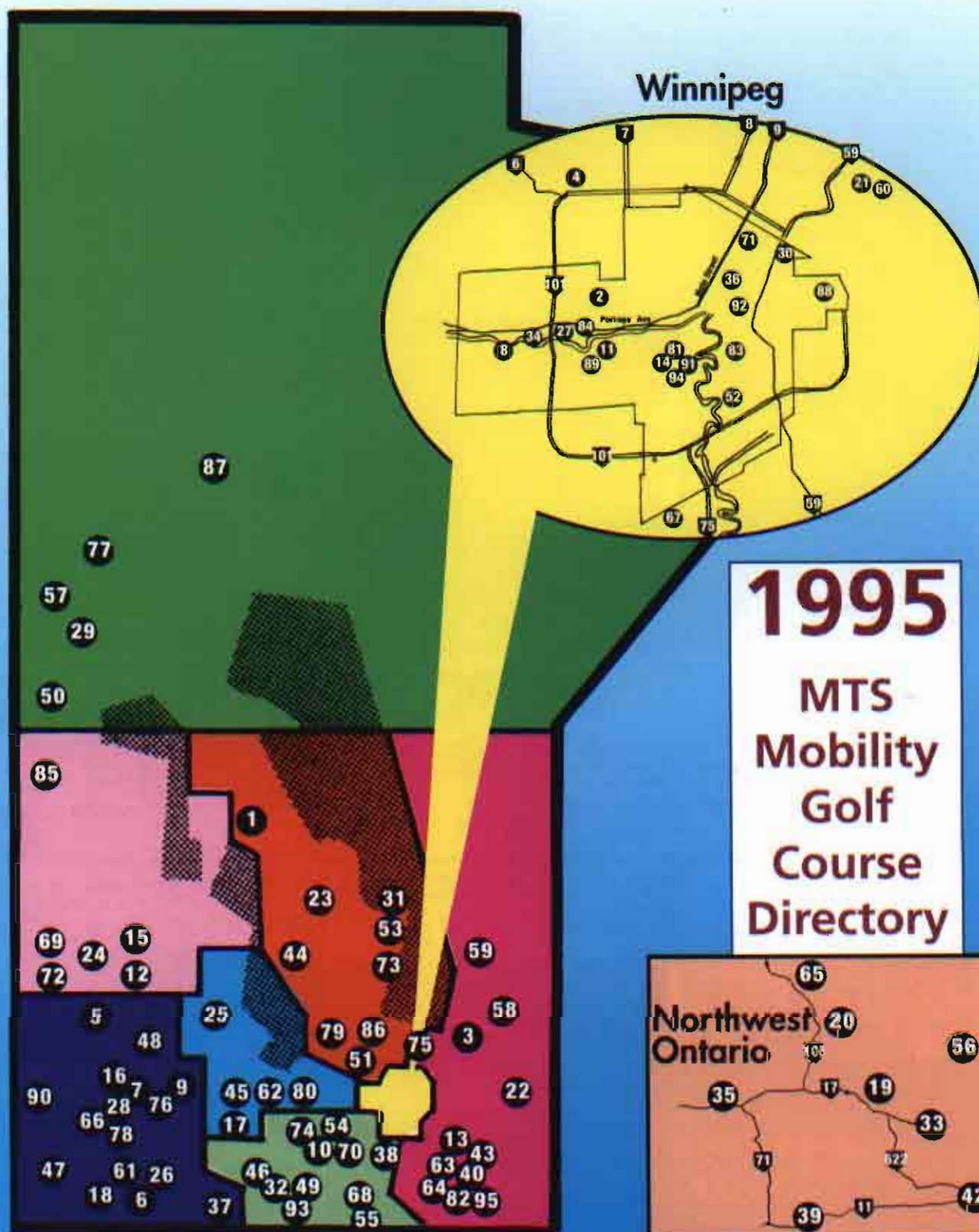

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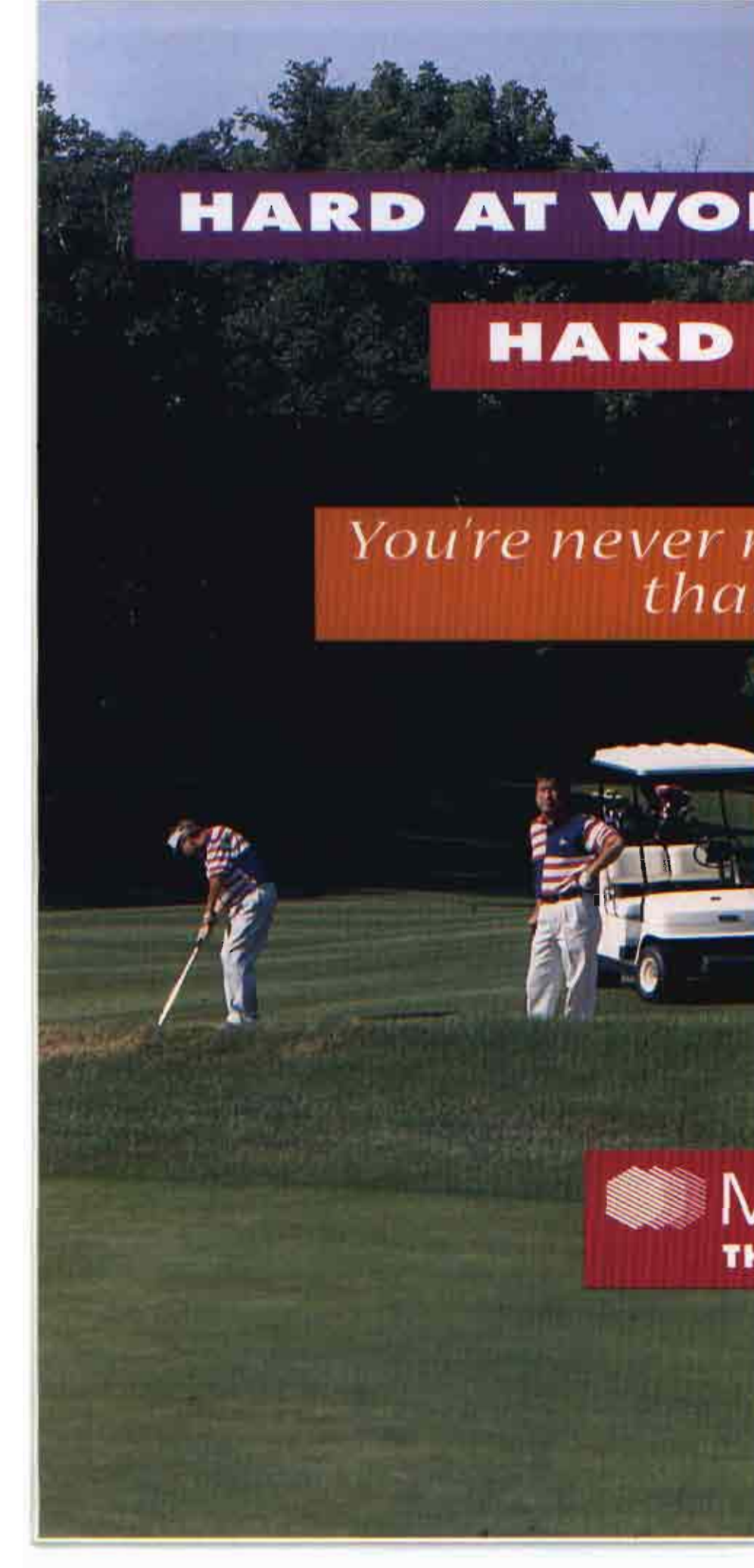

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Aileen would like to do it all again!

What do you do for an encore after you've won just about everything in sight during the previous season?

For Aileen Robertson, the answer comes quickly:

"I'd like to defend everything," the reigning Canadian women's amateur champion said in a spring interview. "I'd love to improve on it all, but that's a pretty tall order."

A tall order, indeed! All the 25-year-old St. Charles Country Club golfer accomplished last year, in addition to the first Canadian Women's titles won by a Manitoban since Mrs. John Rogers, also of St. Charles, won in 1937, was:

- Her fourth Manitoba Amateur championship
- The Ontario Women's Amateur championship
- A berth on the Canadian team for the World Women's championship.
- Named co-winner of the 1994 Manitoba Golfer of the Year award, along with Rob McMillan.

This spring, there was another honor for Robertson. She was invited to play in the British Women's Amateur championship

June 13-17 at Port Rush in Northern Ireland.

"A team of four players was invited by the CLGA and I was happy to accept right away," she said. "I know the others invited were Mary Ann Lapointe of Quebec, Karen Quarry of Alberta and Jackie Little of B.C. I'm really looking forward to the trip."

Robertson, who will play this year out of Southwood Golf and Country Club, noted she won't be able to play in defence of her Ontario championship because the dates conflict with the Manitoba championship this year.

However, in order to compete against players across the country, Robertson plans to play this year in the Alberta women's amateur championship in early July.

Unfortunately, that will take her away during the MLGA's City and District

championship, but she will definitely be on hand for the provincial amateur test later in the month.

"I'd like to be here for the City and District, but it's important that I play against golfers outside of Manitoba whenever I can because it might have a bearing on selections for the Canadian Commonwealth team in the fall," she explained.

Robertson's major goal for the 1995 season is to earn a

place on the five-member team which will represent Canada in the Commonwealth competition in Australia in September.

"Most of the team will likely be announced before the Canadian amateur this year because the team will have to leave around the end of August, soon after the Canadians," Robertson noted.

The 1991 University of South Carolina graduate has been working the past three years at Caddy Shed in Winnipeg and has a spring holiday trip planned in April to Kelowna, B.C., to visit relatives and, hopefully, get in some early golf on B.C. courses.

"I'd like to get away for a while so I can concentrate on playing and practicing before the season starts here," she said. "Then I can come home with a game face on."

Robertson hasn't been ignoring her game during the winter months, working regularly with Southwood pro Tom Kinsman and hitting balls at the Dome.

Robertson feels she's in a good position regarding the Commonwealth team selections after winning the Canadian title last summer, but she wants to keep up her competitive edge.

In addition to the Alberta and Manitoba provincial tests, she plans to defend her Canadian title in August

in Beloeil, Quebec, and to play in the North and South competition at Pinehurst, N.C., for the second time. She will also try to qualify for the U.S. women's amateur championship in July.

Robertson also is looking into an opportunity to play in qualifying tournaments leading up to the duMaurier Ltd. LPGA Classic. The qualifiers are playing at Kelowna, Saskatoon, Thornhill, Ont., plus one in Quebec and one in Prince Edward Island.

"As you can see, I have a pretty busy schedule for this summer," she said. "My calendar is chock full, but I intend to compete a lot because I really want to be on that Commonwealth team. It only comes up every four years and this is a great opportunity for me."

"It's great to have a chance to defend and the thought that maybe I can win it again is not unrealistic."

Robertson was also proud to have been selected a co-winner of the Golfer of the Year award last year.

"That was really exciting," she said. "There were so many golfers with a really good year, so it was an honor to be chosen."

Robertson readily admits her long-time goal is to play as a professional, but the concentration for this season is squarely on amateur play.

"I still think I want to turn pro somewhere down the line, but it won't be before the end of this season at the earliest," she said. "We'll just have to see how things turn out." ●

A Visit With MLGA Leaders

Manitoba Ladies Golf Association president Joyce Collier and executive director Barb Leisle participated this spring in a question-and-answer session regarding the association.

Q: What do you consider the most important role of the MLGA?

A: Our development program, definitely. Manitoba is up at the top in Canada as far as developing athletes, and that's not just elite players, but at all levels, from grass roots to elite. Our programs are available to every golfer in Manitoba, even non-members are able to participate in our general development clinics and we're the only province that makes these programs open to non-members.

Q: What types of development programs are available?

A: Our elite program started several years ago and the mandate was to develop players to reach the top in Canada. We achieved that last year with Aileen Robertson winning the Canadian Amateur and Lynda Palahniuk also ranked in the top five, and the previous year when Brionie Brown won the Canadian Junior. This program is run with the help of CPGA pros Tom Kinsman, Peter Ewert and Cathy Burton. As well, 1995 will mark the first time in a number of years that a junior Elite program will be

reinstated. This program is run with the assistance of CPGA pro Pat Kemball for the top seven junior girls in Manitoba.

Q: What is available below the elite level?

A: We have the advanced development program, which takes in those who aren't quite at the elite level or may have been elite and fallen back, so they don't fall out of the program. Then last year we started our general development skills clinics program, which is open to all, whether they are members or not. Nobody else in Canada is offering this type of service. There are four levels for various handicap groups and clinics are set for May. We also take part, with the MGA, in rural clinics held throughout the province.

Q: What is available for development of newcomers at the junior level?

A: Last year, we introduced the LPGA Junior Girls Golf Club was introduced in Manitoba to junior development. It's an LPGA program and Cathy Burton and Barb Leisle have the Canadian expansion rights. It is sponsored by the MLGA and we're excited about it because it went so well

in the first year. We had 126 registered last year and we had aimed for about 50 or 60. It's open to players age 6 to 18 and most of those registered last year were between 8 and 12, the majority trying golf for the first time. We're the only province with this program so far, but there have been enquires from Saskatchewan, Alberta and B.C. so it will likely expand. For those girls with a little more skill and golfing experience, the MLGA also runs programs that provide development and competitive experiences for junior girls.

Q: Beyond development, what other goals do you have this year?

A: To improve the visibility of the MLGA. So many people don't know there's an association they can go to that deals just with ladies' golf. We have to get out and let people know about the game. That's why we're here. I think you'll be seeing us a bit more visible this year.

Q: Is there anything new on the national scene for women's golf this year?

A: There's one major change, to improve the image of the NCTC (National Club Teams Championship) event. When it was first started, it was not to be a high profile event, but now they've gone full circle and it will be a full-blown competition, with flag-raising, a championship dinner, the works. This is based on net

scores and it starts at the club level, then there are division, provincial and national events. Each province sends two teams and they represent their clubs, not the province.

Q: How does Manitoba compare to other provinces for competitive golf?

A: We think we provide more province-wide competitions at all levels than most of the others, though there may be more regional and zone events elsewhere. We also work with Saskatchewan for the Man-Sask matches, which will be revived this year after being called off last summer. The seniors and amateurs will play at Spiritwood Acres near Canora, Sask. June 11-13, and the juniors will be at Dauphin, Man., July 24-26.

Q: Is there another important area in your MLGA operations?

A: Yes, we devote a fair amount of financial assistance to develop our rules officials. We sent three to USGA/PGA rules workshops this spring. Chris Heywood, vice-president and former rules chairman, went to an advance level workshop, while current rules chairman Nadine Nemy and assistant Bev Harris went to a regular workshop. Chris and Nadine are both certified officials. We hope to have several district representatives and committee people attend a CLGA rules workshop at Saskatoon in May. ●

Kennedy simplified slope recording

Golfers across Canada owe a vote of thanks to Bob Kennedy for a program that enables them to keep their handicaps and Slope rating index figures up to date through a simple computer operation.

Kennedy, a member of St. Charles C. C. in Winnipeg, is the computer whiz who developed the simplified procedure for posting scores which has been adopted by the Royal Canadian Golf Association for use across the country.

His involvement with computerized handicap recording began in 1987 when he developed a program for use at his home club, then made it available to other pro shops in Winnipeg.

When the Slope rating system was adopted last year, the RCGA provided a program for member clubs which created some problems, so Kennedy was asked by the MGA to develop a new program incorporating the Slope system.

"Many members were frustrated by the original RCGA program," Kennedy

recalled. "It required 12 to 15 key-strokes and a lot of members just couldn't make it work. They were just leaving their scores with the pro shop and pros and their assistants were becoming key punch operators for a lot of their time."

His answer was to simplify the recording program to the stage that it takes only a couple of keystrokes to register scores on the course normally played, and only a few more for games played on other courses.

"Keep it simple, that was the idea," Kennedy said. "There's a more complicated program available to the pro shops for alterations, but the members don't have access to anything

rating changeover in the province, showed it to the national officials, who quickly adopted it as the RCGA program.

Kennedy, who graduated from the University of Winnipeg with a B.Sc. in mathematics, got into the computer business as a salesman and was a founder of Computerland in 1972, a business which was sold to

like that. They can just record their scores and the computer does the rest."

Once the Kennedy system was put into use in Manitoba, it wasn't long before Rick Thain, the current MGA president and the man in charge of the Slope

Bell Canada in 1986.

He is now president of PBSC Computer Training Centres with branches across Canada, a company which has become a major training facility for computer operations.

Kennedy claims he isn't a computer programmer, but got involved with the handicap program because of his love for the game. He developed the first handicap program when he was on the rules committee at St. Charles.

"Because the program was popular with the local pro shops, the MGA asked me if I could make a simplified program for use with the Slope system," said Kennedy. "The MGA deserves credit for pursuing the matter for the Manitoba courses."

Kennedy was also recognized for his organizational skills when he served as chairman of the host committee for the 1992 LPGA duMaurier Ltd. Classic at St. Charles. He also has been involved with charity golf events, including the United Way Will to Win event and the Jets Goals for Kids event. ●

RCGA officials were pleased with the successful staging of the Canadian senior men's championship at the Niakwa and Bel Acres courses last August.

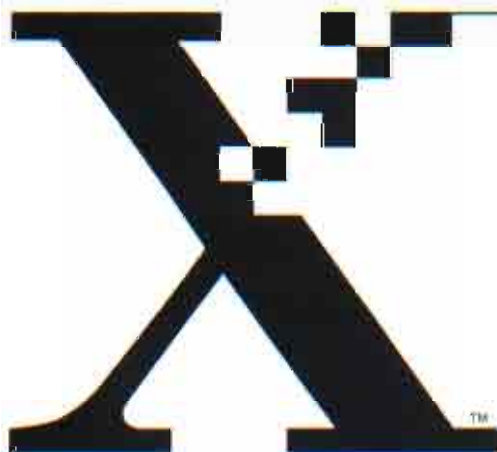
