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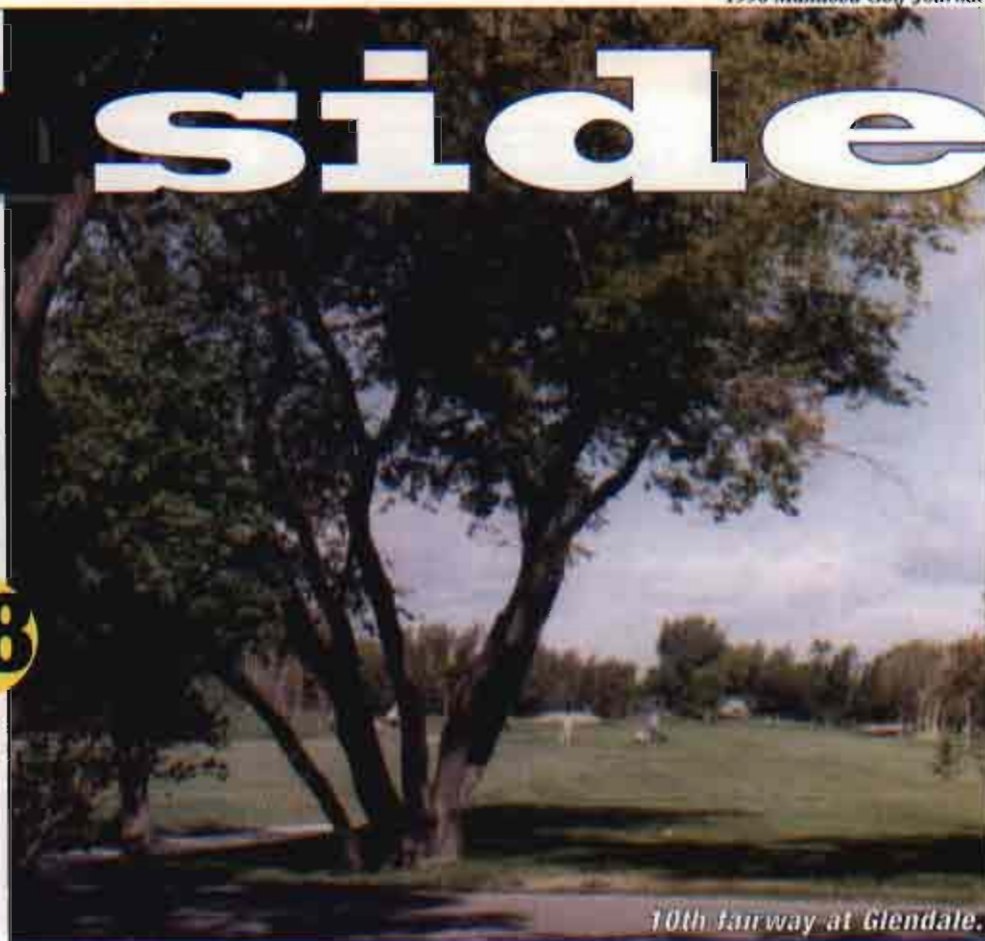

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Meet The MGA President

Syd Cohan hopes to see Hall of Fame for golf

Like most heads of sports organizations, Syd Cohan has some goals and some pet peeves he'd like to see action on during his term as president of the Manitoba Golf Association.

The 65-year-old lawyer from Glendale Golf and Country Club took over the presidency at the MGA's annual meeting Oct. 31, culminating seven years on the MGA Council.

A high priority for Cohan during his year as president will be to investigate the possibility of establishing a Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame to recognize the accomplishments of the province's many outstanding participants and builders.

"Many other sports have established some form of hall of fame and I think it's time we got something going for golf," Cohan says. "There are many noteworthy accomplishments which will likely never rate recognition in the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame, but should be rec-

ognized in golf circles."

Cohan promises a thorough study will be made of the provincial halls established by other sports to see if such a move would be feasible for golf.

Marketing will occupy a major slot in Cohan's thoughts for the year. "We're going to have to become less dependent on governments for our finances and developing a good marketing plan can provide alternate sources of funding for us," he says.

The new president sees more pressure being exerted by governments toward "non-gender" sports funding, with each sport receiving one grant to serve both male and female participation.

"We are working with the women (MLGA) where it's feasible but still operating our programs differently," he says. "For instance, we're sharing office space now and we're discussing common concerns."

Cohan also readily discusses a pair of pet peeves

on the golf scene and would love to see some progress made toward eliminating them.

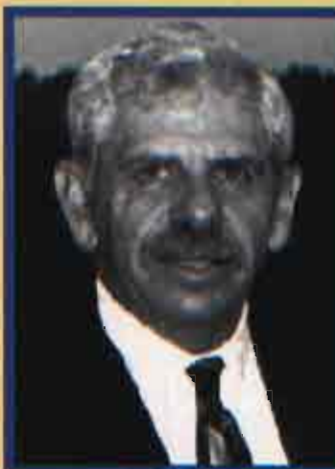
"Slow play is a plague on the sport of golf," he says. "We've had some success in speeding tournament play with the time par rule, but there's still room for improvement."

His other pet peeve is dishonesty among golfers regarding handicaps. "I really deplore sandbagging," he declares. "I wish we could find a fool-proof method of making all handicaps true."

Syd Cohan brings sport leadership experience to his term as MGA president, because golf hasn't always been his No. 1 interest. In the 1960s and 1970s he was very active in the Canadian Amateur Swimming Association, serving as president of the Manitoba section and as a director on the national board. He also represented Amateur Sport on Manitoba Lotteries Distributors in the past.

His golf background features 19 years as a member

at Glendale, where he has served on the board, and he's proud that his home course will be the site for the Canadian Amateur champi-

onship this year.

Prior to joining Glendale, Cohan played at Bel Acres and Rossmere in Winnipeg. He first learned to play golf at Dauphin and also played at Russell before moving to Winnipeg.

Anne Cohan, his wife, is also an active participant and is the current president of the Ladies' Section at Glendale. ●

I took some clutch putting on the final green, but the Manitoba representatives were up to the challenge and the date of Wednesday, Aug. 16, 1995, will be long remembered in the history of golf in Manitoba.

It was on that date that the Manitoba team of Rob McMillan, Garth Collings, Dale Goehring and Derron Magda emerged as the best men's golf team in Canada as they captured the 1995 Willingdon Cup with a two-stroke margin over runner-up Ontario at the Toronto Golf Club in Mississauga.

It marked only the second time for a Manitoba team to capture the Willingdon Cup, emblematic of the national amateur men's team

championship since 1927. Manitoba also had one other Canadian team championship in 1921, before the Willingdon Cup was introduced.

The other Manitoba Willingdon Cup triumph came in 1974 when the team of Gavin Speirs, Ted Homenuik, Steve Bannatyne and Barry McKenzie turned the trick, finishing four strokes ahead of runner-up Quebec when the event was played at the Niakwa Country Club in Winnipeg.

Manitoba will attempt to defend the Willingdon Cup title on home turf this year as the Canadian Amateur championship is scheduled at the Glendale Golf and Country Club in Winnipeg.

The 1995 victory was paced by Pine Ridge's Rob McMillan, the provincial amateur champion and golfer of the year, who fashioned

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rounds of 69 and 67 over the par-70 layout for a 136 total. Breezy Bend's Garth Collings was next in line with 71-70-141, followed by clubmate Dale Goehring with 72-73-145 and Rossmere's Derron Magda with 72-75-147.

Teams count the three best scores each day in the Willingdon test, so Manitoba's daily totals were 212-210 for 422. Ontario finished at 214-210-424. Quebec was third with 217-213-430. Nova Scotia finished at 440; British Columbia 441, Alberta 446, New Brunswick 450, Saskatchewan 455, P.E.I. 476, and Newfoundland 494.

McMillan's 136 total was good for third place in the individual qualifying for the Canadian Amateur championship. Matthew Goggin of Australia was the leader at 134 and Garrett Willis of the United States had 135.

All four Manitoba team members qualified for the 64-

man match-play portion of the tournament. Magda was beaten in the first round; Collings and Goehring both won their first matches and lost in the second round; while McMillan won three matches before being eliminated in the quarter-finals by Garry Winger of London, Ont.

Ted Homenuik Leads Way In Willingdon Appearances

If you've ever argued about who has been on the most Willingdon Cup teams for Manitoba, the full list of team members since the cup was instituted in 1927 is produced on page 10.

Special thanks go out to Allan Boes and Jim Doyle who were next in line with 11 appearances

Association to Bruce Hudson of Pine Ridge, who did the research work to provide the list of all the teams since 1927. Because Manitoba is the defending Willingdon Cup champion this year, it seemed an appropriate time to publish it.

We did a little research of Hudson's listing, too, and came up with the answers to some of the questions which might come to mind.

For instance Ted Homenuik takes the honors for most team appearances, having

made the team 13 times between 1957 and 1977. Eight times he played out of Rossmere, five times out of Elmhurst.

each. Boes played on the team seven times out of Southwood, three times out of Niakwa and once from Assiniboine, while Doyle made nine teams playing out of Elmhurst and two out of Sandy Hook.

Bill Pidlaski is next in line with 10 teams, eight out of Elmhurst and two out of St. Boniface; followed by Barry McKenzie, who made the team nine times, all out of Rossmere; and Mike Pidlaski, who was on the team eight times, all out of St Boniface.

The group of golfers boasting six Willingdon Cup trips includes Bob Reith and A.A. (Sandy) Weir from the earlier days and modern players Bill Parker, Terry Hashimoto and Todd Fanning, while five-time members were C.L. Hodgman, Ernie Palmer and Howard Bennett from the early days and Terry More and Gary Kullman in the later years. ●

Revenue down, but MLGA aims to hold the line

resident Joyce Collier leads the Manitoba Ladies' Golf Association into the 1996 season with a resolve to hold the line on programming, despite a major cut in government funding.

The MLGA and the Manitoba Golf Association will absorb a shared reduction in the current fiscal year of \$109,000 in grant money formerly allocated by the Manitoba Sports Federation (succeeded now by Sport Manitoba). When coupled with an additional decrease expected in bingo revenue, the shortfall will be over \$60,000 to the MLGA.

"I believe we can be financially responsible enough to withstand the cut without dropping any golf development programs," said Collier, heading into her second year at the MLGA helm.

"We'll operate with a deficit budget, but we'll work in concert with the MGA on a management plan that hopefully will keep us on track," said Collier. "Some of our services can be amalgamated to more effectively provide service to our members. A marketing initiative is being developed in

order to help cover the reduction in grant dollars." The MLGA doesn't have a lot of "fat" in its operation but delegates will be asked to accept a cut in mileage rates, executive expenses will be slashed, and the spring seminar luncheon will have no frills.

"In general, our tournament and program fees will have to be raised," revealed Collier. "But I'm confident

association members will understand our situation, and make the adjustment."

Another determination coming out of the 1995 season is to speed up the pace of play in MLGA tournaments. "Taking over six hours to complete a round in ideal conditions is not acceptable."

The shift of dates for the 54-hole City and District tournament will be maintained. "Holding it in the first week in July was a popular decision," said Barb Leisle, the MLGA executive director. "Bel Acres, Carman, and Glendale will be the courses (July 2-4) this season."

The amateur, senior and junior women's provincials (July 17-19) will be held at Elmhurst, and the NCTC provincial finals are slated (August 21) for Selkirk. The '96 highlight will come at St. Charles Country Club, where the 54 hole Canadian Senior Women's Championship (Aug. 27-29) will boast an international field of 108 golfers.

Collier's MLGA volunteer force this year includes vice president Chris Heywood, secretary/treasurer Carol Doerksen, tournament director Joan Pielech, rules director Bev Harris, teams director Brenda Prystayko, junior director Shirley Lowry, prize director Beverly Born, course rating director Donna Lawson and past president Val Spencer. The board of directors is supported by the executive director Barb Leisle and administrative assistant Carol Muzychka. ●

Seniors at St. Charles

From August 27-29 this year, St. Charles Country Club will play host to the Canadian Senior Women's Golf Championship for the first time. It is one of the few major events the venerable club in Winnipeg's western suburbs has missed in its proud history.

Seventy years ago, in 1926, Ada Mackenzie won the closed Canadian women's amateur title at St. Charles, and the golfers of the world have been playing its majestic layout ever since.

The Canadian Men's Amateur Championship was held twice at St. Charles. Fred Haas, Jr., of New Orleans, defeated Manitoba Sports Hall of Famer Bobby Reith in 1936 in the match play final. In 1957, Toronto's Nick Weslock topped

another Manitoba star, Teddy Homeniuk, in the 36-hole final.

Three Canadian women's amateur champions have been crowned at St. Charles—host clubber Mauriel Rogers in 1937, Dorothy Kieley of Los Angeles in 1950, and Australian Jane Lock in 1981.

Two Canadian Senior Men's tournaments (1962 and 1970), a Canadian junior men's (1957), the Americas Cup (1965), and the CPGA (1976) also have been held in the stately setting beside the Assiniboine River.

Four exceptional spectacles highlight the history of St. Charles. In 1952, Johnny Palmer shot an amazing 25-under-par 263 in winning the Canadian Open. George Knudson defeated Roberto de Vicenzo in their memorable match in 1969 in Shell's Wonderful World

of Golf Series. Bob Goalby was 15 under 273 in his 1982 victory in the Peter Jackson Senior Champions event. And, Sherri Steinhauer posted an 11-under 277 in capturing the LPGA du Maurier Classic in 1992.

Donna Gould, the chair of the '96 host committee, hopes to add another significant chapter to the club's heritage. "Nobody will be shooting the way Palmer did or even Steinhauer," she predicted. "But 108 of the best senior women from across Canada and the United States will make it an excellent attraction."

Gould appointed the heads of 10 sub-committees to organize the host club duties, and expects to expand her volunteer numbers to over 50 by August. "Many of them have the experience of the '92 du Maurier going for them, and we'll have people from a number of city clubs on our committees," she said.

The major sponsors of the tournament are The Toronto-Dominion

Bank, Pollard Banknote Ltd., Investors Group, and PBSC Computer Training Services. The Holiday Inn Airport West is the headquarters hotel.

"We expect to have Ontario's Gayle Borthwick here to defend the championship she won in 1994 and '95," said Gould. "The team title is decided over 36 holes, and after a cut to the low 54 and ties they play a third round to decide the individual winner."

Ceil MacLaurin of Savannah, Ga., won the Canadian Senior Women's Championship the last time it was played in Winnipeg, in 1986. It was slated for Niakwa, but the flag-raising ceremony was the only part of it held at the St. Vital course.

"We had a deluge of rain, and Niakwa was unplayable. Elmhurst came to the rescue, and all three rounds were played there," recalled Gould. "I will pray for no repeat." ●

Robertson, Lindsay have high hopes for '96 season

Aileen Robertson and Jo-Ann Lindsay didn't spend the winter acting like couch potatoes, shivering through a brutal Manitoba winter while copious amounts of snow were piling up.

The province's two pre-eminent women golfers worked at their game in Florida, and are resolved to play more and better in 1996.

Robertson, 27 this June, won her fifth Manitoba Amateur championship last season, holding off a hard charging Lindsay in the final round to win by three strokes at Southwood.

Aileen wants to retain her role as the queen of the fairways in this province, and she has a goal of competing for Canada a second time in the World Amateur Team Championship in the Phillipines in November. To put herself on track, she started the year by playing in two events on the Florida women's mini-tour in January.

Robertson entered the Jones-Doherty Match Play tournament at the Coral Ridge Country Club in Fort Lauderdale. She qualified, won one match, and lost her second on the 20th hole to prominent North Carolina amateur Amber Marsh.

In the International Four-Ball team event at the Orangebrook Golf Club in Hollywood, Fla., Aileen teamed with Canadian golf legend Marlene Streit, 62, the 11-time national amateur champion.

"Playing with Marlene was a learning experience and seemed to lift my game," said Robertson. "We both shot 67s in the qualifying round, and had a tournament record best ball of eight under par 64."

The diminutive twosome advanced as far as the semi-finals in the best ball match play, losing at that point to 1988 Canadian junior champion Kelly Doohan of Ontario, who teamed

with Florida's Tiffany Fawcett.

"It was very encouraging, and my game continues to improve," said Robertson. "Some people felt I had a disappointing season last year but I was happy with what I accomplished."

She has been under the tutelage of Southwood pro Tom Kinsman for two years. "Technically, she's very sound, and it's just a matter of fine tuning now," he said. "Aileen has a great attitude, her legs are strong and she stays in shape with a lot of running."

Robertson used a Big Bertha driver with an ultra light shaft in Florida, and was getting more distance. She has used the same Tommy Armour 845 irons for several years.

Her '96 schedule included another fourball tournament in Florida in April, and in June the prestigious North and South Amateur at Pinehurst, N.C., plus the CLGA national camp at Royal Montreal. She will play in either the B.C. Amateur at Gallagher's Canyon in Kelowna or a du Maurier Classic qualifier in Regina the first week in July, then the Alberta Amateur in Calgary. Robertson will defend her Manitoba Amateur at Elmhurst, and hopes to lead our provincial team to the Canadians in North Battleford, Sask., in August.

Lindsay was active in the off season at her winter home in Naples, playing at the Olde Florida Country Club. She

had a new instructor, teaching pro Mike Calbot, and is delighted by some swing adjustments he recommended.

"At my age (55) you have some limitations, but I played very well in Florida, and it almost felt like I had turned back the clock," said Jo-Ann. "As a result, I'm going to play in a number of tournaments in Minnesota in the early part of the season."

Lindsay has the special distinction of winning Manitoba titles at three levels, as a junior, amateur, and senior, plus two City and District crowns. As Jo-Ann Percy of Charleswood, she won her first Manitoba junior championship at the age of 14. She captured the Canadian senior women's title in 1991, and finished fourth in the U.S.A. Seniors in Saint Paul to earn an unexpected honor last year.

"I played in two other events in 1995 in Minnesota, and with the points system they use I was named the state's senior woman golfer of the year," revealed Lindsay. Obviously, she was in a class by herself as a senior in Manitoba, winning the provincial crown

for a third time by a whopping 18 strokes.

Jo-Ann intends to enter the '96 City and District tourney here, and will try to improve on last year's runner-up finish to St. Charles clubmate Brionie Brown. Lindsay will compete in the provincial amateur and

senior at Elmhurst, but also has her sights on the Canadian Seniors in August at her home club.

"I'm really looking forward to playing in a national tournament in Winnipeg," she said. "I hope I can have my game at a peak when we tee it up at St. Charles." ●

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New tournament for club champs

The MGA and MLGA have joined forces for a new season-closing golf tournament this season. The Club Champions Championship is scheduled for September 15-16 at Hecla Island, to be open to male and female amateur champions from member clubs, as well as senior male and female champions if clubs

have them.

Plans call for a 36-hole competition, with the first round on Sunday afternoon and the second round on the Monday morning. A dinner is planned for the Sunday evening.

Because the new event is a sanctioned championship, clubs will be permitted to assist their champions with expenses without affecting amateur status.

Team trial added for seniors

The addition of an extra round to determine the make-up of the provincial men's

senior golf team has been announced by the MGA tournament committee.

The low 12 scores and ties will be invited to play the extra round after the 54-hole Manitoba Senior championship to make the team test a 72-hole competition.

The senior championship event is scheduled August 6-8 at Teulon and Rossmore and it was also decided to hold the annual dinner as a presentation event on the Thursday night at Rossmore.

All age group winners will be decided on retrogression countback, but if there is a tie

for the championship, it will be decided in an 18-hole playoff as part of the team trial on the Friday. A site for the extra round was still to be decided.

North America Cup changes

Changes in the eligibility for players on Manitoba's team for the 1997 North America Cup matches have been announced and officials anticipate it will raise the profile of the Manitoba Amateur Tour this season.

For 1996, the NA Cup team will be determined as in the past to include the members of the 1995 provincial

Willingdon Cup team, the 1996 Match Play Champion and three from the 1995 Manitoba Tour.

For 1997, the NA Cup team will include the 1996 provincial Amateur champion, the 1997 Match Play winner, top five players from the Manitoba Tour and one player to be selected by the tournament committee.

Eligibility to play in the Manitoba Tour has also been expanded to include the top 10 finished in the previous year in the Junior, Mid-Amateur and Senior championships. ●

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Glendale's 50th Anniversary**Canadian Amateur is icing on the cake****By Ralph Bagley**

When Canada's top amateur golfers gather in Winnipeg in August for the 1996 Canadian Men's Amateur championship they'll provide the feature attraction in the host club's special anniversary year.

The national championship event will be played at Glendale Golf and Country Club, which is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year.

There will be other events to mark the occasion, but the Canadian Amateur championship provides the icing on the club's birthday cake.

It comes in a year in which the Glendale club has also provided the Manitoba Golf Association president in the person of Syd Cohan, the third to hold that office from the club. Other Glendale MGA presidents were Manny Bricker in 1973 and Michael Averbach in 1982-83. Bricker

also went on to serve as RCGA president in 1983.

It was in the winter of 1945-46 that negotiations were started by a group of Winnipeg Jewish golfers to purchase the Royaumont Golf Course. The change in ownership was completed in April and the name of the course was changed to Glendale Golf and Country Club.

Dan Stack, an outstanding Winnipeg golfer, returned home from Sudbury to become Glendale's first professional, a post he held for 25 years. Stack also played a major role in the reconstruction work on the course. The current Glendale pro is Jim Steep.

Stack had hoped to be on hand for the Canadian Amateur at Glendale but he passed away last fall in his 86th year.

Ben Jacob was Glendale's first president and Rube Ludwick was the first accountant and secretary.

By 1948, the club was firmly established and plans were made to make alterations on the course and construct a new clubhouse, which were completed by 1949. Stanley Thompson was the course architect, the clubhouse design was by Green, Blankstein, Russell and Ham, architects.

Glendale went through a reconstruction period a few years ago, made possible through the sale of a strip of land facing on Portage Avenue.

Work began in 1987 and the revamped Glendale Course was put into full play in 1989, hailed as one of the best championship layouts in the

province. Renovations were also completed to the clubhouse at the same time.

This year marks the second time Glendale has played host to a national men's championship, the Canadian Senior Men's event was played at the club in 1977. The Canadian Ladies Golf Association staged its amateur championship at Glendale twice, in 1962 and 1991.

Several provincial championships have been played at Glendale, including seven provincial amateur championships, five Manitoba juniors and one provincial senior event. On the professional side, Glendale has been the site of the Manitoba Open Championship five times between 1954 and 1979.

The Glendale Golf and Country Club will be celebrating its 50th anniversary throughout the 1996 season.

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Club Professionals offer full service

The club professionals at Manitoba's golf courses offer a full range of services to their club members and many are also available to non-members for a variety of products and assistance.

Golf instruction, custom-fitting of clubs, advice on equipment, providing shoes, clothing and other golf accessories and developing junior programs and club events are all part of the regular duties performed by the head professionals and their assistants at the clubs of Manitoba.

Members of the Manitoba Division of the Canadian Professional Golfers Association are also actively involved in work for the community, through participation in many Pro-Am events for various charities.

Providing golf instruction and the operation of practice facilities make up just some of the duties of the club pro and staff, but there are many other aspects that make up the full package of services provided.

The custom-fitting of golf clubs ranks high on the list, whether the clubs are to be custom built or from stock, because of several variables to

be taken into account. They will stress the proper lie, angle the shaft flex and length, the swing weight and grip size in fitting the club to the individual.

Club professionals claim one of their biggest advantages over other equipment sources, apart from their knowledge of the game, is the availability of a practice range, where the pro can watch the customer hit balls to ensure the clubs are suitable. Most will also allow players to test clubs before a purchase is finalized.

While members of private golf clubs are well aware of the services provided by their club pros, public players may not be aware they also can obtain professional service since many clubs allow the public to deal at the pro shops.

Pro shops in Manitoba are well stocked with merchandise and the professionals stake their reputation on their goods. Whether a golfer is looking for equipment, balls, accessories, shoes, clothing or books and golf gadgets, the golf pro is there to provide the service.

While the professionals are mainly recognized for their work in the pro shops, many have expanded their responsibilities over the years. Some have taken on the position of Director of Golf, hiring other professionals to work with them and often taking over other duties, such as club management, provision of food and beverages, hiring of clubhouse staff and maintenance of the golf course.

Members of MPGA are proud of the junior golf development programs which are conducted at all clubs and of the achievements of many of the young players who got their start in this way.

Continuing education and training programs are a big part of the Canadian Professional Golfers Association program and all new-

comers to the business must pass stringent tests along the way to full professional status.

Most newcomers these days are required to have a two or three year college degree or are able to catch up to the equivalent through correspondence courses. Apprentices are required to pass a playability entrance test.

It is necessary to serve several years as an assistant pro, passing written tests along the way, before one is eligible to become an associate or head professional.

The Manitoba PGA members take part in a number of Pro-Am tournaments each summer, with the sponsoring clubs having their own favorite charities to support.

The No. 1 charity for the Manitoba pros is the War Amps program, under which the professionals provide instruction for young amputees who are able to take part in golf.

The Manitoba pros are also proud of the playing ability of many of their best players. There have consistently been two or three Manitobans in the running for the Canadian Club Pro championship each year.

On the local scene, the local PGA

in a number of events in which they can earn points toward the Coca-Cola Player of the Year honors and look forward to their provincial championships each year.

Al Scott, head pro at Selkirk and president of the CPGA of Manitoba, captured the Coca-Cola award in 1995, while the MPGA championship was won by **Glenn Collins**, assistant pro at Carman.

Tim Kinsman of Southwood was winner of the other coveted MPGA award for 1995, being chosen by his peers as the Manitoba Professional of the Year. ●

but it will attract the attention of the golf fans from across the country in that one week in August when the best amateurs gather to test the course.

It marks only the sixth time for the Canadian men's amateur championship to be played in Winnipeg. It was played in 1921 at the old Winnipeg Golf Club, in 1935 and 1957 at St. Charles, in 1965 at Pine Ridge and in

1974 at Niakwa.

The '96 Canadian Amateur should attract plenty of local fan interest, too, particularly since Manitoba will be attempting to defend the Willingdon Cup team title which was won last year by the foursome of Rob McMillan, Garth Collings, Dale Goehring and Derron Magda. ●

Supers anticipate busy season



There's a new name and a new logo, but the objectives remain the same—a dedication to the preservation of golf and golf courses and to protect the environment.

The Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association (MGSA) is the new name adopted in November to replace the former Golf Course Superintendents Association of Manitoba (GSCAM).

President **Rob Officer** explained the change in name and logo was part of an effort to streamline the operation and replace a cumbersome association name.

MGSA members continue to promote research and the interchange of knowledge for the betterment of turfgrass management.

Officer, the course superintendent at the new Grand Pines course under construction near Grand Beach, is supported on the board of directors by vice-president **Rob Hamm** of Carman, past president **Ian Martinusen** of Breezy Bend and directors **Dave Oshust** of Carberry, **Paul Henry** of Kenora and **Ian Cairns** of Central Lift Equipment. **Bob Hamm**

of Steinbach is the executive director.

Henry is also one of a number of course superintendents who have changed locations since last season, taking on the post at Kenora after serving at Falcon Lake. **Tony Scheregyhazi** moved from assistant superintendent at Niakwa to take on the post at Falcon Lake, while **Dave Turner** moved from Swan River to Hecla Island and **Lloyd Davies**, who had been the super at Hecla, took on a new post as director of golf operations for both Falcon and Hecla. **Cory Froelich** has moved from the Sand Beach Golf Resort at Beausejour to the Phantom Lake Club at Flin Flon.

Mike Muldowney is a newcomer to the Manitoba association, coming from Fort McMurray, Alberta, to become head superintendent at Glendale Golf and Country Club, taking over in the club's 50th anniversary year and with the Canadian Men's Amateur championship as the season's main attraction. Another newcomer is **Calvin Koenig**, who comes from Edmonton to take on the post at Swan River.

Officer said Manitoba course superintendents would likely face a very busy spring sea-

son because of the abundance of snow in the province during the winter months.

"There's going to be a lot of water obviously, and a lot will depend on how the melt goes," Officer said in a mid-March interview. "If there's a lot of thawing and freezing, it could cause some problems. I'm sure all our members will be staying on top of the situation and there will probably be more operations to clear some of the snow from greens than in other years. It will really depend on the melt."

Officer won't have greens to be concerned about at his own course this year, but anticipates a busy start to the season as he gets the new Grand Pines layout ready for seeding.

"We're hoping we can get the seeding completed in June, then spend the rest of the summer with grooming and maintenance," he said. "We're expecting the course to be opening early in 1997". ●

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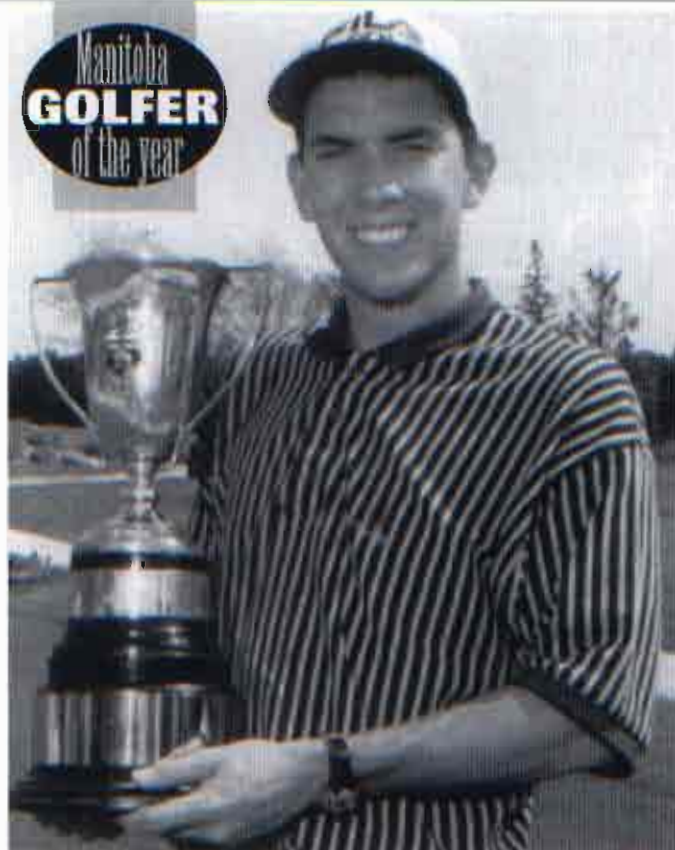

Rob McMillan claims No. 5

For the fifth time in six years, Rob McMillan of Pine Ridge had his name engraved on the Labatt's Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year trophy when the 1995 selection was announced Oct. 31 at the annual meeting of the Manitoba Golf Association.

McMillan became the first five-time winner of the award, pulling ahead of Todd Fanning, who had claimed the honor four times before turning professional.

Fanning's fourth win came in

1991, the year after McMillan's first and it has been almost McMillan's private trophy since then. He won outright in 1992 and 1993, then had to share the honor in 1994 with Aileen Robertson of St. Charles, the only time the award voting finished in a tie as both won national titles.

In 1995, McMillan was a clear winner over the other two finalists - Garth Collings of Breezy Bend and Jo-Ann Lindsay of St. Charles.

McMillan became the first five-time winner of the award

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McMillan's accomplishments for the year included a second place finish in the Xerox Manitoba Open, his second Manitoba Amateur championship and leading the Manitoba team to its first Willingdon Cup national team victory in 21 years.

The University of New Mexico student was unable to attend the October meeting and his award was accepted by his father Jim.

Collings was the runner-up to McMillan in the Manitoba Amateur and was part of the team which won the

Willingdon Cup, along with Dale Goehring of Breezy Bend and Derron Magda of Rossmere. He was also the MGA Manitoba Tour champion for a second consecutive year.

Lindsay was saluted for her strong showing in her first season back on the Manitoba scene after residing several years in Minnesota. She won the provincial senior women's title by 18 strokes, was runner-up to Aileen Robertson in the women's amateur and runner-up to Brionie Brown in the City and District. She finished fourth in the U.S. senior women's championship and seventh in the Canadian senior women's event. ●

Xerox Manitoba Open: A third visit to Pine Ridge

o major changes are in the plans as Pine Ridge Golf Club prepares for the \$100,000 1996 Xerox Manitoba Open championship July 11-14.

This is the final year of Pine Ridge's three-year term as the site of the major Manitoba golf attraction and a decision is expected before this year's tournament on the site for the ensuing three years.

It will be difficult to duplicate the excitement generated in the 1995 Manitoba Open when local amateur whiz Rob McMillan showed a liking for his home course and threw a scare into the mainly professional field by taking a good run at the championship.

McMillan finished second, only three shots behind the winning Trevor Dodds, a native of Namibia playing out of St. Louis, Mo., who won the \$18,000 first

prize money with a 72-hole total of 279, nine under par for the route. McMillan, who closed with back to back four-under 68s on the final two days, had a total of 282, six better than par.

Ian Leggatt of Cambridge, Ont., and Manny Zerman of San Diego, shared the runner-up pro money, each winning \$8,000 with their five-under-par 283 totals and former Manitoba Open Champion Stuart Hendley, a transplanted Texan now playing out of the Goose Hummock Golf Resort near Edmonton, was next in line at 284, good for \$4,800.

Defending champion Scott Dunlap of Sarasota, Fla., was among the sub-par shooters, but he won't be expected back this year because he qualified this spring to play on the major PGA Tour in the United States.

There has been a change in leadership and in marketing for the 1996 Open, but

most of the volunteers who made the event successful in the past two years will be back on duty this time at Pine Ridge.

Don Craig, executive director of the Manitoba Golf Association, has moved back into the picture as the interim president of the Manitoba Open Inc. after Merv Jones stepped down from that post. Craig had served as the president during the three years the Open was played at Breezy Bend, 1991-93.



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Val Overwater of Overwater and Associates has been hired to handle marketing programs for the '96 Open, bringing sports marketing expertise from previous marketing post with the Jets, Goldeyes and other sports teams.

Xerox remains as the title sponsor of the event, with MTS Mobility and IGA returning as major sponsors and Craig said it was expected most former sponsors at other levels would also be back this year.

Craig is joined on the Manitoba Open Inc. board of directors by Rudy Boivin of the MGA, Ray Nault and Garry Bowles of Pine Ridge, Bill Morrissey and Paul Thornhill of Xerox, James Fitzgerald of MTS Mobility, Colin Rathbone of IGA,

Michael Evans as finance chairman and Aihlin Walker in charge of the women's program tournament. Nault is chairman of the Pine Ridge committee, with Bowles as assistant chairman.

Craig said the committee is looking into new special events for this year's tournament and anticipates the marketing programs will assure good crowds for the final year at Pine Ridge.

He said at least three clubs had indicated an interest in hosting the Open for the next three years and detailed applications are to be studied soon with a decision expected to be made prior to this year's event so representatives from the new location can work with the Pine Ridge volunteers. ●

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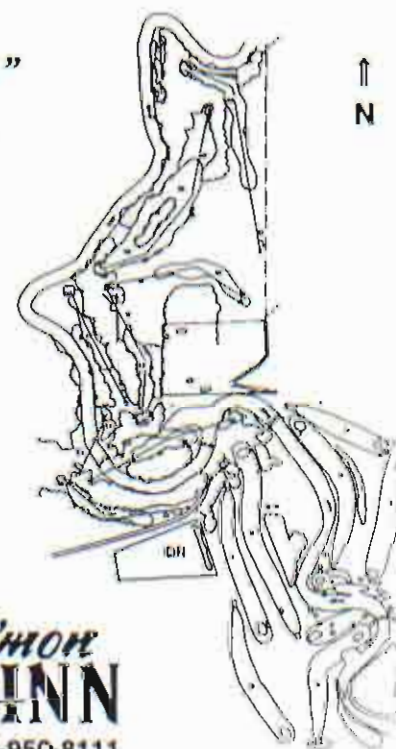

Pidlaski, Doyle inducted

Bill Pidlaski and Jim Doyle had many things in

Both played most of their golf out of the Elmhurst Golf and Country Club, both won Manitoba titles in both ama-

teur and senior categories, both played many times on Manitoba's Willingdon Cup teams, both were very popular among their peers.

Now there's an addition to the list: In November, both were inducted into the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame, the seventh and eighth so honored from the sport of golf.

Earlier golf inductees were male golfers Allan Boes (1981), Bobby Reith (1984) and George Knudson (1988), female golfers Marjorie Edey (1984) and Ann Tachan (1994) and

builder Peggy Colonello (1994).

Doyle, who died suddenly at the age of 58 in 1991, was on Manitoba's Willingdon Cup team 11 times from 1968 to 1985, nine of them out of Elmhurst and two out

of his beloved Sandy Hook, where he was working when he died. He had a string of six straight team appearances from 1968 to 1973.

Doyle is the only Manitoban ever to win the Canadian men's amateur

golf championship (1968), and he is the only male golfer to win the provincial championships at the junior (1951), amateur (1975) and senior (1989 and 1990) levels.

In 1968 he was a member of the Canadian team which finished third at the Eisenhower Cup matches in Australia.

Pidlaski, at 77 still an active member of Elmhurst and often shooting under his age, won the Manitoba title twice (1960 and 1963) and the Manitoba senior title twice (1977 and 1978).

He played on 10 Manitoba Willingdon Cup teams between 1949 and 1966, including a string of seven in a row in 1960 to 1966. Eight

of those team berths came while he played at Elmhurst, the first two while he played at St. Boniface.

On the international scene, Pidlaski played twice on the Canadian America's Cup team, in 1963 and 1965

and was particularly proud of the 1965 team which played at the St. Charles Country Club in Winnipeg and provided Canada's only victory in the competition against teams from the United States and Mexico. ●

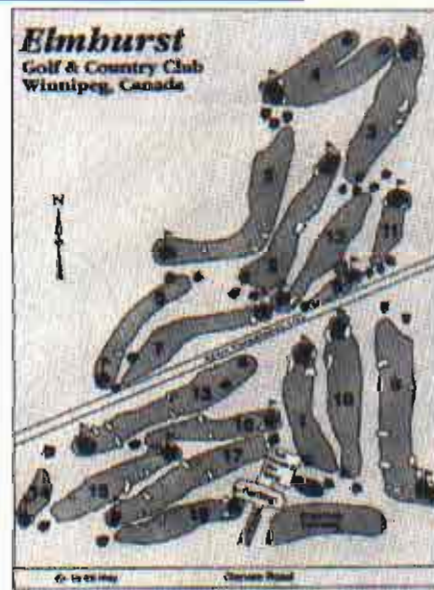
