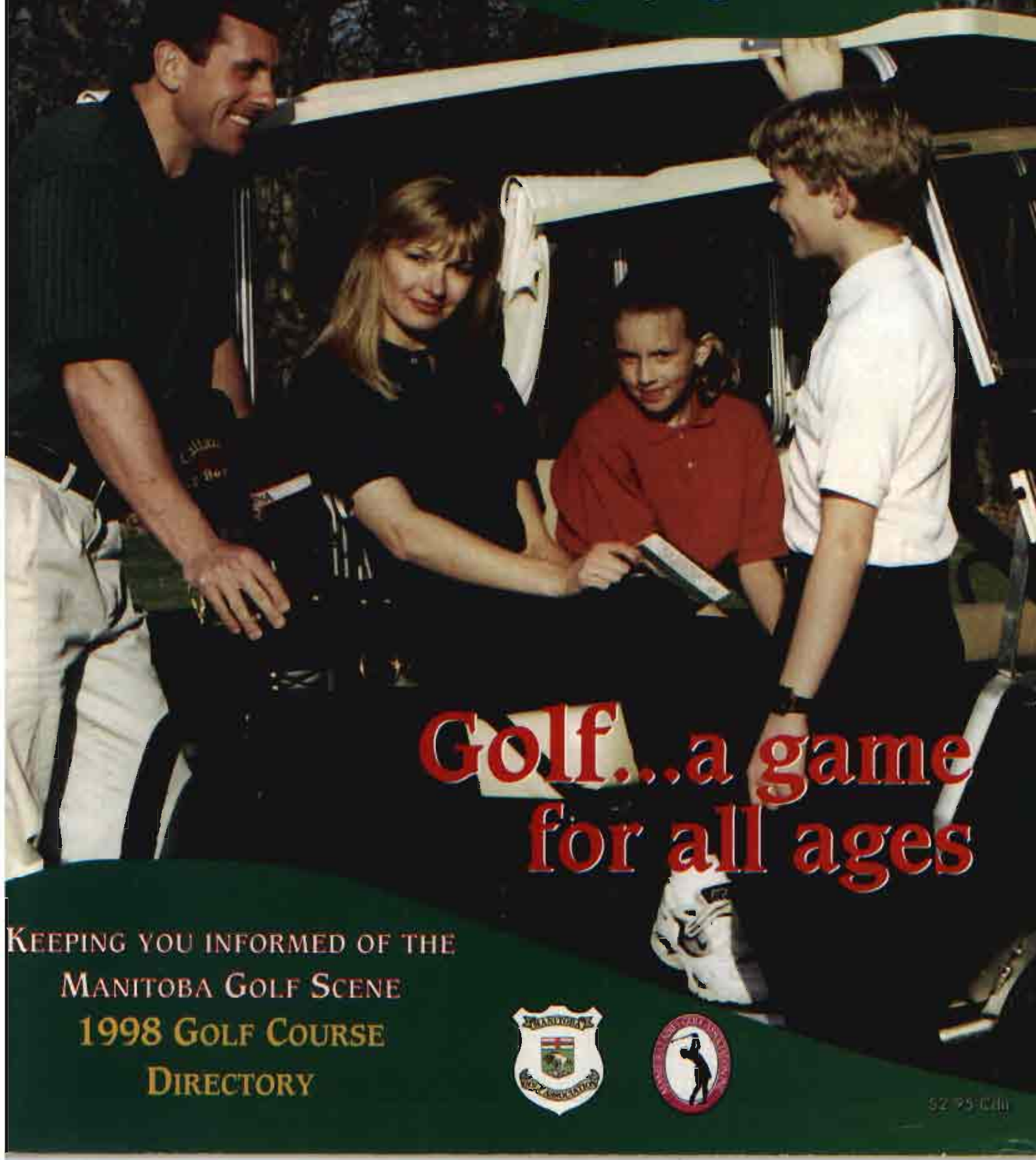

I am honored to follow in the footsteps of native Manitoban Al Macatavish, who accomplished so much during his one year term as president of the RCGA.

With Rob McMillan playing the Canadian Tour and Glen Hnatiuk already making his mark on the PGA Tour, Manitoba golfers are prominent in this year's professional golf spotlight. But even these accomplished golfers started at the grassroots level, which is why I am proud that the RCGA has provided a grant of \$12,000 to the Manitoba Golf Association to launch a provincial Future Links School Program. As you may know, Future Links is the RCGA's national amateur junior development initiative that promotes accessibili-

ty and affordability for kids who might otherwise never play the game. In 1997, the MGA conducted a rural clinic program that attracted 635 golfers at 22 sites. In 1998, junior clinics will now be mandatory at all sites of the program, helping to ensure the future of the game in Manitoba. Last year, more than 7,600 kids participated in the Future Links program across Canada. Manitoba held clinics at eight sites across the province, and as new clubs join the RCGA – such as Pelican Beach Golf Centre in Gimli and The Players Course in Winnipeg – we hope to see that number grow significantly in 1998.

I look forward to serving as the RCGA president this year, and I would like to wish all Manitoba golfers a wonderful year of good sportsmanship and continued support for the game of golf. ●

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Meet the MGA President

Ken MacCharles takes the reins

Finding new sources of revenue, developing young golfers and making the golfing public aware of the benefits of membership are major goals for the new president of the Manitoba Golf Association.

Ken MacCharles of St. Charles Country Club moved into the president's chair at the MGA annual meeting last fall and is preparing for a busy term.

MacCharles, 70, has been associated with the St. Charles Club most of his golfing life, with the exception of a few years spent at Niakwa.

"I was about 15 or so when I took up the game and my father, Frank, was a member and a former club champion at St. Charles so that's where I played," he said. "I left when I was 25, then returned and took over my father's share after he died."

His own accomplishments on the links include one appearance on the provincial men's senior team in 1990, and victories in the 65-69 age group in the provincial senior championship in 1994 & 1995. He plays to a handicap rating of 7. "I finished fifth in the seniors in 1990, but I got to go on the team because Dick Quinton had a trip to Scotland that conflicted," MacCharles noted. "It was a great experience for me."

The new MGA president also had the distinction of losing his amateur status for a year in 1993-94 after he won a car in the hole-in-one competition of the Vipond Classic tournament at St. Charles.

"I pondered whether to accept or not, but Cynthia (his wife) helped make up my mind," he said. "She's still driving the car. I was declared ineligible for amateur play, but I applied for reinstatement right away and I was back as an amateur the next season."

MacCharles has served on the MGA Council for several years and was president-elect and tournament director for the past two years under Syd Cohan. He is a former board member at St. Charles and was club captain for two years. He also served as a rules official before joining the MGA Council and is a certified official.



He takes over the MGA reins at a time when the association is facing financial restraints.

"Our grants are shrinking and we're trying to find alternative sources of revenue to carry out our programs," he said. "We also will be trying to educate our golfers about the association. It's amazing how little people know about the benefits of MGA membership."

He also noted that some golfers believed the MGA would lose revenue this year because of the loss of the Manitoba Open.

"The MGA never made any money out of the Manitoba Open," he said. "The Manitoba Open Inc. was not a profit maker either. In fact, there was a loss situation last year and since we (MGA) subsidized the MOI, we won't get back what funds we had advanced. The financial drain is on us."

MacCharles sees the hiring of Garth Goodbrandson as athlete development co-ordinator as a major move in the associations efforts to develop young golfers through clinics and school programs.

"We have lost some really good golfers in recent years and we have to develop more skilled players," he said. "I'm confident Garth will do a good job in development and I'm looking forward to working with the Council on our other problems this year." ●

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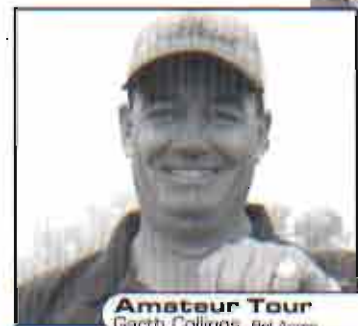

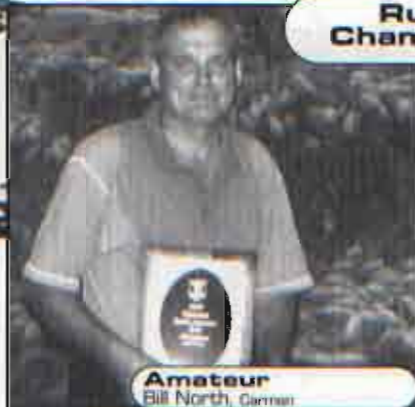

Golfer of the Year

A Year to Remember for Goehring

He knew early in the year that it was to be his last season of golf in Manitoba, but Dale Goehring could never have imagined just how eventful the 1997 season was going to be. He had already left the province to take on a new job in Calgary but he was representing Manitoba when he reached the peak of his young career by winning the Canadian Men's Amateur golf championship in August at the Crowbush Cove course at Lakeside, PEI.

It was his final appearance as a Manitoban, playing in the Canadian event as a member of the provincial Willingdon Cup team. His victory gave Manitoba its second straight Canadian Amateur crown, following on the heels of Rob McMillan's home-town triumph in 1996 at the Glendale Country Club.

Goehring, now 26, moved to Calgary during the 1997 season after accepting an engineering position with Reid Crowther and Partners and this season he will play out of the Glencoe Country Club in Calgary.

He's happy to be settled at a club and is looking forward to the new challenge of competing in Alberta this summer.

His final season in Manitoba was certainly one to remember. He was a semi-finalist in the provincial match play championship, bowing out to eventual winner Dave Francis, after having won the event in 1994 and 1995 and losing in the final to Breezy Bend clubmate Garth Collings in 1996. Francis defeated Collings in the 1997 final.

Goehring tied for third in the Manitoba Amateur championship, which was won by Jamie Wilkie, then went on to earn a berth on the Manitoba Willingdon Cup team for the fifth time, along with Nick Rowe, junior champion Adam Speirs and clubmate Collings.

The Manitoba team tied for third in the 1997 national Willingdon Cup test. Goehring had been a member of the championship team from Manitoba in 1996, along with McMillan, Terry Hashimoto and Ben Bandura.

These accomplishments led to Goehring's selection as the Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year with the presentation made at the Manitoba Golf Association's annual meeting. Two months later his feats earned yet another honor when he was named Manitoba's Male Athlete of the Year in voting by the Manitoba Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association. His father accepted on his behalf at the



Athlete's Dinner held in January.

Yet another honor came his way this spring when he was awarded the Score Magazine Male Amateur of the Year honors for 1997 at a dinner in April in Vancouver.

All in all, it was a year to be remembered and Manitoba fans will be watching Goehring's progress in his new location with interest. ●

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Golf on school curriculum?

Funding of \$24,000 has been established to back a program launched in the fall of 1997 by the MGA/MLGA to introduce golf into provincial schools with the eventual goal of getting the sport on the school curriculum.

The funding includes \$12,000 from the Legacy Trust (a fund to administer a \$2 million holdover from the old Manitoba Sports Federation) and \$12,000 from the Royal Canadian Golf Association.

In his new position as athlete development co-ordinator for the provincial bodies, **Garth Goodbrandson** is in charge of the planning and administration of the school program.

Early reaction indicates the program is being well received by teachers and students.

Trustees of the provincial Legacy Trust include the five members of the Sport Manitoba executive who were elected by the various sports bodies. ●

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Manitoba Pros On The Move

Four former assistant professionals have moved up to head pro positions and there has been a shuffling of personnel in the pro shops at several Manitoba golf courses in the past year.

In addition, one new head pro has arrived in Manitoba from outside the province and two former Manitobans have come back to the province from British Columbia to take on assistant pro jobs here.

Traci Zonneveld has taken over the reins as head pro at Morden's Minnewasta Golf Club after serving as an assistant to **Garth Goodbrandson**, who resigned to take on duties with the Manitoba Golf Association.

Brian Guenther is the new head pro at Falcon Lake, moving up after serving as an assistant to **Larry Robinson** at the Steinbach Fly-In Club. He takes over from **Tom Betz**, who has left the province to remain in Arizona.

Brad Poleschuk, who has been assistant pro under **Robin Henderson** at Quarry Oaks, is now the head man in the pro shop at the Pinawa Golf Club.

Mark Anderson becomes head pro at South Interlake after serving as an assistant to **Jim Sutherland** at the Wildewood Club.

Arriving on the Manitoba scene from Toronto is **Mike Sherman**, who has taken on the role as head professional at St. Charles Country Club, succeeding **Jim Collins**, who retired at the end of the 1997 season after 37 years of service.

Two other head pros have changed their addresses since last year. **Darcy Lachance** moves to Selkirk after being at Russell, and **Barry Gibson** becomes head pro at the PGX Short Game Centre after being unaffiliated.

Jim Mayer, the former head pro at Hecla Island and associate pro at Harbour View, is going into his first full season as general manager of Gilbert Plains Golf Club, a position he accepted midway through the 1997 season.

Returning to the province from British Columbia this year are **Blair Shettler**, who becomes an assistant pro at Bel Acres, and **Bill Dinsdale**, who takes an assistant pro post at Deer Ridge in Brandon.

Cathy Burton, who was head pro at the Short Game operation in its first year of operation, has returned to the assistant pro ranks at St. Charles. **Chris Olafson** is another assistant at St. Charles, moving from Minnewasta.

Other assistant pros on the move includes: **Glen Vanderweyde** to Glendale from Bel Acres; **Greg Love** to Harbour View from Breezy Bend; **Steve Witink** to Tuxedo from Bel Acres; **Geoff Kehler** to Larter's at St. Andrews from St. Boniface; **Ross Lemon** to Grand Pines from Deer Ridge.

New apprentices on the books from the Manitoba PGA this year include **Cameron Hall** at Kingswood, **Mac Macleod** at Southwood and **Dave McMillan** at Charleswood.

Leaving Manitoba in addition to Betz were **Kelly Rasmussen** from Larter's and **Robert Hollins** from John Blumberg, both heading west to British Columbia.

Brian Howard has left the assistant pro ranks at Glendale to become the local representative for Callaway Golf.

In addition to **Jim Collins**, the ranks of retired pros in Manitoba welcomed **Bud Edwards**, who served as the head man at Falcon Lake for many years.

Leaving the Manitoba pro scene this year to join the Canadian Tour are **Dean North**, who was an assistant at St. Charles and won the Manitoba Coca-Cola Player of the Year honors in 1997, and **Derek Ingram**, who was head pro at South Interlake.

Outside the province but still part of the Manitoba Division of the Canadian Professional Golfers Association are two position changes at Thunder Bay, where **Jim Szturm** moves from Centennial to Emerald Green as head pro, and former assistant **Pat Berezowski** moves up to the head job at Centennial. ●

Athlete Development Co-ordinator

Goodbrandson excited about new job

It was a big step to leave the club pro ranks and take on a new position with the provincial amateur golf association, but **Garth Goodbrandson** is taking it in stride and his enthusiasm is building steadily.

Goodbrandson, 37, spent six years as the head professional at the Minnewasta Golf and Country Club in Morden before he was appointed to the new position of Athlete Development Co-ordinator for the Manitoba Golf Association and Manitoba Ladies Golf Association on Nov. 1.

"It's a big change after being a club professional, but I've always been interested in getting new people involved in golf, so I feel it's natural for me," Goodbrandson said. "I'm still very involved as a CPGA pro and I hope to play in some tournaments, but I'm just taking a different route now."

He retains his standing in the Manitoba Division of the Canadian Professional Golfers Association under the new classification of Administrative Golf Professional.

Goodbrandson's new post will focus largely on the development of golfers with programs to assist the elite players as well as to introduce newcomers to the game. Much of the winter work is in association with the schools, while the summer agenda will be mainly clinics arranged at various golf clubs throughout the province.

The rural clinics, sponsored by Meyers, Norris, Penny (MNP), will feature junior boys and girls, but there will also be adult instruction. He expects there will be one junior and one or two adult clinics at each rural stop during May and June.

"We expect our program will develop many new golfers and will also help those who are relatively new to the game to improve skills," he said.

Through the winter months, Goodbrandson was busy with school programs, along with duties in the organization of the summer clinics. Through May, June and July he anticipates spending a lot of time at clubs throughout Manitoba.

Along with a program of camps and sessions for the elite junior players, he will be in charge of three spring camps to be held for youngsters with handicaps in the 12 to 20 range, one in the eastern section, one in the western section and one in Winnipeg. Participants are recommended by the golf clubs.

Goodbrandson is also excited about the school programs because it provides an opportunity to introduce the game to

some who have never been exposed to golf.

"We're catching some of the kids who don't have a chance to belong to a golf club and it's great to see their interest," he said. "They might not be able to continue right away, but down the road, they'll know what golf is all about."

He estimated more than 1,000 had gone through the school program by mid-April and there might be 1,500 students through the program by the end of the school year.

"We can see this program growing, as the word spreads among the teachers," Goodbrandson said. "We will work with the teachers to establish programs at the schools."

He was also enthusiastic about a six-week program in progress with a drop-in centre on Langside Street.

"This is aimed at the core area kids," he explained. "It's a pilot program and we're working with kids who have never swung a club before. The kids were selected because of their good attitude and this is a sort of reward for them."

Goodbrandson took four youngsters, age 11 to 15, and started with a miniature golf session at The Dome, to be followed by four lessons at the St. Vital Golf Centre and it is hoped to get them out on a golf course after that.

"It's rewarding to work with these kids who have never been exposed to golf before," he said. "It really makes it all worthwhile because they're so eager."

Goodbrandson said it was a tough decision to leave Morden after six years there, but he's content in his new position and is looking forward to the summer months.

His wife Lisa has been transferred to Winnipeg with Manitoba Telephones and they have settled into the city with their two children, daughter Samantha and son Dale.

Goodbrandson is in his 17th year as a CPGA professional, having spent five years as an assistant at Tuxedo, four years as head pro at The Pas and one year as an assistant at Breezy Bend before going to Morden. He will also continue to give golf lessons this season at the St. Vital Golf Centre. ●

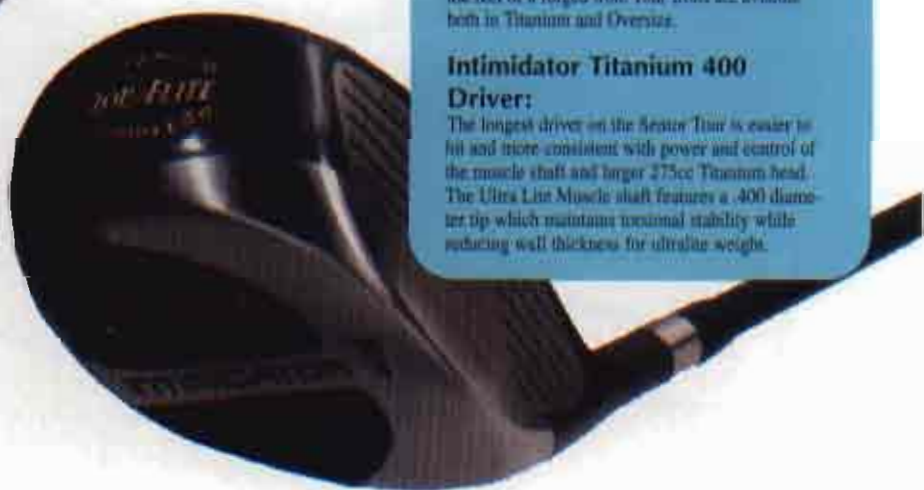

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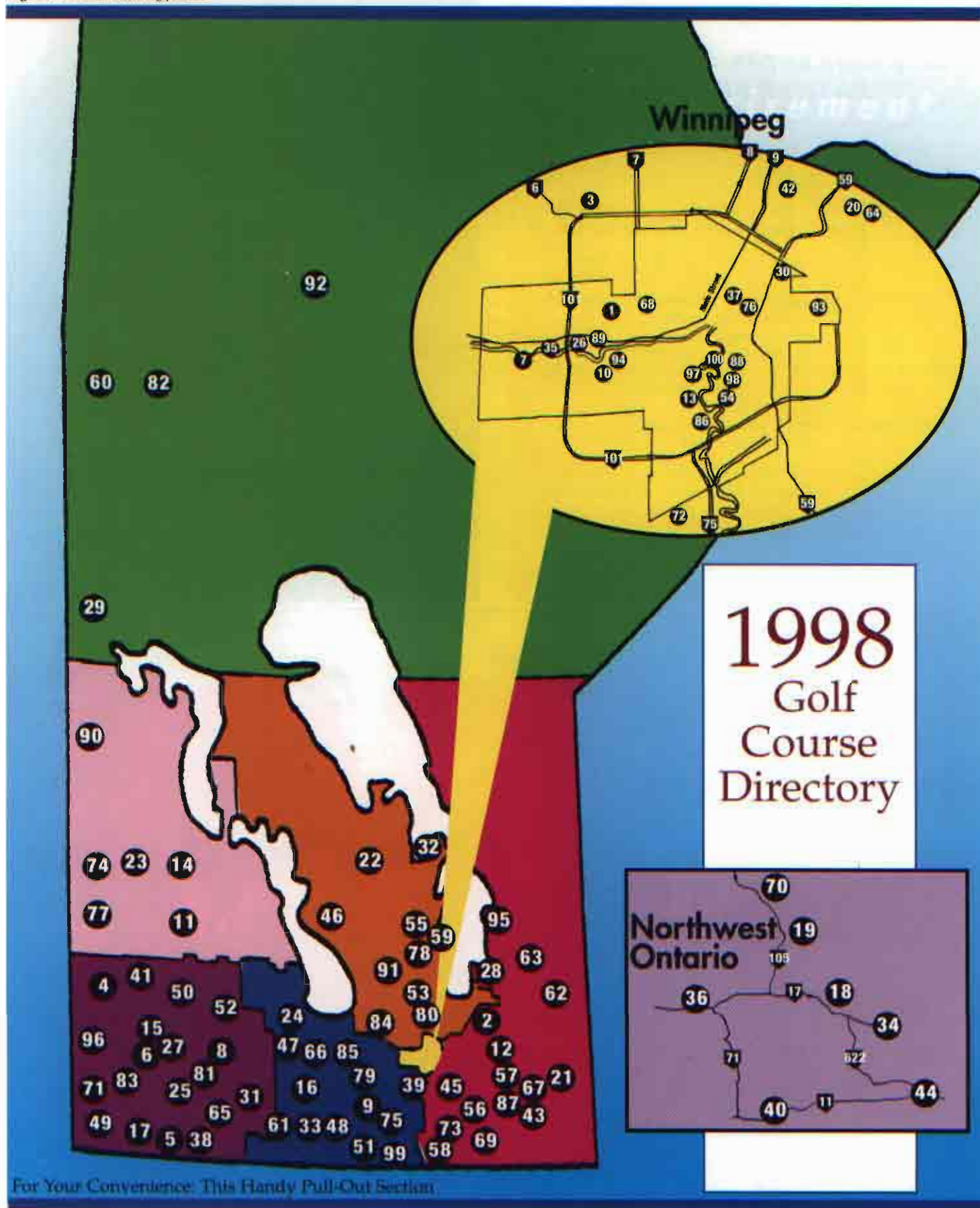

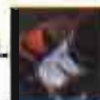

MTS Classic

New event takes Manitoba spot on Canadian Tour

The Manitoba Open was dropped from the 1998 Canadian Tour schedule in January, but it took only a few weeks for a new tournament to be developed in its place. Manitoba Telecom Services has become the title sponsor of the \$125,000 Tour event to be played July 9-12 at the Elmhurst Golf and County Club.

The Winnipeg Free Press stepped into the breach after Tour commissioner Jacques Burelle notified the Manitoba Open Inc. that it was to be dropped from the schedule.

Spearheaded by Laurie Finley, director of advertising, the Free Press took on the role of organizing and marketing the new tournament and hired Mitch Zalnasky as the tournament director.

The agreement is to conduct the Manitoba stop on the tour for three years, Elmhurst, which played host to the 1997 Manitoba Open as the first of a planned three-year program, subsequently agreed to be the host for 1998 and 1999 for the new event.

Manitoba Telecom Services came on board in March as the title sponsor of the tournament, which was then named the MTS Classic. It will be the sixth official stop on the Canadian Tour this year, following two in British Columbia and three in Alberta. An international team match will also be staged in Saskatoon in June.

Other sponsors are being sought and Zalnasky reported those signed up by mid-April included Sport Select as a major sponsor, CJOB radio, Global TV and Mediacom billboards as media sponsors. There will also be associate and general sponsor packages available to corporations.

Zalnasky said the goal will be to have a field of 156 golfers for the inaugural MTS Classic, which would include 130 tour players and 26 exempted or qualifying players. Exemptions will be extended to five Manitoba amateurs (to be selected by the MGA) and 10 Manitoba professionals (to be named by the Manitoba Division of the Canadian Professional Golfers Association). A qualifying round will be played July 6 at Pine Ridge.

He also announced there would be only one day of pro-am competition for the tournament on July 8 and this would leave the Tuesday available for the touring pros to practice.

The pro-am day will feature two separate tournaments, morning and afternoon, with a limit of 20 teams in each. Teams will be made up of one professional and three amateurs. The entry fee of \$500 will include golf, prize package, golf carts, refreshments and dinner.

"We want to make the pro-am events enjoyable for the pros and the amateurs and by limiting the field we hope to play at a much faster pace than has been experienced in the past," Zalnasky said. He said admission prices will be reduced this year, with single-day passes selling for \$3 for Thursday and Friday and \$5 for Saturday and Sunday, or a four-day pass available for \$10. Children under 16 can attend free of charge if accompanied by an adult on the Thursday and Friday.

The course will be played as it was for the 1997 Manitoba Open, with the nines reversed so the usual ninth hole will be on the 18th.

The \$125,000 purse (\$22,500 to the winner) is equal to the minimum purse for all Canadian Tour events this year. The opening Tour event, the Payless Open at Victoria, will also have a total of \$125,000, while the next three events will be a little richer.

The purse will be \$150,000 at the BC TEL Open at Richmond, B.C., as well as all three events in Alberta, the TELUS Calgary Open, TELUS Edmonton Open and the Henry Singer Alberta Open. The remaining tour stops all offer \$125,000 with the exception of the Canadian Masters event in July with a purse of \$200,000. Total Canadian Tour prize money for 1998 will be \$2 million. ●

Meet the MLGA President

Anne Leibl set for busy term

Anne Leibl married her husband Ron 37 years ago, and realized very quickly that the best way to her man's heart would be down the fairways of a golf course.

"It was very much a case of if you can't beat him, join him," said the president of the Manitoba Ladies Golf Association, who picked up a golf club for the first time at Wildewood, Ron's club, soon after she became his wife.

Except for a three-year sojourn in Saskatoon, the Leibls have been fixtures at Wildewood ever since, enjoying its year-round facility as they watched two children grow up, and now have four grandchildren.

"I always knew I'd have my limitations on the golf course," said Anne. "But Ron and I love the game, and my handicap (about 20) made me respectable enough when I had a chance to play with him."

How much time they'll have together in the next two years is a pertinent question, as Anne takes on the responsibilities of the premier women's administrative post in her sport in Manitoba.

"I'll be busy, but I have great women on my board, and my vice-president (Carol Doerksen) and I really work well together," said Leibl. "I also have more time on my hands because I quit work. I'd been at Eaton's for 22 years, and the MLGA presidency was the final nudge I needed to walk away."

She brings to her position 11 years of varied experience working as an MLGA director on rules and course rating, as the association treasurer, and as the vice-president last season.

"I had to move up to president a year sooner than I expected due to Chris Heywood's death," Leibl pointed out. "But Joyce Collier stayed on for an extra year as president, and I learned a great deal about the process from her, particularly about matters at the national level."

Leibl noticed a major difference at Canadian Ladies Golf Association meetings this off season. "The atmosphere was much more positive. The doom and gloom over financial cuts last year is gone. Everybody is pleased about the return of the National Club Teams Championship, and going back to four players from three per team in the other national events," she observed.

"The NCTC was very popular, but it was costly (\$60,000) to run

on the former basis," said Leibl. "The entry fee now will be \$15 at the club level (\$5 of which will go to the Canadian Breast Cancer Foundation), and our three teams will pay \$100 each to go into the nationals to supplement the funding from new sponsors Revlon and the Bank of Montreal."

In provincial matters, she is concerned about the difficulty in obtaining courses for MGA and MLGA tournaments, but realizes there is a changing scene in that respect. "We had to cut the City and District down from 54 to 36 holes because we couldn't get a third course that week, and part of the reason is the number of corporate and charity events that now are flourishing," she said.

"We'll sit down with MGA officials later this year to discuss the issue, and try to map out a solution," Leibl promised. "It's a conflict, but if that's the way the golfing public wants to go, maybe we have to accept the fact and reduce our provincial tournaments."

Another scheduling problem developed for the MLGA provincials, when the host site Niakwa requested a date change due to a corporate event. The women's Amateur, Senior and Junior championships will be held one week later (July 21-23) this year, but at the same time as the Manitoba Men's Amateur.

"We've tried to avoid scheduling against the men's Amateur and the Manitoba Open in the past, although now that the Open is no longer run by the MGA and has become just a professional tournament we won't have the same reluctance," she said.

Leibl is prepared to take these dilemmas in stride, accepting them as part of the territory. She also knows her handicap is liable to climb, because her presidential duties will be more in the boardroom than on the golf course.

"I guess I'll miss some of the Wednesday morning rounds with the gals at Wildewood," she said. "But, hey, doesn't the MLGA president get the odd invitation to play at other times?"

For sure, Anne. And no green fees either. ●





MLGA tournaments get 'new look'

The 1998 MLGA tournament schedule looks much the same as other years, but it really has undergone a complete overhaul, and there now will be a radical "new look" to most events.

"It was obvious the interest in some tournaments was on a decline, and it was time to try something new," said Shirley Oliver, MLGA tournament director. "We hope the adjustments we've made will be popular at all levels of competition."

The opening event on June 19 is the Crocus in Teulon, and it now will be a net best ball tournament for higher handicap (index 22.9 to 40.2) golfers. They will enter individually but compete in foursomes set according to index, counting three low net best balls for prizes.

The Crocus will have an 8 am shotgun start, with a maximum of 96 players, for an entry fee of \$20, including lunch. The entry deadline is June 8 at 9 am at the MLGA office.

The City and District tournament was cut from three rounds to 18 holes last year due to heavy rains. This season it will be reduced to 36 holes, with rounds July 2 at Morden and July 3 at St. Charles, because the MLGA couldn't obtain a third golf course for a round on June 30.

"Many club activities are slated around the Canada Day holiday, and nothing was available for us," said Oliver.

The MLGA Interclub A event will be held July 8 at Pinawa, and the Interclub B tourney is scheduled for July 9 at Winkler.

The former Rural Open will have a new format. It will declare provincial rural champions in three divisions, Amateur, Senior, and Junior, in an 18 hole tournament July 16 in Portage. It will be limited to 96 players in the three divisions, and lunch again is included in the \$20 entry fee.

The total field also will be 96 players (cut from 108) in the MLGA Provincial Championships, over 54 holes July 21-23 at Niakwa. "The entry fee is up slightly (from \$50 to \$60), but by reducing the field the intention is to speed up play, which has been a problem," said Oliver.

The MLGA also has shifted to a sudden death playoff format at the site, if required for division titles, team positions, or extra players, a change from 18-hole playoffs. The provincial teams will revert back to four players (three last year), and two extra amateurs and juniors will be funded to the nationals.

The Colleen Hutchison Match Play tournament will run August 4-7 at Transcona, South Interlake, Wildewood and Assiniboine.

In the hope of attracting more lower handicap players, it will be split into A (up to 18.8 index) and B (18.9 to 37.2) handicap divisions, with separate champions and flight winners.

The Bronze provincial final will be held Aug. 19 at Neepawa, and the Foursome event again will be the final MLGA fixture, scheduled for Sept. 2 at St. Boniface.

"We're delighted the CLGA is re-instating the National Club Teams Championship and staging it here," said Oliver. "It was one of our most popular competitions. Our provincials will be Aug. 12 at Breezy Bend, and we play host to the NCTC nationals Sept. 12-14 at Rossmere."

The NCTC now will be conducted with two-member teams (instead of three players), but each province will send three teams to the nationals. One player must have a 24 or above index, and the other below.

Oliver, a member at Elmhurst, will have Peggy Wakeman of Pine Ridge, and Shirley Penner of Southwood, as her assistant tournament directors.

"We didn't want to revamp everything," said Oliver. "But nothing should stay the same forever, and when tournament entries are falling off it's time to offer the golfers some changes." ●

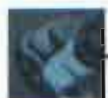

Ann Tachan Leads Team Parade

Ann Tachan is the leader among a group of nine Manitoba golfers who have played on more than 10 provincial women's golf teams over the years.

Manitoba Ladies Golf Association past president **Lorraine MacLeod** has completed research to compile a complete listing of all team players since the national competitions began in 1947 with amateur teams.

A national event for junior women's provincial teams was started in 1955, while the event for provincial senior women's teams began in 1971.

Tachan played on a total of 25 provincial teams over the years, 11 amateur and 14 senior. **Lynda Palahniuk** leads the way on amateur teams with 16 appearances and also played on two junior teams for a total of 18. That figure is matched by **Merlene Netterfield**, who played on nine amateur and nine senior teams.

Marj Edey played for Manitoba 15 times, 12 as an amateur and three as a senior, followed by **June Bagley** with a total of 14, five amateur and nine senior. **Marg Ford** and **Aileen Robertson** each played on 13 Manitoba teams, Ford with four amateur and nine senior and Robertson with four junior and nine amateur.

Marj Homenuik's total of 12 included one junior and 11 amateur appearances and **Jo-Ann Lindsay** rounds out the leaders as the only one to appear on Manitoba teams in all three categories.

She played on a total of 11 teams, including three junior, six amateur and two senior.

Due to space limitations, only the provincial amateur teams are recorded in this issue, with the junior and senior teams to be listed in the 1999 Manitoba Golf Journal.

Palahniuk's 16 is the top number for the amateur team, followed by **Edey** with 12, **Tachan** and **Homenuik** each with 11 and **Netterfield** and **Robertson** each with nine. **Ollie Hnydiuk** appeared on eight amateur teams, followed by **Lynda Lauder** on seven, while **Lindsay**, **Pam Falk** and **Cathy Burton** each played on six teams. **Bagley** and **Susan Thomson** each were on five amateur teams.

Tachan's 14 tops the senior list, followed by **Ford**, **Bagley** and **Netterfield** each with nine, **Judy Lang** with six and **Joy Knudson**, **Mary Snider** and **Fern Crook** each with five.

Among the juniors, **Brionie Brown** and **Alissa Lauder** each played on five teams, while four junior appearances were made by **Dorelle Mathews**, **Angela Daykins**, **Aileen Robertson**, **Diane Frederickson**, **Tannys Aspevig** and **Marian Lawrence**.

This year's listing includes all Manitoba women's amateur teams from 1947 to 1997 and also shows when the national event was played in Winnipeg and when Manitoba teams and individuals won honors. ●

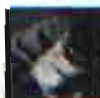

Other clubs with mandatory softspike rules are asked to notify the association.

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Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association Link provides more turf info

The Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association has joined forces with the Prairie Turfgrass Research Centre in Olds, Alberta, in a move designed to keep members on top of the latest information.

The PTRC is operated under the Alberta Turfgrass Research Foundation and officials of both bodies expect the move will make research information more accessible.

MGSA President **Rob Hamm** and past president **Rob Officer** opened discussions with the research centre in 1997 and the joining of forces was announced this spring. It came about because the Manitoba group had similar needs to those of the Albertans in turfgrass research.

The Manitoba members will receive the regular publications of the PTRC, will have free access to a turfgrass hotline and will receive a member rate for any site visitations to assist with problems.

Hamm, the head superintendent at the Carman Golf Club, is into his second year as president of the MGSA. He said the Manitoba members feel the association will be beneficial to members in both provinces.

Derek Holbrow of Charleswood has been elected vice-president for 1998 and other members of the board include past president **Officer**, who is teaching a course at Red River Community College; directors **Paul Henry** of Kenora, **Gord Robinson** of South Interlake, **Randy Loewen** of Cottonwood, **Gord Mackay** of Breezy Bend and **Ian Cairns**, commercial. **Bob Hamm** of Steinbach is the executive director.

Three changes in head superintendent positions have been made as the 1998 season gets under way. **Jody Macey** is the new superintendent at the Pinawa Golf Club. She was formerly an assistant at Falcon Lake. **David Andersen** has taken over as head assistant at La Verendrye Golf Club after serving as assistant at Cottonwood. **Dave Tkachuk**, formerly at La Verendrye is the new head superintendent at the Swan River Golf Club.

The Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association's major fund-raising event, the annual Turf Research Tournament, has been scheduled for August 14 at Teulon. The association also holds monthly meetings at various clubs during the season, with the May gathering slated for May 14 at Rat River and the June event to be held at Sandy Hook.

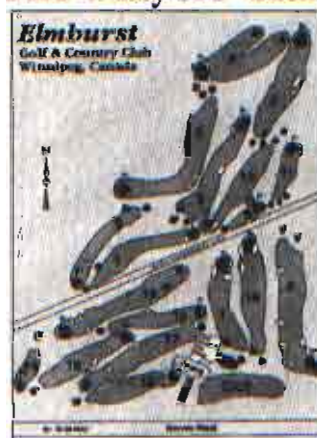

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The Manitoba Lung Association has launched its eighth season of fund-raising through its Golf Privilege Card. The 1998 card, priced at \$25, went on sale April 20 in Winnipeg and April 26 in Brandon and the numbers are limited to 600 in Winnipeg and 500 in Brandon.

The Lung Association has raised \$165,000 through the sale of the cards over the years and anticipate adding another \$20,000 this year.

The program began in the 1991 season in Winnipeg and the following year a similar program was launched in the Westman community. Some courses are involved in both.

The card generally provides one free round of golf with one paid round at the participating clubs or golf centers. A discount at the Nevada Bob's golf shop has been added this year to the Winnipeg Card.

The program allows an opportunity for the golf courses to work in partnership with the association in a charitable cause. Funds raised through the program support the asthma research and education programs and services in Manitoba.

Two of the original 1991 courses have been with the project from the start, the Beaches and Pinawa. Ten others have been involved continually since 1992. Nine of the original courses are still involved in the Westman project.

There are 29 golf clubs, practice facilities or golf shops listed for the 1998 Golf Privilege Card in Winnipeg and 24 on the list for the Westman card. ●



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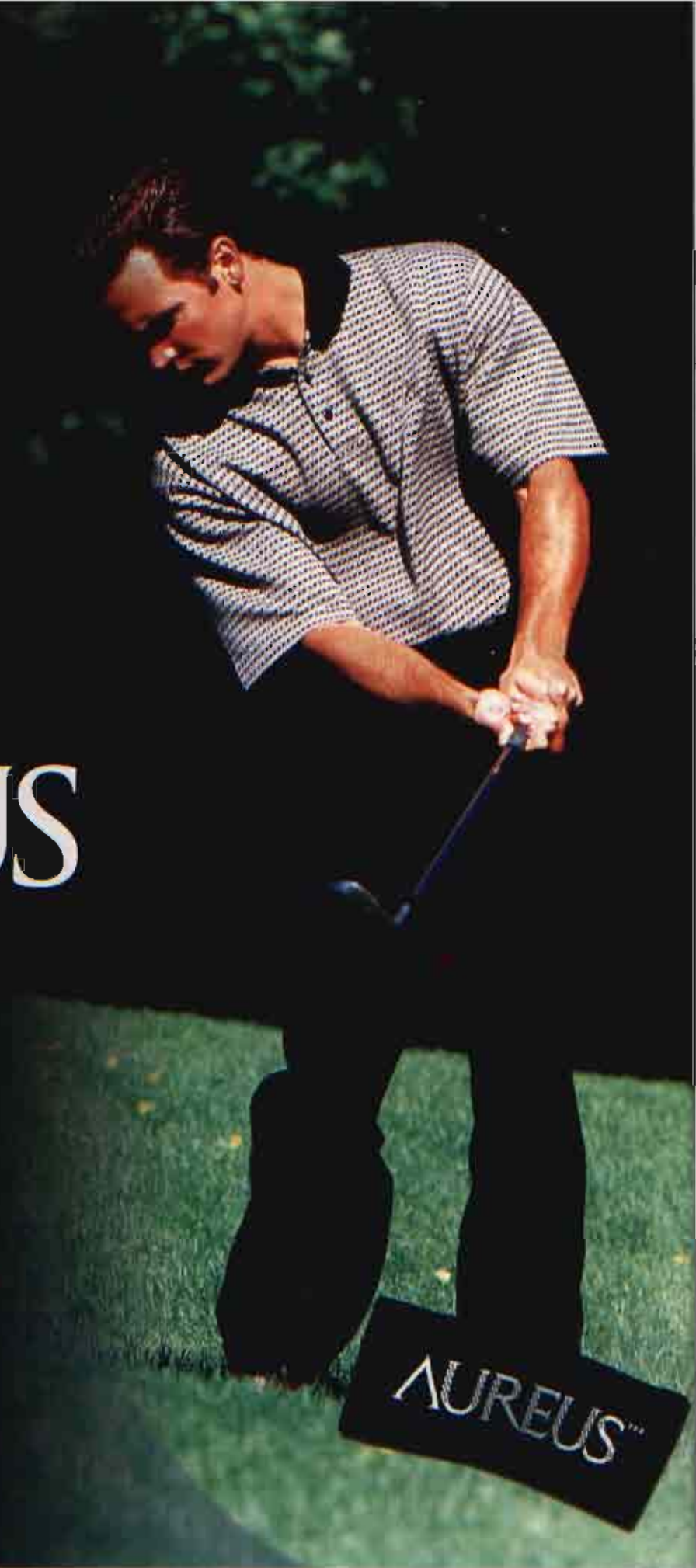
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
