Welcome to the newest edition in a 22-year line of annual publications of the Manitoba Golf Association, which first came on the scene in 1980 as the Manitoba Golf Annual. It became the Manitoba Golf Journal in 1989 and was under that title through last year.

This year it becomes *Golf Manitoba 2001*, but most of the traditions of the past 21 years have been retained. There has been a slight "tweaking" of some of the presentations, but the basic information on past champions, results of major events of the preceding season and photographic recognition of the province's top golfers remains.

Regular readers of this annual publication will notice a major restyling and regrouping of the annual Directory of Golf Courses. It is hoped the grouping by regions will make it easier to look for information on the golf clubs in a given area.

Through all the years, this annual magazine has been primarily an implement of the Manitoba Golf Association. The Manitoba Ladies Golf Association became officially involved in 1995 with a special section. While there has always been news about the Manitoba Division of the Canadian Professional Golfers Association and the Golf Superintendents of Manitoba, this year those organizations have become part of *Golf Manitoba 2001* with special sections devoted to their news.

It has been my personal pleasure to be involved with the MGA during most of the 22 years of this publication, serving as editor for the first nine years, watching developments from the outside from 1989 to 1994 as the publishing duties went to Craig Kelman and Associates, then returning as Editorial Consultant in 1995 when Canadian Publishers (now Transcontinental) became the publishers.

As the new publisher as well as editor, it has been my wish to present an attractive and informative package for the golfers of the province. Distribution will be through the clubs and courses which are members of the MGA and it is to be noted that only clubs in the MGA are included in the Directory listings.

We hope the new look meets with the approval of Manitoba golfers and we welcome your comments. There are some ideas to be implemented in future years and your suggestions may help in the final decisions.

Our best wishes go out to the golfers of the province and it is our hope that this publication will be of assistance in just about anything you want to know about the game in Manitoba. Have a good season and remember: KEEP 'EM IN THE FAIRWAYS!

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MGA EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The 2001 golf season is upon us and the MGA staff is looking forward to another exciting year of golf in Manitoba. Following are a variety of items I would like to draw to all golfers attention.

NON - CONFORMING CLUBS

There has been a great deal of media attention to the issue of non-conforming clubs (specifically drivers) over the past number of months. The RCGA follows the USGA policy regarding non-conforming clubs and accordingly, they are not permitted for use in Canada.

Specifically, they may not be used in MGA events and scores may not be used for handicap purposes when a non-conforming driver has been used. Visit the RCGA website for a complete list of non-conforming drivers.

HANDICAP

Handicap factors in Canada must be calculated in accordance with the RCGA formula. Accordingly, all handicap software must be RCGA certified.

All member clubs will be provided the option of

switching to a windows-based handicap software program at no charge, or continuing to use the InfoScore system at nominal cost.

TOURNAMENTS

In 2000, the basis of qualifying for the PING Amateur Tour was changed to make any player with a handicap factor of 5.0 or less eligible.

We are very pleased to have Dynamic Mutual Funds as a sponsor for our inaugural Mixed Team Championship in June. We think the modified two-person scramble format and flighting will make it an exciting event for golfers of all skill levels.

The Junior Tour proved to be very popular in 2000 and as a result the number of entries has been expanded from 100 to 135 participants.

Clubs will be receiving a very limited supply of entry forms this year. As such we encourage competitive golfers to download entry forms from our website (www.golfmanitoba.mb.ca).

The MGA staff wish all golfers fun in playing the game we all enjoy so much.

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WHAT'S NEW ON MANITOBA GOLF SCENE

Riverview changes in spotlight

The Riverview Golf and Country Club in Morris takes the spotlight for changes heading into the new golf season.

After suffering for many years through annual flooding of the pretty river holes and late starts to the season, a major course renovation was undertaken last fall, resulting in the construction of three completely new holes and two part holes to get away from the river. To top off the project, the clubhouse has been moved to higher ground along Highway 75.

That's not all that's new on the Manitoba golf scene heading into the 2001 season. Construction has been going on for a large clubhouse at the new Bridges Golf Course, which opened last season at Starbuck. Another construction project this spring saw renovations to the Dale Esopenko pro shop at the Assiniboine Golf Club.

Two nine-hole courses are being expanded to 18 holes this year. At the Netley Creek Golf and Country Club, the grand opening of the new nine is scheduled for Aug. 3, while the Neepawa Golf and Country Club is hoping to open its second nine in September.

They're not changing the layout, but later in the season the Gilbert Plains Country Club will get into the renovations act with a program to replace the tees and greens on the club's original nine holes.

The work at Morris has members anticipating an earlier-than-usual start for the 2001 season at the Riverview club, hoping to get going at the same time as most other Manitobans.

Course superintendent **Martin Bailey** said work entailed

construction of three completely new holes and parts of two others.

"We did away with the fifth, sixth and seventh holes as well as parts of the third, fourth and eighth holes," Martin said. "The old No. 3 is part of the new No. 8 dog-leg and the new third hole is a dog-leg right to the old fourth green."

The changes have increased the yardage at the Riverview course to about 3,100 yards. The old layout measured about 2,500 yards. Par will go up to 36 from 35.

Parts of the revamped Riverview layout were played before the season ended last fall. The clubhouse move was done in January with the new location at the highway raised about 14 feet above ground level.

Bailey remains course superintendent, but gave up his duties as club manager. That position is now held by to **Ron Jenke**.

Work was progressing well in the late winter and early spring on the new clubhouse at the Bridges course and head pro **Wayne Meek** was looking forward to a mid-May opening for the 10,000-square-foot structure. The pro shop was opened in April and the full clubhouse won't be far behind.

Assiniboine head pro **Dale Esopenko** missed out on most of the construction work in his Assiniboine pro shop. He was away with his golf holiday group in Texas and didn't have to dodge the workers. He returned to find the shop renovated with more display space and also increased office space for himself and wife Kim to handle the bookwork.



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Aug. 3 has been set as the big day at Netley Creek, where they will be celebrating the club's 10th anniversary along with the opening of the new back nine. A three-day carnival is scheduled to mark the big occasion.

Natural elevations ranging from 20 to 30 feet help to make the Netley Creek course a well-drained layout. Many elevated tees are featured, the large greens measure from 5,000 to 8,500 square feet, and there's an 80-foot wide creek that comes into play six times, not to mention several ponds and bunkers to keep it interesting.

The 18-hole layout measures more than 6,500 yards with a par of 73. All greens on the new nine were designed by Grant Golf to compliment the front nine. The two nines have their own separate look but go with the natural flow of the land.

At Neepawa, head pro **Shawn Woods** reports members are anxious to get onto their new nine holes, hopefully in the fall. The new holes will be integrated with the present nine-hole layout so both nines will get back to the clubhouse.

The Whitemud River will come into play on five holes. The yardage for the 18-hole layout will be about 6,700 yards from the back tees, 6,450 from the white markers. The present nine-hole course measures 6,336 from the back and 6,166 from the front over two trips.

The addition of a tent beside the clubhouse is another new feature at Neepawa. It will allow the club to book larger tournaments.

The Gilbert Plains club is marking its 35th anniversary this year and general manager **Jim Mayer** said the original nine won't be undergoing any drastic changes with the make-over this fall.

"We might tweak a few holes a little, maybe add a few sand traps, but mainly we're going for larger greens and tees," he said. The project actually got started last year when the club seeded 1-1/2 acres of bent grass for greens, an acre of blue grass for tees and four acres of blue grass for fairways.

By closing the front nine Aug. 8, there will be no interference with the sodding of the rebuilt tees and greens through the fall months. It is hoped to have everything ready to go next May.

Dynamic Mutual sponsors new mixed tournament

A new golf tournament is on the Manitoba Golf Association's calendar this summer and it is expected to attract a lot of interest from both male and female golfers. The Dynamic Mutual Funds Manitoba Mixed Championship is set for June 23-24 at the Pelican Beach Golf Club at Gimli.

Members of the MGA or MLGA are eligible for the competition, which will handle a maximum of 64 teams comprised of one male and one female competitor. Teams will be flighted into a maximum of four flights based on team handicap. Winners will be determined on gross scores.

The mixed championship will be played in a modified alternate-shot format with 18 holes of stroke play each day. The entry fee of \$53.50 per player (\$107 per team) includes the GST tax and a dinner for all contestants. Entries close at noon June 8.

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Glen Hnatiuk Named Manitoba's Male Athlete of Year

Glen Hnatiuk may not match the long term success of **George Knudson** or **Danny Halldorson** on the PGA tour, but on his present pace it won't be long before he has made more money than both of them combined.

Hnatiuk, 35, is following the sun on the premier golf tour like his Manitoba-born predecessors, and also like them, he now has been selected as a Manitoba male athlete of the year.

The Seikirk product earned the honour for 2000 in voting conducted by the Manitoba Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association, winning over **Ed Belfour**, the goaltender of the Dallas Stars, basketball's **Todd MacCulloch**, jockey **Todd Kabel**, and Manitoba Bison football star **Joey Mikawoz**, the other finalists.

Hnatiuk started on the road to golf prominence by winning the Manitoba amateur championship in 1986, and was named the Labatt Manitoba amateur golfer of the year in 1987.

He had a sparkling season in his second attempt to earn a place on the PGA tour, earning \$482,744 and was 101st on the money list in 2000. He tied for third in the B.C. Open, tied for sixth in the International, and teamed with Mike Weir in representing Canada in the EMC World Cup in Argentina in December.

Hnatiuk shared the 2000 spotlight with paralympic swimmer **Kirby Cote**, elected as Manitoba's female athlete of the year, and the Lucania soccer club, the provincial team of the year.

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CPGA Pro

Jazz head high on new shafts

Enthusiasm is something you come to expect when you get into a discussion about equipment with the president of a golf manufacturing firm. **Terry Hashimoto**, the head man of Jazz Golf, has plenty of enthusiasm when he starts to explain the concept of Bimatrix, a new technology in club shafts which combines steel and graphite.

He's proud of the fact that Jazz has obtained the rights to use the new shafts and he expects the development will make a major impact on the golf scene.

"We want to design products and build what the market wants," Hashimoto said. "I think this Bimatrix shaft will really take off in the market this year. We plan to make use of it on our trouble-shooter pro series and the high-end titanium drivers."

Hashimoto is looking for 2001 to be a very important year for Jazz Golf. "We've got a lot to prove to the golfers that Jazz is a brand on the move."

He said accessory sales were moving up and pointed out that the Jazz golf bags are growing in popularity, jumping from 150 three years ago to 1,000 last year and there are orders for about 6,000 this year. Hats and head covers are also popular accessory items in the Jazz line.

The Jazz company has undergone some upper management changes, with **Jeff Gidney** stepping down as chief executive officer but remaining as chairman of the board. **Bob Kennedy**, who has been on the board of directors, has taken a position as acting chief executive officer.

Another new development has been the arrival of **Sandra Post**, popular Canadian female professional star, as an endorsed player for Jazz. She was in Winnipeg early this year to conduct a clinic which was well attended by local female golfers.

Glen Hnatiuk, the Selkirk native playing on the PGA Tour, is also under the Jazz banner, using some of the Manitoba firm's clubs in his quest for the big money on the tour.

As for his own golf, Hashimoto anticipates he may find time to play in some local competitions this year, but he won't say how many. He just warned that his game is in good shape and he recently recorded a nifty 10-under 62 at Porta Vedra Merriott. That might indicate he's ready for some competition.

Golf travel takes planning

While the local golf season is just nicely getting underway, there are many Manitobans already thinking ahead to spending part of the winter or spring in warmer climes and extending the golf season.

Travel agents and several golf pros have golf vacation plans for short or long holiday trips and advise it's never too early to make plans.

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Juniors take Mundie honours

Manitoba's leading junior golfers proved they can more than hold their own in competition with some of their older opposition last season by taking top honours in the Mundie Putter League.

The Manitoba Golf Association's junior team finished fourth in the A division of the weekly competition, then went on a winning streak through the playoffs to claim the honours.

The junior team defeated Selkirk in the quarter-final round, got by Rossmere in the semi-finals, then captured the title with a win over Breezy Bend in the final.

MGA development co-ordinator **Garth Goodbrandson** and junior chairman **Dennis Langrell** praised the young team players for their efforts and are looking forward to continuing the competition with the club teams in the coming season.

Rossmere Golf and Country Club provided six of the 15 players who took part in matches for the MGA junior team last season. There were four players from Niakwa Country Club, two from Breezy Bend Country Club and three from rural Manitoba points.

The Rossmere participants included reigning Manitoba amateur champion **Kevin Kotyk** and reigning provincial junior champion **Peter More**, along with **Brad Kirton**, **Sean Matsalla**, **Steve Crampton** and **Chad Welechenko**.

Team players from Niakwa included **Liam Mulhail**, **Mike Keast**, **Brian Kornelson** and **Terry James**. Breezy Bend was

represented by **Ryan Rawluk** and **Jeff Horrocks**. The rural players were former provincial junior champion **Ryan Horn** of Dauphin, **Tyler Henderson** of Reston and **Chanse Robertson** of Brandon.

Hockey-golf camp into fourth year

Young athletes get a chance to learn skills in two sports at the same time in August by attending the **Bob Thomson Hockey/Golf camp** at the St. James Civic Centre and Assiniboine Golf Club.

In its fourth year, this popular camp takes place in four one-week sessions from July 30 to Aug. 24 and is tailored for boys and girls age 10 to 15 years.

A Level 5 certified coach, Thomson combines his experience and abilities with other elite level instructors for the hockey aspect of the camp. Assiniboine pro **Dale Esopenko** and his staff take care of the golfing component.

The week-long camps feature two age groups — 10-12 and 13-15. Morning hockey training consists each day of 90 minutes of on-ice instruction, drills and scrimmages, followed by 45 minutes of golf instruction and 45 minutes of dry-land training. The afternoon consists of nine holes of golf at Assiniboine.

A feature attraction on the Friday each week is a Lunch with the Legends, when well-known hockey stars and other sports personalities join the youngsters as a treat.

The camps can handle 50 boys and girls each week. To register or for further information contact Bob Thomson in the evening at 284-4589.

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The pro side of the argument has been consistent for many years. Clubs belonging to the MGA and RCGA have access to numerous services, such as agronomy advice and assistance and other aids in club operations; handicap and course rating service, which enables club members to maintain an official handicap and take part in official event, and many other benefits.

While it isn't an attraction to all clubs, membership in the MGA also provides access to some fund-raising activities, such as bingo nights.

There's another financial advantage not often mentioned, but important to many clubs — a reduced commission

service rate on Visa and Mastercard transactions for member clubs.

The con side of the ledger also has several points, the main one concerning the members of the non-affiliated clubs.

The RCGA has ruled that non-affiliated clubs will no longer be permitted to make use of the association's course-rating and slope/handicap services. This means members will not have official handicaps and won't be allowed to enter competitions.

It also means that clubs will not be allowed to make use of any reference to course and slope rating in any literature or score cards.

Most golf clubs in the province are MGA members, but there are some which have opted out. Clubs wishing more information on the benefits of membership may contact **Dave Morison**, Executive Director of the MGA.

Public Players Club an Option

Golfers who don't belong to private or semi-private clubs can still become members of the Manitoba Golf Association through the Public Players Club.

For a fee of \$20 (\$11 for juniors) golfers can become eligible for MGA services through several public courses.

A membership card will be issued and there is a requirement to designate a course on which a handicap will be maintained. Members will be eligible to take part in official MGA tournaments with updated handicap cards.

Eligible clubs for Public Players Club members included all city municipal courses as well as Tuxedo, Players and the Executive course in the Greater Winnipeg area, along with Grand Pines, Pelican Beach, Hecla, Quarry Oaks, Falcon Lake, Bridges and Wheat City.

Application forms are available from the MGA office at 200 Main Street or on the MGA website.

Goodbrandson was cited for his continuing work in the development of junior programs for the MGA and the organization and operation of clinics throughout the province.

Sherman was recognized for the operation of his well-stocked pro shop, with particular emphasis on the special merchandising in connection with the staging of the 2000 AT&T Canada Senior Open Championship on the Senior Tour at the St. Charles course.

The head pro and general manager of the Larter's at St. Andrews Golf and Country Club was elected president of the provincial branch for 2001, taking over from Southwood's **Tom Kinsman**, who completed a two-year term at the helm.

Ewert began his pro golf career in 1980 as an assistant to **Al Patterson** at the John Blumberg course, then spent eight years under **Jim Roy** at St. Boniface Golf Club before his first

head pro job in 1988 at the Carman Golf Club. He has been at Larter's since the course was opened in 1991.

The new Manitoba CPGA president has seen some changes in the golf business during his 21 years and stresses the importance of the CPGA to continue with its education programs to keep members abreast of the advancements.

"The job descriptions are changing in the golf business," Ewert said. "There are more positions coming up where club management is included and we have to prepare our young people coming into the business to lean more toward becoming pro-managers rather than straight golf pros."

He points out that the Manitoba situation is unique because there is only one main centre (Winnipeg) and many rural areas, while most other provinces have several major centres.

"The trend in the rural areas is more and more toward the pro-manager type of position and our Associate and Apprentice professionals have to prepare for that if they want to remain in the province," he added. "It's a big jump and we have to help them to prepare by providing good education programs. Our national organization is continuing to do a good job and we are in full support."

Ewert noted there is a shortage of good young apprentice pros just now and he hopes the provincial body can continue to encourage newcomers to come into the profession.

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Doerksen confident heading into second year as MLGA President

Carol Doerksen has some mixed feelings heading into the second year of her term as MLGA president.

"I'm pleased that I accomplished one of my goals in securing more provincial funding from the national association," she pointed out. "But I'm disappointed in the trend at some city golf clubs to resist our appeal to provide venues for our tournaments."

Doerksen vowed to lobby hard to change the former 60-40 split of affiliation fees in favor of the CLGA. As a member of the national finance committee she did exactly that, and won approval to adjust to a 50-50 division of the fees with the provinces.

As a result, the MLGA will receive an extra \$7,700 in 2001 to go into its programs. One direct benefit will be to provide extra funding to help four to six local players enter the CLGA national amateur tournament at Niakwa in August.

"That was an encouraging development," said Doerksen. "On the other hand, I wish more clubs would regard the allocation of their courses for MLGA events as an obligation, the way some of them do. I know the clubs make money on corporate and charity outings, but should there not be some kind of balance?"

The MLGA practically had to go begging this year to secure a venue for one of its majors, the City and District tournament. Thanks to **Michel Pilon** and **Jacques Lavack**, now operating the Lorette Golf Course, a site was obtained for the event that dates back to 1924. It will be reduced to 36 holes (June 27-28), with a limit of 48 entries on the nine-hole course.

MLGA executive director **Barb Leisle** also had to scramble to find a location for the alternate shot (foursome) tourney. It has been held in September for the last couple of seasons, but will be the lead-off event this season, in early May at Pine Ridge.

Two Winnipeg clubs, Southwood and Niakwa, are committed to the CLGA Junior (Aug. 6-9) and Amateur (Aug. 13-19), and those events are expected to provide the competitive highlights of the golf season.

New competitions featured

Peggy Wakeman and **Joan Lyons**, the teams and junior development directors, have initiated two new features that should be popular, an MLGA match play tournament and a female junior tour.

Sixteen players, 11 in the MLGA advanced development group and five others who made the leaderboard in last year's Manitoba women's amateur, will compete in match play spaced out over the summer at their own clubs. Championship and

consolation finals will be held in September. The pairings were made by draw, and it will be head-to-head with no handicaps involved.

Five tournaments will be on the Golf Manitoba-Wilson Golf Junior Tour, including the City and District at Lorette and the MTS Junior Classic (July 11-13) at South Interlake and St. Charles. Others will be the Tuxedo Junior Open (June 23-24), the Optimist Junior Open at Lartars (July 4-5), and the Portage Credit Union Junior Open (Aug. 14) in Portage.

The MLGA staged its Inaugural Northwestern Ontario junior/amateur/senior tournament with a favorable response in Dryden last season, and it will be moved further east (Aug. 20) to the Kenogamisis course in Geraldton this year.

After two years of a travelling caravan out to the districts to hold a series of spring meetings, the MLGA reverted to one session (April 25) at Sport Manitoba this term.

"We think a rotation of two years out, then a year of bringing all the delegates into Winnipeg is a workable process for us," said Doerksen. "Our main intention is to improve communication, and to try to deal with any problems that crop up. I hope we're succeeding."

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Lindsay fourth female to win Manitoba Golfer of Year honours

To earn some of the very special honours in sport, you may have to pay your dues, be persistent and wait for the timing to be right.

That was very much the case for **Garth Collings**, and then for **Jo-Ann Lindsay** before they won acclaim as the Labatt Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year the last two seasons.

Collings was a finalist five times before he received the award in 1999, and Lindsay had three nominations as a finalist before the premier honour in Manitoba golf came her way in 2000.

"I didn't think it was going to happen," said Jo-Ann. "Every year there are so many outstanding achievements by our golfers. To be singled out above all others

is beyond your expectations."

Lindsay, 59, earned the award for 2000 over Collings and **Ben Bandura**, the other finalists, with honourable mention going to **Ryan Horn**, **Peter More** and **Kevin Kotyk**.

Her 2000 season was a remarkable success story. She repeated her women's triple of 1997, winning the provincial Amateur, Senior and the City and District championships, the three Manitoba majors. Lindsay is the only golfer in Manitoba history to accomplish that feat.

She captured the City and District crown for a fifth time, with rounds of 75 at Morden and 78-78 at Breezy Bend to win by three strokes over **Brenda Parrott**.

The St. Charles shotmaker breezed to her sixth straight Senior title, and her eighth in the last nine seasons, winning by 23 strokes over **Pat Fusee**. The Amateur victory, however, came after a contentious three-way battle with **Jill Hardy** and **Christy Nolin**, and Lindsay needed a superb nine-wood approach shot to within three feet of the pin to beat Hardy on the first hole of a playoff at Rossmere.

Lindsay added to her credits by winning the State of Minnesota senior match play championship, and tied for second place

in the CLGA National Seniors in Prince Edward Island.

Collings had another impressive year. He was the runner-up in the Manitoba Amateur, won individual honours in the Manitoba Inter-club, was low Manitoban in the Canadian Amateur, Canadian Mid-Amateur and Canadian Club Champions event, and the only amateur to make the cut in the MTS Classic.

Bandura won the Manitoba Match Play championship, and the Hal Eidsvig trophy as low amateur in the Jazz Manitoba Open.

Lindsay is the fourth female recipient of the Labatt award since its inception in 1975. **Shauna Gechel** (Butters) won in 1981, **Gail Anderson** (Graham) in 1983, and **Aileen Robertson** was a co-winner with **Rob McMillan** in 1994.



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4 Manitobans honoured by CLGA

Manitoba has had no shortage of capable golf administrators over the years, willing volunteers who served their clubs and carried on to play key leadership or developmental roles on the governing bodies of women's golf in Manitoba or in Canada.

The Canadian Ladies Golf Association has a means of recognizing this form of dedication and commitment and four Manitobans were honoured last December as recipients of Distinguished Service Awards. The presentations were made to **Aihlin Walker**, **Peggy Colonello**, **Lorraine MacLeod**, and **Joyce Collier** at the CLGA annual meeting in Winnipeg.

The citation on the DSA award states an intention to recognize significant volunteer contributions to the promotion of amateur golf for women in Canada. The recipients are selected for their exceptional qualities of leadership, for tangible results through lengthy service, or their devotion to the game at the provincial or national level.

Walker advanced from the women's executive committee at Breezy Bend to the executive of the MLGA, on to the CLGA to serve as its president, national

course rating and handicap director and twice was the non-playing captain of the Canadian World Amateur team. She also has been ladies' captain and a member of the board of governors at St. Charles, and an organizing committee director of the Manitoba Open.

Colonello's service to golf has been saluted before. A lifelong member at Elmhurst, she received the Manitoba Sports Federation's outstanding volunteer in sport award in 1984, and she was inducted into the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame as a builder in 1994. She guided both the MLGA and the CLGA in the presidential office and has attended world and Commonwealth golf events around the globe.

MacLeod went up through women's executive ranks to the presidency at Southwood and followed a similar course with the MLGA. She introduced the MLGA district handicap reduction awards and the provision of district tournament trophies to be awarded throughout the association's jurisdiction.

A noted golf researcher, she produced a history of ladies' golf at the Winnipeg Canoe Club, which was included in **Alan Hackett's** book, *Manitoba Links*.

Collier has just completed a three-year term as National Director of Player Development for the CLGA. Starting at the Portage Golf Club 17 years ago, her labour of love with golf took her up through executive positions to the presidency of her club and the MLGA. She has served on the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund, the LPGA Girls Golf Club, the Canadian Golf Foundation and the Marlene Streit Awards Fund. In 1999, Collier was honoured as Sportsperson of the Year in Portage la Prairie.

Clearly, all four are ideal selections for a tribute of national magnitude, and Manitoba golfers should be proud to join in endorsing their outstanding contributions to their sport in this province.

June Bagley into Sports Hall of Fame

The women? **Marg Homenuik**, **Marj Edey** and **Merlene Netterfield**, of course, and **Jo-Ann Lindsay** if she ever stops playing and winning.

How about **June Bagley**? No doubt about it. And while we wait for the golf shrine to come about, the lady who learned the game from her professional father **Art Baker** at the Winnipeg Canoe Club received some general sport recognition last November.

Bagley was inducted into the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame as an athlete on a night when other outstanding stars **Freddy Ingaldson**, **Sandy Gibb** and **Trevor Porritt** were honoured by the sports community.

June was the first amateur golfer in Manitoba to win provincial titles in three divisions. She won the junior women's crown in 1948, the amateur in 1952, and added senior championships in

1979 and '81. Doyle, Netterfield, and Lindsay are the only others to achieve that distinction. Bagley also was an exceptional team player, going to the nationals on five Manitoba Amateur teams and nine in the Senior golf division. In each of the decades from the 1940s to the 90s, she was either a provincial champion or a Manitoba team player.

June has put something back into golf as an MLGA director in recent years, and still loves to play the game. Her golf swing is as smooth as ever, but not much of her talent has rubbed off on her biggest admirer. Her husband Ralph is the former golf writer of the Winnipeg Free Press, and the editor of this Manitoba Golf Association publication.

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New courses sprout up in turfgrass program

To mark its 25th year of operation, Fairview College in Alberta is launching four new one-year certificate programs.

Sportsfields/Parks Technician, Horticulture Technician, Precision Applicator Technician and Irrigation Technician programs are now accepting students for September.

"We're excited and happy to make this announcement because we've kept in tune with industry," says instructor Gerry Lettner. "We monitor all the positions advertised for instance, we talk to people in the industry and we know that industry is asking for these skills." Turfgrass Co-ordinator Dave Allan agrees the message from industry is clear.

The courses have been in development for the past couple of years and utilize portions of the curriculum from the two-year diploma program, Turfgrass Management.

"Our Turfgrass diploma program is still our flagship," says Allan. "It's recognized as a leader in Canada and we'll continue to offer it. But we need to expand and offer options and alternatives, according to what employers are asking for."

There's no shortage of employment opportunities for graduates of either the new one-year certificate programs or the two-year diploma program.

The affordability of a one-year program has a lot of appeal. For many students, being able to get out into the workforce earlier is a big plus. A student can take a one-year course, advance in experience in the workplace for a few years while earning a living, then have the choice of returning to take the second year

of Turfgrass and train for management.

Lettner adds that even those who have graduated from Fairview College's Turfgrass diploma program may find the new certificate courses useful in the future. "You can come back and update your skills and stay current."

A Sportsfields/Parks Technician is qualified to design, construct and maintain grassed recreation facilities such as soccer pitches and ball diamonds.

A Horticulture Technician can analyze a site and plan landscaping accordingly. Propagation and care of ornamental plants either indoors or outdoors forms a large part of the job.

A Precision Applicator Technician is skilled not only in fertilizer, pesticide and herbicide application, but in analyzing when to apply and how much.

An Irrigation Technician is qualified to design, install and maintain watering systems for all types of outdoor landscapes.

Lettner says the new certificate courses are just the beginning for the college's Turfgrass department. "There's lots that's being worked on. We're hoping to increase transferability options for our students, and for students in other institutions so you could take one year here at Fairview College and do your second year in the recreation facilities program at SAIT for instance."

"There are times when the club members may be a little put out by the work on a course," Mistelbacher said, "but in the long run, we have to worry about what's best for the course, not the members."

There was nothing sinister in that statement — simply a realistic viewpoint from one charged with the responsibility of providing good playing conditions throughout the season.

"We know the members will be happy in the long run as long as we can keep the inconveniences down to a minimum," he added.

Like his fellow superintendents (they really don't like to be called greenskeepers these days), Mistelbacher has had some of the members react negatively to the work being done and

there may have been some occasions when members have suggested they know more about it than the superintendent.

But, rest assured, the folks who look after your golf courses these days are well educated in their trade and they have to keep up with all the latest methods of course maintenance.

Darryl has been in the business since 1979, starting as a laborer at the Niakwa Country Club under the supervision of **Jim Barr**, who is still the Niakwa superintendent. He worked his way up to assistant with Barr in 1988 and 1989.

His first position as a head man came when he went to the Pinawa Golf Club in 1990 and was involved with the building of the new nine holes with architect **Dave Grant**. He then moved on to the head superintendent position at Elmhurst in 1993.

At Elmhurst, Mistelbacher has a staff of 14 course workers, six of them full-time from mid-March to the end of October and eight others on a part-time basis.

Like any superintendent, he has had his share of woes when Mother Nature may not be co-operative. He recalls the first year the MTS Classic was played at his course and he had two greens which

were suffering from drainage problems. It was hectic working to make them playable for the visiting Canadian Tour players.

"You can't treat all greens the same," he said. "Snow patterns differ in the open or among the trees and the weather in the spring and fall is always just a crap shoot. We have to be ready for just about everything."

He has the same attitude as he steps into the president position with the MGSA, stressing that ongoing education is the key to success for the organization, which takes in workers in park areas as well as golf courses, along with an active commercial element.

Newcomers are encouraged to learn new methods and the MGSA sponsors four annual \$500 scholarships, which are matched by Red River College for students starting courses.

Those who have been in the business for years also keep up to date by attending courses and taking part in regular meetings, which always feature some educational aspect.

MGSA program is designed to help the environment

Everyone knows there's a lot more to looking after a golf course than cutting grass and watering fairways and greens. Those in the business are finding they must pay strict attention to the environment as they go about their tasks.

Members of the Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association are well aware of that fact and the organization is a front-runner in efforts to protect the natural elements.

The MGSA launched a program in January, 1999, as part of an ongoing effort to help the industry improve its environmental performance.

Awards have been designed to encourage golf courses to maintain a standard of environmental management and officials believe the early success of the program is an indication the program will continue to prosper in Manitoba and has the potential to be utilized across the country.

The MGSA has identified five major building blocks in the Environmental Management System (EMS). They are:

1) develop an authority structure;

- 2) establish an environmental baseline;
- 3) write an environmental policy;
- 4) develop and implement an environmental plan; and
- 5) internal audit and annual review.

Golf clubs are encouraged to become involved with this program and the MGSA Recognition Program has been established to honour the individuals and clubs taking part.

A bronze certificate is to recognize an individual obtaining environmental training.

A silver award (plaque) is to recognize a golf course working toward an EMS.

A gold award (sculpture) is in recognition of a golf course which has completed an external audit and accreditation process for an EMS.

A platinum Award (nature print) is to recognize a golf course that has received the gold award and is certified in the Audubon Co-Operative Sanctuary Program.

Oh, why do they have to aerify the greens!

Golfers have been known to say unkind words about their course superintendents when they find their greens have been aerified. They blame those little holes on the green for ruining their day on the links.

But, think about it. Aerification is really just a short-term disruption to your golf game, but it has long-term benefits for the course. Without aerification, the greens would eventually die.

Like many things, the quality of a good putting green is more than skin deep. In fact, the condition of a green has a lot to do with what goes on below the surface. In order to keep grass growing at 3/16-inch, you have to have deep, healthy roots.

Good roots demand oxygen. In good soil, they get it from tiny pockets of air trapped between soil and sand particles. Over

time, the traffic from golfers' feet and mowing equipment tends to compact the soil beneath the putting green, particularly when the soil contains a lot of clay.

Aerification is the mechanical process that creates more air space in the soil and promotes deeper rooting, thus helping the grass plants stay healthy.

In most cases it's done by removing half-inch cores or plugs. The spaces are then filled with sand "topdressing" that helps the soil retain air space and makes it easier for roots to grow downward. It may be annoying to the golfer in the short term, but think of the long-term benefits and you can understand why aerification is a very necessary part of golf course maintenance.

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Follow golf cart rules for protection of course and personal safety

Golf carts are a convenience enjoyed by millions of players and a necessity for many golfers with disabilities. However, when they are driven improperly, they can cause serious damage to the course.

More important, unsafe operation can lead to accidents and injuries.

Most golfers who drive or ride in golf carts are aware they should be considerate of their fellow golfers and always remember to "drive friendly" on the course.

But, there's more to golf cart etiquette than showing consideration to others. There's the golf course to think about, too, and it's important that you avoid causing any damage.

Here are few general tips for golf cart use:

- ⇒ Never drive a golf cart through standing water in fairways or any turf areas that are obviously wet.
- ⇒ Never drive onto a green, collar or tee or any marked hazard.
- ⇒ Never drive into any area that has been recently seeded or sodded.
- ⇒ Spread wear-and-tear by avoiding compacted areas
- ⇒ Avoid abrupt stops or sharp turns that cause skidding
- ⇒ If golf carts are allowed in the fairway, follow the 90-degree rule. Stay on path until you are even with your ball, then

make a 90-degree turn onto the fairway and drive directly to your ball. After your shot, drive directly back to the path.

- ⇒ Watch for special signs or other markers that direct traffic.
- ⇒ Avoid driving over sprinkler heads and yardage markers.
- ⇒ Don't drive carts into out-of-play areas that may be environmentally sensitive (such as wildflower patches, native grass plantings and marshes).
- ⇒ Golfers with medically-certified disabilities may need access to areas not normally open to golf cart traffic. Their golf carts are generally marked with a flag to let others know they have special access.
- ⇒ Avoid pulling off the path near tees and greens.
- ⇒ Keep all four tires on the path wherever possible. Do not park with tires off the path.

The wear-and-tear of golf cart traffic can cause unsightly and expensive damage to the golf course. Tire ruts in soft and wet areas can take weeks to heal. Compaction caused by heavy traffic can also ruin the playing surface.

You can help prevent damage by following the course's standard golf cart policy and obeying temporary restrictions caused by weather, construction or other factors.

While the preceding rules are addressed mainly to the protection of the golf course, there are also general golf cart rules which should be observed for safety reasons:

- Golf carts should only be operated from the driver's side.
- Never driver with more than two occupants or allow riders on the back of the cart.
- Be sure your passenger is fully seated and check for obstructions before moving.
- Keep your entire body — particularly your feet — inside the cart when moving.
- Drive slowly through turns and drive straight and slow up and down slopes.
- Use extra care when operating a golf cart in reverse, or on hills, wet turf, loose surfaces or rough terrain.
- Remove the key when the golf cart is not in use.
- Do not operate a golf cart when impaired by alcohol or drugs.
- Golf carts do not provide protection from lightning — seek appropriate shelter if lightning is present.

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6 earn golf scholarships

Six young golfers were named in the fall as the 2000 recipients of awards from the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund Inc.

The \$1,000 scholarships were awarded to **Christopher Alto** of John Blumberg, **Rhonda Beatty** of Clear Lake, **Steven Bucko** of Larters at St. Andrews, **Jordan Krantz** of Eagle Landing (Dryden), **Joel Matthews** of Southwood and **Heather McMunn** of Dauphin. Beatty and Matthews were also on the list of scholarship award winners in 1999. The others are first-time recipients.

The 2000 awards bring the totals to \$65,000 in scholarships to 72 students since the inception of the fund in 1983. The scholarships are awarded to individuals who have participated in the Manitoba golf community and have demonstrated scholastic excellence.

Rudy Boivin, president of the Foundation, also announced the fund received \$7,000 from the RCGA last summer as 20 junior golfers worked with board members and friends as "Clean Team" at the AT&T Canadian Senior tour event at St. Charles Country Club. There was an additional \$1,635 in donations in memory of **Jim Semenchuk**, who was also a volunteer at the event.

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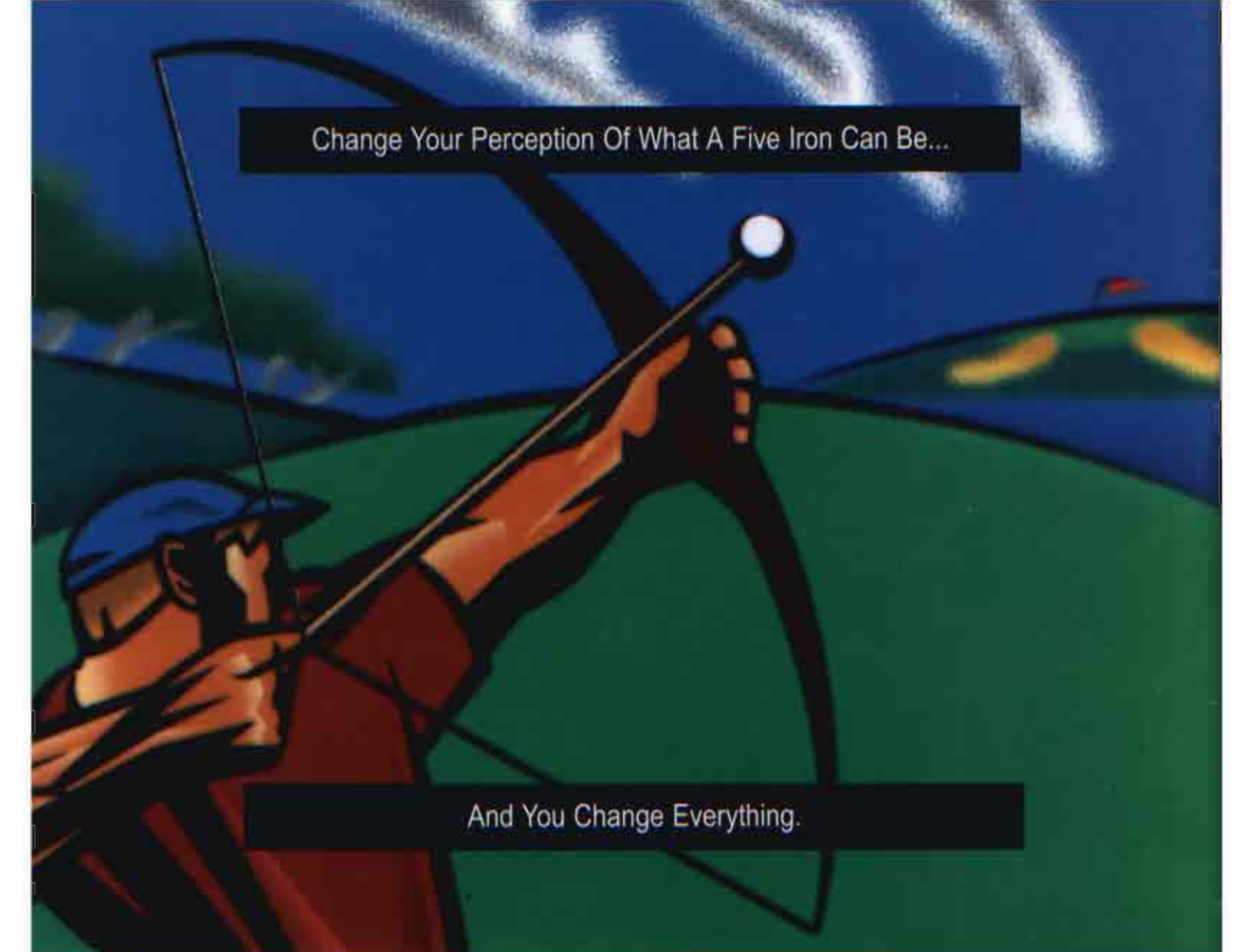
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
