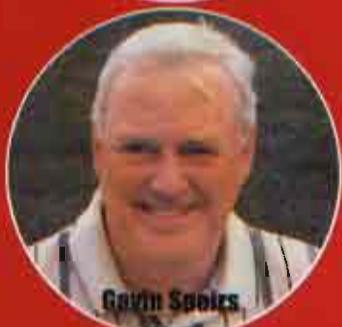
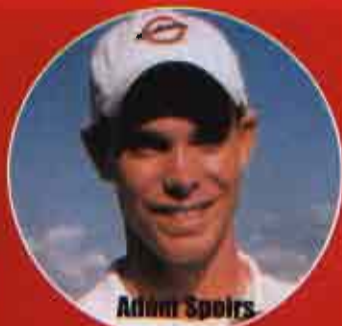
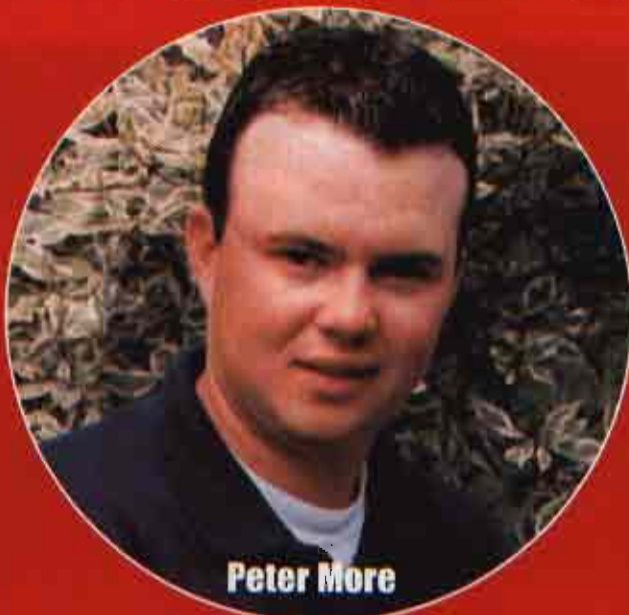

Merger on the line?

They're emphasizing it's not a "done deal" but there's every indication amalgamation of the Manitoba Golf Association and the Manitoba Ladies Golf Association is coming in the near future.

Check out the interviews with the two association presidents (MGA on page 5, MLGA on page 9) and you don't even have to read between the lines to learn that the two sides are on the same page. The proper first steps have been taken, a committee has been established to do the groundwork and you can almost bet there will be a proposal presented to the annual meetings of the two bodies in the fall.

The two groups are already working together on some projects and amalgamation could eliminate some duplication. Another big step was taken in April when **Dave Morison** was appointed executive director of the MLGA, along with his duties in the same position in the MGA, filling the vacancy after the resignation of **Barb Leisle** from the female group.

Members of both associations will have their chance to discuss things, but it would appear that amalgamation is the best thing that could happen to golf in Manitoba at this time. Not that it will be easy. There are some differences that must be ironed out.

For instance, the boundaries of the MLGA stretch past the Lakehead into Northwestern Ontario, while the MGA membership goes east only part-way to the Lakehead. Ontario officials may have the final word in settling that issue. There are some differences in the membership charges as well.

But, amalgamation is working fine with the golf groups in other provinces and the joining of male and female organizations has been well received in the curling fraternity. Here's to a long and blissful life together for the male and female golfers of Manitoba!

MEET THE NEW MANITOBA GOLF ASSOCIATION PRESIDENT

George McLeod looks to fill big shoes

When **George McLeod** took over the president's chair at the annual meeting of the Manitoba Golf Association last fall, nobody had to remind him of the importance of the position.

"I was totally honored by the process," the Brandon resident recalls. "To be only the fourth president in the MGA history to come from a club outside of Winnipeg means I have some very huge shoes to fill. I am totally in awe and I am humbled and honored to be named president of the MGA."

Like **Lezlie Parker**, his counterpart in the Manitoba Ladies Golf Association, McLeod sees the current study of amalgamation of the two groups as a major undertaking for this season. But, he also has a pair of other "pet projects" which he hopes to establish before his term of office runs out.

"My first goal is to come up with some system under which an MGA membership card can be looked upon as something of value to every golfer in the province," he said. "A lot of golfers have asked what they get for their membership dollars if they don't play in the MGA events?"

There are a number of benefits which can be listed, said McLeod, but he feels there is a need for some tangible reward.

"I'd like to see something that would mean something special to the grass

roots golfers, who play 90 per cent of their golf as their home course and may visit other courses eight or 10 times a year," he said. "Maybe there could be some sort of membership value for those players. Maybe something like a one-dollar discount off green fees at other courses for card-carrying members. This wouldn't cost the clubs much and they might gain more visitors.

"That might not be the answer, but I hope we can work toward some provision of this type to encourage golfers and clubs to take pride in membership in the Manitoba Golf Association."

McLeod's second major goal for his term is to see the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame

become established. The idea was brought forward during **Syd Cohan's** term in 1996, but became sidetracked over the past few seasons.

On the question of amalgamation, McLeod noted that while there had been some talk in the past there is an active movement toward that goal at this time. "Both sides seem to be feeling it is something we want to do and we're taking a serious look at amalgamation," he said.

A committee has been established, comprised of the president, president-elect and past president of each of the organizations. This group will hold meetings to get the views of the membership of both bodies.

"This certainly is not a done deal," McLeod said. "There are many questions to be answered and a lot of homework to be done before any proposal can be presented to the memberships, but we are talking and we are going to take a very serious look at the advantages of amalgamation."

Amalgamation of the male and female golf operations is already in place in Ontario, Saskatchewan and Alberta. Quebec is also looking into amalgamation.

In Manitoba, it is in the discussion stage and the committee will be looking for feedback from members before any package can be prepared for presentation to the two associations.

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MEET THE NEW MANITOBA LADIES GOLF ASSOCIATION PRESIDENT

Amalgamation may be in the cards

Lezlie Parker accepted the president's gavel of the Manitoba Ladies Golf Association from **Carol Doerksen** last October without the anticipation she may be the last to occupy the position.

"Amalgamation with the MGA was a prospect I expected would develop some time in the future," said Parker. "But as soon as **George McLeod** (MGA president) and I started to discuss mutual plans and concerns, we both realized it was something we should move on sooner rather than later."

Parker will guide the MLGA in its 80th anniversary year. The association was organized in 1922, and whether or not it will continue to exist in its present form beyond this season will depend on process and transition.

"We have a joint committee working on it, researching the methods used to bring together associations in other provinces, and recommendations will be presented to the MGA and MLGA boards," said Parker.

"The membership of both associations will vote on the final proposal, and all going well, the new governing body could be in place as early as 2003," she predicted.

Manitoba is following sister provinces Alberta, Saskatchewan and Ontario in linking their men's and women's golf associations and Quebec is on the same course. Over 70 per cent of Canadian golfers will be governed by "gender-neutral associations" when the moves are completed. Parker has no serious qualms about amalgamation. "We've had a good volunteer relationship with the MGA for some

time. Our course rating teams have worked together and running the Junior championships as a combined venture has been very successful," she pointed out.

Any fear of getting swallowed up? "Not in the least," said Parker. "I'm sure there will continue to be respective autonomy in operating our tournaments, but we'll co-operate as much as possible and try to eliminate most of the duplication."

Parker, 47, has been married to Andrew Fast for 26 years, and has her husband's strong support in tackling the responsibilities that lie ahead. She has only played the game of golf for about 12 years. She started at Tuxedo, and now is a member of the South Interlake club.

"It wasn't long before I became involved in MLGA activities," she reflected. "I asked if I could help, and I quickly got interested in the rules of the game. Then I was appointed assistant rules director to

Bev Harris, and my commitment progressed from there."

One of the MLGA procedures Parker would like to retain is the Spring Tour, a series of meetings held at various locations to replace the semi-annual two out of three years. Parker, vice president **Peggy Wakeman** and rules director **Cathy Macatavish** took the MLGA message to sessions with delegates in April this year at Dauphin, Atikokan, and the Assiniboine and Niakwa clubs in Winnipeg.

The women's association has changed its entry form for tournaments to a brochure style for this year, and two posters have been produced to identify MLGA events and club tournaments.

Other innovations are a Junior golf newsletter to be circulated three times annually, and more spacing between tee times which Parker is convinced will avoid delays and speed up tournament play.

On the national scene, the CLGA has made two new appointments. **Jeffrey Thompson** now is the Executive Director and **Michael Ramsden** joins the Oakville office team as Tournament and Program Co-ordinator.

Parker was impressed with both officials at the CLGA semi-annual board meeting in March. "They demonstrated a strong business approach to the operation, have produced a new logo, and will be updating the national web site (www.clga.org)."

And, like all new MLGA presidents in recent years, Parker would like to see the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame move off the drawing board. It was incorporated in 1997, and a selection committee appointed two years later. Since then? Presumably, what usually is termed "progress".

One interprovincial event on MLGA's 2002 calendar

After a season highlighted by two national championships held at Niakwa and Southwood, the women's golf scene in Manitoba will settle back into a normal routine of localized features in 2002.

"On the other hand, we will have one interprovincial event in the province. We'll be showcasing one of Manitoba's excellent rural golf courses at Gilbert Plains this year," said MLGA president **Lezlie Parker**. "The Western Canadian Amateur Championship will be held there from July 27-29."

Securing positions on three Manitoba teams also offers the incentive of travel to the Maritimes this season. The CLGA National Junior will be held Aug. 5-8 in Prince Edward Island, the National Amateur Aug. 12-16 in Wolfville, Nova Scotia, and the National Senior Aug. 26-29 at the renowned Riverside Country Club in Saint John, New Brunswick.

The local fixture card opens with the Alternate Shot (Foursome) at Pine Ridge on June 3, followed by the Mixed Team Championship event at Pelican Beach June 8-9.

"We launched the Mixed Team tournament with the MGA last year," said Parker. "It proved to be highly popular for a limited field. Hopefully, the interest it generated will produce more entries this term."

The City and District championship is next on the calendar, a 36-hole competition to be played July 4 and 5 at the Portage and South Interlake clubs. The soon-to-be-linked MGA and MLGA have co-operated in the operation of the Manitoba Junior Championships for the past three years, and that will continue July 10-12 at Selkirk and Pinawa.

"Unfortunately, the Junior will overlap with our provincial Amateur and Senior July 8-10 at Breezy Bend," revealed Parker. "Some of our leading juniors who could play in the Amateur won't be able to this year. We had to advance the Amateur and Senior one week to obtain the golf course."

One of the events with an overflow entry in 2001 was the net best ball Crocus, and that pattern should continue July 23 at

Carman. The next day, July 24, the Rural Amateur-Senior-Junior tourney is scheduled for Brandon's Glen Lea club. It had to be cancelled last year due to lack of interest, and the MLGA is beating the drums to promote more awareness this season.

That also holds true for the Northwestern Ontario Amateur-Senior-Junior Championship, slated Aug. 1 for the Little Falls Golf Club in Atikokan. Geography may have worked against it last year with a low level entry when it was held in Geraldton.

The Bronze provincials are scheduled Aug. 14 at Grand Pines, the Interclub A event Aug. 21 at Teulon and the Interclub B Aug. 22 at Glendale. The Club Championships Championship Sept. 7-8 once again will be a weekend feature at Hecla Island.

"Our competitive golfers also are involved in three Amateur Tour events to be held at rural courses this year," revealed Parker. "They're at Killarney June 22-23, at Gilbert Plains Aug. 17-18, and the season finale Sept. 14-15 is at Portage."

Barb Leisle leaves after 17 years

After 17 years of administrative guidance, **Barb Leisle** resigned her position as Executive Director of the MLGA at the end of March to accept a new opportunity at the University of Manitoba.

Leisle drew plaudits from president **Lezlie Parker**, who described her as "an excellent, highly efficient director, who gave the MLGA very loyal and dedicated service."

With amalgamation pending with the MGA, **Dave Morison** has been appointed as Executive Director, and a number of Leisle's basic duties have been allocated to administrative assistant **Carol Muzychka**.

The final office structure and staff responsibilities of the amalgamated associations will be determined in due course.

Junior golfer **Peter More** of Rossmere was in the spotlight as the 2001 Labatt Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year Award was presented at the Manitoba Golf Association's annual general meeting in October.

It marked the first time for a second-generation winner of the annual award. Peter's father **Terry More** captured the honours in 1978 and was a runner-up for the title in 1979.

More was grouped with **Bruce North** of Carman and **Adam Speirs** of St. Charles as the three finalists for the 2001 award following voting by a panel of judges.

Honourable mention went to others under consideration: 2000 Golfer of the Year **Jo-Ann Lindsay** of St. Charles; 1999 Golfer of the Year **Garth Collings** of Breezy Bend; 2001 provincial champions junior **Terry James** of Niakwa, senior **Gavin Speirs** of St. Charles (Adam's father), women's amateur **Jill Hardy** of Niakwa and rural senior **Michael Funke** of Carman.

More and Adam Speirs were both selected by the RCGA last season as members of a group of players named to represent Canada at various international events. They had been chosen to play Sept. 11 in Argentina, but that event was cancelled following the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks in New York and Washington.

More's resume for the 2001 season included winning the Manitoba Match Play Championship, runner-up in the Manitoba Junior, tied for low Manitoban at the Canadian Junior, member of the University of Manitoba golf team, winner of the Tuxedo junior tournament and runner-up at the Future Links tournament at Yorkton.

North reached the final of the Canadian Mid-Amateur championship before losing out in a close match to six-time champion **Graham Cooke** of Quebec. He earned a berth on the Mani-

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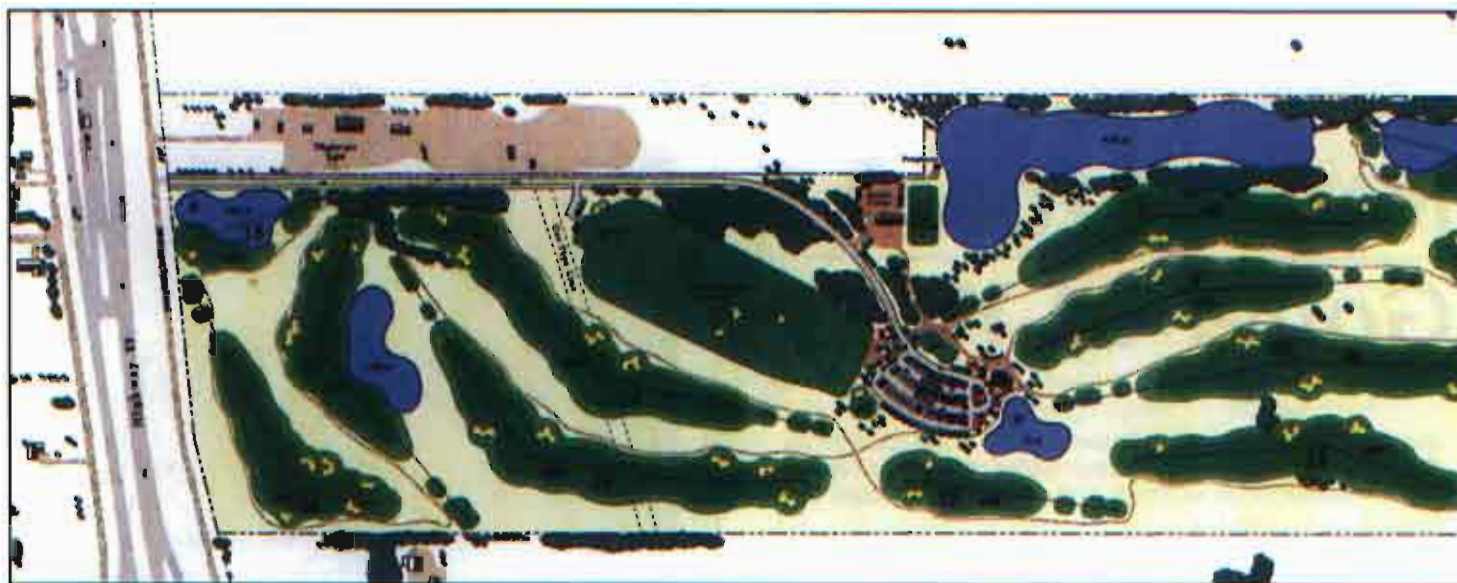
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Proposed layout of the new Meadows at East St. Paul golf course scheduled for opening in late 2003 or early 2004

What's new on Manitoba golf scene

There are new ownership groups at two well-known Manitoba golf courses. A new 18-hole course goes into its first full season in the southeast corner. Another new 18-hole course is on the drawing board in the Winnipeg area. While one city nine-hole course has closed, there's a second nine opening at one western Manitoba layout and a second nine into development at another.

These are some of the highlights for the "what's new" feature on the Manitoba golf scene this spring.

Throw in various programs of improvements at some of the Manitoba courses and it makes for a busy summer ahead for golfers who want to try to get a look at all that's new around the province.

Here's a quick trip to some of the Manitoba sites:

THE LINKS AT QUARRY OAKS

First stop on this journey is at the Links at Quarry Oaks in the Steinbach area. The 27-hole layout, which went into bankruptcy last year, has been bought by a group from Toronto. Head pro **Robin Henderson** and course superintendent **Wilf Peters** have been retained and the management position has been assumed by **Dave McDonald**, one of the four partners in the operation.

Al Scott, **Ken Sewell** and **J.J. Lyons** are the other partners, all from Ontario. Lyons has local ties in Winnipeg and Steinbach, but the Manitoba scene is new to the others. Golf course operation isn't new, however, as McDonald and Scott had past ties to well-known courses in the Toronto area.

McDonald is looking forward to the start of the season at Quarry Oaks and promises green fees for the popular layout will remain unchanged from last year — \$35 on weekdays, \$40 on weekends. All new power carts and new course maintenance equipment are among the features provided by the new ownership.

Another new feature is the provision of a new toll-free telephone service for booking tee times by calling 1-866-948-GOLF (4653).

DAUPHIN LAKE GOLF CLUB

The other new ownership group involves hockey personality **Ron Low**, a native of Foxwarren, MB, who heads up a group which bought the Dauphin Golf Club from a local group headed by pro **Stan Homeniuk**, who is retiring after 37 at Dauphin.

Low is president of the new ownership group, with **Pat Falloon**, another hockey notable, as vice-president. Another member of the group is **Gary Brandon**, who takes on the duties as head professional and manager of the club, which has been renamed the Dauphin Lake Golf Club to better indicate the course location. Brandon spent 17 years as head pro at Melfort, SK, prior to coming to Dauphin this year.

LAKE OF THE SANDHILLS

There's a new 18-hole facility known as Lake of the Sandhills Golf Course at Buffalo Point, MB. It's off Highway 12 on the shores of Lake of the Woods and just north of the U.S. border near Warroad, MN. The location is about five miles north of the United States border and about 15 miles from Warroad.

The picturesque layout actually opened at the end of July last year and there were good reactions. The course features four tees on each hole, providing a lengthy 6,862 yards from the black tees, down to 4,989 from the reds. Green fees have been set at \$25 on weekdays, \$28 on weekends for regular play, while seniors can play at a reduced rate of \$22 on weekdays or after 3 p.m. on weekends. Mark Smith is superintendent and also involved with the management of the operation.

THE MEADOWS AT EAST ST. PAUL

Back in the Winnipeg area, there will a lot of interest in the development of a new 18-hole course, which calls for start of construction this spring and a possible opening in the fall of 2003 or spring of 2004.

The management group from the Larters at St. Andrews course is behind the project, making use of 180 acres of vacant farmland off Highway 59 and just north of the Perimeter Highway in the Rural Municipality of East St. Paul.



Peter Ewert, director of golf operations at Larters, said the group is optimistic about providing a course on the northeast side of the city. The course is designed by **David Grant**, who was also the architect for the Grand Pines course. Ewert said the course will measure between 5,500 and 6,800 yards, depending on the tees played. It will be a public course and the planning is to make it available at greens around the \$25 level.

CHARLESWOOD GOLF CLUB

Winnipeg area golfers had to bid farewell to another golf course as the 2001 season came to a close. The nine-hole Charleswood Golf Club went out of existence as the season ended, with bulldozers working on the Charleswood bridge extension road before the snow arrived. It truly marked the end of an era for the long-time golf course on Haney Street, but the writing had been on the wall for several years and late efforts to stall off the city take-over of the property failed.

NEEPAWA GOLF & COUNTRY CLUB

At the Neepawa Golf and Country Club a full 18-hole layout will go into play this year, a little behind schedule. The addition to the nine-hole course was to open last fall, but it wasn't ready so the opening was rescheduled for this year. The new nine holes are integrated with the original nine so play will still start and finish as before at the clubhouse. Pro/manager **Shawn Woods** said it is planned to open the full layout to the members on June 16 and a grand opening will follow during the July long weekend.

MINNEDOSA COUNTRY CLUB

Another nine-hole addition is under way at Minnedosa, pro/manager **Chris**

Worley reported clearing work was started on four of the new holes last fall. The work will continue this spring with a hope of reaching the seeding stage in the fall. This will be a completely new nine to go along with the existing nine-hole course and the aim is to be ready for play in the fall of 2003 or the start of the 2004 season.

GILBERT PLAINS COUNTRY CLUB

At Gilbert Plains, manager **Jim Mayer** will be happy to show the improvements made on the original nine holes of the 18-hole course which has become a showpiece for the western part of the province. Every tee and every green on the old nine was replaced in a major reconstruction program through the late summer and fall of last year. They also added 16 sand bunkers in the program.

LAVERENDRYE GOLF

Back in the southern part of the province, the La Verendrye Golf Course at La Broquerie was another that came under new management a year ago and there have been some improvements made in the past year by the new owners.

Gilbert Dube, Roland Gauthier, Mitch Tetrault and Paul Gauthier are the four local owners who took over the course in the spring of 2001. They immediately transplanted more than 100 trees and built one new bunker on the course and refurbished the restaurant. During the summer months, they paved the parking lot and area around the clubhouse. In the fall, they continued their improvement program with the addition of another 120 trees and the building of four bunkers.

RAT RIVER GOLF

Things are happening around the Rat River Golf Course at St. Pierre-Jolys. It's an ongoing upgrading program scheduled for completion in the 2004-2005 season to coincide with the club's 25th anniversary. The Rat River course opened in 1981 as a nine-hole layout and Phase One of the upgrade program was completed in 1994 with the opening of a second nine. In the past year, the club's dikes on the Rat River have been raised above the flood levels experienced in 1950 and 1997.

Architect **David Grant** of Grant Golf is involved with the improvements which will include expansion of the overall length from the present 5,950 yards to about 6,700 yards. Also included in the major plan is construction of a new year-round 6,000-square-foot clubhouse with a maple sugar shack theme. Investment memberships and corporate packages are being promoted as part of the program.

OTHER CHANGES

There have been more programs of improvements and plans for other changes at several other locations, such as:

Bridges Golf Course has completed its first full season of operation but isn't resting on its laurels. Course superintendent **Tony Fehergyhazi** and his crew have been working at clearing underbrush along the fairways and also have cleared some of the trees from corners of some of the dogleg holes, providing easier angles on the curves.

Miami Golf and Country Club was another course that went into operation a year ago and has been undergoing gentle improvements through its first year. The Miami members are hoping to greet golfers from other areas to pay a visit this summer.

At the **Kenora Golf and Country Club**, there are plans to start renovations on the clubhouse this season and also a hope to make some changes on the golf course later in the season.

A name change is on the books for the course which opened two years ago as **The Executive Course** at the Southside Golf Centre. This 18-hole layout is now known as the **Southside Golf Course**.



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New Palmer course for Grand Forks

In addition to the new courses and changes around the province, Manitoba golfers will also have a new 18-hole layout at Grand Forks to visit this year.

King's Walk, an Arnold Palmer Signature Course, is located on Columbia Road one mile south of the Columbia Mall in the North Dakota city that is a regular visiting spot for Manitobans. It's an undertaking of the Grand Forks Park District to bring a "world class" facility to the region following the flood of 1997.

The Arnold Palmer design features the natural prairie and views of the Red River Valley. The layout stretches out to more than 7,300 yards from the back tees or can be less than 5,400 from the most forward tees. There are four or five tees on every hole. There are four par-three holes and four par-five holes on the par 36-36-72 course.

A 5,300-square-foot clubhouse overlooks the finishing greens and across a nine-acre lake, with the 16th hole and pine-topped hill in the distance. Dining room, bar and meeting rooms will be featured along with a modern pro shop under the direction of pro **Dan Tannahill**.

As a special attraction for Manitoba visitors, King's Walk is inviting Canadian golfers to play any Monday during the summer with green fees at par for Canadian cash. Regular green fee for the course will be \$45 (US), with a twilight fee of \$24.

Stan Homeniuk packs it in After 37 years at Dauphin

Stan Homeniuk has retired from active service at the Dauphin Golf Club, but he'll still be seeing a lot of the golf course where he served as head professional for the past 37 years.

Homeniuk and the Dauphin group he headed as owners of the course for the past 13 years sold the property this year to a group headed by Ron Low, but he intends to play a lot of golf around the familiar layout in his retirement years.

Gary Brandon, part of the group which has purchased the club, has taken over the head pro and managerial duties at the club. He spent 17 years as head pro at Melfort Golf and Country Club in Saskatchewan. The new group has renamed the course as the Dauphin Lake Golf Club to better reflect the location of the course, east of the town of Dauphin and on the shores of Dauphin Lake.



Stan Homeniuk

Homeniuk, 62, has been in the golf pro business since 1961, serving with Joe Tachan at Elmhurst in Winnipeg before moving to Dauphin in 1964.

Golf competition remains a main interest for Homeniuk and he promises he will be taking part in as many tournaments as he can on the Manitoba scene this summer. He has enjoyed some success in those competitive forays, too. As an amateur, playing

out of his home town of Yorkton, he played on a Saskatchewan Willingdon Cup team and reached the eights in the Canadian Amateur Championship.

As a pro, Homeniuk won the Manitoba PGA championship twice, finished third in a Manitoba Open at Elmhurst, won Opens in Saskatchewan, Alberta, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. He led his Dauphin team to victory in the first Crown Life Western Canada pro-am team championship in 1979.

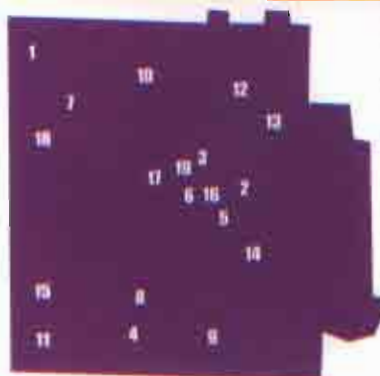

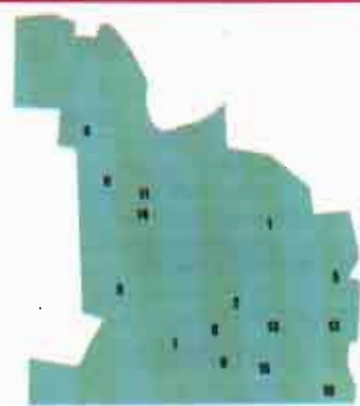

Greenspace Management Program offers employment opportunities

Do you enjoy the beauty of a well landscaped yard or park? How about playing golf on a well maintained golf course?

Would you like to see an improvement in the way athletic fields are maintained? What about the therapeutic aspects of a greenhouse environment or the serenity of an outdoor plant nursery?

Is it time to take your passion for gardening, landscaping, yard care or a general concern for the environment to a level where you can make a difference?

Then, maybe the Greenspace Management Program at Red River College is for you! Bet, you didn't know training of this nature was available in Winnipeg.

The purpose of the program is to develop the knowledge and skills required to construct and manage greenspace areas such as golf courses, parks, athletic fields, cemeteries, residential and commercial landscape construction and management, and greenhouse and nursery operations.

Greenspace Management is a 30-month diploma program with an entry date in September. The focus of the program is turfgrass management, design and construction of greenspace and recreational areas, equipment maintenance and operation, pesticide application, irrigation system management, horticulture, arboriculture, computer applications, office management and strategic planning.

Greenspace Management is a co-operative education program, which integrates two five-month paid terms of employment with five terms of academic theory. Red River College offers co-operative education as part of its education strategy to enhance students' career training opportunities.

A Greenspace Management Technician should have an inquiring mind, mechanical aptitude and the ability to analyze problems. Good grades are required in courses of a technical nature, such as mathematics and one of the following: chemistry, physics or biology. You should have a special appreciation of the outdoors and its many opportunities to promote physical and psychological well-being throughout the year.



Students may receive credit for prior learning/training acquired through life or work experience.

After successfully completing Term 7, students will graduate with a two-day St. John's Ambulance Certificate and a Manitoba Pesticide Applicator's License. They will also attend the Prairie East Horticultural Trade Show, the Prairie Turfgrass Conference and the Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association's annual two-day seminar as well as many other half-day and one-day field trips.

Upon completion, students will receive a Diploma in Greenspace Management from Red River College. Graduates will find employment in parks, golf courses, athletic fields, cemeteries and in the sales and supply of greenspace products.

The program also puts students in a favourable position to successfully complete certification testing offered through the Canadian Nursery and Landscape Trades Association. The program is also recognized by the Canadian Golf Superintendents Association.

We currently have a 100-per-cent employment placement record. In five years we have had students working in various areas of Manitoba and in four

other provinces. This a growth industry that is seeking knowledgeable and skilled workers.

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MEET NEW PRESIDENT OF COURSE SUPERINTENDENTS

Mark Jordan sees busy year facing environmental issues

Environmental issues continue to play a major role in the lives of those involved with the operation of golf courses and **Mark Jordan** intends to keep the emphasis there during his term as president of the Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association.

Jordan took over the reigns as the MGSA president in November and looks forward to a busy season of association duties along with his regular duties as superintendent at the Bel Acres Golf and Country Club. He succeeds **Darryl Mistelbacher** of Elmhurst.

The new president is proud that the association takes a leading role in the protection of the environment and feels it is important as leaders in the industry to get the message out that the golf superintendents take their responsibilities seriously.

"Most people don't realize that homeowners use pesticides and chemicals on their lawns far more than we do on the golf courses and parks," he said. "Half of our ongoing education is involved with environmental issues. We have to renew our pesticide applicators license every five years and suppliers have to see our license before we can buy the products. Homeowners can pick up products from the shelves and may not have the training we are required to have."

Jordan points out the association members try to curtail the use of chemicals where possible and there have been studies on the affect to nearby residential properties, which concluded that properly

applied pesticides do not pose any danger to the environment.

The MGSA president has been on the Manitoba scene since 1996, serving under **Jim Barr** at Niakwa prior to taking on the head superintendent duties at Bel Acres in 2000. Originally from the Ottawa area, he graduated from a turfgrass program at Guelph before moving west in 1978. He worked at Radium Hot Springs in B.C., then moved to Calgary where he was at the Shawnee course for five years. Jordan then worked on construction and operation of the downtown Fox Hollow course before moving to Manitoba.

He believes course superintendents must retain a good relationship with club members and

is happy to explain things when members are curious about some aspects of the operation. He also feels club members can be very helpful in telling course workers about any problems they might encounter regarding maintenance.

The MGSA will continue to operate this year with a schedule of monthly meetings which feature a speaker or seminar, followed by a golf outing and dinner meeting at various courses during the season. Emphasis is placed on the educational aspect of these meetings, with the golf providing an opportunity for social contact with the other members.

Dave Turner of Falcon Lake is vice-president of the MGSA this year and is responsible for the Prairie Turfgrass Conference in November as well as the association's newsletter and website. As past president, Mistelbacher is also involved with the Prairie Turfgrass Conference and with public relations. Other board members and their duties include: **Tony Feheregyhazi** of Bridges, environment and scholarships; **Cory Froehlich** of Beausejour, newsletter, website and education; **Greg Mitchell** of Northernair, competitions, long-range planning and environment; **Mike Gierok** of Rossmere, sick and visiting and newsletter; and **Todd Thompson** of Even Spray Chemicals, social and course selection.



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Golf and the environment

One of the hottest topics of discussion at the 2002 Canadian Golf Superintendents Association annual convention in Quebec City was the decision by some municipal governments (Halifax, NS and Hudson PQ) to ban the use of pesticides on municipal land.

Currently, this affects only municipal land, including golf courses, but could escalate to include private land and private or non-municipal golf courses as well.

The Supreme Court of Canada ruled in 2001 that municipal governments have the right to impose these bans as they like. Previously, this power was under the jurisdiction of the provincial governments.

A roundtable discussion in Quebec put the focus on the golf industry's nationwide strategy on pesticides. Representatives from all provinces, as well as other interested golf parties (RCGA and NGCOA), made presentations as to what was happening in their respective regions.

Ontario, Quebec and British Columbia are the key areas of concern at the present time. Most other provinces are not currently seeking pesticide bans, but this could change quickly if we don't begin to address the issue now and take the necessary compliance steps to ensure pesticides are used responsibly.

All who participated in the discussion agreed a nationwide strategy should be developed to educate the public and government officials on the benefits of responsible pesticide use. The basic message that needs to be conveyed in that pesticide use – as a last resort in an integrated pest management (I.P.M.) program – is a responsible procedure to con-

trol weeds, insects and diseases on golf courses, parks and lawns while posing no measurable risk to the environment.

The panel also suggested the golf industry should find as many allies as it can to help in this fight. This could be the landscape industry, provincial governments, the agricultural community, golf course owners and professionals and, of course, the golfers of Canada.

Golf courses provide thousands of jobs for Canadians and contribute millions of dollars in taxes to all levels of government. Men and women employed in the maintenance of golf courses are the most highly-trained and most highly-regulated professionals in the industry and all care very deeply for the environment.

The MGSA has taken a greater environmental leadership role in the last few years with help of a \$40,000 grant from Environment Canada. This grant has enabled golf course superintendents to re-

duce the use of pesticides, inventory wildlife on our golf courses, improve wildlife habitats and educate members on environmental issues.

More than 30 golf courses in Manitoba have undergone environmental assessments, while other courses have improved their fuel storage facilities or implemented Integrated Pest Management (I.P.M.) programs.

Plans are under way on the development of an MGSA website, which will serve as an excellent source of information on environmental and stewardship issues in the golfing industry and actively communicate the many positive initiatives being undertaken by golf courses across the province to be good stewards.

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Feheregyhazi named 'Super' of the year

Tony Feheregyhazi did his first work on a golf course simply as a fill-in summer job, not realizing it could become a full-time career.

Nineteen years later, as superintendent at the Bridges Golf Course at Starbuck, he has earned the respect of his peers and has been honored as the Manitoba Golf Superintendent of the Year for 2001.

Feheregyhazi was recognized for his work on the Bridges Golf Course at Starbuck, where he holds down the position of course superintendent and also was involved with the construction of the course.



The Superintendent of the Year award is not given out every year by the Golf Superintendents of Manitoba, so Feheregyhazi has good reason to take pride in being honored. The last winner of the award was **Parker Sutherland**, who was honored in 1998 for his work in restoring the Selkirk Golf and Country Club after it had been flooded.

Feheregyhazi was singled out for his work on the construction of the Bridges course as well as his continuing service as the superintendent. In fact, the construction work is still going on with some alterations on the 18-hole layout, which was opened for play late in the 2000 season.

His course career began as a summer job working at Niakwa Country Club under superintendent **Jim Barr**. He got interested in some course construction projects and worked his way up the ladder to serve as the assistant superintendent at Niakwa for five years. During that period he also attended Fairview College and graduated from that institution in 1995.

Feheregyhazi went to Falcon Lake as the course superintendent in 1995 and served there through the 1998 season before moving to his present position at Bridges, where he now has a staff of 11 permanent (seasonal) employees and two part-timers during the summer months.

The Bridges course covers a large area, about 220 acres, and features water on 14 of the 18 holes and more than 50 sand bunkers to maintain, using John Deere and E-Z-GO equipment.

In addition to regular course maintenance, the staff is continuing with course development, clearing out some of the underbrush

areas and reducing the angles on some of the dog-leg holes on the course.

"There's something to learn just about every day on a golf course," Feheregyhazi says. "Experience really is a good teacher."

MOVING AROUND

There have been some employment movements among members of the Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association this year.

Derek Holbrow, a former MGSA president, has left the business following the closing of the Charleswood Golf Club, where he had served as superintendent. He is attending school in Ontario.

Curtis Ramsden, a Red River College graduate, moved up last year to take on head superintendent duties at LaVerendrye. He had also worked at the Charleswood course prior to last year.

Other moves this year include: **Dave Tkachuk** moves to Wildewood from Swan River, **Mike Buchanan** goes to Gilbert Plains from Saskatchewan, **Aaron Goertzen** goes to Pinawa from Rosetown, SK, and **Scott Ramsay** moves to Shilo from Pinawa.

Michael Greenwood, a new student member, has taken on duties at the Delahunt club at Treherne.

One new commercial member was also added to the roster – **Terry Debaets** of John Deere.



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Junior development in good hands

Heading into his fifth season as Development Co-Ordinator for the Manitoba Golf Association, **Garth Goodbrandson** is justifiably proud and satisfied that golf in this province is moving in the right direction.

He points to the growing number of good competitive young players taking part in the tournaments and the development of a golf program at the University of Manitoba as positive signs.

The MGA was the first provincial association to establish a position for a development co-ordinator in 1998. Saskatchewan now has a co-ordinator, British Columbia is getting started on a similar program and the idea is being looked at in New Brunswick.

Goodbrandson was recognized for his development work in 1999 when he was named national junior golf leader by the Royal Canadian Golf Association. That same award was bestowed on **Brock Balog** for the 2001 season, giving Manitoba the honour two times in three years.

The success of the MGA Junior team in the Mundie Putter League for the past three seasons has been a source of pride for everyone connected to the development of young golfers in Manitoba. The juniors lost in the Mundie Putter final in 1999, then went to win the title in 2000 and again in 2001.

Sixteen junior players are on the list to take part in the Mundie Putter League, which features teams of adult amateur golfers from most of the Winnipeg area clubs. Eight of the players are age 16 and under and everyone is guaranteed a minimum of

two games. This gives the young players the experience of competition against older players.

Goodbrandson teams up with **Derek Ingram** of Golf Central to coach the University of Manitoba men's and women's golf teams. Competing with college teams south the line, the men's team claimed two tournament victories last season – at the Bemidji State Open and at the Crookston/Morris State Classic. In women's play, Manitoba's **Jill Hardy** set a course record with a 71 at Wildflower in the Concordia women's invitational event.

"We have the past four Manitoba junior golf champions playing on our University men's team," Goodbrandson boasted. **Terry James, Peter More, Ryan Horn** and **Steven Bucko** are all playing, along with players like **Jared Ladobruk** and **Lewis Allen**. We've had some good ones move on, too. **Todd Slatnik** has graduated and **Kevin Kotyk** has moved to Kent State with a scholarship. **Jill Hardy** and **Kristin Homeniuk** are among the leaders on the women's team."

Goodbrandson has high praise for the funding help received from the Manitoba Optimist Junior Golf Championship for the university program and to assist with the operation of the Wilson Junior Tour, which began two years ago.

The junior tour this year will feature 22 rounds of golf, up from the 18 played last season. There were 14 rounds in the first year. There were 135 players involved in the Wilson Junior Tour last season.

One of the feature tournaments on that tour is the Optimist Junior Open tournament, which this year is expanding to a two-course event to be played July 3-4 at Larters at St. Andrews Golf and Country Club and Rossmere Country Club. This will allow officials to accommodate about 200 golfers for the event, up from the 140 players handled last season at Larters only.

Goodbrandson is happy with improvements in the quality as well as quantity of participation in junior competitions in Manitoba.

"We're producing more good young players with our ongoing development programs," he said. "There used to be six to eight outstanding juniors in a tournament, but there's a lot more depth now and there may be 25 or 30 with the potential to earn a place on a junior team."

As for quality, he points out that the Manitoba junior team was the winner of the annual Manitoba/Minnesota matches last season and this event has always featured close competition between the two teams.

He said many clubs have developed good junior programs and the professionals are encouraging increased activity for the youngsters. He had particular praise for the work being done at Tuxedo and Netley Creek but stressed all clubs are offering some instruction and the Manitoba Golf Association does more than any of the other provincial organizations to get young people attracted to the game.

Goodbrandson's junior clinics continue to be a feature on the Manitoba development scene. About 15 to 20 clinics will be held this year, weather permitting. They will start in May and carry on through June and into July, mainly at locations where there are no club professionals. Where there are pros, junior programs are already going.

Junior camps will also continue to be held at Quarry Oaks aimed at golfers aged 12 to 18. It is hoped to have five camps this year, each with about 20 participants.

College qualifier at Bridges

The success of junior development in this province and the University of Manitoba program has also caught the attention of the Royal Canadian Golf Association, making such an impression the national body is assisting Manitoba to host the qualifying event for Canada's team in the World University Golf championship.

That event will be held May 21-23 at the Bridges Golf Club, which also serves as the home course for the U of M team. It will be the only qualifying event in Canada and will attract top post-secondary students from across the country.

Goodbrandson is also hoping to develop a team championship in addition to the individual trials.

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Optimist Junior event goes to two courses

The Manitoba Optimist Junior Open Golf Championship is growing and officials anticipate upwards of 200 players will be involved in the 2002 event.

The two-day tournament attracted 140 boys and girls last year at Larters at St. Andrews Golf and Country Club, reaching a limit as far as participation goes at a single site. The solution is to expand the event over two golf courses so Rossmere Country Club has been added this year.

With the two courses, more young golfers can be involved and the participants will get the added value of playing over two layouts in the two-day competition to be held July 3 and 4.

The event is for golfers from all parts of the province and winners are declared in three categories – 12 and 13 years, 14 and 15 years and 16 and 17 years.

The winners in the 16-17 division win the right to represent Manitoba at the prestigious International Optimist championship in Florida, while six players will qualify to play in the Canadian Optimist Junior Golf National Championships in Ontario.

The 2001 representatives to the International event were **Stewart Bannatyne**

and **Tanis Hastmann**. Carrying Manitoba colors at the national event were **Nick Alderton** in the 12-13 division; **Owen Nodrick**, **Crystal Nagle**, **Scott Markham** and **Ashlen Christie** in the 14-15 group; and **Liam Mulhall** in the 16-18 group.

Moe Orlowski is chairman of the Manitoba Optimist Junior Golf Championship Committee, with **Rick Sobey** and **Jim Parisian** in charge of fund development, **Don Green** and **Doug Page** in charge of promotions and public relations, **Serge Houle** as secretary and **Darren Neufeld** as treasurer. **Peter Ewert**, head pro and general manager of the Larters course, is the tournament chairman.

The committee is a major contributor to, and supporter of, the new golf program at the University of Manitoba and proceeds* from the 2002 tournament are earmarked to go to help underwrite the costs of establishing this program.

The junior golf championships are a part of hundreds of youth programs endorsed and supported by the Optimists as part of the international slogan – "friends of youth". The local committee can provide information for those interested in sponsorship of the event.

Six scholarships awarded in 2001

Six \$1,000 scholarships were awarded to young Manitoba golfers in 2001, bringing the total to 78 since the inception of the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund Inc.

The registered charity was established in 1983 to provide scholarships for young golfers in Manitoba for the advancement of their education. The first scholarships were awarded in 1986 and the modest amounts have grown over the years.

From the initial capital of \$5,000, the fund has grown to a current balance of \$106,000 and scholarships are mainly provided through interest earned.

Growth of the fund has been provided through the Manitoba Golf Association, Manitoba Ladies Golf Association, various golf clubs and other organizations and individuals. Tax-deductible receipts can be provided for individual contributors. Donations received in the past year came from Niakwa, St. Charles, Southwood and Elmhurst golf clubs, from the ladies sec-

tions at Dauphin and Clear Lake golf clubs, from the Portage junior golf club, from the Grey Owl golf tournament at Clear Lake and from John and Phyllis Matthews, whose two children were recipients of scholarships in the past.

The 2001 scholarship awards went to **Neil Erickson** of Selkirk, in commerce at University of Manitoba; **Jill Hardy** of Niakwa, in science at University of Manitoba; **Tyler Kearns** of Breezy Bend, in environmental design at University of Manitoba; **Peter More** of Rossmere, in arts at University of Manitoba; **Jordan Krantz** of Eagles Landing, in science at University of Texas; and **Heather McMunn** of Dauphin, in science at University of North Carolina.

Rudy Boivin is chairman of the board of directors of the fund. Other board members are **Lezlie Parker**, **Carol Doerksen**, **Bob Forcand**, **Bob Goodwin**, **Jim Scolan** and **Dave Morison**.

MANITOBA CPGA PRO OF THE YEAR

Niakwa's Scott Dickson chalks up a triple win

The 2001 golf season will be well remembered by **Scott Dickson**, the amicable head pro at Niakwa Country Club. He emerged as a triple winner as the Manitoba Division of the Canadian Professional Golfers Association handed out its awards for the year.

Dickson was chosen by his fellow members as the Manitoba Pro of the Year for 2001 in recognition of his talents around the pro shop. He was also a winner for his talents on the golf course. He won his second straight E-Z-GO Manitoba CPGA championship and he led the way in the season-long Coca-Cola Player of the Year points standings.

Dickson, 34, was recognized for his service to the Niakwa club since his arrival in the 2000 season. He increased lesson attendance by 250 per cent and revenues by 320 per cent over the two seasons; he implemented a revised handicapping of the holes at Niakwa; he hired, trained and implemented a new pace-of-play policy; and he was involved with a revision of the club's dress code.

Originally from Victoria, he became a professional there in 1987. He gained much of his professional experience during sev-

eral years of service in Quebec under head pro **Bob Hogarth** at the Royal Montreal club.

"I love teaching and I always want teaching to be a big part of my professional life," Dickson said. "But, the responsibility

of being a head pro cuts into some of the teaching time. It's certainly a challenge and I rely on my staff a lot to allow me some time for both teaching and playing."

His staff at Niakwa this season includes associate pro **Wade Nybakken** and apprentice pros **Ryan Sommerfeld** and **Jason Katcher**.

As far as his playing ability, Dickson said he is content to "let my clubs do the talking" and they certainly do. He is generally in the top five at most competitions and has an impressive record behind him.

He chalked up 12 pro victories while a member of the British Columbia CPGA from 1988-91 and eight pro victories while a member of the Quebec CPGA. Dickson represented Quebec in the Canadian Assistants championship in 1995, 1997, 1998 and 1999. He won the Quebec Assistant Order of Merit championship in 1992 and 1996 and was Quebec Assistant Player of the Year in 1998.

In addition to his success on the Manitoba pro circuit last season, he finished 16th in the 2001 CPGA Club Pro Championships. He looks forward to the Manitoba season and also is excited because he has earned an exemption to play in the Buy.Com Canadian stop for the CPGA Championship this season.

Peter Ewert continues as pro president

Peter Ewert, head pro and general manager of the Larters at St. Andrews Golf and Country Club, is serving his second season as president of the Manitoba Division of the Canadian Golf Professionals Association. He succeeds **Tom Kinsman** of Southwood Golf and Country Club, who remains a member of the board of directors.

Brock Balog has expressed a desire to bring golf into as many junior lives as possible and that desire has led to three awards during the 2001 golf season.

The head pro and manager of the Tuxedo Golf Club was honoured by the Manitoba Division of the CPGA as the Teacher of the Year and also Junior Leader of the Year. Then it was topped off with the announcement that Balog was also winner of the National Junior Leader of the Year by the CPGA. He'll receive that award at the Canadian PGA Championship in Richmond Hill, ON, in June.

It also marks the second time in three seasons the national award has gone to a Manitoban. **Garth Goodbrandson**, the Manitoba Golf Association's development co-ordinator was the 1999 winner.

Balog, who also serves as executive director on the Manitoba CPGA, was recognized nationally for contributions to the development of junior golf through leadership, inspiration and promotion of the game.

"My philosophy has always been to expose as many children to the game as possible, no matter what their skill level may be," Balog said. "As golf professionals, it's our job to develop young talent while parents should be nurturing and encouraging."

On the Manitoba scene, Balog's junior leadership qualities were recognized for co-ordinating and conducting one-week junior camps for girls and boys under 16 and for a Future Links Introduction program at Tuxedo. There were 200 children involved in seven junior camps in 2001. Fourteen camps have been featured during the past four years. The Future Links program involved 240 children this year. It also was operated over the previous three years.

He also ran a junior golf league with 50 children involved during

the summer months, participated in the MGA Junior Tour by holding a two-day event at Tuxedo, was co-ordinator to the St. James-Assiniboia School Division golf program and assisted in organizing a golf league for the division.

His teacher of the year award recognizes his wide range of instruction programs at Tuxedo which include individual sessions and series, friends program, adult clinics, Sunday evening seminars, junior league, junior camps and equipment evaluation clinics. He also initiated the Tuxedo Golf Academy winter golf instruction program in 1991, providing facilities from January through March each year.

Balog, 34, began his professional golf career in 1986 as an assistant under **Chick Duncan** at Niakwa Country Club and also with **John Irwin** at that club in 1991. He moved to Tuxedo in 1992 as assistant under **John Isaac** and remained assistant there under **Michel Pilon** in 1997-98. He was appointed head pro at Tuxedo in 1999.

Halldorson into Hall of Fame

Manitoba native **Dan Halldorson** has been named to the Canadian Golf Hall of Fame and will be honored at an induction ceremony later this year.

Halldorson, who now lives in Cambridge, Ill, grew up in the Winnipeg and Brandon areas. He has been an outstanding professional player and has earned a fine reputation for his competitive ability over the years. He also had his 50th birthday on April 2 and hopes to get a chance to play on the Senior PGA Tour this year.

In international competition, Halldorson was twice on teams that brought World Cup victories to Canada – in 1980 with **Jim Neilford** and in 1985 with **Dave Barr**.

Playing out of Brandon, Halldorson won the Manitoba junior championship in 1970, then turned to pro ranks in 1971 and joined the Canadian Tour in 1973. He joined the PGA Tour in 1975.

On the local scene, he won the Manitoba PGA championship in 1971 and he was a four-time winner of the Manitoba Open championship, in 1977, 1978, 1983 and 1984. He also won Open championships in Saskatchewan in 1977 and Quebec in 1980 and was the Canadian PGA champion in 1986. In 1981 and 1983 he was named Canadian CPGA player of the year and in 1983 he won the Canadian Tour Order of Merit.

His PGA career included victories in the Pensacola Open in 1980, the Colorado Open in 1982 and the Deposit Guaranty Classic in 1986.

Also being inducted into the Canadian Golf Hall of Fame this year is **Clinton E. (Robbie) Robinson**, noted golf course architect.

Halldorson joins former Winnipegger **George Knudson**, who was inducted in 1986. Knudson was also a former Winnipeg junior champion, who went on to win a total of eight PGA tournaments during his career.

Top Class A marks for Rob Bell

The 2002 report on local professional golfers on the move features one new head professional coming into Manitoba and two associate pros attaining their Class A ratings – one of them topping the list in the Canadian Professional Golfers Association test.

Gary Brandon is the newcomer to the province, moving from Melfort, SK, to take over duties as the new head pro at the Dauphin Beach Golf Club after the retirement of **Stan Homeniuk**, who served there for 37 years. Homeniuk goes to retired status with the Manitoba Division of the CPGA. Brandon spent 17 years at Melfort and played on Saskatchewan teams in the Titleist Cup matches with Manitoba pros in the past.

Rob Bell of Glendale and **Wayne Nybakken** of Niakwa are the two associate pros who attained their Class A status in the 2001 test. Bell captured the Tex Noble Award with a final mark of 94.1 per cent, the highest mark in a field of 87 who took the exam. Average mark was 77.95 per cent.

"It was a wonderful surprise," exclaimed the 25-year-old Bell, who serves as an associated pro at the Glendale Country Club under head pro **Jim Steep**. Bell has been a member of the CPGA since 1996 but has actually worked at Glendale for 10 years, starting as a club cleaner.

The prestigious award remembers Tex Noble, a former education director of the CPGA who was instrumental in the development and training of young golf professionals. Bell was presented with the award at the CPGA annual meeting held in March in Winnipeg. He also received a monetary bonus from Simmonds Insurance.

Bell, who has degrees in Phys Ed and Education from the University of Manitoba, encourages young golfers to get an education if possible. He hopes to get more involved in the junior development side of the golf business and wants to get into the schools to teach.

Workum top merchandiser

Pine Ridge Golf Club's head professional **Gord Workum** has been named the 2001 Merchandiser of the Year by the Manitoba Division of the CPGA.

Professionalism, enthusiasm and cleanliness are the key words in the merchandising philosophy which Workum instills in his staff.

"Nothing speaks louder than a shop that is clean and organized," he says. "This means all clothing neatly folded, shelves dusted and items organized so the shop will have a flow to it. This is a daily and continuous job that is never-ending from the start of the season."

The Pine Ridge shop serves a membership of 539 and many guests. Total rounds of golf played at the course last season were more than 33,000.

Apprentice professionals changing their address this year include: **Adam Boge**, to St. Boniface from Niakwa; **Darren Hayden**, to Southwood from St. Charles; and **Dan Klindtworth**, to Pine Ridge from Rossmere.

The Manitoba Division of the CPGA also welcomed 12 new apprentice professionals into the fold this season, six going to clubs in Winnipeg and six to rural positions.

Back in 1998, eight privately-owned Manitoba golf course owners got together to form a local association. That group has now grown to a membership of 27 in the Manitoba chapter of the National Golf Course Owners Association of Canada.

The national organization, which is affiliated with the NGCOA of the United States, came into being in 1993 as a not-for-profit trade association with 15 Ottawa area golf courses. The goal is to provide business support for the members, to form one united voice for the golf industry and to create "an effective networking environment for golf course operators."

The Manitobans joined the national group in 1999. Today, the national organization boasts a membership of 910, an increase of 157 from the previous year.

Originally designed as an organization for privately owned golf courses, the organization now includes private, semi-private, member-owned and government courses as well as corporate memberships. On the national scene, there are 733 privately owned courses, 124 member-owned or government courses and 49 corporate members. The Manitoba chap-

ter membership of 27 includes 21 public courses, three semi-private clubs, two private clubs and one parent company.

Real Cure of Rat River Golf is the president of the Manitoba chapter and also the Manitoba representative on the national board of directors. Vice-president is **Randy Loewen** of Cottonwood, with **Dave Dawes** of Beaches as secretary and **Bruce Dalman** of Netley Creek as treasurer. The executive members are **Pat Doyle** of Sandy Hook, **Bonnie Dalman** of Netley Creek and **Gary Curtis** of Kingswood. **Glen Bosecke** is regional director of the national association for Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta. He is based in Alberta.

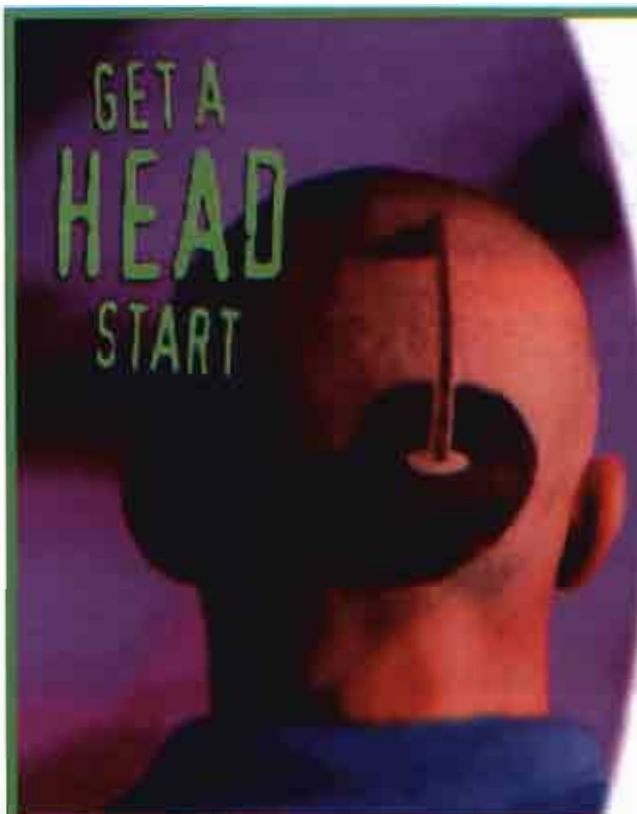

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The Players Course**

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A busy year for JAZZ

It has been an eventful year for Jazz Golf Equipment and company president **Terry Hashimoto**.

Since last fall the Manitoba golf club manufacturing firm has moved into new quarters in the west end of Winnipeg, there's a new chief executive officer and a new vice-president of finance and Jazz clubs have been featured twice in recent issues of the prestigious *Golf Digest* magazine.

Add to all that the construction of what Hashimoto claims to be the "largest driving range in the land" which is scheduled to be in operation in late May or early June.

The new head office and distribution center for Jazz Golf is located at 1866 King Edward Street. The company formerly occupied space on the third floor at 70 Arthur Street in downtown Winnipeg. It provides a one-level assembly plant and warehouse with ample parking and easy access to the shipping doors.

"The size is about the same as we had before, but the ceiling height allows us to stack our stock higher and almost doubles our capacity," Hashimoto explained during a tour of the new facilities. "We still have about 23,000 square feet, but we've also doubled our shipping capacity at this location."

The move was made last fall, with the staff of 30 all pitching in. There has been no change in the size of the staff.

Ron Diduch is the new chief executive officer of the company, taking on his duties in October. Former CEO **Jeff Gidney** remains as chairman of the board of directors with **Jim Osborne** as executive committee director. The new vice-president of finance is **Gestur Kristjansson**.

"Our sales continue to grow and we're producing more golf clubs than any other Canadian company," Hashimoto reports. "The deal we were making last year with Accuform didn't come about because they didn't meet the conditions. But, we're producing more than Wilson or TNT or Cosmo."

The Jazz clubs also getting to be known in the United States, thanks to *Golf Digest*, which featured the Jazz clubs in its new products review in January, then again featured a Jazz driver in a story about head sizes of the newer clubs in the March issue.

There are plans to launch more marketing into the U.S. soon.

The Jazz Trouble Shooter System is attracting attention and more pro shops and golf stores are being trained to use the fitting system. Hashimoto has also collaborated with **Al Resinger**, a master professional, on a book directed at consumers to provide information on "How to Fit and Be Fitted Perfectly." The book will be in shops this summer.

Meanwhile, construction is well under way on Hashimoto's latest project, a training center and club test facility.

Champions Nest is the name of the operation located at 400 Caron Road, just west of the West Perimeter Highway between Roblin Boulevard and Wilkes Avenue.

It's more than a golf driving range, according to Hashimoto, though that will be a major part of the operation. There will also be volleyball courts, skating, a biathlon track, jogging facilities and open fire pits.

"The property covers 154 acres and the driving range areas are 340 yards in depth and 1,000 yards wide," an enthusiastic Hashimoto said. "There will be room for about 200 stations and you will be able to hit in both directions (north or south) with another 200 stations. We're also looking into building a golf course there, probably with three or six holes to start and possibly get up to nine holes. I'm convinced in the future more people will be wanting to play less numbers of holes because they haven't got the time for 18 holes."

A clubhouse has been constructed and work is continuing on preparing the site for this season. As soon as the weather is suitable to lay sod for the tees, it will move ahead and Hashimoto is aiming at late May or early June for the opening of his Champions Nest facility.



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
