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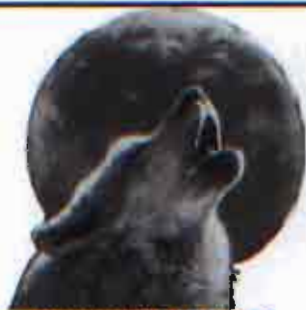
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FROM THE *Editor's Chair* WITH

We're the *Journal* again

We've put the "*Journal*" back in the title in this 24th annual edition of the official magazine of golf administration in Manitoba.

That phrase is used because, until this year, this has been the official annual publication of the Manitoba Golf Association. That association no longer exists since the amalgamation with the Manitoba Ladies' Golf Association to become Golf Manitoba.

And, since Golf Manitoba is now the official name of the administrative body, it was also necessary to make an alteration in the publication name, which has been known as *Golf Manitoba* in the past two years. We've added "Journal" to the official title, which is only fitting since most Manitoba golfers and officials continued to refer to it as "the Journal" anyway.

It was back in 1980 when the first annual publication was issued by the MGA. It was then known as the *Manitoba Golf Annual*. It became the *Manitoba Golf Journal* in 1989 and retained that title through two publishing firms until we took over the publishing duties along with editorial responsibilities with the 2001 edition. Now, it's official. We are known as *Golf Manitoba Journal*.

There's no change in the basic function of this magazine. We're still the official annual publication of Golf Manitoba and also represent the professional golfers and the superintendents. In short, *Golf Manitoba Journal* seeks to be THE annual review for all of golf in Manitoba. We will continue to salute the winners of the previous season, stay in touch with the activities in all golf organizations in the province and provide schedules of major golf events for amateur men and women and for the professional players.

While the amalgamation of the men's and women's organizations has captured the main interest, we also make note of a few alterations in the makeup of this publication. There is no longer a separation of male and female golf activities. Pictures of the men's and women's winners from 2002 are grouped together. There has been a change in the presentation of the annual Golf Course Directory, color-coded to clearly indicate the courses in the various areas of Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario.

A new feature this year is the inclusion of a section devoted to the many golf courses in the northern half of Minnesota which are anxious to welcome Canadian visitors. It's not that we don't have a wealth of fine courses on our own side of the border, but it may give you some ideas of places to go for a golfing holiday. And, if you do follow up on some of the travel ideas, please do us one little favor. Tell them you heard about them through the *Golf Manitoba Journal*.

Amalgamation

A new route for amateur golf in Manitoba

Effective April 1, 2003, the Manitoba Golf Association (MGA) and Manitoba Ladies' Golf Association (MLGA) amalgamated to form Golf Manitoba.

History

In 1996, funding for golf from Sport Manitoba was limited to one golf association, rather than funding both the MGA and MLGA as separate organizations. As a result, the two associations started sharing office space and delivering a limited number of programs on a co-operative basis.

In early 2002, the two associations began exploring the feasibility of becoming the fourth province in Canada to amalgamate. A joint committee was struck and the due diligence began. Very quickly, the committee came to the conclusion that there would be administrative efficiencies, financial savings and improved program delivery with an amalgamated organization.

A resolution to amalgamate was presented to the MGA and MLGA annual meetings in October, both of which passed unanimously.

Transition

The board of Golf Manitoba is comprised of 10 men and four women, based on the proportionate number of men and women members. For 2003, it was decided to maintain the very effective system of club, zone and district representation of the predecessor organizations.

These representatives provide the link to our member clubs and ultimately to our 20,000 individual members.

The membership dues structure of 2002 was frozen for 2003 as it was felt that approval for the amalgamation came too late in the fall to effect change for 2003.

A committee is exploring options for the 2004 dues. Possibilities include a blended fee, which is the same for men and women. Another option is to have the provincial dues the same, but reflect the difference in dues collected for the national organizations.

Changes for 2003

Much of the programming delivery will remain unchanged for 2003. However, there will be some notable changes in our development programs and tournaments.

A new website which we hope will be more user friendly and informative went live at the beginning of April.

Our development camp program for juniors and adults has been expanded as set out on the website.

Changes to tournaments have been made on the basis of making them appealing to a broader base of members.

The board and staff of Golf Manitoba wish all golfers a successful and enjoyable 2003 golf season.



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AMALGAMATION brings no basic changes in operations for member clubs

The amalgamation of the former Manitoba Golf Association and the Manitoba Ladies' Golf Association into one body under the name Golf Manitoba has brought about several changes in the operation, but many items remain basically unchanged. Membership in Golf Manitoba also provides membership in the CLGA and RCGA. The national governing bodies determine different categories of membership.

In general, the definitions of and requirements for membership are the same for each organization. However, there are technical differences between the CLGA and RCGA and as such, interested parties should contact Golf Manitoba with specific enquiries.

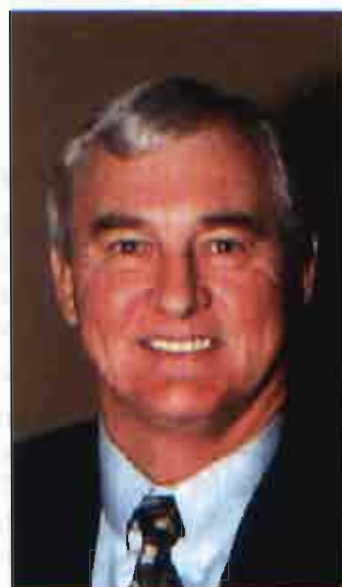
There are three basic categories for membership in Golf Manitoba. A **Member Club** is described as a Private or Semi-Private Golf Club with real estate. A **Players Club** is described as a club without real estate. A **Member Facility** is described as a public golf facility without members.

A Member Club is formed by members who pay annual dues at a private or semi-private golf course to support club operating expenses with the intent of those members playing regularly on that course. Each individual member must pay to the club annual dues required by Golf Manitoba and the RCGA/CLGA. By reason of its membership, the club undertakes to remit these dues promptly to Golf Manitoba. The provincial association and the RCGA/CLGA then will issue membership/handicap cards to the golf club. A golf club not remitting the dues for each individual member of that club will have its membership suspended.

A Players Club is comprised of an organized group of 10 or more golfers in a close geographical region which meets the definition of an RCGA/CLGA golf club, and will play together regularly at one golf course or a variety of golf courses and do not have to be based at one golf course. Such a club does not own, lease, manage, operate or control a golf course. It must establish the appropriate committees and otherwise meet all criteria set out for member clubs. Each individual member must pay to the club annual dues required by Golf Manitoba and the RCGA/CLGA. By reason of its membership, the club undertakes to remit these dues promptly to Golf Manitoba. The provincial association and the RCGA/CLGA then will issue membership/handicap cards to the golf club. A golf club not remitting the dues for each individual member of that club will have its membership suspended.

A Member Facility may have one or more Players Clubs operating on its premises, but the facility itself must become a member of Golf Manitoba in order to avail itself of the various programs and services of the provincial golf association. A facility membership does not permit the distribution of RCGA/CLGA membership/handicap cards by the owners or operators of such a facility.

As an amalgamated entity, Golf Manitoba cannot permit private and semi-private clubs to select male only or female only membership. It is the policy that clubs must collect and remit dues for ALL members.

WHAT'S NEW ON THE MANITOBA GOLF SCENE

CHANGES MADE OR COMING AT SEVERAL LOCATIONS

While the amalgamation of the men's and women's administrative organizations into Golf Manitoba have captured the headlines on the ever-changing Manitoba golf scene, there have also been (or will be) a good number of physical changes.

It seems there is always something new to talk about in Manitoba golf circles and this year is no exception, featuring some course alterations, some new courses or parts of courses under construction and some major changes in clubhouse facilities.

If there's some course design or improvement work involved, chances are pretty good that Grant Golf might be involved. Golf course architect David Grant was involved last year with three expansion programs, including the opening of a new nine at the Neepawa Golf and Country Club.

This year, there's a new nine under construction at neighboring Minnedosa Country Club, scheduled for opening late this season or early in 2004, and Grant Golf is also the architect for The Meadows at East St. Paul, the new 18-hole layout in the north-east area of Winnipeg.

Grant is also involved in the planning for a new pro shop at the Clear Lake Golf Course, exploring a possible expansion at Swan River and has worked on hole alterations at the Southwood, Transcona, Breezy Bend, Elmhurst and Pine Ridge courses in the Winnipeg area.

Major clubhouse work is planned this year at two locations -- the Kenora Golf and Country Club and at the St. Boniface Golf Club.

ST. BONIFACE GOLF CLUB

The St. Boniface project is the newest one on the drawing board, approved just this spring by the club's board of directors. Director of golf Jason Ludke reported the plans call for demolition of the 53-year-old clubhouse this fall, starting Oct. 6, with the new building on the same site to be opened at the start of the 2004 season next April.

The new clubhouse will be 17,000 square feet, nearly doubling the space of the present clubhouse of about 10,000 square feet. It will be a two-storey structure with no basement. Locker facilities will be located on the main floor, with banquet hall and dining facilities and a balcony on the upper level. The banquet hall

will have seating for up to 300 and it is planned to operate the club year-round.

"It will be designed to meet our members' needs," said Ludke. "There will be exercise facilities and space for members to attend winter golf school activities."

Ludke also said there were some changes on the St. Boniface course. Major change is the enlargement of the water hazard in front of the ninth green, which is nearly triple the size it was and also comes into play from the 10th tee. The earth dug out to enlarge the pond has been used to do some mounding on several holes on the course.

KENORA GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB

The other new clubhouse won't involve tearing down an old one. The folks at Kenora plan to keep the rustic design of the clubhouse, but it will undergo major renovations.

"The entire floor in the upstairs area will undergo extensive up-grading," reports pro **Rob Guthrie**. "There will be new windows, new flooring, new bar and kitchen area and new washrooms on the upper level."

There will also be new roofing, new siding and air conditioning and a new deck built on the storage area overlooking the lake.

"Now we will have two decks," Guthrie noted, "one that overlooks the golf course and one that overlooks the lake. What more could one want?"

It's the first major renovation at Kenora in about 50 years and the facility will accommodate up to 150 guests with full bar and kitchen facilities.

Meanwhile, there are also ongoing improvements on the golf course at Kenora. Phase one of a two-phase project began last fall under the direction of golf architect **Les Furber**. Now completed and growing in, the first phase was to construct a new par-three hole on vacant land between the 11th and 15th holes. The new hole, with a pond in front of the entire green, is expected to become Kenora's signature hole.

Furber made use of the natural surroundings of rock and elevation to design a picturesque hole. With the construction of the pond, the drainage problem in the area will be eliminated. Also included in phase one was the construction of new tee areas for the new 16th hole, as well as fairway bunkers for the adjacent 11th hole. The par-three hole is expected to be in play this fall.

Phase two of the project, to start this fall, will feature a new pond to be dug on the present 15th hole, the elimination of the 15th green and new fairway bunkers constructed to turn the present 15th into a dogleg-right par-five 16th hole. With the fill from the pond, two new tee areas will be developed on the 11th hole and the landing area will be regraded on this hole as well.

MINNEDOSA COUNTRY CLUB

The Grant project at Minnedosa is a full nine-hole expansion, going out from the clubhouse and back with the 18th hole adjacent the present ninth hole. The new nine will be a little longer than the existing nine and features rolling terrain.

The project was seeded last fall and Grant said it will depend on the weather to determine if it will be ready to be opened late this fall or early in 2004.

Minnedosa pro/manager **Chris Worley** said members have been excited about the project and are looking forward to playing the new nine. "Many are hoping we can get on this fall, but it may have to wait until next spring," he said.

THE MEADOWS AT EAST ST. PAUL

The Meadows at East St. Paul is an on-going project for Grant. Nine holes were constructed last fall and the other nine holes are to be completed this year. The irrigation work on the 18-hole layout was basically completed last year, Grant said.

The par-72 layout will incorporate a blend of grasses to achieve the look and feel of a "prairie links" style golf course. It is located on McGregor Farm Road, adjacent to Lagimodiere Boulevard (Highway 59) just north of the North Perimeter Highway.

It will have multiple tee boxes on each hole and will play from 5,400 yards to a formidable 6,900 yards for the low handicapper.

"We included a main irrigation pond and five or six other ponds on the layout, so water will come into play on at least six of the holes," he said. "There will also be many bunkers on the course."

In addition to the Neepawa expansion opened last year, Grant also was involved with an expansion program at Regina's Tor Hill course and a new nine-hole course, Dragon Hills, at Thunder Bay.

SOUTH INTERLAKE GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB

The South Interlake Golf and Country Club at Warren has undergone several changes, designed to improve drainage and to improve the playability and enjoyment of the course.

Pro **Bill Dinsdale** said the removal of mounds on the first, second, fourth and seventh fairways, will provide better visibility and reward golfers for well-hit shots. A number of new tees were also constructed at the course. There are new forward tees (red) on 1, 2, 4, 9, 10 and 18; new middle tees (white) on 2, 9, 10 and 18; and new back tees (blue) on 9, 10 and 18.

"The pond on the 18th fairway was removed and replaced with a

ditch to improve drainage," Dinsdale said, "and No. 10 fairway has been reshaped for better drainage."

LINKS AT THE LAKE

The course originally known as Pelican Beach north of Gimli was renamed Links at the Lake last year and **Harry Brochie's** Lakeland Golf Management Inc. has been engaged to operate the facility.

Brochie's company is also involved with course operations at Tuxedo and Harbour View in the city, as well as Grand Pines near Victoria Beach and courses in Saskatchewan.

RAT RIVER GOLF

Rat River Golf at St. Pierre-Jolys also had extensive renovation work completed last year after river flooding forced the course to be closed for much of the summer. It was re-opened late in the season and manager **Real Cure** was looking forward to a good spring to allow golfers to see the improvements undertaken while the course was being cleaned up following the flood.

"We're hoping our troubles are behind us and we can look forward to some relief from the flood problem," Cure said. "We're planning to go ahead and we also have plans to get back to our project to build a new clubhouse for the operation."

The golf fraternity in Manitoba will be joining Cure in his wish for an uneventful summer.

'The Jazz' Open to make a return in August

Leading amateur and professional golfers can look forward to a revival for the popular Jazz Manitoba Open in August.

"The Jazz" as it became known, wasn't played in 2002 due to difficulties in obtaining a course for the three-day event.

In 2003, the 54-hole Open championship will be played Aug. 27-28-29 at two courses – one round each at St. Boniface and Rossmere with the low 60 and ties going on for a third round at the Rossmere layout.

The Jazz Manitoba Open came into being in the fall of 1998 after the Canadian Tour dropped its connection with the Manitoba Golf Association in the presentation of the Manitoba Open championship.

Terry Hashimoto and Jazz Golf came to the rescue that year and a 36-hole Manitoba Open championship was played at John Blumberg. It returned to the same site in 1999 as a 54-hole competition, then was played in 2000 and 2001 at Transcona.

Details of the 2003 revival of the Jazz Manitoba Open were not available as this publication went to press, but an announcement is to be made early in the season about qualifications for the tournament.

The first round of the 54-hole championship will be played Wednesday, Aug. 27, at the St. Boniface Golf Club, then the entire field will move to Rossmere Country Club for round two on Thursday, Aug. 28. The low 60 and ties will play in the final round Friday, Aug. 29, at Rossmere.

Dave McMillan of Golf Central was winner of the first Jazz event at Blumberg in 1998. **Scott Parker** of Rossmere was the

winner in 1999 at Blumberg, then successfully defended the title in 2000 at Transcona. McMillan returned to the winner's circle in 2001.

Low amateur honors went to **Garth Collings** of Breezy Bend in 1998 and 1999, then to **Ben Bandura** of Niakwa in 2000 and to **Jay Doyle** of Niakwa in 2001.

When the Jazz Manitoba Open was born in 1998 it took the Manitoba Open championship back to its roots, allowing the province's top amateurs and professionals to compete in a single event for provincial honors. Amateurs and pros have both praised the event and it is expected interest will be high for the revival this year.

The official announcements will be forthcoming early in the season, but golfers interested should make note of the dates.

The 34-year-old head pro at the Portage Golf Club is in the first year of a two-year term as president of the Manitoba Division of the Canadian Professional Golfers' Association.

Duncan has been in the pro golf business for 13 years and is entering his seventh season at the Portage club. He has made his mark as a player in local competitions and also in the board room as a member of the CPGA executive.

"We have provided excellent education programs and we strive to give good service to our members," he said. "We want to ensure that our apprentices are given every opportunity to take part in management schooling along the way."

"We also have our duty to serve the public and I believe the people who are doing the buying want to be treated well."

As a competitive golfer himself, Duncan is also pleased with the way the Manitoba CPGA schedule has been developed.

"We have a very aggressive tournament schedule in Manitoba," he pointed out, "and it is very well supported by our members. There are plenty of opportunities to keep your golf game in shape, but you also have to remember your other duties and you have to be willing to make changes along the way."

The development of junior golfers is an important part of his philosophy and he practices what he preaches. His Portage club has an active junior membership of 130 to 160 members, a big increase from the 50 juniors at the club when he arrived seven years ago.

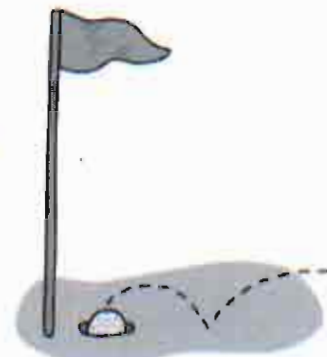

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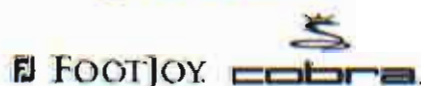

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A big boost in confidence for Southwood's Mac McLeod

A huge \$5,500 cheque certainly came in handy, but it really wasn't the biggest thing **Mac McLeod** won in British Columbia last September.

"It was all very exciting and really boosted my confidence, that's the main thing," the 27-year-old Southwood assistant pro remarked, as he looked back on his victory in the Titleist/Footjoy/Cobra Canadian PGA Assistants championship.

"It was the biggest tournament win ever for me and I now feel a confidence I never felt before," he added. "It helps me to pursue my dreams as a kid, wanting to play professional golf."

McLeod struggled down the stretch but still managed to hang on to win the Canadian championship at the Beach Grove Golf Club in Delta, BC, just south of Vancouver. He shot scores of 69-65-72—206 to win by a single stroke over **David Bolton** of Coquitlam, BC and **Keir Smith** of Woodbridge, ON.

The champion led by four shots with eight holes to play, but he missed a couple of short putts on the back nine and still managed to post a final score 54-hole total of one-under par. The course played to a par of 69 at 5,905 yards while construction continues on the par-five 17th hole that was replaced by a temporary par-three hole.

The victory has McLeod setting his sights back on that childhood dream and he plans to make an attempt to get onto the

Canadian Tour in September. He had given some thought to trying at the Tour's spring qualifying test in May but decided he would stand a better chance at the close of the season rather than at the start.

"I always thought there would be an opportunity to get into some tour action and this has just boosted my confidence so I believe I can make it," he said.

McLeod, originally from Brandon, graduated from the Golf Academy of the South and spent two years as an apprentice pro in Florida before returning to Manitoba to work with **Tom Kinsman** at Southwood Golf and Country Club for the past seven years.

At Southwood, he is very active with golf lessons and is enthused over the busy Junior program at the club. If he can't be a tournament player, he would like to be a teaching pro.

He has enjoyed some professional tournament success in Manitoba over the years. He was the Manitoba PGA cham-

pion in 1998 and he won the Manitoba Assistant Pro title prior to going to the national test last season.

"Unbelievable," McLeod said when asked what it's like to be a national champion. "It feels really good. The way I did it was kind of scary but I pulled it off. It was fun."

McLeod was joined by **Steve Witiuk** of Tuxedo, **Geoff Kehler** of Lartars and **Rob Doucette** of Elmhurst to make up the Manitoba team at the Assistants championship. The team finished second in the 36-hole event, six strokes behind the winning foursome from British Columbia.

The Assistants Champion also received invitations to the US and Australian Assistants' Championships. McLeod had an excellent showing at the U.S. National Assistant Professional Championship in Port St. Lucie, Florida. With scores of 74-77-76-73 for a total of 300, he finished in 29th place and earned \$1,125.

Dave Turner sets goals for term as head of the superintendents

When **Dave Turner** took over the reins as president of the Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association, he set both internal and external goals for his term.

On the inside, the 33-year-old head superintendent at the Falcon Lake Golf Course looks for increased participation in association activities, keeping up the interest among the members and a continuation of the training programs available to the members.

On the outside, he wants his organization to keep the public informed on the proper use of pesticides, new developments and products in the industry and to assure the public that golf course superintendents are the environmental stewards for the community.

"We are less reliant on old technology and we are all better turf managers than our predecessors," Turner says. "Our members are professionals with formal

education in the field and we strive to keep up with developments through training seminars."

The new MGSA president hopes to continue the progress made in the past five years through a training program that follows environmental checklists and is in step with other associations interested in the proper care of facilities.

MGSA members have a healthy attendance record for their monthly gatherings, held mainly at various golf courses in the province. They play golf, but they also pay attention to business and show a willingness to provide assistance if any member encounters problems.

"The position of golf course superintendent has dramatically changed since the MGSA was first established in 1950," Turner says. "It is now a profession that forces a superintendent to possess a wide variety of skills, including personnel management, budget management, equipment management and strong agronomic skills. The MGSA is here to help our membership to achieve a high level of professionalism."

The MGSA has more than 180 members in Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario. The association also has strong ties to other like-minded organizations and many departments of the provincial and federal governments.

"Our area is blessed with many excellent golf courses and we are extremely fortunate to have the talented professionals to maintain these facilities to the demanding

standards that the public expects," he said.

Turner was 17 when he started his career in 1987, working with superintendent **Jack Davies** at Southwood. He later served as an assistant superintendent at the same course from 1991 to 1994 under **Ray Savard**. He moved north for the 1995 season at Swan River, then spent two years as superintendent at Hecla. 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Breezy Bend owl released after rehabilitation

Wildlife organization to the rescue

It was a birdie, but not quite
an eagle!

Rob Simmons was enjoying
a day of golfing with friends
early last spring at Breezy
Bend Country Club when he
discovered a very young
great horned owl lying in the
grass near the 13th tee box.

"There were no leaves on the
trees at that point in the
spring, and the little guy was
fairly exposed," said Sim-
mons, a member at the club. "He had
only pin-feathers and I figured that he
wouldn't last long where he was".

He spotted the nest that the young owl
had apparently fallen from, and could
make out at least one sibling peeking
safely over the edge. The tangled nest
had been either damaged from winds or
perhaps constructed by an inexperienced
mother owl.

Simmons contacted the Manitoba Wildlife
Rehabilitation Organization, Manitoba's
only licensed wildlife rehabilitation centre.
For almost 20 years, the MWRO has
been taking care of injured and orphaned
native Manitoba wildlife, and returning
animals back to the wild.

"Spring is our busiest season," said rehab
director Lisa Tretiak, "as animals migrate
through our backyards, parks and golf
courses, and their babies are born and
hatched. We receive more than 60 per
cent of our annual case-load of 2,000 ani-
mals in a short three-month period."

Young owls will sometimes jostle for
dominance in the nest and can even eject
smaller siblings from the nest. In many
instances, returning uninjured young ani-
mals to the wild is simply a matter of a
few tricks and techniques.

MWRO staff recommended Simmons at-
tempt to reunite the young owl either by
placing it back into its own nest, or in a
"foster basket" as close to the nest as
possible. But, for this little bird, the tech-
nique just wasn't feasible, so he was ad-

vised to bring the owl to the MWRO Cen-
tre in Glenlea. Here the bird was fostered
by the committed staff and volunteers, as
well as a stuffed owl "mom".

"Rehabbing wild animals, especially young
animals, is much more involved than simply
providing food and water," said Tretiak.
"With owls and some other species we
keep direct contact to a minimum. We ac-
tually dress up as ghosts when we work with
them to avoid having them imprint to hu-
mans." An imprinted owl has lost its instinc-
tual fear of people and can be extremely
dangerous.

Four months later, Simmons was reunited
with the now fully-feathered great horned
owl, when MWRO staff invited him to the
bird's release back into the wild. As soon
as the lid was lifted off the transport box,
the owl gave a few powerful beats of its
wings and flew up into the trees, just up the
river from Breezy Bend.

"I'm just glad I found him when I did," said
Simmons. "There was a real sense of satis-
faction watching him fly off. It's what he
was meant to do."

Other golfer's can have the chance to wit-
ness the release of a rehabbed wild animal
at the first annual MWRO Creature Classic
Golf Tournament, to be held in late sum-
mer.

Anyone encountering a wild bird or animal
that appears to be injured or orphaned is
asked to call the Manitoba Wildlife Rehabili-

Red River graduate Gary Stadnek earns trip to home of golf in Scotland

Gary Stadnek, a 2002 graduate of the Greenspace Management program at Red River College is the winner of the Toro Future Superintendent Award and the Canadian Golf Superintendents Association Award.

Presented annually by the Toro Company of Canada and the Canadian Golf Superintendents Association, the award goes to one Turfgrass Management student from across Canada, who is pursuing a career in golf course maintenance, and exemplifies what Toro and the CGSA feel to be the future of Golf Course Superintendents.

The journey for Stadnek began when he was selected as the perfect representative by the Greenspace Management program at Red River College. He was then chosen from five candidates in Calgary, who represent the best students in Turfgrass Management from across Canada.

Because of this honour bestowed on him, Stadnek spent six weeks studying Turfgrass Management at Elmwood College in St. Andrews, Scotland — the home of golf.

The perks for the award are numerous. Prior to commencing his

studies, he had the opportunity to work at the Dunhill Cup, a tournament on the European PGA Tour. Prior to his studies, he worked at a number of golf courses in the region, including the Old Course at St. Andrews, Turnberry and Kingsbarn. In addition, Stadnek visited the Toro manufacturing and production facilities in Wisconsin and Minneapolis, and in March made a presentation to delegates of the Canadian International Turfgrass conference in Calgary, covering his experiences as the winner. He also spoke about his chosen profession, and whether there is room for improvement.

The Greenspace Management program at Red River College also benefits. The college receives a computer, complete with Toro software for their part in the nomination process.

Stadnek grew up in the northern Manitoba mining town of Thompson. Following in his father's footsteps, and taking advantage of the local employment opportunity, Gary began working at the mine after completing high school.

Longing to see the light of day and be closer to one of his hobbies and passions (golf) he decided a career change was in order. He was accepted into the Greenspace Management program at Red River College in September, 1999. At the completion of his first year of studies, and with the assistance of the Greenspace Work Co-op program; Gary secured employment at Bel Acres Golf and Country Club.

He returned to Bel Acres during his second year of studies, around the time he had to find a topic for his third year practicum research project. Bel Acres was considering the construction of another 18 holes, and, in particular, the growth of bentgrass fairways.

Since there are no such fairways in Manitoba, a student exchange program was arranged. Stadnek took the opportunity to work at the York Downs Golf and Country Club for one month to become more familiar with bentgrass fairways. He completed his practicum research project regarding the viability of such a fairway in Manitoba, and successfully completed the program in January, 2002.

Upon graduation, Stadnek was offered the Assistant Superintendent position at the York Downs Golf and Country Club under the guidance of Superintendent **Bill Fach**, president of the Canadian Golf Superintendents Association.

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Adult, junior development linked

Under the new amalgamated Golf Manitoba, a new committee has been struck which brings together under one committee all player development activities.

Previously most player development efforts went toward junior age players in both men's and women's associations. In the past year though, programs have been started that will bring the opportunity of game improvement programs to the adult amateur golfer as well.

This year, three men's and three women's clinics will be offered to players who competed in provincial amateur events in 2002. These clinics will offer game improvement techniques of the highest caliber, which have been part of the junior development program for several years.

The player development committee will maintain its emphasis on development of junior, juvenile and pre-juvenile women's and men's players by offering a total of nine spring development camps for various skill and age groupings.

The camps will be directed by **Garth Goodbrandson** and **Derek Ingram**, both of whom are RCGA/CLGA National Coaches and experienced CPGA professionals.

Goodbrandson, athlete development co-ordinator for Golf Manitoba, is a 21-year member of the CPGA. He was recipient of Manitoba PGA Junior Leader of the Year award in 1999 and

2000 and was Canadian PGA Junior Leader of the Year in 1999.

Ingram, the head professional at Golf Central, is a 10-year Canadian PGA member. He was the 2002 Manitoba PGA Player of the Year, 2001 Manitoba head professional champion and 2000 Manitoba PGA Teacher of the Year. He played on the Canadian Tour in 1998-99. He was coach of Team Canada at the world junior golf championship in Japan in 2001, 2002 and 2003. He was co-author of the best-seller "Play Golf in the Zone".

Goodbrandson and Ingram are members of RCGA and CLGA national coaching teams and co-coaches and co-founders of the University of Manitoba golf teams.

Optimist Junior event gets a course change

At the National Championship in Ontario, Manitoba representatives in the 16-18 division were **Stacey Bieber** and **Stewart Bannatyne**, while the 14-15 representatives were **Crystal Nagle**, **Kaitlin Troop**, **Chay Genoway** and **Jesse Skelton**.

The Optimist Junior Golf Championships are a part of numerous youth programs sponsored by the Optimist Clubs of Winnipeg as part of their mandate "Friends of Youth". Minnesota has welcome mat out for Manitoba golfers

Many fine courses available if you're looking for golfing variety

Manitoba golfers have it pretty good. Not only are they blessed with an abundance of golf courses within the province and Northwestern Ontario, but there's a virtual paradise of great golf locations only a few hours away to the south.

The many golf courses of Minnesota and North Dakota have the welcome sign out for Manitobans, and there's a wide variety of courses and accommodation available.

We had the pleasure last summer of a visit to resorts in the Brainerd area, just about in the center of the state of Minnesota. On previous trips we have enjoyed some of the courses in such areas as Grand Rapids, Eveleth, Bemidji, Park Rapids, Detroit Lakes and other points.

There has been a common thread on most of the southern journeys. The scenery is great, the golf courses are interesting and challenging, and most of the locations love to show their hospitality to visitors from the north.

There are many areas in which groups of courses and resorts have banded together with promotions. You can find special

two- or three-day golf packages or week-long specials at many sites. Some of them feature play at one set of courses, while others may give golfers a variety of courses that can be played.

So, where do you begin with a report on the Minnesota attractions? Let's start with our most recent visit, which was to join officials of the Minnesota Golf Association's for that group's annual media event last summer in the Brainerd area.

BRAINERD GOLF TRAIL

We spent some time at two of the largest resorts in the Brainerd area — Madden's Resort and Cragun's Resort, both located on Gull Lake. In addition to playing on the feature courses at these two resorts, we had the pleasure of a round of golf at Grand View Lodge, also in the Brainerd area.

If we had the time, we could have seen much more in that area of the state alone. The Brainerd Golf Trail boasts of a total of more than 450 holes at 18 sites all within a 45-minute drive. There are 20 lodging groups in the area as well, so packages are readily available.

On this trip, we were able to play three of the courses — The Classic at Madden's, the Legacy courses at Cragun's and The

Pines at Grand View. These truly are three championship courses, not only by virtue of their layout, but they also are in the championship class for splendor.

In addition to The Classic course, Madden's Resort has its Pine Beach East, Pine Beach West and its Social Nine. At Cragun's the Legacy courses include the Dutch's 18, Bobby's 18 and a Reversible par 3. At Grand View Lodge, The Pines course is joined by The Preserve and The Garden Course.

We didn't get a chance to see them all, but other favorites in the Brainerd area include the Traditional and Whitebirch courses at Breezy Point, Pine Meadows Golf Club, Crosswoods Golf Course, Deacon's Lodge, Whitefish Golf Club, Golden Eagle Golf Club, the Lakes course at Ruttger's Bay Lake Lodge and Alec's Nine at Ruttger's.

The Brainerd area is a good six-or-seven-hour drive from Winnipeg, but there's not much driving to do during a stay at any of the many resorts in the area. Some like to go through the Bemidji area and head south, some like to stay on the I-29 route south to Fargo/Moorhead, then head east. Distance is similar in each case.

The resorts in the area are part of the Brainerd Golf Trail and much of the marketing for the area is handled through that name. There's a wide choice of accommodation facilities to go with that wide choice of golf layouts, ranging from cabins, to suites and rooms at the lodges or to hotels and motels in Brainerd or other cities and towns in the area.

The Classic at Madden's has been ranked Minnesota's No. 1 public course and 33rd greatest public course in America by Golf Digest magazine. It's a championship course and is the

feature of the Madden establishment, though the other courses at Madden's also prove to be very popular.

Manager **Brian Thuringer** and the staff at Madden's Resort are very accommodating and offer full lodging services to go along with the first-class golf facilities. The Classic course features five

sets of tees and plays from 4,883 yards all the way back to a formidable 7,109 yards

Just down the road you'll find Cragun's Resort and the well-known Legacy courses, which feature 55 holes of great golf. If you're wondering how they got to 55 holes, you'll learn about the

Gambler's Hole, a new 19th tiebreaker hole surrounded by bunkers and called the perfect way to settle a tie.

Dutch and Irma Cragun are the owner/operators of this resort and both take an active role in the operation to see that guests are well treated. During our visit last summer, we also had the pleasure of meeting, playing a couple of holes and dining with **Robert Trent Jones Jr.**, the designer of the courses, who was on hand for the official opening of the final nine holes.

The first 18 holes is called Dutch's Legacy, named for the resort owner, while the newest 18 is called Bobby's Legacy, named for the designer. The Dutch Legacy measures 6,879 yards and is a par-72 layout, while Bobby's Legacy is 6,755 yards and plays to par 73. All holes have multiple tees to suit all levels of play.

The reversible par-three course features nine holes clockwise (1,365 yards, par 27) and nine holes counter clockwise (1,240 yards, par 27). It's considered an ideal setup for practice, group play and a place for families and novices to have fun and learn the game.

At Grand View Lodge, The Pines features 27 holes with Lakes, Woods and Marsh nines. Yardages can range everywhere from 5,112 to 6,883 yards depending on the nines and the use of four tees on each hole. The 18-hole Preserve layout can play from 4,816 to 6,601 yards from four sets of tees, while Deacon's Lodge runs from 4,766 to 6,965 from five sets of tees.

WILD NORTH GOLF

Twenty-five golf locations are included in another marketing group which takes in the northeast corner of Minnesota. This family of golf facilities features some nine-hole layouts, several 18-holers and a couple of 27-hole courses.

One of the Wild North feature areas – Giant Ridge at Biwabik – is to become a 36-hole location this summer with the opening in July of its new Quarry course to go along with its already-popular Legend course.

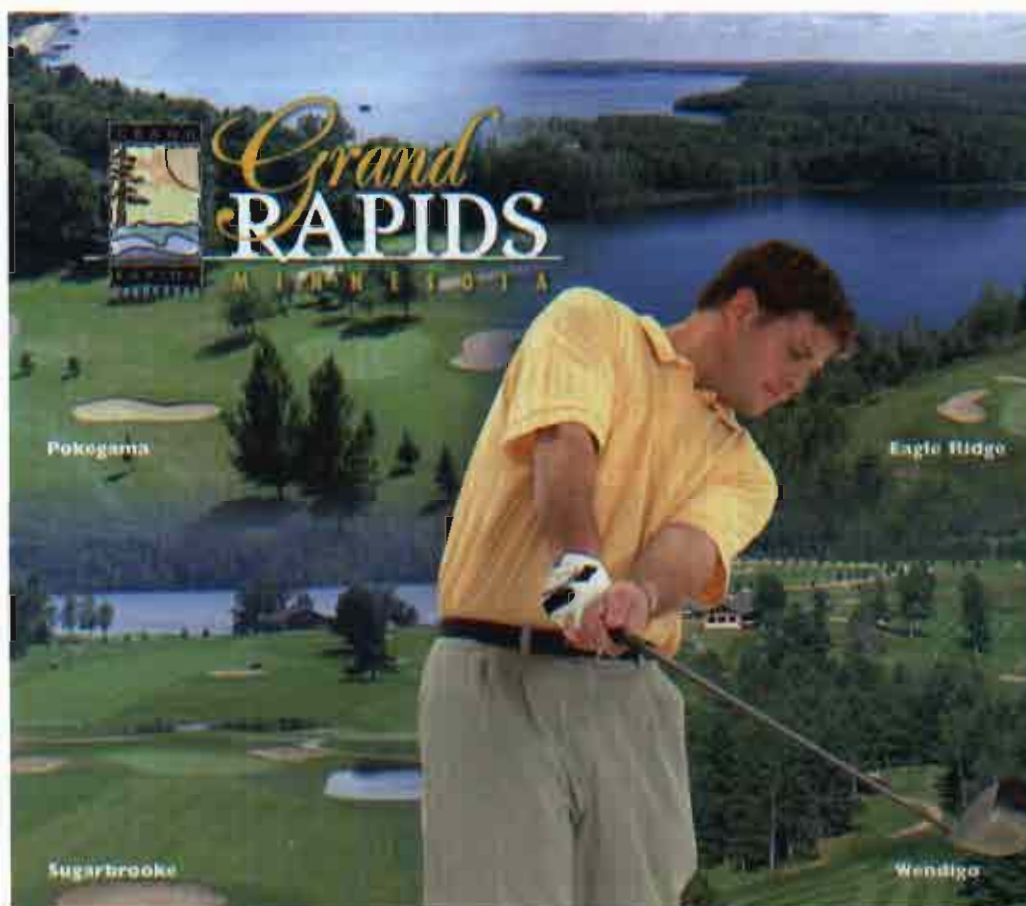
Giants Ridge is also a popular ski resort in the winter months and the same facilities serve both the summer and winter activi-

ties. The area has enjoyed a good relationship with Manitobans through both seasons.

Another well-known Wild North location is the Superior National Golf Course at Lutsen, another popular ski area in the snowy months. This location, near Lake Superior, features 27 holes, the 18-hole Mountain Canyon course and the nine-hole River course.

The city of Grand Rapids features its own golf promotion group called Minnesota's Grand Slam of Golf, which also bills itself as the gateway to Wild North Golf. This group consists of four ex-

cellent 18-hole golf courses in the Grand Rapids area and the Grand Slam packages are available complete with a variety of accommodation facilities.

Making up the Grand Slam are Sugarbrooke, five miles south of the city; Pokegama, three miles west; Wendigo, two miles south;

and Eagle Ridge, six miles east of Grand Rapids at Coleraine. There's a big feature attraction for Canadian golfers this season with Pokegama, Wendigo and Eagle Ridge all offering their green fees to Canadians at par

Other 18-hole locations on the Wild North listing include Cuyana at Deerwood, Emily Greens at Emily, Lakeview National at Two Harbors, Mesaba at Hibbing and Virginia Golf Course at Virginia. There are also 13 nine-hole courses in the area.

MORE MEMORABLE AREAS

Moving west from Grand Rapids will get you to Bemidji, another Minnesota city with a number of fine golf courses within short driving distance. The star of the show in that area is the Bemidji Town and Country Club located on the north end of Lake Bemidji.

Head south and you can enjoy the fine Tianna Country Club near Walker, take advantage of the Blueberry Pines Golf Club, eight miles south of Park Rapids, or try the Headwaters course at Park Rapids.

From Park Rapids, the highway west will take you through another hotbed for golf courses, Detroit Lakes. One of the feature courses is the popular Wildflower Golf Course at Fair Hills Resort, where they'll take your money at par.

Wildflower is rated among the premier courses in Minnesota, featuring a distinctive "Prairie Links" design built in the tradition of seaside golf in Scotland. With more than 90 feet in elevation changes and the beautiful Pelican Lake in the background, the course offers spectacular views. Wildflower also features 86 bunkers and a course rating of 139 from the back tees to make it one of the most challenging layouts in the state, but with four sets of tees to golfers can choose their own degree of difficulty.

Heading toward home, or maybe on the way to the other areas mentioned, Manitobans may want to stop in Fargo or Grand Forks. Both of these North Dakota centers are popular with Manitoba travelers for shopping or just visiting, but both also have some interesting golf courses in their confines or nearby, including neighboring Moorhead or East Grand Forks across the Red River from the two cities.

Many Manitobans had the pleasure of playing the Arnold Palmer course King's Walk at Grand Forks after it was opened a year ago. Manitobans are familiar with several of the other courses in the two areas.

We haven't had the pleasure of playing all the courses mentioned in this Minnesota guide, but from personal experience we can vouch for quite a few of them.

In addition to the Madden's, Cragun's and Grand View courses played last summer near Brainerd, earlier travels included rounds of golf at Giants Ridge, all four courses in the Grand Rapids Grand Slam promotion, the Bemidji Town and Country Club and other courses near that city, Tianna at Walker, Head-

waters and Blueberry Pines around Park Rapids.

We regret we have not yet enjoyed visits to the Wildflower course near Detroit Lakes, the Kings Walk course at Grand Forks and a few others that have been brought to our attention by golfing friends. These two are on our wish list for this summer, along with the new Quarry course opening in July at Giants Ridge.

Maybe we'll see you somewhere along the way.



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Jazz Golf stays in tune with marketing changes

Staying on top of changes on the Canadian golf scene is an ongoing project for everyone involved with the production and marketing at Jazz Golf Equipment Inc.

Ron Diduch, chief executive officer, notes several major changes have been made in the marketing of golf equipment and Jazz has kept pace with a number of innovations.

The company's Fat Cat series of clubs has become an exclusive line for Golf Town, the big national golf store chain with 14 large stores across Canada. There's a big Golf Town store scheduled for Winnipeg in the near future.

The new Vibe series of customized clubs from Jazz has been set up for sale through golf professionals in what is known in the industry as green grass shops. The Trouble Shooter series is also on the market through custom club-fitters.

Jazz also has developed the Rally series to be available at other outlets. Rounding out the club line is the Lady Jazz series for women and the new Sandra Post series coming out this summer and available only through pro shops for the better female golfers.

While the big Jazz market is in Canada, the company is also making some moves into the United States and on the international scene. The Scheels Sports chain of large outdoor stores is handling the Jazz line at 22 outlets in the northern and mid-west portions of the U.S.

"We have to keep up with what's happening in Canadian golf," Diduch said. "There's a growing trend to large retail centers, but there is also a growth in the sales through pro shops which can provide a high degree of technical support. We have to service both markets, but the selling is different. Our changes have been working well and the feedback from the industry has been good."

This is the second year for Jazz at its single-storey 1866 King Edward Street address after operating for several years

from a third-floor location on Arthur Street in downtown Winnipeg.

"It has allowed us to make changes in our production facilities and we're much more efficient in handling our inventory and shipping procedures," Diduch explained. "We can ship three or four times the volume we could handle from our downtown location and we can provide better customer service."

This is also Diduch's second year as chief executive officer for Jazz. His background includes engineering and marketing positions. **Terry Hashimoto** remains as president and founder of the company and is in charge of the design and development of products.

Sandra Post, one of Canada's best known female golfers, is part of the Jazz team and her name is used on the top line clubs for women.

Adam Speirs is sponsored by Jazz and using the company's equipment on the Canadian Tour.

Jazz Golf is rated as Canada's largest wholly Canadian-owned manufacturer of golf clubs and equipment. The company has a full line of golf bags and accessories, including hats, umbrellas, head covers, towels and travel bags.

"Our new series of bags feature the Team Canada logo, which is very fitting because golf and hockey go hand in hand in this country," said Diduch.

Mike Keast captures Golfer of Year honours

Mike Keast of Niakwa was declared the 2002 Labatt Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year at the annual general meeting of the Manitoba Golf Association held in October at the Breezy Bend Country Club.

He was chosen over two other finalists for the awards — Garth Collings of Breezy Bend and Jill Hardy of Niakwa. All three finalists enjoyed success in the 2002 season on the Manitoba golf scene as well as outside the province.

The 17-year-old Keast won the Manitoba Junior Optimist title, and finished in a second place tie in the World Junior Optimist tournament in Florida. He became only the third Manitoba golfer to capture both the provincial Junior and the men's Amateur Championships in the same year, matching the feat of Todd Fanning (1984) and Rob McMillan (1993). He was a member of two provincial teams, the Willingdon Cup squad as an amateur and the junior team as a junior. He was fifth in the Canadian Junior.

Collings, 44, was nominated for the honour for the eighth time. He earned a berth on Manitoba's Willingdon Cup team for a ninth time, and advanced to the third round of match play in the Canadian Amateur tournament. He won his second Manitoba Mid-Amateur title and added the Manitoba Club Champions men's amateur crown. He tied for third in the

Grey Owl, and was seventh in the Canadian Club Champions tourney in Whistler, British Columbia.

Hardy, 21, was the leader in the women's division of the World University qualifying tournament, advancing to the World event held in Taiwan. She was runner-up in the City and District tournament, and tied for second in the Manitoba women's Amateur championship.

Four other golfers received honourable mention from the selection panel.

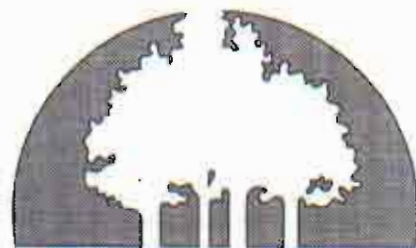
Judi Lidstone of Elmhurst won the Manitoba Senior women's title in her first year of eligibility, and secured a berth on both Amateur and Senior provincial teams.

Kathleen Zeweniuk of Niakwa became only the second golfer to win three (1998, 2000, 2002) Manitoba Junior Women's Championships, a previous achievement of Marlene Wach (Netterfield).

Stacey Bleber of St. Charles tied for eighth in the Canadian Junior Women's Championship, posting the low medal round on the final day. She also tied for ninth place in an American Junior Golf Association tournament.

Kevin Kotyk of Elmhurst earned a salute for winning the Manitoba Match Play Championship, and helping the Manitoba team to victory in the North America Cup against North Dakota.

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Can Mike Keast continue to dominate male scene?

Not since Todd Fanning and Rob McMillan blossomed with outstanding promise in Manitoba junior golf ranks has a youngster vaulted into local prominence, and shown comparable potential the way Niakwa's Mike Keast has done in the past year.

His 2002 achievements were exceptional. He started by winning the Manitoba Junior Optimist title, and finished in second place in the World Junior Optimist tournament in Florida.

Keast followed that success with a rare double. He joined Fanning and McMillan as the only Manitoba golfers to win both the provincial Junior and the men's Amateur championships in the same season, and he was selected as the Labatt Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year.

Keast also had a fifth place finish in the Canadian Junior Championship, earning a berth on the national team that travelled to Puerto Rico in April this year for the Toyota Junior World Cup four-country qualifying tournament.

"I didn't think we played that well down there," he said modestly. "It was good enough to qualify along with Puerto Rico (beating out Mexico and Guatemala) for the world tournament in Japan, but our team will have to be much better to stand any kind of a chance against the best juniors in the world."

Keast posted a nine-over-par 225, the best Canadian score and second overall individually, on a course around 6,800 yards in length, a Florida-type layout with an abundance of water hazards.

Canada and Puerto Rico advanced to the Toyota Junior World Cup event to be held June 14-20 in Kobe, Japan, and Keast will be following Manitobans like McMillan, Adam Speirs, and Ryan Horn, who have worn the maple leaf in the global junior test in the past.

"It's an exciting prospect, and I'm devoting all my time this spring to practising and working on my game to be at a peak for Japan," said the 18-year-old Grade 12 student at Vincent Massey Collegiate.

Keast has decided to by-pass the Manitoba Match Play Championship, the first event on the men's 2003 provincial golf calendar. "After thinking about it, I didn't want to concentrate right now on anything other than the World Junior in Japan," he claimed. "I'll get some playing practice in a Future Links tourney in Saskatoon in June."

Looking ahead to July, Keast will be gunning to repeat his '02 double as he defends his Manitoba Junior and Amateur titles. Another obvious goal is to play for Manitoba in the Canadian Junior tournament in Calgary and the Canadian Amateur in Vancouver in August.

Garth Collings of Breezy Bend is expected to defend his Manitoba Mid-Amateur Championship July 29-31 at Morden's Minnewasta club, and Dave Martin of Rossmere will try to extend his reign as provincial Senior men's champion Sept. 2-4 at Teulon.

New champs assured in two women's events

There will be no repeat Amateur or Junior champions on the women's provincial golf scene this season.

Bobbi Brandon, who won the 2002 Amateur championship, has turned professional, and three-time Junior champion Kathleen Zeweniuk of Niakwa has graduated.

Formerly of Saskatoon, Brandon, now 25, is working in her father Gary's pro shop in Dauphin. She passed her professional Playing Ability Test last fall, and would like to develop her golf teaching skills if she fails to make the jump to professional playing ranks.

Brandon entered the LPGA qualifying school last October, and achieved a "status position" on the Futures Tour. That could open the door to playing in three or four tournaments this season, and with any degree of success Brandon may take another shot at securing a playing card.

"I'll play wherever I can in the meantime," she said. "There's a Bank of Montreal women's professional event in Ponoka, Alberta, in June that I intend to enter."

Brandon's successor as Manitoba Amateur champion will be crowned over 54 holes July 14-16 at Transcona this season. At the same time, Judi Lidstone of Elmhurst will defend the women's provincial Senior title she won in her first year of eligibility in 2002.

Golf Manitoba is counting on a positive reaction to an additional event on the women's schedule this year. A 16-player women's Match Play tournament is slated for Southwood May 24-29. The 16 lowest handicap index entries will be accepted to launch the event.

Two other changes to the women's program have been approved for 2003. The popular Crocus tourney formerly was limited to golfers with a handicap index of 18.4 to 40.1. Now there will be no handicap restrictions when it is staged July 22 at La Verendrye.

A fighting system will be implemented, eliminating the net prizes of the past, in the three provincial championships and the City and District tournament.

Tanis Hastmann of Rossmere holds the C & D title, which will be played six weeks later than usual, over 36 holes Aug. 18-19 at Rossmere and St. Charles.

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Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame to become reality in September

The Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame is to be launched this year.

Joyce Collier, president of the restructured board, has announced the first induction of honorees will take place at a reception to be held Sept. 29 at the Sports Manitoba facilities.

Collier, a past president of the Manitoba Ladies' Golf Association, took over the reins of the board of the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum when it was re-established in 2002.

Former MGA president **Rudy Boivin**, former MLGA head **Lorraine MacLeod** and **Ken Mould** join Collier as the representatives from Golf Manitoba on the board. **Jason Duncan** and **Bill Dinsale** are the representatives from the Manitoba Division of the Canadian Professional Golfers' Association, while **Mark Jordan** and **Tony Feheregyhazi** are the representatives of the Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association. Rounding out the board are Golf Manitoba president **George McLeod** and executive director **Dave Morison** as members-at-large.

Boivin serves as vice-president and **Dave Comaskey**, assistant executive director of Golf Manitoba, is the recording secretary.

Don Craig is chairman of the selection committee, which includes **Lorraine MacLeod**, who serves as the liaison with the

board, retired golf pro **Jim Collins** and media representatives **Bob Picken** and **Ralph Bagley**. The board has also announced the appointment of **Cathy Macatavish** as chairman of the public relations, promotions and media committee.

The names of the first inductees are to be announced during the summer and full details on the initial induction ceremony will be announced at that time.

The first steps to establish a Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame were taken 1998 under past MGA president **Syd Cohan**. At that time, it was expected the first induction event would be held during the 2000 season. The program was dormant until it was revised last year to go ahead with first induction during the 2003 season.

Collier expressed a feeling of relief that the move toward setting up a Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame was under way.

"We have a heritage connected to our sport and I think this method of recognizing the heroes of the past is long overdue," she said. "I was involved as president of the MLGA when the idea was first put forward and I'm only sorry it has taken this long to get it going. I am pleased that we are finally at the stage to make the first inductions this fall."

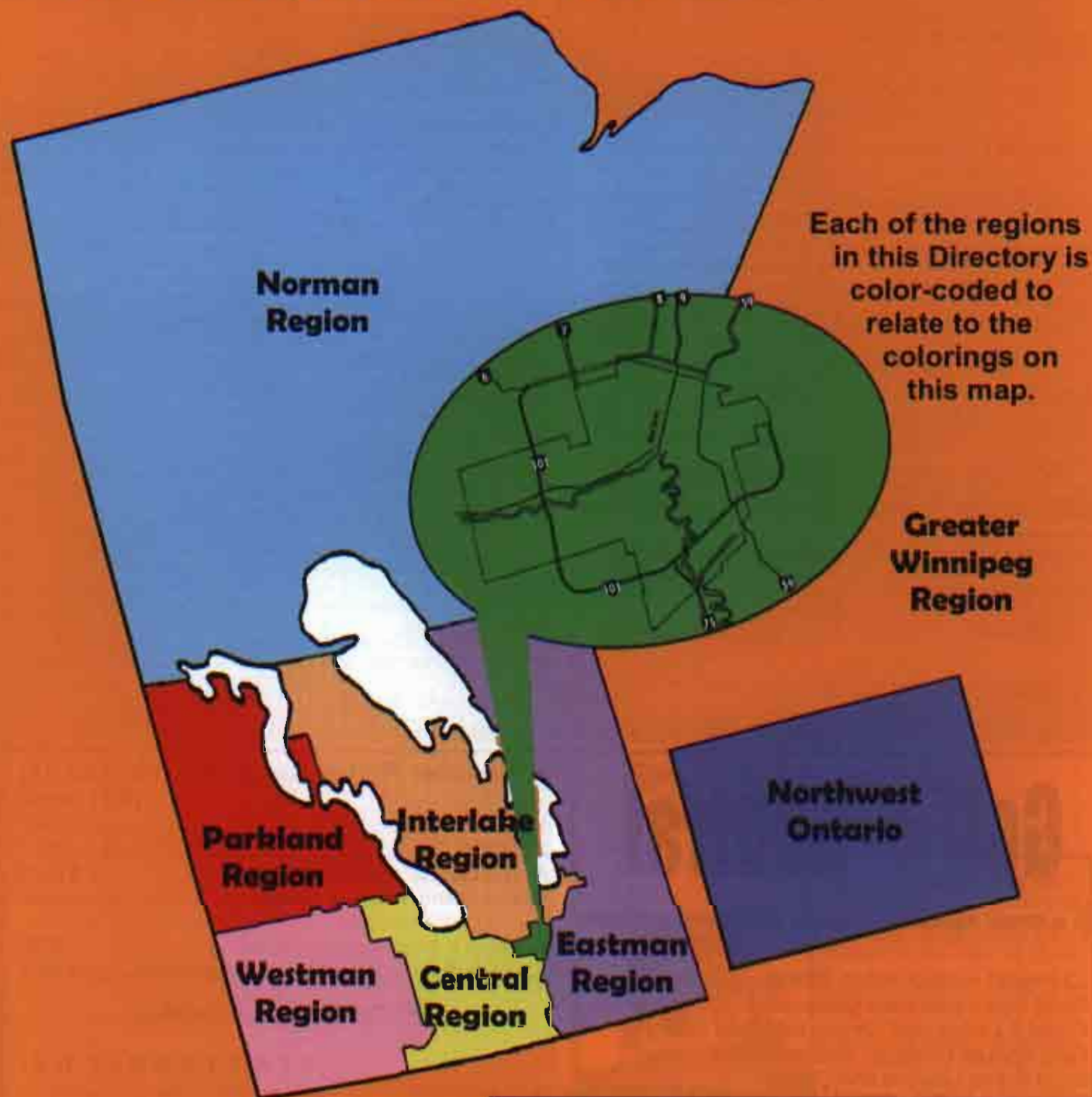
