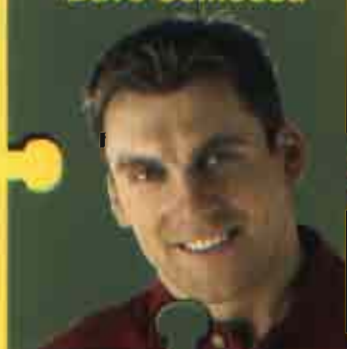

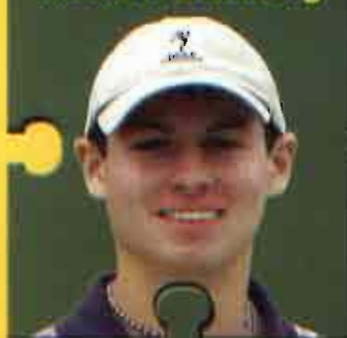

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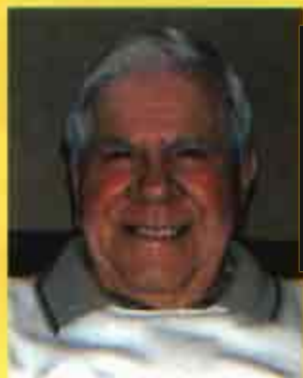
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FROM THE Editor's Chair WITH Ralph Bagley

CHANGES IN GOLF MANITOBA OFFICE

Dave Morison retires after eight years as executive director

It might be called the changing of the guard.

The torch has been passed on and a new body occupies the chair as the executive director of **Golf Manitoba**.

After serving in that position for eight years, **Dave Morison** has retired and is leaving the province this year to take up residence in Bathurst, New Brunswick.

The executive director's post was taken over on April 1 by **Dave Comaskey**, who served as assistant executive director under Morison for the past three years.

And, there's another newcomer in the Golf Manitoba offices at 200 Main Street these days. **John Lamarche** joined the team this year as director of administration.

Garth Goodbrandson remains as director of player development, **Lisa Andersen** has been named director of competitions, **Brenda Soares** continues as administrative co-ordinator and **Carol Muzychka** continues as membership co-ordinator. **Lorne How** has moved up a step as tournament administrator after serving last year as an assistant to **Bob Gill**, who retired as tournament secretary at the close of the 2004 season.

A chartered accountant, Dave Morison, 58, has been officially part of the Golf Manitoba team for 10 years, having served as assistant executive director under **Don Craig** for two years before taking over the post on Craig's retirement in 1997.

Morison is quick to heap praise on his predecessor as the mentor who showed him what it takes to oversee a large amateur sport organization.

"Don Craig was a big help when I first became involved with golf in Manitoba and he continued to be a prime source of information and advice during my eight years as executive director," Morison said.

Both Craig and Morison played large roles in the amalgamation of the Manitoba Golf Association and Manitoba Ladies' Golf Association, which was completed in April, 2003. It was a major project

in which Morison was proud to be involved as it has provided an improvement to the association's services to the golfers of the province.

Born in Toronto, Morison received his early education at Kingston. He first ventured into Manitoba in 1970 as a chartered accountant student articling with the Clarkson Gordon firm. He graduated as a Chartered Accountant in 1973 and remained with the firm until 1990.

He was with the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Manitoba for five years, then joined the staff at the Manitoba Golf Association in February, 1995, as assistant executive director. He became executive director when Craig retired in 1997.

Morison was a multi-sport athlete in his college years, participating in baseball, football, hockey, track and field and swimming as well as playing on his university golf team.

He joined the Breezy Bend Golf and Country Club in 1975 and has been a member of that club ever since, serving on the club's board of governors and a term as president in 1983-84.

He joined the MGA board as a representative of Breezy Bend in 1986 and served as chairman of several committees, including junior golf, finance and tournaments, before becoming president in 1993-94.

Morison was married in 1991 and his wife Brenda Parrott is also a long-time member of Breezy Bend. They met at the club. She originally came from Bathurst, NB, so their move this summer will be a homecoming.

Morison is justly proud of his involvement with Golf Manitoba and readily brags about the MGA being the first amateur golf organization in Canada to appoint a full-time director of player development (Garth Goodbrandson).

He expects Manitoba golf officials to continue with the exploration of technical improvements in the service to the golfers and, though he will be many miles away, one could make a safe bet that Morison's thoughts will continue to dwell on the complexities of governing the sport of golf in Manitoba for a while.

His years of service have been greatly appreciated by all those who helped golf maintain an important position on the Manitoba sports scene.

"We wish him nothing but good fairway lies and long putts that always find the hole as he enjoys a well-earned retirement. Bon Voyage on your eastward trek, Dave and Brenda."

'The other Dave' becomes executive director

Nobody has to tell **Dave Comaskey** that he has some large shoes to fill. But, he's a big guy and his feet should literally fill any shoes.

But, it's not the feet they're talking about. It's the leadership qualities and the knowledge of golf he will need as he succeeds **Dave Morison** as executive director of **Golf Manitoba**.

When he joined the staff as Morison's assistant three years ago, Comaskey became known as "Dave 2" or "the other Dave" as he learned the ropes.

Morison spent the past eight years putting his spin on the position after a two-year training period as assistant under **Don Craig**.

Now, after three years as Morison's assistant, Comaskey is quick with his praise for the guidance provided by Morison to enable him to make the step up.

"All the help I got from Dave Morison in the past three years has been excellent and there's no doubt he will be missed in this office," said Comaskey. "I'm thankful for all I learned under him and I'm sure I can count on further guidance if needed."

So, who is this new executive director? Where did he come from and what is his background? We're coming to that.

Dave Comaskey was born and raised in Thompson, MB, and that's where he was first involved with the sport of golf. He played three times in Manitoba junior tournaments, guided in Thompson by pros **Randy Brekke** and **Paul Vellemaire**.

He attended the University of Manitoba to obtain his Bachelor of Arts degree from 1991 to 1995. He also worked for pro **Tom Kinsman** in the pro shop at Southwood Golf and Country Club and turned professional as an assistant in the fall of 1995.

Comaskey served as an assistant pro until the summer of 1999 when he returned to University of Manitoba to finish his Bachelor of Recreation Studies.

He joined the Golf Manitoba staff as assistant executive director in May, 2002, as amalgamation proceedings were under way to link the MGA and MLGA.

Among his first duties was overseeing the conducting of the MLGA tournaments as well as assisting Morison with the other office duties.

While he enjoyed his time as a professional in the golf ranks, he looks forward to again playing as amateur. He expects to have his amateur status reinstated on June 1.

Comaskey became a playing member of Rossmore Country Club last summer and looks forward to more play there this season.

His outlook for the future of golf in Manitoba is a positive one.

"We're always looking to change," he noted. "We want to stay current and we want to stay relevant. We will always try to do what is best for golf."

The other new face in the Golf Manitoba office these days belongs to **John Lamarche**, who comes to the association after 30 years of service to the City of Winnipeg.

He completed his MBA degree in 1990 at the University of Manitoba and will

be responsible for management and financial accounting.

Lamarche has been a participant in several Manitoba golf events in the past and is a member of the Selkirk Golf and Country Club.

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Two new tournaments on schedule for men

Two new events have been added to the Golf Manitoba tournament calendar for male golfers in the 2005 season.

PROVINCIAL TEAM HANDICAP tournament replaces the former rural team handicap event. It will be played on the same format but teams can be entered from city as well as rural clubs.

The tournament requires clubs to enter four-member teams with the scores of each player to count, less 75 per cent of the team handicap. There must be one member from each of three handicap categories (0 to 10.9, 11 to 16.9 and 17 and over), with a fourth player from any group. The tournament is scheduled for Aug. 29 at Grand Pines.

MEN'S BEST BALL CHAMPIONSHIP is for two-member adult teams with the best score to count on each hole. Teams will be flighted by handicap and the maximum differential between team members handicap factors is 6.0. The tournament will be played June 25-26 at the Links at Quarry Oaks.

Blue Golf system provides on-line tournament entries

As part of the Blue Golf system adopted last season by Golf Manitoba, players can now register for tournaments on-line using a VISA or MASTERCARD through the Golf Manitoba website (www.golfmanitoba.mb.ca).

Players can establish player profiles through the Blue Golf system, including such profile items as tournament history of the individual, "what's in the bag?" and other items.

THE PREMIUM PLAYERS CLUB is a further service available with a minimal annual fee. This allows players to track in-depth statistics such as greens in regulation, fairways hit, putts per round or other details.

Level One Rules Program

The RCGA is implementing an educational program where persons interested can become certified rules officials through a four-level process. Each member club should have received a copy of the Level 1 CD Rom.

Golf Manitoba will conduct a Level One seminar May 9 and information is available at the Golf Manitoba office.

The Level One may also be done at home with a small examination done on-line.

Jill Hardy captures Golfer of the Year award

Niakwa golfer becomes fifth female to claim the honour

Also named to Canadian women's team

Jill Hardy had just a single regret in looking back on her outstanding golf season in 2004.

"I just wish I had played much better in Prince Albert at the National Amateur," said the 23-year-old from Niakwa. "It was cool and conditions were difficult, but I just didn't have it going that week."

Hardy was the only Manitoban to make the 54-hole cut, but was not a contender as veteran **Mary Ann Lapointe** of Ontario won the Canadian Women's Amateur Championship. Hardy started with a promising three-over-par 75, but faded out of the picture in the next three rounds.

That performance really didn't detract from the achievements that earned Hardy the 30th Labatt Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year Award.

She became only the fifth female shot-maker to receive the premier amateur golf honour in the province, following notables **Jo-Ann Lindsay** (2000), **Aileen Robertson** (1994), **Gail Anderson** (now Graham) (1983), and **Shauna Gechel** (now Butters) (1981).

"To be added to a class of golfers like that is marvellous," said Hardy, after the presentation at Golf Manitoba's annual general meeting last October at St. Boniface Golf Club. "I learned a lot from Jo-Ann in playing with her a number of times."

Hardy was a double provincial winner in 2004, capturing both the women's Manitoba Amateur championship and the women's Match Play title. Her late rally to beat **Stacey Bieber** of St. Charles in a playoff to win her second Amateur crown validates the premise that a long-odds comeback is always possible.

"You don't expect to make up four strokes in the last three holes of a major tournament," reflected Hardy. "But when I had a chance to force the playoff by making birdie on the 18th at Southwood, I had a feeling in my stomach that I was going to do it."

In the women's Match Play event, Hardy topped a 10-player field, winning three matches, 4 and 3 over **Annette Durica** of Niakwa, 1 up over **Judi Laidstone** of Elmhurst, and 6 and 5 over **Shelley Muir** of Breezy Bend in the final.

Later in the season, Hardy finished in 11th place and was the low amateur on the BMO Financial Group Canadian Women's Pro Tour. In pursuing a pharmacy degree at the University of Manitoba, she played on the Bison golf team and won two tournaments, the Concordia University Invitational and the Moorhead State Dragon Invitational.

One of Hardy's best 18-hole rounds of the year was a four-under-par 70 at St. Boniface, in leading Niakwa into second place in the Manitoba Women's Inter-club "A" Championship.

Beyond Manitoba borders, Hardy's potential has been recognized by the Royal Canadian Golf Association. In February this year, she was named to Canada's eight-women national golf team, to be guided by head coach **Dean Spriddle**. The team program encompasses fitness, sports psychology, technique development, and exposure to international competition.

The other finalists in the selection of the 2004 Golfer of the Year were two-time recipient **Garth Collings** of Breezy Bend, who was nominated for a 10th time, and **Scott Loewen** of Elmhurst.

Collings made the provincial Willingdon Cup team for an 11th time, in addition to repeating as Saskatchewan Mid-Amateur champion and finishing runner-up to **Jordan Krantz** in the men's Manitoba Amateur Championship. He also made the cut into match play at both the Canadian Amateur and Mid-Amateur Championships.

Loewen, 19, won the Manitoba Junior

Optimist title, and earned a position on two Manitoba interprovincial teams, the Willingdon Cup and the provincial Junior foursome. He was low Manitoban in the Canadian Junior Championship, and finished in the top ten in the BMO Financial Group Future Links Prairie Championship.

The selection panel singled out two other golfers, **Judi Lidstone** and **Jordan Krantz**, for honourable mention.

Lidstone was the runner-up in the Canadian Senior Women's Championship at Steinbach, and second in the Manitoba City and District Championship.

Krantz was an academic all-Southland conference in his senior year at the University of Texas at Arlington, led his university team in two intra-state tournaments, and his seven-under-par 65 in a Texas event was the third best round in golf history at his school.

Golf Hall of Fame adds 8 new inductees

The second annual induction ceremony for the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum last September increased the honoured membership to 12 athletes and four in the builder category.

The Manitoba Lotteries Commission played the host role in sponsoring the first two inductions, switching from the inaugural at the Club Regent Casino to the McPhillips Street Station in 2004.

June Bagley, Marj Edey, Marg Homenuik, Ted Homenuik, Merlene Netterfield and Bill Pidlaski joined the athletes in the golf shrine, while **Jack Blair** and **Arlin Walker** were elected as builders.

They join the initial group inducted when the Hall of Fame was launched in 2003: golfers **Allan Boes, Jimmy Doyle, Dan Halldorson, George Knudsen, Bobby Reith** and **Anne Tachan**, plus builders **Peggy Colonello** and **John Steel**.

June Bagley was the first Manitoba golfer, male or female, to win provincial

championships in three divisions — junior, amateur and senior. She added a city and district title, and played on 14 Manitoba teams, five amateur and nine in senior ranks.

Marj Edey won the Charleswood Golf Club women's championship an amazing 36 times, played on 15 Manitoba teams, and won five amateur and four Manitoba senior championships. She also chalked up six victories in the women's city and district championship.

Marg Homenuik had a sparkling record on the Manitoba golf scene from 1959 to 1977, before her career was cut short by arthritis in her hands. She was a six-time Manitoba amateur champion, including four in succession from 1961-64, added seven city and district titles, and played on 11 provincial amateur teams.

Ted Homenuik was a member of Manitoba's first winning Willingdon Cup team in 1974 along with **Steve Bannatyne, Barry McKenzie**, and **Gavin Speirs**. Another career highlight was two runner-up finishes in the men's Canadian Amateur Golf Championship. He won

the Manitoba amateur title three times and played on 13 Manitoba Willingdon Cup teams between 1957 and 1977.

Merlene Netterfield played on 18 provincial teams, nine amateur and nine senior. She joined **Marg Homenuik, Heather Lawrence**, and **Anne Tachan** on the only Manitoba foursome to win the Canadian women's amateur team championship in 1962. She won a total of 10 provincial junior, amateur and senior crowns, and five city and district titles.

Bill Pidlaski's career high point came in representing Canada twice in Americas Cup matches, in 1963 and '65. He won the Manitoba men's amateur championship twice, the senior title twice, was low amateur twice in the Manitoba Open, medallist in the Manitoba amateur five times, and played on 16 provincial teams, 10 amateur and six in senior ranks.

Jack Blair was a renowned golf official and administrator, serving as president of both the Manitoba Golf Association and the RCGA. He was active on the national rules committee and as a rules official at Manitoba and Canadian events. A tro-

phy perpetuating his name goes to the winner of the men's Manitoba Match Play tournament.

Aihlin Walker served as president of both the Manitoba and Canadian Ladies' Golf Associations, and a term on the World Amateur Golf Council. She was CLGA national course rating director for four years. Locally, she was vice-chair-

person of the du Maurier Classic at St. Charles in 1992 and had service on the board of the Xerox Manitoba Open.

Edey, Pidlaski and Blair were inducted posthumously last year, while all other new members attended the ceremony.

Future planning calls for a permanent home for the Golf Hall of Fame, but in the

meantime, the plaques in honour of the first 16 Hall of Fame inductees are on display at the Golf Manitoba office.

The deadline to submit nominations to the selection committee is April 30 each year. Forms are available on the Golf Manitoba website: (www.golfmanitoba.mb.ca).

Member Clubs may consider making cash donations, hosting pro-am tournaments or other fund-raising events and should honour outstanding members by submitting nominations.

The Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum has established the "Heritage Club" as the basis of all fund-raising. Funds raised through donations from individuals and corporations will go into the Heritage Club capital fund and will aid the Hall of Fame & Museum in accomplishing its objectives.

The short-term objectives are to be able to acknowledge the contributions and accomplishments made by Manitobans to the game of golf, and to elect and induct members in these categories. Long-term objectives are to arrange for funding and sponsorship to support the goals and objectives of the corporation. Ultimately the Heritage Club plans to establish and operate a place of honour for the members with a museum to relate to and display the Manitoba golf heritage.

All donors and contributors to the Heritage Club will be recognized at future induction events. Major donors and sponsors will be designated a place of honour in the Hall of Fame where their names will be placed on a special plaque appropriately called the "Leader Board" to say thank you for the support they have provided.

Names will appear on the Leader Board in the appropriate category based on donations as follows: Diamond, \$7,500 and over; Platinum, \$5,000 and over; Gold, \$2,500 and over; Silver, \$1,000 and over; and Bronze, \$500 and over.

What's new on the Manitoba golf scene for 2005

18-hole course set for next year at Lac du Bonnet; 3-hole concept to be introduced this summer in Winnipeg

There's always something new going on or coming up on the ever-changing Manitoba golf scene.

- Ranging all the way from complete new golf courses to some fine-tuning on existing layouts, from clubhouse renovations to the opening of new facilities for golf equipment, every year there are a number of changes.

This year's edition of *What's New* has a wide variety of subjects to hear about and discuss.

Perhaps the biggest item on this year's agenda is the building of a brand new 18-hole golf course with construction well under way and an anticipated opening for the 2006 season. There's also a lot of attention on a new three-hole project going into operation this year, a nine-hole addition that was opened late last season and is ready for its first full season, other course renovations in progress or planned, some clubhouse and pro shop news and some changes on the retail golf scene.

Here are the *What's New* items that caught our interest as we look to the start of another interesting season of golf in Manitoba.

GRANITE HILLS GOLF COURSE AND ESTATES

This is the biggest of this year's new items and it won't actually come into play until the 2006 season, but work has proceeded to the stage that golfers can begin to make plans to include a trip in their future planning.

The golf course and housing development is under construction at the junction of the Lee River and Lake Lac du Bonnet, north-east of the town of Lac du Bonnet. Developers describe the location as a 90-minute drive from Winnipeg.

The course is being billed as "the Pebble Beach of the North" and the developers boast that the third hole has the same characteristics as the famous No. 18 at Pebble Beach, dog-legging around the shoreline of the lake and playing to a green situated at the edge of that water. Four other holes (15th, 16th, 17th and 18th) also play along the lake shore.

The course will also feature large outcroppings of granite, elevation changes of 60 feet or more and tall stands of birch, jack pine, ash, oak and poplar trees. There will be four tees on every hole to accommodate all classes of golfer and there is also consideration of adding another set of shorter tees for youngsters.

The course will be in the range of 7,000 yards from the championship tees and will play down to about 5,300 yards from the forward tees.

Tom Watson, vice-president and and treasurer **Norm Labossiere** both are enthusiastic in their descriptions of the project and are particularly anxious to get the course into operation. They are two of a dozen investors involved with the project.

It had been hoped to open in 2005, but last summer's weather conditions caused some delays and it is now planned to be ready for 2006.

They are also enthusiastic about the surrounding building lots and have reported nearly 60 per cent of the 138 lots were sold going into this spring. The fully-treed lots are 20,000 to 30,000 square feet and about 50 them have golf course frontage.

Plans for the first clubhouse for the course are modest, a building of about 2,500 square feet, but the eventual plans call for a much larger structure to be situated on a large rock outcropping about 75 feet above the ninth green and overlooking Lake Lac du Bonnet.

The main emphasis is placed on the golf course and the developers are hopeful more favourable weather conditions will prevail this summer so the opening of this new layout can become a reality in 2006. Golfers will be anxious to give it a try.

GOLF 3 - 4 - 5

It's a small name for a small course, but Terry Hashimoto is expecting big things from this addition to his Champions Nest Training Centre just west of the West Perimeter Highway and south of Roblin Boulevard.

The concept is quite simple. It's a three-hole golf course, featured one par-three, one par-four and one par-five hole which will afford golfers opportunities to play every type of shot one could encounter on a regulation golf course.

The three holes measure 200, 420 and 520 yards and each also features a tee box every 10 yards to vary the distances.

"Every golf hole eventually becomes a par-three," Hashimoto says. "This allows you to play each hole to that par-three stage. I'm sure this facility can become a feeder system to bring more golfers into the picture and I expect this idea will spread to other areas."

One of the driving forces that

pushed Hashimoto to his three-hole plan was his personal displeasure with the slow play on golf courses in these times.

"Golf has been on a decline for the last three years," he said, "and much of it is because many insist on playing from the wrong tee boxes and they don't play the right shots. I hope this 3-4-5 concept can help to cure some of that."

He also sees the three-hole concept as a popular idea for those who want to play but don't have three or four hours to spend at it. Players can have a quick three holes in the morning, at lunch time or in the evening. He expects it will become a good teaching facility and he sees the opportunity for corporate outings over the layout.

Champions Nest features 120 hitting stations and practice and training sessions. There is also a putting green and areas to practice bunker and greenside shots.

WILLOW CREEK GOLF FOR HER

When **Karen Sparrow** had more than a little frustration when she was looking for women's golf apparel and equipment, she decided to do something about it. That's how Willow Creek Golf for Her came into existence at the end of March last year at Unit 11 – 584 Pembina Highway, just north of Grant Avenue.

The well-equipped store is designed as a one-stop shop for women's golf, including equipment, fashions, footwear, accessories and gift items and Sparrow intends to provide female golfers with everything they need. She has even started a "gift registry" program, where women can have their preferences and size information recorded to assist friends or husbands with their gift shopping.

Willow Creek is involved in a number of women's golf activities, including a winter golf league on golf simulators at Tee Off

Sports Lounge and a winter golf school at Southside Golf Course. Sparrow was involved with the CLGA Girls Club in 2004 and expects that involvement to grow this year.

Tournament involvement includes the Troy Westwood Breath of Life Classic for Cystic Fibrosis at Breezy Bend, the Women Business Owners of Manitoba annual tournament at Southside, the Casinos of Winnipeg Pink Ribbon Ladies Classic at Niakwa, the Whyte Ridge Ladies Classic at Wildewood and the Women in the Ruff tournament at Carman.

A new tournament for Willow Creek this year will be a mother/daughter event planned in May at Southside. The store held its first annual fall fashion show in November at the Wildewood Club and a repeat is planned this year.

THE GOLF SHOP/GOLF DOME

When **Curtis Gray** took over the operation of The Golf Dome in November, 2001, he knew there would be some changes along the way. In the fall of 2003, the inflated "bubble" was replaced along with other improvements to the big indoor facility.

In November 2004, Gray made the next big step, opening The Golf Shop as an integral part of the operation, taking over the space formerly occupied by the Caddy Shed.

The Golf Shop has been completely remodelled and features attractive displays of various lines of equipment. The featured equipment line is DeLaCruz, which is an exclusive line for the store. Several other brands of equipment are also available along with a varied selection of golf clothing and custom-fit shoes. **Linda Currie** has taken on the duties of merchandise manager and **Brad Reimer** has become head professional for the CPGA-approved training facility at The Dome.

NIAKWA COUNTRY CLUB

An ambitious program of course renovations is being undertaken at Niakwa Country Club, with work scheduled to begin in May. The project is designed mainly to improve drainage on many of the holes.

Club president **Brad King** reports drainage engineers will be involved in much of the work in conjunction with **Doug Carrick**, an eastern course architect who has worked on other Stanley Thompson courses.

One of the major alterations at Niakwa will see the second hole moved to the east and become a 175-yard par-three. This will enable an enlargement of the club's practice fairway and improve golfer safety in that area.

Another major change will see a new tee to lengthen the long par-three 15th hole into a par-four, though golfers will have the option to continue to play it as a par-three if desired. Some additional lengthening will be done on a few other holes to add some 200 yards to the course's overall length.

MINNEDOSA COUNTRY CLUB

The work was completed last year and local members got to try it out late in the season, but the new nine holes at the picturesque Minnedosa Golf Club will see its first full season this year.

The new back nine measures 3,355 yards on the blue tees, along with 3,097 on the original front nine for a total of 6,452 yards. The distance drops down to 6,202 from the white tees and 5,451 from the red tees.

Pro **Chris Worley** reports those who got to play the new holes last fall were favourably impressed and he anticipates there will be wide interest from golfers across the province to play the new 18-hole layout.

THE MEADOWS AT EAST ST. PAUL

This newest 18-hole course in the Winnipeg area saw some action on one nine last season, but won't be fully into operation until later this year. It is expected to have nine holes in play at the start of the season with the other nine to be opened later in the summer.

The course is tied in with the Larters at St. Andrews club and executive pro **Peter Ewert** has announced the head pro duties at the two clubs will be taken over by **Geoff Kehler** at Larters and **Jason Sweeney** at the Meadows.

The par-72 Meadows layout is located just outside the North Perimeter Highway east of Lagimodiere Blvd. (Highway 59).

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Development program continues to expand

Golf Manitoba's player development program continues to expand with new and better ways to help golfers in the province improve.

Garth Goodbrandson is going into his eighth season as the association's director of player development and he's proud to say the program isn't resting on past successes.

"We're always exploring new areas and looking for ways to expand our development programs for the benefit of the Manitoba golfers," he said. "We have been fortunate to be involved with several RCGA seminars and also to work with many of the Canadian and Manitoba pros."

The "we" in Goodbrandson's vocabulary refers to **Derek Ingram**, who operates the Golf Central facility and handles contract work through Golf Manitoba to assist in many of Goodbrandson's development programs. Goodbrandson and Ingram also serve as co-coaches for the University of Manitoba golf team.

"Derek is very passionate about golf and

he is very committed to our programs, so we work pretty well as a team," Goodbrandson said.

The Golf Manitoba player development programs feature the presentation of multi-day camps for junior boys and girls as well as for adult men and women. New initiatives in the program include a men's mental game seminar, a women's physical fitness program and a parent seminar, all of which were well attended in 2004.

Another new item last year was a successful Future Links clinic held in August at Golf Central, established through a partnership of Golf Manitoba, McDonalds Restaurants, the Optimist Club of Manitoba and the University of Manitoba golf team. More than 110 boys and girls between the ages of 5 and 12 participated. Plans are under way to expand this program.

Goodbrandson also plans further on-course sessions with adult golfers to augment the classroom studies, more regional junior golf camps and introduction of regional camps for women.

On the university front, Goodbrandson is proud of the progress made in the development of the University of Manitoba golf teams.

"We're getting more interest and I'm pleased because we are keeping more of our good young golfers at home with the attraction of continuing with golf while furthering education without having to seek scholarships and opportunities from schools in the United States," he said.

The 2004 season was the fifth season for the U of M men's golf team and there has been improvement each year. The team

highlight for the season was finishing third at the RCGA/CIS national championship in Ontario. Tyler Mancini qualified to represent Canada at the 2004 World University Games in Thailand and placed 32nd in that event.

The Manitoba men's teams placed first and seventh in a field of 14 teams at Concordia, fifth among 19 teams at Bemidji, second and eighth in a field of 17 teams in the Irv Kaiser Invitational, eighth among 22 teams at the Twin Cities Classic and eighth among 14 teams at the University of Victoria tournament.

The U of M women's team, was led by Golfer of the Year Jill Hardy, who had two first-place and two second-place finishes as the team placed first, second, fourth, sixth and ninth in five competitions.

With the success of the University program and the continuing growth of the player development programs, it comes as no surprise that both Goodbrandson and Ingram have been recognized by their peers. Both won honours as national Junior Leaders in the past — Garth in 1999 and Derek in 2003 and Ingram also captured Teacher of the Year honours the same year.



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Loewen, Troop take top honours In Optimist Junior championship

While the annual Manitoba Optimist Junior Open golf championship attracts major attention, it is just one of several programs in support of golf sponsored each year by the Optimist International organization.

The 2005 edition of the Junior Open event is scheduled for June 11 and 12 at the Larters at St. Andrews Golf and Country Club and the St. Boniface Golf Club and officials anticipate a full entry for the popular event.

Scott Loewen of Elmhurst and **Kaitlin Troop** of the Wheat City club in Brandon emerged as the major winners in the 2004 event. As the overall male and female winners in the age 16-18 division, they earned the right to represent Manitoba at the Optimist World International Championship in Florida.

Following Loewen in the boys 16-18 class were **Michael Goldberg** and **Jonathan Weigner**, while Troop won out over **Ashlen Christie** and **Sarah Stebeleski** in the girls 16-18 group.

Cody MacAulay topped the boys 14-15 age class ahead of **Riley Unger** and **Joey McInnes**. The girls 14-15 group was won by **Brittney Piche**, with **Erin Goldberg** the runner-up.

In the boys 12-13 age division, the winner was **Brock Helgeson**, followed by **Burke Wiebe** and **Austin Steinberger**. **Tasia Zuk** was the winner in the girls 12-13 group.

As in the past, there will be numerous prizes awarded in all three age groups when the 2005 tournament is played June 11 and 12. The entry fee is \$60 to cover two rounds of golf and lunch, with each player also receiving a tee gift of a Ben Hogan backpack completed with golf accessories valued at \$50.

The top male and female players in the 16-18 divisions will again earn the right to represent the province at the Optimist World competition in Florida in July. Six qualifying players representing the three age groups will participate in the Canadian Optimist Junior Golf National Championship to be held in Ingersoll, ON, in August.

The 13th annual Canadian Optimist championship event played last August at Ingersoll attracted a record field of 235 young golfers in six age divisions. Ontario golfers won the overall titles in the event and Manitoba's **Riley Unger** finished third in the boys 14-15 division.

The national event in Ontario and the international competition in Florida are the headline events for Optimists International as the organization follows its slogan: Friends of Youth. There are almost 124,000 members, men and women, belonging to more than 3,900 clubs around the world.

On the local scene, Optimists raise the funding for the golf program through the Optim-UM Golf Tournament to be played June

21 at Larters at St. Andrews. Money raised will be earmarked for the University of Manitoba golf program, the Golf Manitoba junior program, bantam clinics and the Optimist Junior Championships.

The Manitoba Optimist Junior Golf Committee is a major contributor and supporter of the golf program at the University of Manitoba. Proceeds from the 2005 tournament will go to the U of M to help underwrite the costs of this program.

The University of Manitoba golf program enables athletes in Manitoba to continue developing their abilities in golf while receiving a quality education at an affordable cost here at home.

At the Optim-UM tournament, many of the U of M Bison Gold golf team players will be on hand to assist and will also provide instruction at the McDonald's Small Fry clinics for ages 5-12 years at Golf Central.

Manitoba Optimist Junior Open Golf Championship

The Manitoba Optimist Junior Open Golf Championship attracts junior golfers from all parts of the Province of Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario. The 16-18 year old male and female winners will win the right to represent Manitoba at the prestigious Optimist World International Championship in Florida, USA, in July, 2005. Additional prizes will be awarded in all three age groups.

Five young golfers have been selected to receive \$1,000 scholarships from the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund.

The 2004 recipients are **Robert Hardy** of Niakwa, **Matthew Johnston** of St. Charles, **Scott Markham** of Niakwa, **Kyle Scott** of Elmhurst and **Christin Thomson** of Kitchen Creek, Fort Frances.

The board also announced that a **Glen Hnatiuk Scholarship award** has been implemented and this year's recipient is **Ryan Rawluk** of Breezy Bend.

Since its inception the fund has been accumulating a capital fund and has awarded 96 scholarships to worthy recipients who have participated in the Manitoba golf community and who have demonstrated scholastic excellence. In the last number of years, scholarships have been in the amount of \$1,000. It is the board's hope that the capital fund can be steadily augmented so that both the number of scholarships and the amount of each can be increased.

The Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund is a registered charity, the object of which is to provide financial assistance to young

golfers entering or continuing in a post-secondary educational institution.

The undertaking of the Fund is restricted to: "The provision of periodic scholarships to younger golfers of either gender, resident in Manitoba and Northwest Ontario, for the advancement and furtherance of such person's education ... and the receipt, accumulation and disbursement of funds for this purpose."

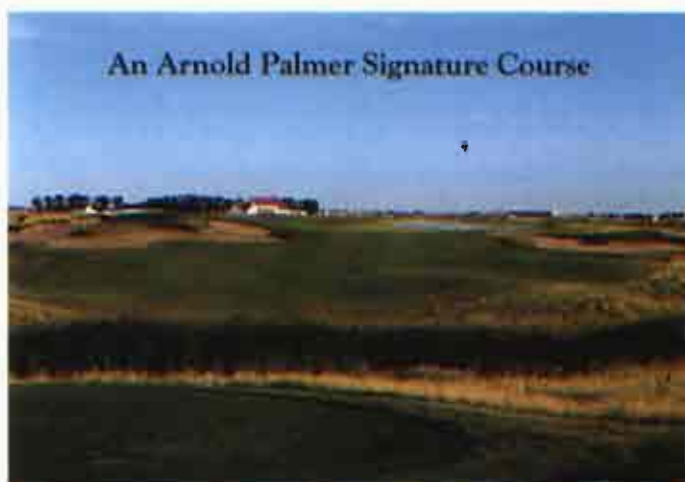
There are no administrative or other charges against the fund. The earnings of the fund are used exclusively for the granting of scholarships.

The Fund has been greatly assisted in building its Capital Fund through the generosity of Golf Manitoba, various golf clubs and other organizations and individuals.

The scholarship fund is managed by a volunteer board of directors which includes **Rudy Boivin** and **Dorelle Fulton** of Southwood, **Bob Forcand** of Breezy Bend, **Bob Goodwin** of Niakwa, **Dennis Cangrell** of South Interlake, **Jim Scollan** and **Rob MacDonald** of Elmhurst and **Dave Comaskey** of Golf Manitoba.

Individuals are encouraged to include the Golf Scholarship Fund among gift-giving considerations. A direct contribution will yield a tax-deductible receipt. Persons wishing to honour someone or make a memorial donation are asked to consider the fund as one of the charities of choice.

Club members are asked to take the message back to boards and committees for assistance. Some clubs have made direct contributions to the scholarship fund. Others have included the fund in yearly assessments or as part of specific tournaments. Persons interested in donating or applying for a golf scholarship



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Membership categories defined

Membership in Golf Manitoba also provides membership in the Royal Canadian Golf Association. The different categories of membership are determined by the national governing body. In general, the definitions of and requirements for membership are the same for each organization as set out here:

TYPE OF MEMBERSHIPS

Member Club (Private or Semi-Private Golf Club with real estate)

A Member Club is formed by members who pay annual dues at a private or semi-private golf course to support club operating expenses with the intent of those members playing regularly on that course.

Each individual member must pay to the club annual dues required by Golf Manitoba and the RCGA. By reason of its membership, the club undertakes to remit these dues promptly to Golf Manitoba. The provincial association and the RCGA then will issue membership/handicap cards to the golf club.

A golf club not remitting the dues for each individual member of that club will have its membership suspended.

Players Club (A Club without real estate)

A Players club is comprised of an organized group of 10 or more golfers in a close geographical region which meets the definition of an RCGA golf club, and will play together regularly at one golf course or a variety of golf courses and do not have to be based at one golf course.

Such a club does not own, lease, manage, operate or control a golf course. It must establish the appropriate committees and otherwise meet all criteria set out for member clubs. Each individual member must pay to the club annual dues required by Golf Manitoba and the RCGA. By reason of its membership, the club undertakes to remit these dues promptly to Golf Manitoba. The provincial association and the RCGA/CLGA then will issue membership/handicap cards to the golf club.

A golf club not remitting the dues for each individual member of that club will have its membership suspended.

Member Facility (A public golf facility without members)

Membership is available for public golf facilities. While such a facility may have one or more Players golf clubs operating on its premises, the facility itself must become a member of Golf Manitoba in order to avail itself of the various programs and services of the provincial golf association.

A facility membership does not permit the distribution of RCGA membership/handicap cards by the owners or operators of such a facility.

As an amalgamated entity, Golf Manitoba cannot permit private and semi-private clubs to select male only or female only membership. It is Golf Manitoba's policy that clubs must collect and remit dues for ALL members.



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SOGGY CONDITIONS FOR TWO NATIONAL EVENTS

Visitors heap praise on superintendents for their efforts

Two national tournaments were staged in Manitoba in 2004, and when they were completed the participants at both locations bestowed their major plaudits on the course superintendents — **Ian Martinusen** of Breezy Bend and **Rob Fast** at Steinbach.

The two supers and their crews had to cope with torrential rains that saturated their courses in late August, when the men's Canadian Mid-Amateur was held at Breezy Bend, and the Royale National Senior Women's Championship at Steinbach.

Frank Van Dornick of Camrose, Alta., who won the Mid-Amateur, was virtually amazed at how Martinusen made Breezy Bend playable.

"The whole course looked like Lake Winnipeg at one point in the week," he remarked. "Like most of the field, I was ready to pack my bags and forget about it for this year."

Somehow, with pumps and drainage tubing all over the course, a golf course emerged from the swamp, and after only a one-day setback, the Mid-Amateur was played to a finish. Minor miracle? Close to it.

Fast had to cope with a deluge of rainfall that was less severe at Steinbach, but like the soggy problems at Breezy Bend, it required overtime attention by his staff to provide a most acceptable track.

Alison Murdoch of Victoria, who won the Senior women's national crown for the second time in three years, had lavish praise for the Steinbach greenskeeping crew. "I couldn't believe how beautifully manicured it was around the greens, in spite of all the rain," she said.

Mark Brewer of Pickering, Ont., who shot five-under-par 70-69-139 and **Tom Studer** of Joliet, Ill., with 72-67-139, splashed their way around Breezy Bend to earn the 36-hole medallist honours in the Mid-Amateur. New Brunswick won the team title by one stroke over Ontario.

The Manitoba team of **Mike Walker** of St. Boniface, plus **Brian Katchmoski**, **John Mullam** and **Gary Kullman** of Elmhurst, finished in seventh place, and all failed to qualify for the 32-player five-round match play.

Six Manitoba golfers did advance, led by **Brent Armstrong** of St. Charles at four-under-par 71-69-140, defending Canadian champion **Garth Collings** at 74-67-141, plus **Tom Humniski** of Elmhurst carding 143, **Graham Zakaluk** of Breezy Bend at par 144, **Mark Starodub** of Pinawa 146, and **Russ Slobodian** of Rossmore 147.

That was the end of the local story, however, as all six went down to first-round match play defeats. In defense of his title, Collings started well enough against **Randall Oka** of Montreal, and had a 1-up lead after nine holes. But Oka threw four birdies at Collings on the back nine and won 2 and 1.

Van Dornick, who lost to Collings in the 2003 final in Regina, hoisted the trophy this time, beating **Alex Lauzon** of Montreal 1 up in the 18-hole closing match. A birdie four on the 560-yard 15th at Breezy Bend made the difference in Van Dornick's favor, as they halved the last three holes.

At Steinbach, the 54-year-old Murdoch won the Senior women's crown, posting rounds of 76-73-75-228, but a major Manitoba highlight was provided by **Judi Lidstone** of Elmhurst, who carded 77-78-76-231 over 54 holes, finishing three strokes back as the runner-up.

"To finish second in a national event is a really big thrill for me," said Lidstone. "The wind was strong and gusty in the final round, and though we could lift, clean and place, it was very wet and you didn't get much roll on the fairways."

Marilyn O'Connor and **Diane Williams**, both of Calgary, were third and fourth at 232 and 233, followed by **Cathy McMillan** of Ponoka, Alta., at 234, and **Jane Kirkpatrick** of Woodbridge, Ont., at 236.

Four-time Manitoba Amateur champion **Lynda Palahniuk**, who now lives in Kelowna, was not in contention at 243, but her birdie on the second playoff hole won the team title for British Columbia after tying with Alberta.

Manitoba's team of **Betty Ann Houde** and **Bonnie Stephenson** of Niakwa, **Noreen Stewart** of Southwood and **Yow Kangi** of Rossmore finished in seventh place. A total of 15 Manitoba golfers competed in a field of 69 entries.

Tony Feheregyhazi heads Superintendents association

Bridges Golf Club superintendent **Tony Feheregyhazi** was elected president of the Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association at the annual general meeting held in November at the Victoria Inn in Winnipeg.

He succeeds **Dave Turner** of Falcon Lake Golf Course, who held the post for the past two years and remains on the board of directors as past president. **Dave Tkachuk** of The Wildewood Club, was named vice-president and other members of the board include: **Dan Ciekiewicz** of Elmhurst Golf and Country Club, **Darren Kalyniuk** of St. Boniface Golf Club, **Tom Kowalchuk** of Glendale Golf and Country Club, **Mike Trager** of Virden Well View Golf Club and **Todd Thompson** of Even Spray Chemicals (commercial). **Bob Hamm** is the executive director.

Ian Martinusen, course superintendent at Breezy Bend Country Club, has moved up to the president's chair of the Canadian Golf Course Superintendents Association and **Greg Holden** of Clear Lake Golf Course is the provincial representative to the national body.

Self-promotion is president's goal

As **Tony Feheregyhazi** takes over the presidency of the Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association he expects the organization will continue to focus major attention on environment and safety issues, but he also hopes his fellow members can do more to educate the golfers about their duties.

At age 39, Feheregyhazi has spent more than of his life working around golf courses so he knows a little about the subject. He began his career at age 18 while still in school working on the greens at Niakwa Country Club under superintendent **Jim Barr**. He spent 11 years at Niakwa and during that time he completed a short course in Saskatchewan then received his Turfgrass diploma at Fairview College in Alberta in 1995.

Feheregyhazi moved to Falcon Lake in 1996 and spent three seasons there before moving on to the Bridges Golf Course near Starbuck as the growing superintendent, working with architect **David Wagner**. He stayed on as the course superintendent when the course opened. He was chosen as the association's Superintendent of the Year in 2002.

"Environment is always a key issue for our organization," he said. "We are constantly re-addressing our environmental checklist and we have a responsible self-assessing administration program with a comprehensive manual. And, of course, we can never do too much to ensure safety in our handling of material and equipment."

But, while he hopes to steer the membership along those familiar roads, he also wants to see his fellow superintendents move further into the spotlight to let everyone know just what the superintendent's duties entail.

"We (MGSA) had a booth at the recent golf show at the Convention Centre and I was dumfounded about how little the public knows about us," he said. "Most of the golfing public has no idea what a golf course superintendent does and what the job entails. They think we 'cut grass' for a living."

Ciekiewicz and Tkachuk on newsletter; Trager on education and scholarships; Thompson and Turner on turf research and course selection for meetings; Kalyniuk and Tkachuk on the Prairie Turfgrass Conference and competitions; Kowalchuk on environment; and Feheregyhazi on public relations and long-range planning.

It got him wondering who to blame for this and came to the conclusion it isn't really anyone's fault.

"As a whole, golf course superintendents seem to be very humble people and do not mind to be the unseen heroes of the game," he noted. "The average golfer just doesn't realize that everything we do pertains to their game of golf."

"Does Joe Golfer know that the birdie he made at noon on 11 is in part due to someone changing that pin, fixing 20 ball marks and having that green cut all before his alarm clock rang? Probably not. The real question is: how do we change this?"

"Well, maybe we need to stop and talk to a golfer for a few minutes, look more professional at work (something that I could stand to improve on), ask your pros and marshals when complimented on course conditions to give credit to the maintenance department, start a newsletter and/or a bulletin board at your facility are just a few suggestions."

"Maybe this summer as MGSA members we should all try to do just one thing to promote our profession and ourselves. Like my mother says 'it can't hurt to try' and maybe, just maybe, the golfing public will be less apt to think of us as a moving target when they see us zip by on our cart."

Maybe some of the golfers can learn something from Feheregyhazi's musings and help bring the work of the course superintendents into the spotlight.

The new MGSA president had one more thought as he got back to the business of getting things ready for a new season – a thought that all golfers will join in:

"One can only hope and pray that Mother Nature is kinder to us in 2005 than she was in 2004," he said.

Amen to that, say the golfers.

Turfgrass tournament has raised \$105,000

It was a rare sunny day that greeted 120 players for the 2004 edition of the MGSA's annual Turfgrass Research Tournament played Aug. 13 at Bel Acres Golf and Country Club. Course superintendent **Mark Jordan** and his staff had the course in great shape in spite of the wet, cool conditions through last year's "summer that never was".

Andy Cromarty and his team from the Selkirk Golf and Country Club made up the winning team in the four-man scramble format. Prizes were also awarded to individual golfers for competitions such as the longest and straightest drives. The hole-in-one contest featured three holes that offered hopes of seeing contestants win travel vouchers valued at \$7,500.

The 22nd annual Turfgrass Research tournament is scheduled this season for Friday, Aug. 12 at the Bridges Golf Course near Starbuck.

Amateur golfers from across the province are invited to participate in this year's tournament. Entry fee for a four-person team is \$500, which includes 18 holes of golf, tee prizes, shared power cart, lunch, banquet dinner and opportunities to win team and individual prizes. Space is limited to 36 teams.

Over the past 21 years, the tournament has raised more than \$105,000 for a variety of research projects in Canada and contributed positively to the betterment of golf courses in Manitoba. Without the funding raised through this tournament, Manitoba golf course superintendents could not have made use of the many innovations that have resulted in the superior turfgrass conditions enjoyed by all Manitoba golfers.

Turf research supported by the MGSA has led to such improvements as the introduction of new varieties of turfgrass that are tolerant to the lower cut heights demanded by most golfers today.

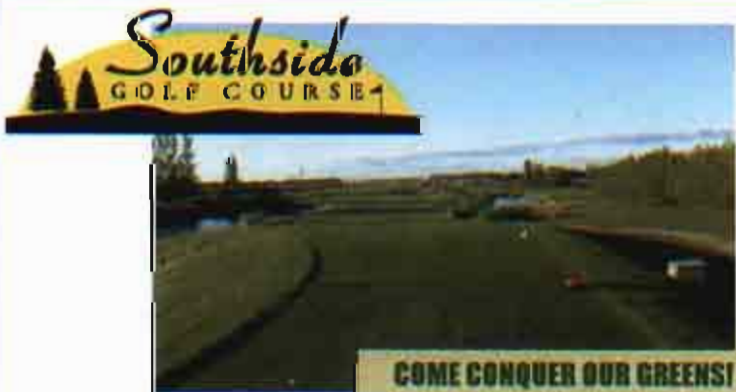

It's a sideline he enjoys, but there's no question about where his first love is. He is a golf pro, through and through, and he looks forward to his term as president of the Manitoba PGA.

Dave Scinocca captures Player of Year award

Dave Scinocca needed a couple of playoff wins as he captured the Player of the Year honours as the Manitoba Division of the Canadian Professional Golfers Association handed out awards for the 2004 season.

Scinocca, a Brandon native from the Northern Pines Golf Course, had to win a playoff over **Dave McMillan** of Golf Central and the Transcona Golf Club for the Golfer of the Year title when the pair tied with a total of 60 points earned in their best four tournament results for the season.

Rob Doucette of Southside Golf Course was next in line in the Golfer of the Year chase with 58 points. He was followed by **Emerson Mahoney** of Niakwa Country Club and **Steve Witiuk** of Tuxedo Golf Courses, both with 54, then **Jason Duncan** of Portage Golf Club with 53.

Scinocca also needed a playoff victory over Duncan to register a victory in the Manitoba PGA championship tournament at Rossmere.

Scinocca was also named Assistant Pro player of the year to complete a successful season.

He was also one of 12 professionals who represented Manitoba in the Titleist Cup team matches with pros from Saskatchewan late in the season. Others on the Manitoba team were: **Adam Boge** of St. Boniface, **Rob Doucette** of Southside, **Jason Duncan** of Portage, **Barry Gibson** of McGibby's Golf, **Dave Gray** of Hecla, **Stan Homeniuk** of Dauphin, **Emerson Mahoney** of Niakwa, **Michel Pilon** of Lorette, **Al Scott** of Grand Pines, **Steve Witiuk** of Tuxedo and **Steve Wood** of Kitchen Creek.

Last year, the overnight stop was at Gimli's Lakeview Resort and the courses were Sandy Hook, Hecla and Links at the Lake.

The other packages all include two-night stays at Super 8 establishments at Dauphin, Morden and Beausejour.

Westward Bound includes golf at Neepawa, Gilbert Plains and Clear Lake, with accommodation at Dauphin.

Big Sky Country features golf at Killarney Lakeside, Minnewasta and Carman, with accommodation at Morden.

Eastern Magic takes in golf at Quarry Oaks, Pinawa and Grand Pines, with accommodation at Beausejour.

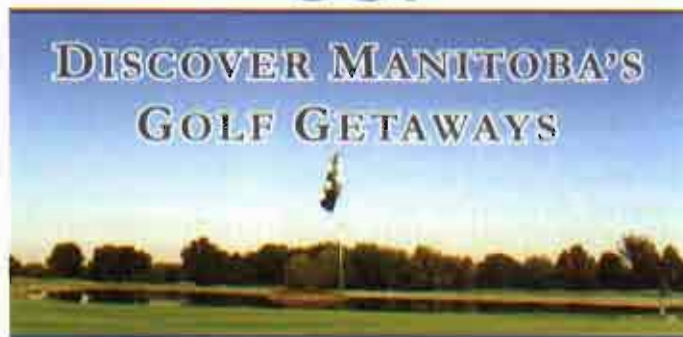
The self-drive three-day packages range in price from \$199 to \$259 per person, which covers green fees and power carts for three rounds of golf, two nights accommodation and continental breakfasts at the Super 8 locations. All rates are based on double occupancy. Arrangements can be made for individuals or for groups.

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RCGA/CLGA merger gets formal approval

Turfgrass programs boosted; further donations announced

The Royal Canadian Golf Association (RCGA) general membership voted to approve a merger with the Canadian Ladies' Golf Association (CLGA) at the annual general meeting in January in Victoria, BC. This concluded a formal agreement by both organizations to create one unified body governing golf in Canada.

Last spring, both the CLGA and RCGA Board of Directors accepted the merger agreement pending membership approval at their respective annual general meetings. The CLGA voted unanimously in agreement to merge with the RCGA at the annual general meeting last November.

"Both associations have worked hard to get to this point and we are looking forward to the future as a unified organization governing golf in Canada," said **David Shaw**, outgoing RCGA President. "By sharing our resources and expertise, we will be able to better serve our members and further our mutual goal of protecting and growing the game of golf in Canada."

"This is a historic moment for women's golf in Canada," said CLGA president **Carole Mix**. "I know our membership is excited about our future and we believe that it is not only women's golf that will benefit but that the entire game will thrive under this new mandate."

"In addition to the merger, a women's division has been created with the RCGA to maintain and expand existing services for women's golf in Canada."

In a ceremony following acceptance of the merger **James J.A. Halliday** of Victoria, B.C. was inducted as the 100th

president of the RCGA. Halliday succeeds **Shaw** while **Wayne Petersen** of Lethbridge, AB, becomes first vice-president and **Garry West** of Kitchener, Ont. becomes second vice-president.

The RCGA also donated \$75,000 to the Canadian Turfgrass Research Foundation (CTRF). The cheque was presented during the RCGA's annual general meeting. Over the last 12 years the RCGA has donated a total of \$885,000 to the CTRF.

The Canadian Turfgrass Research Foundation funds turfgrass and environmental research at various universities

and research facilities across Canada. The foundation's goal is to reduce maintenance requirements by improving turfgrass species and management practices. The program has funded numerous research projects at six different Canadian universities and research facilities across Canada.

The RCGA also made the following donations: \$1 million to RCGA Foundation, \$150,000 to Future Links, \$50,000 to Canadian Golf Hall of Fame, \$20,000 to Provincial Grants and \$28,000 to RCGA Internship Program.

Wilf Homeniuk to Golf Hall of Fame

A former Winnipegger and a golfer with ties to Manitoba have been named as the 2005 inductees into the Canadian Golf Hall of Fame.

The Royal Canadian Golf Association and The Canadian Golf Hall of Fame and Museum have announced that **Wilfred (Wilf) Homeniuk** and **Robert (Bob) Panasik** will be inducted this year.

Homeniuk becomes the fourth Manitoban to be inducted into the Canadian Golf Hall of Fame. **Dan Halldorson** and **George Knudson** were previously honoured as golfers, while **John B. Steel** was recognized in the builder category for his work in organizing the golf course superintendents organizations in Manitoba and Canada.

Homeniuk, a native of Kamsack, SK, and former Winnipeg golfer, comes from one of Canada's most famous golfing families. His parents John and Mary Homeniuk had seven boys, all of whom played a role in the Canadian golfing community. Wilf and his brothers Ted and Stan were each successful competitors in prairie golf competitions during the 50's and 60's.

In 1962, Homeniuk became nationally recognized when he finished as the low Canadian at the Canadian Open at Club de golf Laval-sur-le-Lac, Que. Overall, Homeniuk amassed eight international professional victories and earned two CPGA Tour Championship titles in 1965 and 1971. While playing on the PGA Tour, Homeniuk competed in 99 events placing in the top-10 eleven times.

He won the Manitoba Amateur championship twice, in 1956 and 1957, and was winner of the Manitoba Open in 1972. Panasik of Windsor, Ont., was a regular compellitor on the Canadian Tour and won the Manitoba Open championship in 1986 at Southwood.

Homeniuk's induction is planned for Sept. 24 at Glendale Golf & Country Club in Winnipeg, while Essex Golf & Country Club in Windsor, Ont., is set to host Panasik's induction Sept. 17. involving the operation of tournaments in Canada, the United States and Mexico.

A two-time World Cup champion, Halldorson is a 30-year veteran of the association, a multiple winner on the PGA Tour and was inducted into the Canadian Golf Hall of Fame in 2002 and Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame in 2003.

In a distinguished professional career that has spanned three decades, Halldorson won seven times on the Canadian Tour including the 1986 CPGA Championship and spent 16 years on the PGA Tour with wins at the 1986 Deposit Guaranty Classic and the 1980 Pensacola Open.

He was a four-time winner of the Manitoba Open golf championship in 1977, 1978, 1982 and 1983.

The Tournament Players' Association is the governing body of the Canadian Professional Golf Tour and part of the International Federation of PGA Tours. The association represents a membership of 250 Canadian and International tournament professionals with an alumnus that has included Masters champion **Mike Weir**, **Stuart Appleby**, **Chris DiMarco**, **Steve Stricker**, **Craig Perry** and **Tim Herron**.

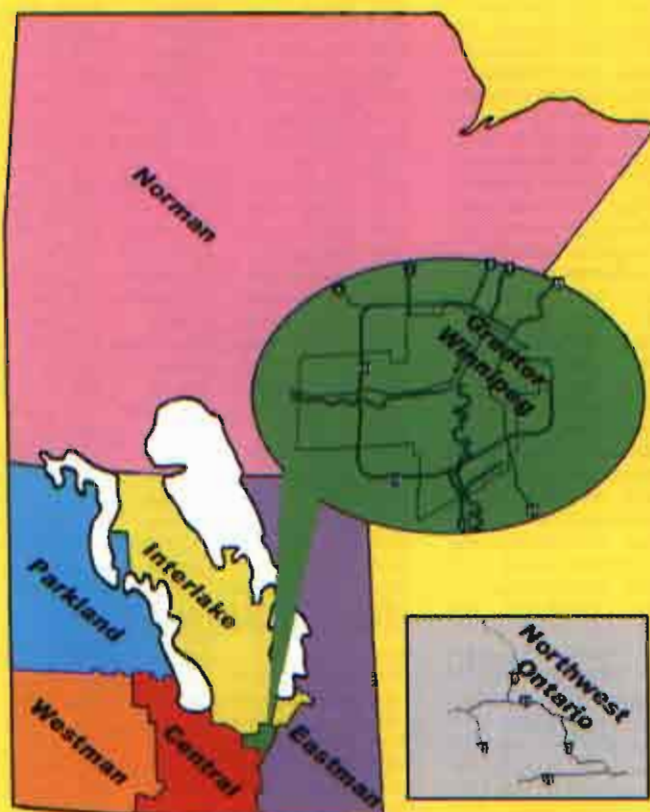

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Golf to be included in 2009 Summer Games

The Royal Canadian Golf Association has announced that golf will be a part of the 2009 Canada Summer Games competition for the first time ever.

The Canada Games Council confirmed that golf will be among the 12 sports to participate in the 2009 Summer Games to be held in Prince Edward Island.

The announcement by the CGC culminates almost 12 months of effort by the RCGA and its recently merged partner, the Canadian Ladies' Golf Association. As a direct result of the merger, golf was able to apply and receive approval to join the Canada Summer Games roster.

"This is absolutely a benefit of the recent merger," says Jeff Thompson of the RCGA. "Without the two association's coming together to form one governing body for the game we would not be in a position to have our sport recognized by the Canada Games Council."

"Our focus is to continue to profile golf among Canadians and build the best golf player development program in the world. Having our sport recognized and played during Canada's national summer games is an important step as we move forward towards attaining this goal."

Although full details have yet to be confirmed, teams of three men and three women from each province will make up the competition. The RCGA will work directly with the Games Host Committee advising on technical aspects surrounding the venue and tournament organization.

Held once every two years, alternating between winter and summer, the Canada Games represent the highest level of national competition for up and coming Canadian athletes. This summer the 2005 Canada Summer Games will be hosted by Regina in August while the next Canada Winter Games are to be held in Whitehorse, Yukon, in 2007.
