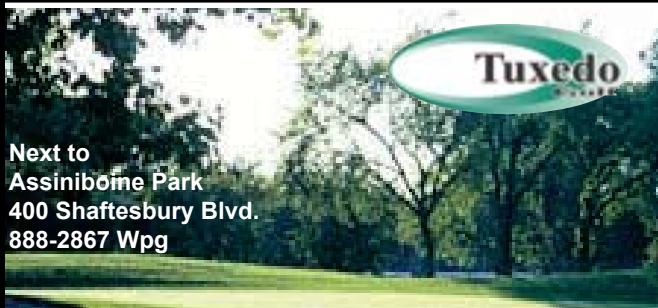

FROM THE **Editor's Chair** WITH **Ralph Bagley**



IT'S THE 31ST YEAR for the Golf Manitoba Journal and new publishers are at the helm. I'm still aboard as the editor for this issue, but the publishing duties have been passed on from *Bagcom Publications* to *Esdale Publishing*, with **Dale Hughesman** in charge of the operation and **Laural Bickford** looking after the advertising. You won't find many changes from last year, except there is no repeat of the historical information, which was a special feature of the 30th anniversary edition of 2009. We're still featuring the previous year's tournament results and winners, Golf Manitoba awards and news, the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame inductions, the directory of member clubs and special sections for news from the Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association and the Manitoba Division of the Professional Golfers Association.

WHAT'S NEW ON THE MANITOBA GOLF SCENE has been an annual feature for several years and that tradition is continued in this issue (pages 31-34) because it seems there are always new courses or changes under way in this province. It's one of those rites of spring for this writer to try to track down information on just what is new around Manitoba and there are usually a few surprises. The movement among the professionals also seems to be never-ending and it's a chore each spring to try to keep up with the changes.

IT WAS A TOUGH WINTER and I'm not referring to the weather but rather to the Golf Manitoba staff, who had to go through TWO big moves in what was supposed to be their off-season. Like all the other sports organizations which enjoyed office space at 200 Main Street for several years, they had to make the move to the new Sport Manitoba building on Pacific Avenue. However, that building wasn't ready when they had to vacate the Main Street quarters, so the staff had to pack up their things and moved to a temporary winter location at Rossmere Country Club. Then, the second big move came in the spring when they finally moved into their new digs on the fourth floor at the Pacific Avenue location. It was certainly a busier-than-usual winter for the gang but they're getting nicely settled in their new surroundings.

IT SHOULD BE AN EXCITING SEASON FOR GOLF FANS around Winnipeg this summer. If you like to watch professionals strut their stuff, you'll have a chance to see the best female golfers in the world in action when the CN Canadian Women's Open tournament comes to St. Charles Country Club Aug. 23-29. And, before that you can watch some of the up-and-coming male pros as they converge on Pine Ridge Golf Club for the Players Cup event, which has become the second-biggest money event on the Canadian Tour, thanks to a boost up to \$300,000 from last year's \$200,000 purse, and the winner gets a spot in the Canadian Open to boot. It's easy to use the phrase up-and-coming on the Canadian Tour because many have moved on to the big PGA Tour. Notably, last year's winner of the local tournament, **Graham DeLaet** from Weyburn, SK, went on to win his PGA Tour card and recently had a big payday as he tied for third in the Shell Houston Open in April. In addition to that, the event at Pine Ridge is under new leadership with **Nicole** and **Rob McMillan** in charge as executive director and executive chairman respectively.

Harvey Goehring takes over president's chair

Harvey Goehring stepped up to the president's chair following the annual general meeting of Golf Manitoba held Oct. 19 at Elmhurst Golf and Country Club and looks forward to leading the association through the next two years.

When his son was winning golf championships in the province and nationally, Harvey Goehring was known around Manitoba golf circles as "Dale's Dad". Now that he is president of Golf Manitoba, it's possible that **Dale Goehring** will again be known as "Harvey's Son".

Harvey and his wife Marion were regular figures around the Manitoba courses as son Dale, a mechanical engineer, established a distinguished career before moving to Calgary, though he was still representing Manitoba as he won the Canadian Amateur championship in 1997. He was playing on his fifth Manitoba Willingdon Cup team that year and has also played on the Alberta team. It was Dale's second national championship, having won the Canadian Juvenile championship in 1988. He also claimed the Manitoba Junior title in 1990, won the Manitoba Match Play championship in 1994 and 1995 and was the Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year in 1988 and 1997.

That was then and now it's time for Harvey Goehring to take the spotlight as leader of the governing body of the sport in Manitoba and Northwest Ontario. He became involved with the provincial association as a club representative from Breezy Bend and has been a tournament volunteer for 16 years in the capacities of starter/scorer and as a rules official. He joined the Board of Directors in 2004, was elected vice-president in 2006 and named president-elect in 2007. He has chaired the player development, tournament and membership committees. He accompanied the Manitoba Willingdon Cup team to the Canadian Amateur championships in 2007, 2008 and 2009. He is also on the Board of the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame & Museum.

He is a graduate from the University of Saskatchewan with a Bachelor of Science in Agriculture and a certificate in Management Development from the University of Calgary.

He retired after a working career with Pioneer Grain, the Canadian Wheat Board and executive director of the Manitoba Institute of Agrologists.

He joined Breezy Bend Country Club in 1985 and went on the board in 1986 as the junior chairman. He also chaired the play and rules committee, served as secretary and was president of the club in 2000 and 2001. Marion was also a golf volunteer as co-ordinator of the junior program at the John Blumberg course and then became involved with the junior program and Ladies section at Breezy Bend.

In addition to his duties as president of Golf Manitoba, Goehring also serves on the Royal Canadian Golf Association Provincial Council, which reports to the RCGA Board of Directors on matters of concern to the provincial golf associations and is a member of the RCGA Governance Committee, which reviews and updates the mandate and bylaws of the RCGA committees.

He looks forward to the 2010 season. "With a somewhat milder winter and an earlier start to the season, the golf industry should be in for a longer and better year. The new RCGA (Golf Canada) membership card and benefits initiative will be of interest and value to golfers," he noted.

He also acknowledged the contributions from those who assist in the operations of the association.

"As a not-for-profit association, Golf Manitoba relies on dedicated volunteers who are willing to give of their time and skills to help us carry out our work," he said. "We thank them for agreeing to serve and look forward to their positive contributions in helping us grow and develop the game of golf. I also want to express appreciation to the golf courses who host our tournaments and to the sponsors for their contributions. We rely on your support to carry out our programs."

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT REPORT

CANADA GAMES

For the first time in history, golf participated in the 2009 Canada Summer Games. The inclusion of golf gave six young Manitoba golfers some terrific experience as well as some tremendous lifetime memories.

The Junior girls team was made up of **Lindsay Stewart**, **Bri-Ann Tokariwski** and **Jenna Roadley** while the Junior boys team consisted of **Ryan Pitzel**, **Myles Sullivan** and **Aaron Cockerill**. **Garth Goodbrandson** and **Derek Ingram** were coaches for the team and Golf Manitoba's Director of Competitions **Lisa Andersen** was the manager.

Team Manitoba had an excellent showing for both the boys and girls team. The boys team finished fourth and the girls team finished sixth at The Brudenell River Golf Club in Prince Edward Island. Pitzel led the boys team finishing eighth with scores of 78-74-73-73 and a 298 total. Stewart led the girls team finishing in 15th place

with scores of 86-76-82-87 and a 331 total. Other Manitoban's scores, which narrowly missed the cut, were Sullivan 76-76-83--235, Cockerill 76-83-73--235, Roadley 80-84-86--250 and Tokariwski 87-88-83--258.

Golf Manitoba's program for the Canada Games began in May, 2008. Twenty-one juniors were involved in the program, which was divided into three phases. The participants received numerous sports science opportunities such as:

- A fitness assessment and an individualized program through the Titleist Performance Institute overseen by TPI golf fitness instructor and physiotherapist **Barry Mitchell**.
- Three sport science seminars including guest speakers Phil Towle (Personal Enhancement Coach), Dr. Adrienne Leslie Toogood (Director of Sports Psychology at the Canadian Sports Center Manitoba) and Jason Brooks (Sports Psychologist). Dr. Toogood also conducted a Bio Feed-

back session which gave participants feedback on their personal physiology. A personalized plan was then created for each team member to assist them with relaxation, calming themselves quicker and refocusing.

- Individualized Flightscope sessions with Ingram to monitor club speed, distance and club fitting recommendations.
- The winter program consisted of weekly fitness sessions (Xcel Fitness for the boys team and the Yoga Center for the girls team) and a membership at The Golf Dome.
- The summer program also included weekly team practices, rules education seminars, Ryder Cup matches against the University of Manitoba Golf team and each team member played in the Men's Mundie Putter League or the Women's Nassau League.

The 2009 season was a very successful year for Golf Manitoba's Junior Mundie Putter Team. The squad finished in fifth place in "A" Division and lost to Pine Ridge on the last hole in the last match in the playoffs. The boys were fantastic representatives of junior golf in Manitoba and North Western Ontario and gained some very valuable experience throughout the year. Many thanks to **Dennis Prystayko** who was the non-playing captain for the Junior boys team.

Junior Girls Nassau Team

For the first time a Junior Girls team was formed to participate in the Women's Nassau League. The girls had an exceptional year finishing in second place in the "B" division and eventually lost to Bel Acres

in the "B" division finals. The girls gained valuable experience playing in a format that was new to them. The "B" division teams were excellent role models for the girls and did a great job welcoming the girls into the Nassau League. A big thanks to **Brenda Prystayko** who was the non-playing captain for the Junior girls team.

CN Future Links Program

Although Golf Manitoba conducts an extensive High Performance Program we are also actively involved with many grass roots programs. Two key programs that have seen steady growth are the City of Winnipeg/Golf Manitoba Children's camps and the University of Manitoba's Mini U camps. CPGA Class A Professional **Glen Sirkis** is the lead instructor for Golf Manitoba in both programs. The week-long camps feature instruction in the morning with golf in the afternoon. The programs are an excellent way to get young golfers exposed to the game and get them on the course in a fun environment.

The past two seasons Golf Manitoba and the University of Manitoba Women's team have assisted St. Charles Head Professional **Cory Kartusch** in conducting clinics aimed at introducing young girls to the game. Over 125 girls have participated in these clinics with Cory and his staff doing a great job of conducting these clinics.

Golf Manitoba will continue to offer the school clinics program throughout Manitoba in 2010. This grass roots program has

proved to be very popular with over 10,000 children participating in these clinics over the last 13 seasons. Golf Manitoba will also continue to offer junior and adult clinics to member clubs who do not employ a CPGA Professional.

University of Manitoba Golf Team

The University of Manitoba Golf Team completed their 10th fall season in 2009. The schedule saw the Men's team participate in six events and the Women's Team in five events. The Women's team concluded the year in fine fashion by winning the St. Cloud "Huskie Invite". The Women's team also had a third-place finish at the Cobber Open. The Men's team had a successful fall season with three second-place finishes at the Concordia, Bemidji and North Dakota State University events.

Team highlights were:

- Three individual tournament wins by Lichtman, Wazney and **Bobby Wiebe**
- **Jesse Skelton** had four top-10 finishes

- Stewart (78-84-162) and Lichtman (83-79-163) tied for fourth at the Cobber Invite

Garth Collings captures fifth Golfer of Year honours

Fifteen times he has been selected as a finalist and 2009 marked the fifth time **Garth Collings** of Breezy Bend has been named the Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year.

The presentation was made at the Golf Manitoba annual awards dinner Oct. 19 at Elmhurst Golf and Country Club. The other finalists in the voting were **Tyler Mancini** of Pine Ridge and **Ryan Pitzel** of Rossmere.

Collings' 2009 season included his third victory in the Manitoba men's amateur championship, runner-up in the mid-amateur championship, winner of the mid-masters category (40-and-over) and earning berths on both the Willingdon Cup and Mid-Amateur provincial teams. He finished tied for 10th at the Canadian mid-amateur and fifth at the national mid-masters. He is currently ranked 21st on the RCGA Order of Merit. Collings

was also winner of the Grey Owl golf championship for a record eighth time in 2009.

Mancini and Pitzel were both first-time nominees for the list of finalists in 2009. Mancini won the men's provincial match play and the men's mid-amateur championships and was fifth in the men's amateur championship. He finished 29th at the national mid-amateur and is ranked 118th on the RCGA Order of Merit.

Pitzel captured the provincial junior men's championship and earned a berth on the Manitoba junior men's team. He also had two good finishes in the RCGA Future Links events (tied for 19th in the western event and tied for fifth in the prairie event). He led team Manitoba to a fourth-place finish at the Canada Games and was eighth in the individual scoring. He was a member of the University of Manitoba Bisons golf team and had a number of

top 20 finishes in the competitive season. He is currently ranked 32nd on the RCGA Junior Order of Merit.

Six more golfers earned honourable mention for the 2009 season – **Tammy Gibson** of St. Boniface, **Jill Hardy** of the Golf Manitoba Public Player Club, **Don Jackson** of Portage, **Scott Markham** of Niakwa, **Jesse Skelton** of Breezy Bend and **Lindsay Stewart** of Selkirk.

Gibson won the provincial senior women's championship, finished third at the provincial women's amateur and was a finalist in the women's match play championship. She earned berths on both the women's amateur and women's senior provincial teams.

Hardy won the Manitoba women's amateur, made the cut at the national women's amateur and qualified for the U.S. women's mid-amateur championship.

Jackson won the Manitoba senior men's championship for the third straight year and was also the low individual scorer at the provincial senior inter-club competition.

Markham finished third at the provincial men's amateur and earned a berth on the Willingdon Cup team, finishing 55th at the national amateur. He also won the medal honours at the provincial men's match play championship.

Skelton was in the top 20 at the men's amateur, made it to the 16s at the match play championship and had a number of top 10 finishes in the fall season with the University of Manitoba Bisons golf team.

Stewart won the Manitoba junior women's title, was seventh in the provincial women's amateur, was the low Manitoban at the Canada Games and had two top five finishes with the University of Manitoba Bisons golf team.

The 2009 awards dinner marked the 35th year for the Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year award. **Rob McMillan** was a six-time winner of the award, followed by Collings with his five wins, **Todd Fanning** with four and **Terry Hashimoto** with three. Two-time award winners over the years include **Billy Parker**, **Dale Goehring** and **Brad Kirton**.

Collings is far ahead in the race for most times chosen as finalists with his 10 in addition to his five wins. Hashimoto was a finalist five times in addition to his three triumphs. □

Rules also played a major role in the selection of Betty Grant as the 2009 recipient of the award. She has been a volunteer since 1997 with the Manitoba Ladies' Golf Association (MLGA) and Golf Manitoba. She served on the MLGA board of directors as rules assistant, rules chair and teams director and is currently on the Golf Manitoba officials committee.

Grant works as a rules official at Golf Manitoba events and is well respected by fellow officials, volunteers, competitors and staff.

She is a two-time winner of the CLGA/RCGA pin rounds at Windsor Park as well as the CLGA/RCGA low net winner twice in the club championship. She won the club championship of the Crescent Drive group eight times.

When she's not volunteering for Golf Manitoba or playing golf herself, she spends some time volunteering as a starter at Southwood Golf and Country Club.

"Betty Grant exemplifies what it means to be a volunteer for Golf Manitoba," said President **Harvey Goehring** as he made the presentation. "Her passion for the rules of golf is evident and her professionalism on the golf course is a true asset to our association. Betty's diligence and dedication in all she does is beyond belief."

Golf Hall of Fame welcomes four new members



Four new members were inducted into the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum October 5, when the seventh annual induction ceremonies were conducted at the McPhillips Station Casino.

The list of members grew to 36 with the new inductees, two honoured in the athlete category, one as an athlete/builder and one posthumously as a builder. There are now 23 athletes, 11 builders and two athlete/builders in the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame.

The 2009 inductees in the athlete category were **Lynda Palahniuk**, now a resident of Kelowna, BC, and **William (Billy) Parker**, now a resident of Edmonton, AB. Inducted as a builder/athlete was **Cathy Burton**, who now resides in Calgary, AB. Inducted as a builder was **J.A. (Jack) Swanson**, who died in 1979 and who was represented by his brother-in-law **Robert Jones**.

It was the seventh year for the awards to be presented by the Casinos of Winnipeg division of the

Manitoba Lotteries Corporation. The inaugural induction ceremony was held at the Club Regent Casino in 2003 and the past six have been held at the McPhillips Station Casino.

The Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum Inc. was formed to acknowledge the contributions and accomplishments made by Manitobans to the game of golf. It is a tripartite organization in the partnership of Golf Manitoba, Canadian Professional Golfers Association of Manitoba and Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association.

LYNDA PALAHNIUK was born in Winnipeg and played golf out of St. Boniface Golf Club from 1965 to 1972, then Elmhurst Golf and Country Club 1972 to 1996 before moving to Kelowna, where she has been a member of Kelowna Golf Club since 1998.



As Lynda Smith, she won the Manitoba Women's Junior championship in 1969 and 1970 and also was a member of the provincial junior women's team in those two years. She won the Manitoba Women's Amateur championship four times between 1982 and 1992 and won the Saskatchewan Women's Amateur title in 1996. She also teamed with her father, **Art Smith**, to win the provincial father-daughter honours several times. In addition to her two appearances on provincial junior teams, she was a member of the Manitoba Women's Amateur team 16 times and played five times as a member of British Columbia Women's Senior teams. She won the British Columbia Women's Senior championship in 2002 and added the Canadian Women's Senior championship in 2003. She was also runner-up for the national senior title in 2007 and placed third in 2006. She was ranked No.10 in Canadian women's golf in 1990 and was named Women's Senior Golfer of the Year by Score magazine in 2003.

BILLY PARKER was born in Winnipeg and made his mark on the Manitoba golf scene before moving to Edmonton, where he is a physician and radiologist. He belonged to Niakwa Country Club from 1972 to 1975, then Breezy Bend Country Club from 1978 to 1991 and back to Niakwa in 1994-95.

Parker won the Manitoba High School championship in 1971 and 1972, the Manitoba Men's Junior championship in 1974 and the Manitoba Men's Amateur championship in 1978, 1979 and 1982. He was winner of the Manitoba Match Play championship in 1981 and 1982 and was medalist in the match play competition in 1995. He won Manitoba Golfer of the Year honours in 1979 and 1982. Parker won the Canadian Juvenile championship and finished third in the Canadian Junior championship in 1973 and was in the top 10 at Canadian Junior championships in 1974 and 1975. He was a member of the Manitoba Junior team twice and was on the provin-



cial Willingdon Cup amateur team five times. He represented Canada in the Junior World championship in San Diego in 1974 where he was runner-up to Nick Price in the Foreign Division. He was on the Indiana University golf team in 1975-78 (team captain in 1978) and qualified to play in the NCAA championships in 1977.

CATHY BURTON was born in Brandon and started her golf career as a junior player at Bin-scarth and Russell in 1977-79. She played out of Selkirk in 1981-82, then Harbour View in 1982-87 before turning to professional ranks.

She won the Manitoba Women's Amateur championship twice and was also a finalist in Manitoba Golfer of the Year voting twice. She won the Saskatchewan Women's Amateur championship in 1986.



Also in 1986, Burton reached the semi-finals in the United States Public Links championship, a competition which attracted 1,085 entries. She played on provincial amateur teams at the national championship for six straight years from 1982 to 1987. She was a Team Canada member in 1986 and 1987 and was a member of Canada's Commonwealth team, which won the championship in 1987 in New Zealand, the only Canadian team to win the event.

Burton joined the professional Futures Tour in 1988-90, was an LPGA Teaching Division member 1992-96 and has been a CPGA Class A professional since 1996. She was an associate pro at St. Charles Country Club 1991-94, an assistant pro at Southwood Golf and Country Club 1995-96, pro and manager at the Short Game

Golf Training Centre in 1997 and associate pro at St. Charles 1998-2001. She was a leading force behind the establishment in 1994 on the LPGA Girls Club in Manitoba, the first move into Canada for that program after a successful launch in the United States. It provided opportunities for young girls to get into golf with proper training. It was the fore-runner of the successful Future Links program still in operation across Canada for young golfers. Moving to Calgary, Burton was a teaching pro at Cottonwood Golf and Country Club 2001-2003, head pro at Harvest Hills in 2004 and is currently head pro at River Spirit Golf Club. She also served as national junior women's coach for the RCGA 1998-2004.

JACK SWANSON was born in Edinburgh, Scotland, and came to Canada with his parents when he was 12. He earned a reputation as "Mr. Golf in Manitoba" for his many years of leadership in the sport from 1951 until his death at the age of 68 in 1979. He and his wife Marion were members of Assiniboine Golf Club from the 1930s to 1959, when they moved to Elmhurst Golf and Country Club.

Swanson got into the executive



side of the game as secretary at Assiniboine in 1945, then as president in 1949-50. He was vice-president at Elmhurst in 1964-65. He became a member of the Manitoba Golf Association board of directors in 1951 and was president of the provincial body in 1958-59. He also served as secretary-manager of the Manitoba Golf Association from 1971 to 1979. He became a member of the Royal Canadian Golf Association Board of Governors in 1959 and went on to become national president in 1968. He was named an honorary life member of the board in 1972. He was non-playing captain of Canada's World Amateur team that travelled to Australia in 1968. During his term on the RCGA Board of Governors, Swanson served as chair of the membership and public relations committee in 1960, chair of the amateur status and reinstatement committee in 1962, chair of the Canadian junior interprovincial team matches and national junior championships in Prince Edward Island in 1964 and as a member of the junior championship committee in 1979.

Full biographical items on the 2009 inductees will be available on the new Manitoba Golf of Fame and Museum website, which was scheduled to be in operation before the end of May. The new site is: www.manitobagolfhalloffame.com. Further information is available through the Golf Manitoba office.

The deadline for submitting nominations for the Manitoba Golf of Fame is April 30 each year. The official form is available on the web site. The 2010 inductees will be selected early in the summer and the eighth induction ceremony will be held September 27 at the McPhillips Station Casino. □

Tyler Mancini only double winner in '09



***Tyler Mancini
Match Play and
Mid-Amateur Champ***

The 2009 golf season was a good one for **Tyler Mancini** of Pine Ridge Golf Club and there are new developments for 2010.

He opened the year with a victory in the Manitoba men's Match Play championship, then followed up with a win in the provincial Mid-Amateur championship to become the province's only double champion for 2009. He also had a good run at the provincial Amateur championship, finishing in fifth place and just one stroke away from a berth on the Willingdon Cup team.

In March of this year, Mancini decided to try the professional world of golf and earned non-exempt playing status on the Canadian Tour. In a qualifying test in Florida, he shot rounds of 73-70 for 143 when bad weather forced officials to wipe out the final two rounds of a scheduled 72-hole event. Eight players earned exempt cards and Mancini was in the next group of eight who received non-exempt cards. Watch for him on the Canadian Tour this year.

Mancini was 10 strokes off the pace as the medalist honours for the Manitoba match play event went to **Scott Markham** of Niakwa Country Club, who posted rounds of 67-71 for a 138 total in the 36-hole qualifying test at Winkler Golf Club. That was two better than Pine Ridge's **Scott Loewen**, who shot 69-71—140. Mancini checked in at 17th place in the 32-man qualifying field with a pair of 74s for 148.

As the match play started at Niakwa Country Club, Markham won his opening match 5-and-3 over **Travis Fifi** of Shilo, but was eliminated in the second round by Mancini by the same 5-and-3 score. Mancini also won his opening match 5-and-3 over **Bobby Wiebe** of Breezy Bend.

Moving into the quarter-final round, Mancini chalked up a 7-and-5 win over **Riley Unger** of Pine Ridge, then defeated **Aaron Cockerill** of Teulon 3-and-1 in the semi-final and wrapped up the championship with a 3-and-2 win over **Matt Gray** of St. Charles.

Gray's route to the championship final included some close battles. He went to the 19th hole to win his first match over **Matt Dodds** of Carman, then won 1-up over **Nathan Wazney** of Elmhurst, on the 19th hole over Loewen and 2-and-1 over **Kody Fawcett** of Pine Ridge before losing out to Mancini in the final match.

In the Manitoba men's Mid-Amateur championship, Mancini led all the way through the 72-hole competition played at Southwood Golf and Country Club in late July, posting scores of 72-70-72-71 for a 285 total, one stroke better than five-time champion **Garth Collings** of Breezy Bend, who closed strong with rounds of 73-74-69-70 for 286.

Terry James of Niakwa finished in third place 75-74-72-71 for

292, with Niakwa clubmate **Todd Fanning** and Pine Ridge's **Mike Tibbs** sharing the fourth spot with 298 totals. Fanning scored 77-72-77-72 and Tibbs carded 79-72-74-73. **Stewart Bannatyne** of St. Charles and **Chris Yaremkiewich** of Rossmere were next with 72-hole totals of 300.

Mancini, Collings and James were joined on the Manitoba Mid-Amateur team by **Dwayne Heinrichs** of Assiniboine, who finished in a 10th place tie in the championship battle but gained the team berth because national rules called for two players to be 40 years of age or older (Collings and Heinrichs).

At the national Mid-Amateur championship played in August at Prince Albert, SK, the Manitobans finished fourth with a 440 total behind Ontario (429), Saskatchewan (433) and British Columbia (436). In individual scoring, Collings led the Manitoba contingent with 285 to place 10th overall, Mancini finished with 294 in 29th place and Heinrich had 308, tied in 64th place. James missed the 36-hole cut.

Collings was a repeat winner of the Manitoba Mid-Masters championship with his 286 total, with Fanning in the runner-up position

at 298 and Heinrich and **Mike Walker** of St. Boniface sharing third with 305. Collings was fifth in the national Mid-Masters classification. □

Jill Hardy repeats as Women's Amateur champ

Playing out of the Golf Manitoba Public Players Club, **Jill Hardy** successfully defended her title as Manitoba women's Amateur champion in July at the Selkirk Golf and Country Club.

It was the fourth time Hardy captured the provincial amateur honors, winning in 2001 and 2004 out of Niakwa and in 2008 out of Elmhurst.

Hardy had to come from behind to claim her victory over **Tanis Hastmann**, playing out of Colbert Hills, who took a one-stroke lead into the final round with scores of 75-73 for 148 against Hardy's 76-73 for 149.

In the final round of the 54-hole test, Hardy claimed the championship with a 77 for a 226 total, while Hastmann settled for the runner-up position with 82 for 230. **Tammy Gibson** of St. Boniface finished third with 79-78-78 for 235 and fourth place went to **Rhonda Orr** of Southwood with 80-78-79 for 237.

Just missing out in the battle for the four berths on the provincial team were **Jenna Roadley** of Glendale and **Sarah Stebeleski** of River Oaks, who both finished with 238. Roadley scored 78-80-80, while Stebeleski had the first-round lead with 74 and followed up with 85-79.

Roadley was winner of the first flight prize with Stebeleski the runner-up. The second flight was won by **Jessie Choi** of Southwood, ahead of **Kathleen Spalding** of Assiniboine, and the third flight winner was **Heather Penno** of Southwood, with **Dana Todd** of St. Charles as runner-up.

At the national women's amateur championship at Moncton in July, the Manitoba team finished fifth with a total of 486. Ontario won the team honours with 426, followed by Quebec with 430, British Columbia with 431 and Alberta with 464.

Hastmann led the Manitoba team with 77-80-157. Hardy had 84-75-159, Gibson had 89-81-170 and Orr scored 89-84-173. Hardy and Hastmann were the only Manitobans to make the cut in individual scoring, placing 51st and 52nd. □

Garth Collings captures third Amateur title

There were a lot of years in between them, but **Garth Collings** of Breezy Bend finally won his third Manitoba men's Amateur golf championship in July at the Pinawa and Elmhurst courses.

His first amateur crown came in 1987, then it took seven years before he captured the honours for a second time in 1994. There were some close calls, but it was another 15 years before Collings chalked up Amateur title No. 3 in 2009.

Through the 22 years between that first one and the third, Collings earned his way to 15 appearances on the Manitoba Willingdon Cup team.

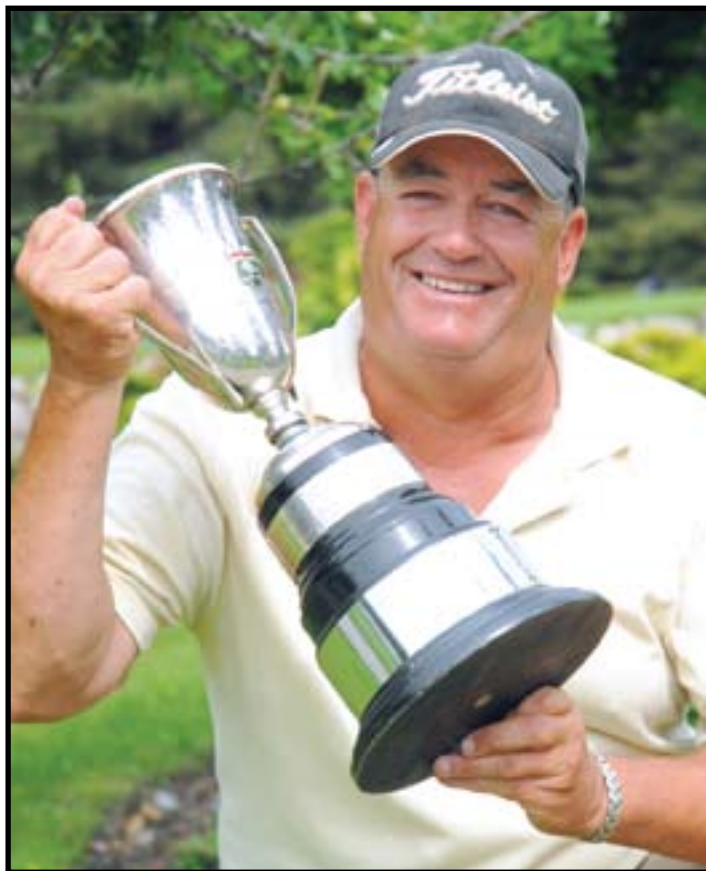
He had to come from behind and hold off a charge from **Scott Borsa** of Selkirk to squeeze out a one-stroke victory this time. He posted scores of 75 and 68 at Pinawa and the 143 total had him tied in fourth place with **Tyler Mancini** of Pine Ridge, who had rounds of 71 and 72.

In the lead at the half-way point was **Scott Loewen** of Pine Ridge with 67-70 for 137, followed by **Scott Markham** of Niakwa with 72-68—140. Borsa was well back with a pair of 75s for 150.

The scene shifted to Elmhurst for the final two rounds and the scores went up a little. In the third round, Loewen maintained the lead with a 76 for 213, Markham closed the gap with 74 for 214, Mancini shot 72 for 215. Collings carded 73 for 216 and Borsa gained some ground with 72 for 222.

Borsa made the big move in the final round with a 69 for a 72-hole total of 291, but that was one stroke behind Collings, who finished with 74 for 290. Loewen slipped to 79, Markham shot 78 to tie in third place with 292 and Mancini also turned in a 78 to finish fifth at 293.

The Manitoba Willingdon Cup team of Collings, Borsa, Loewen and Markham placed sixth in the national amateur championship with a score of 444. Ontario won with 418, followed by British Columbia with 426, Alberta with 435, Prince Edward Island with 440 and Quebec with 442.

Markham led the Manitoba team with 76-67—143, Borsa had 75-76—151, Collings had 80-75—155 and Loewen had 75-83—158. Markham was the only Manitoba to make the cut in the individual competition, posting a four-round total of 299 to finish 55th. □

Lindsay Stewart **claims Junior** **Womens title**

Six shots off the pace heading into the final round, **Lindsay Stewart** of Selkirk recorded the best round of the tournament to win the 2009 Manitoba junior women's golf championship in July at the Rossmere Country Club.

Stewart fired a tidy 78 in the final round of the 54-hole competition to claim the title with a total score of 250. She had scored 87 and 85 in her first two rounds and trailed 36-hole leader **Jessie Choi** of Southwood, who opened with 84-82. Choi slipped to 86 in the final round to finish at 252, tied in the runner-up spot with **Jenna Roadley** of Glendale, who shot 82-87-83 for her 252 total.

Defending junior champion **Bri-Ann Tokariwski** of Elmhurst settled for fourth place with 87-89-85-261 and rounded out the team which represented the province at the national junior women's championship in August at Hampton, NB.

The Manitoba team tied for fifth place with Saskatchewan in the national team competition with a total of 507. British Columbia led the way with 458, followed by Ontario with 460, Quebec 463 and Alberta 489. Stewart led the Manitobans with 84-81-165. Roadley shot 85-84-169, Choi had 88-85-173 and Tokariwski had 88-87-175.

All four Manitoba players made the cut in the individual competition, with Choi and Roadley finishing in a tie in 43rd place, Lindsay was 56th and Tokariwski 64th.

Stewart, Choi, Roadley and Tokariwski were joined by **Kayla Ketcheson** of Larters and **Breanne Fredette** of Niakwa on the Manitoba/ Minnesota team.

Fredette was the winner in the 15-and-under division in the provincial competition with 277 and low net honors went to **Dana Todd** of St. Charles with a net score of 226. □

Southwood Golf and Country Club is looking forward to the opening of its brand-new layout at St. Norbert at the start of the 2011 season, with the new clubhouse expected to be ready for occupancy in January.

In other "what's new" reports, there's a major clubhouse extension at the Meadows at East St. Paul, construction of a new 18-hole course at the Manitoba Narrows and renovations at several other Manitoba courses.

Here's a brief review of the growth, changes and plans which have been reported as the 2010 season was swinging into earlier-than-usual action in April.

POPLAR RIDGE GOLF CLUB

This is the newest 18-hole course to be opened for play in Manitoba, with the first golfers teeing off in July last season and some good comments from those who got a chance to give it a try before the snow came. The operators are looking forward to the first full season and hoping golfers from all across the province will make the trip to test it out.

The Poplar Ridge course was constructed on terrain which features rolling hills, valleys and water west of Highway 10 at Onanole. It includes a residential development along with the scenic golf course. A good number of the 60 fully-serviced half-acre

residential lots have been sold and four houses were completed prior to the course opening last summer.

With four sets of tees on each hole, the Poplar Ridge layout stretches out to 6,665 yards from the black tees, down to 6,278 from the whites, 5,698 from the reds and 5,071 from the yellows, providing a course to suit all levels of players.

Course owners **Gaynor Vivian** and **Boyd Robertson** had the course designed by Steeves and Sons. The land was developed by Ken Beatty Construction. **Ryan Myers** came from Calgary two years ago as the course superintendent to oversee the development and remain as the head superintendent as well as taking on the general manager duties this year. **Shawn Woods**, who spent 12 years at Neepawa, was hired last year as the head professional.

The pro shop was completed last year and a larger clubhouse will be constructed close to the first tee. There is a large building to house the fleet of golf cars behind the pro shop and there is also a concession stand at the ninth hole.

The rolling terrain is one of the major attractions of the Poplar Ridge layout with several changes in elevation featured. Water comes into play on five of the holes.

One of the feature holes is the 350-yard par-four sixth hole, which is uphill all the way and with a gaping bunker in front. Another favourite is the scenic and challenging par-three 11th hole, 193 yards from the back tee and downhill all the way to a two-tiered green.

The Poplar Ridge course starts and ends with the two longest holes, both par-five efforts. No. 1 is 607 yards from the back tee, straight and uphill with out-of-bounds on the left and a waste bunker on the right. No. 18 is 593 yards, mainly downhill. In between, there's a good variety of holes to please golfers of all levels.

SOUTHWOOD GOLF & COUNTRY CLUB

"Everything is on schedule and on budget," was the report from general manager **Mike Kenney** as he reported on progress of the new Southwood Golf and Country Club under construction at St. Norbert.

Seeding of one of the nines was completed last year and the seeding of the other nine is expected to be completed in June of this year so the new 18-hole layout is scheduled to be ready for play at the start of the 2011 season.

Meanwhile construction on the new clubhouse is moving along and Kenney said plans are to make the move from the pres-

ent clubhouse to the new one in January. The present clubhouse will remain open through the Christmas season as in past years. The new clubhouse will offer about 16,500-square-feet of space and will be slightly larger than the present location.

The new location will provide "a fantastic golf course which will be a good test for all levels," Kenney commented. The par-72 layout will feature five sets of tees of each hole and will play a challenging 7,400 yards from the back tees, down to 5,200 yards from the front. It will also feature a 15-acre practice facility to provide members with opportunities to improve all aspects of their game.

An enlarged clubhouse is the feature attraction at the Meadows at East St. Paul course. The 1,300-square-foot addition doubles the clubhouse space and will provide room for up to 80 persons in the dining and lounge area. The enlarged patio will also provide more space for golfers to enjoy their meals and refreshments in an outdoor setting.

ELMHURST GOLF & COUNTRY CLUB

While members enjoy the recently renovated clubhouse, work is also being done on the course at Elmhurst under a program to recapture the original bunkers and greens on the layout. Holes

1 and 10 were completed last year with enlarged bunkers and redefined greens. The program is continuing this year on holes 5 and 14. The plan is to renovate two holes per year.

MAPLEWOOD CLUB DE GOLF

The revised 18-hole golf course at St. Pierre-Jolys, formerly known as Rat River Golf, will be open for play this year. Nine holes were opened at the start of the season and the full 18 will be put into play by mid-summer.

Fourteen of the 18 holes on the course have been changed, reports head pro and general manager **Barry Gibson**. The course saw only limited play on nine holes last season and the operators are anxiously looking forward to showing off the revamped layout this summer.

SWAN RIVER GOLF & COUNTRY CLUB

Construction has been completed on a new nine holes at Swan River and, depending on weather, the club hopes to have the new portion in play later this season. The grow-in was started last fall and progress has been good, said golf course architect **Dave Grant**. The new holes will be interwoven with the existing nines for the 18-hole layout.

THE NARROWS

Dave Grant is also the architect for a new 18-hole course under construction at The Narrows on Lake Manitoba. Earth-moving operations and early construction work have been completed and it is hoped seeding and grow-in periods will be finished this year or early next season. It is hoped the course may be ready to open in the fall of 2011 or early in 2012.

Tentatively known as North Wind Narrows, the golf course project is in conjunction with a cottage lot development, which is selling well. It's under the direction of **Chad Olafson**, owner of the Manitoba Narrows lodge.

Grant also reported on other projects involving his services. There have been no developments, but discussions are continuing regarding a new 18-hole golf course planned in the Russell area near the ski resort development.

At the Brandon Wheat City Golf Club, three new greens have been designed and construction is scheduled to begin later this year.

At Breezy Bend Country Club, Grant was putting the finishing touches on rebuilding of the second hole which was started last fall. The hole will have 40 yards added to its length along with a new pond. □

New leadership, more money for Players Cup



With new leadership and a big increase in the prize money, the Manitoba stop on the Canadian Tour should attract a great following at Pine Ridge Golf Club July 12-18.

The Players Cup, one of the biggest events on the Tour, will offer a purse of \$300,000 this year, up from \$200,000 in 2009. The season-ending Canadian Tour Championship in August at St. Catharines, ON, will have the only larger purse, growing to \$325,000 this year from \$250,000 in '09.

The increased purses for these two major events were announced in January, but there was earlier news last fall that heightened the interest of Manitoba golf followers.

It was the appointment of **Nicole McMillan** as Executive Director of The Players Cup and her husband **Rob McMillan**, a past member of the Canadian Tour Board of Directors, as Executive Chairman. The announcements were made by **Richard Janes**, commissioner of the Canadian Tour, and took effect Oct. 1, 2009.

The Players Cup is one of the flagship events on the Canadian Professional Golf Tour with a coveted spot into the RBC Canadian Open, the only event on the Tour that offers a Canadian Open exemption to the winner.

The McMillan name is one of the most respected in Manitoba golf. Nicole has been involved in event management for a dozen years. Rob, who won the 1996 Canadian Amateur in Winnipeg, also won the Canadian Tour's Manitoba Open as an amateur that same year. As a professional, he captured another two Canadian Tour titles and played the Nationwide Tour in 2001 and 2003.

"Manitoba has a long history of hosting major sporting events and this is an event that has always been well managed," stated Janes. "Rob and Nicole share a vision and have the passion to make The Players Cup one of the most significant golf tournaments in Canada."

"This is an opportunity that Nicole and I really wanted. Nicole is an excellent event manager and I look forward to working with all of the sponsors. It is a good marriage in more ways than one," stated Rob McMillan.

Mitch Zalnasky, who had been with the event as Tournament Director for the past 10 years stepped down at the end of the year. He was instrumental in making the tournament one of the premier events on the Canadian Tour and led its rebranding to The Players Cup when the tournament secured a Canadian Open exemption and purse increase in 2008.

"This will be a team operation for Rob and I and we're extremely happy to be working on this together," Nicole said. "We really feel fortunate to have the opportunity to do this."

Nicole has been involved in the golf industry for several years in management and operation of golf tournaments. She also served for two years as caddy for Rob, who closed out his career on the Canadian Tour in 2006. Rob spent a year at Golf Town and is currently the Nike territory representative for Canada.

The McMillans were married in 2002 and they have a two-year-old daughter, Gracie.

Last year's winner of the Players Cup at Pine Ridge was Canadian Graham DeLaet from Weyburn, SK, who went on to the top money winner on the Canadian Tour for 2009, then capped off his year by winning his place on the PGA Tour at the fall qualifying school. His 2010 season got off to a good start, highlighted by a tie for third place at the Shell Houston Open in April, winning \$336,400 for that effort and giving him total earnings of \$457,069 to that point in his rookie PGA Tour season. □

FORE Kids, a non-profit charitable organization that has raised over \$30,000 for the Children's Rehabilitation Foundation, will be hosting the first annual Boston Pizza Jonathan Toews FORE Kids Golf Classic July 12 at Pine Ridge Golf Club.

Best in the world coming to St. Charles



Manitoba golf fans will have an opportunity to see the best female golfers in the world compete at St. Charles Country Club in the 2010 CN Canadian Women's Open championship Aug. 23-29.

Canada has been an important stop on the LPGA Tour since 1966. Operated under various auspices the event officially became the Canadian Women's Open Championship in 2001 when the Royal Canadian Golf Association assumed management. Now, the CN Canadian Women's Open is a marquee event on the LPGA Tour and is a key element of the Canadian golf scene.

The 72-hole event is among the richest tournaments on the Ladies Professional Golf Association Tour, with a total purse of \$2.25 million US up for grabs and most of the leading players from the LPGA Tour are expected to be on hand. The tournament will open with a field of 156 players, which will be reduced to the low 70 and ties after 36 holes.

The CN Canadian Women's Open moves yearly to the best golf facilities in Canada. Wherever the national championship is hosted the goal is always to leave a legacy in the host region via a charitable initiative called the CN Miracle Match by donating proceeds from the event to a local children's charity.

The list of past champions reads as a "who's who" of golfing greats. In 1973, La Canadienne Golf Championship was held at the Club de golf municipal de Montréal in St. Lambert, Quebec. Jocelyne Bourassa won the event and is the only Canadian to have ever won an LPGA event on her home soil. Jocelyne took home the winners cheque of \$10,000.

Things have changed since then! In 2007 and 2008 the CN Canadian Women's Open champions, Lorena Ochoa and Katherine Hull both received a first-place cheque for \$337,500(US)

Early week (Monday-Wednesday) grounds tickets are \$15 and anyday grounds tickets are priced at \$25. Clubhouse badges are also available, providing a full week of grounds access as well as admittance to the St. Charles clubhouse and patio, priced at \$140 for a single. \$250 for a two-some and \$460 for a foursome. GST taxes apply on all tickets. □

Turfgrass Management 101

The Manitoba Golf Superintendent Association (MGSA) would like to congratulate all those who won golf events in 2009 as outlined in this magazine. The 2009 season will be remembered as the rainy season! At least there was a hint of summer weather during 2009, it just so happened to be in September. This once again highlights the power of Mother Nature and how weather can impact the most detailed planned events. Inclement weather can create a lot of highs and lows with the business of golf and ultimately with conditioning a golf course for play.

In looking toward the 2010 season, the goal of this article is to increase the awareness of three key variables golf course superintendents have to manage every golf season, so that you, the golfer, will play on throughout the great golf courses of Manitoba.

So let's begin, the first point is that Manitoba has some of the most extreme weather conditions which golf course superintendents are challenged with in maintaining and sustaining turf health and the high expectations placed on playing quality. Manitoba usually has dry and hot summers followed by snow and very cold winters.

Having 80-degree temperatures swings (-40°C to +40°C) only months apart is phenomenal when you think about it. The brief list of variables has a major influence on preparing a golf course for play. They are: (this is by no means the final list and the list may vary greatly from golf course to golf course)

1. **Type Of Grass**
2. **Irrigation Performance & Management**
3. **Drainage (water through soils and surface drainage)**

1. Type Of Grass

The playing surfaces on a golf course can be some of the most scrutinized, criticized features of a golf course. This is only natural as every golfer is entitled to their own opinion on what "quality" is with regards to the playing surfaces on a golf course. The most common grasses you play on throughout Manitoba golf courses would include Kentucky Bluegrass, Bentgrass, Annual Bluegrass, and some courses have Fescue type grasses. The chart at the bottom of this page will provide a very quick overview of the characteristics of the above listed grasses on Manitoba golf courses.

The photo below showcases the early 2010 spring grass conditions and provides a great comparison of the over wintering performance of the following grasses Annual Bluegrass, Kentucky Bluegrass and Bentgrass on a green site.



#1 BENTGRASS STRIP OF TURF IN A GREEN
#2 ANNUAL BLUEGRASS ON THE GREEN AND APRON SURROUND
#3 KENTUCKY BLUEGRASS ON THE APRON SURROUND

A photo does not lie and in this case there is no doubting the difference visually between the three grasses during early spring of 2010. This green and surround is predominately Annual Bluegrass, which is very tan-brown as seen in the photo, and unfortunately did not handle the winter of 2009-2010 very well.

For a golf course that has Annual Bluegrass it's a matter of how quickly the tan-brown color plants can respond/rebound and green up. Time is needed for Annual Bluegrass to catch up to the other grasses in the photo when winter damage is experienced.

Annual Bluegrass is very susceptible to browning off during the hot and dry weather that can be experienced through Manitoba summers. While Kentucky Bluegrasses and Bentgrasses have superior heat and drought tolerance due to the ability to go dormant (turf can be brown in color, living just not very active). When comparing golf courses please be aware that there are many variables to be considered and the type of grass can greatly impact your review.

2. Irrigation Performance & Management

The most important resource golf course superintendents manage (besides people) is water. The ability to apply water at the right amount, at the right rate to a given area is the primary objective. Factors such as the age of the irrigation system, the design, the reliability and dependability can impact the confidence a golf course superintendent has in keeping grass alive, never mind green, during hot and dry periods.

A good rain is the most consistent coverage of applying water. For most golf courses numerous hours are spent determining watering needs and then the actual watering of the golf course through hot and dry periods. Watering needs greatly depend on the type of grass and the material the grass is growing in. Annual Bluegrass needs frequent watering while Kentucky Bluegrasses and Bentgrasses may need infrequent watering.

Over-watering can occur when irrigation systems are not performing properly due to many reasons. The art of watering a golf course relies on the daily inspection and sound judgment by the golf course superintendent while maximizing the use of the irrigation system and knowing the systems limitations.

3. Drainage (water through soils and surface drainage)

In the golf course maintenance profession it is often said that "you will not have a golf course without irrigation and drainage." This statement could not be truer when you reflect back to the 2009 season, with all the rain events, and to the drought and heats of the 2006 season. Golf courses that have poor drainage had

continuous disruption to the game of golf and to golf courses maintenance practices, while golf courses with excellent drainage experienced minimal if any disruption during the rain events of 2009. The 2009 season was great for Annual Bluegrass golf courses due to the fact that water coverage was almost a non-issue given the timely rains.

If you reflect back to the 2006 season, with one of the warmest and driest seasons on record, golf courses that have problematic irrigation systems or lack of water to be used could not keep up with the watering demands of the golf course, while golf courses with superior irrigation systems had a great chance at keeping up with the watering needs.

If you could not apply water where you needed it, Annual Bluegrass golf courses suffered the most as far as turf browning and having poor aesthetics. Some golf course properties are blessed with great drainage and are challenged to keep up with watering needs while other golf courses are have minimal drainage and are challenged to keep up with the watering needs while not over-watering.

To conclude, the game of golf is a great sport that can be enjoyed by all ages. The game provides great time to spend with family and or friends. After reading this article, hopefully you aware of the challenges golf course superintendents face in preparing the golf courses you play. The MGSA wishes all golfers the best of luck this season and may the weather co-operate for the game of golf and golf course maintenance!

The conversion stems from Greg's personal commitment to the health of the planet. He has also been a certified organic garlic grower, built his own energy efficient home, and provides sustainability presentations to Riding Mountain visitors.

Innovative features of the golf course include: the use of composting toilets and a digester to minimize waste, create a resource for natural fertilization of the course, and eliminate the requirement for 300,000 gallons of groundwater for conventional flushing; use of compost tees and a variety of natural and biological controls for weeds and fungi; over the past several years, diversion of about 10,000 litres of waste cooking oil from area restaurants as a biodiesel source for golf course vehicles and tractors; composting of all kitchen waste, grass clippings and leaf debris for use on the course and in the herb gardens; and use of native species for plantings around the golf course.

As Holden embarks on his term as president of the CGSA, he will be taking the examples and lessons learned at Clear Lake to a national audience. ☐

Ian Brooks new President of MGSA

He's stepping up a little earlier than he expected, but **Ian Brooks** has moved into the president's chair for the Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association for the next two years.

The head superintendent at Selkirk Golf and Country Club was elected vice-president at the MGSA annual meeting last November, but was elevated to the top spot due to a constitutional matter which led to the resignation of **Michael Trager**, who moved from his head superintendent position at the Virden Well View Golf Club to become an assistant superintendent at Glendale Golf and Country Club.

When it was discovered the association's constitution stated the president must be a head superintendent, Trager stepped down as Brooks became the president for the 2009-10 term. **Darren Kalyniuk** of St. Boniface Golf Club is the past president and **Ralph Schofield** of Tuxedo Golf Course is the vice-president.

Brooks began his career on the golf links in 1988 as an assistant superintendent under **Parker Sutherland** at the Selkirk course. He also spent a couple of years at the Netley Creek Golf Course before returning to Selkirk as the head superintendent in 2000. He has been a member of the MGSA executive board since 2006, the year he was also proclaimed the Superintendent of the Year. Brooks also serves as the icemaker at the Selkirk Curling Club in the winter months.

He has experienced flooding at the Selkirk course on more than one occasion and was involved in rebuilding and improving the diking system to keep the Red River at bay. The course was flooded and covered with silt in 1997, forcing the closing of the course for the entire season. Improvements were made, but the diking was breached and the course flooded again in 2006 to force another late opening.

At the start of the 2009 season, there was further flooding, but it drained quickly and delayed the opening by only three or four weeks and Brooks was hopeful the 2010 season will get under way without delays.

Brooks is 38 years old and he and his wife **Stacey** have two sons, **Jordan**, 10 and **Matthew**, 8.

"I'm sorry to have to move up ahead of schedule because of the circumstances, but I have confidence that the members of the board will provide all the support I will need in the president's position," he said. "We're looking forward to a great season in 2010."

Dean North wins Pro Player of the Year honours



**Dean North,
Player of the Year**

A decision to rededicate himself as a competitive golfer paid dividends for **Dean North** as he captured the 2009 Callaway Golf Pro Player of the Year honours for the Manitoba division of the Canadian Professional Golfers Association.

He was playing out of Selkirk Golf and Country Club last season and has now moved back to his home town as the head pro at the Carman Golf Club.

North led throughout the season in the race for 2009 Player of the Year honours. He finished with a total of 349 points, well ahead of runner-up **Scott Parker** of Hecla Golf Course, who had a total of 326 points. **Andrew Steep** of Glendale finished third with

318, followed by **Dave Lavallee** of Quarry Oaks with 314. **Dave McMillan** of Transcona with 312 and **Shane Dick** of Pine Ridge with 311.

Points were awarded in eligible competitions throughout the season and North was a leader all the way. He had the top total of 126 points from his best three of four one-day events, earned 153 points as the winner of the three-round Titleist/Footjoy Manitoba CPGA championship and had the leading 70 points as winner of the two-round Callaway Fall Classic.

"After I lost the player of year in a close finish last year (runner-up to **Derek Ingram**) I decided I had been allowing my game to slip a little, so I rededicated myself to having a stronger game this time," said North "And it really paid off because I had a great year of golf in Manitoba."

The 37-year-old has moved back to his roots as he moves to Carman as head pro this year. He was raised in Carman and got his golfing start there. He played on one Manitoba Junior team in 1991 and that year he began his professional career as an apprentice under head pro **Pat Kemball** at Carman. He served as assistant at Pine Ridge in 1994 and 1995, then moved to St. Charles under **Jim Collins** in 1996 through to 2005.

He spent five years as a playing pro on the Canadian Tour, in 1998, then again in 2001 to 2004.

"It was great being on the tour," he recalled. "But it's tough to be on the tour and have a family. There's not much money and you just run out of time."

North took over the head pro duties at the Selkirk club in 2006 and spent four seasons there before making the return to his home town of Carman this year. He experienced two years of some flooding during his four years at Selkirk but was happy to say they weren't major floods, like the one that closed the course for the 1997 season. "Just a little inconvenience, but we still had good seasons," he said.

Dean and his wife April have two sons, Reid, 4, and Kierson, 2, and there was as addition expected to arrive in May. □

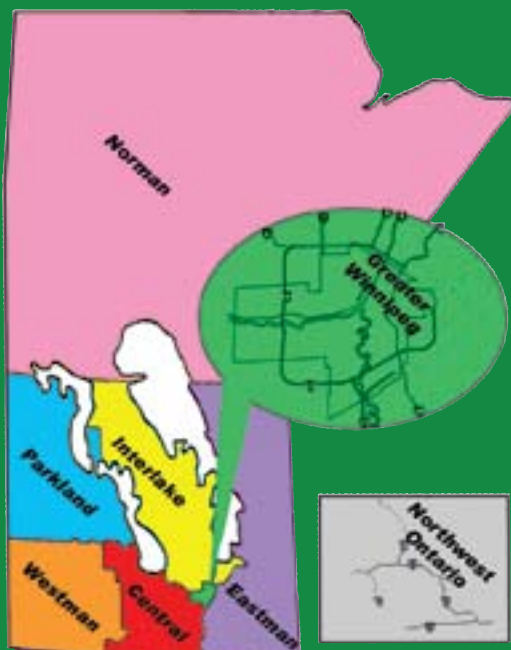

After all the moisture and unfavourable conditions in 2009, we feel we deserve a break. Some local golfers were on the courses in early March this year and all the courses were in action by the middle of April. Many have taken full advantage of the early start and there were reports of some golfers getting as many as 12 games in by the third week of April. After some disappointments last year, the attitude seems to be to get in the games when the chance is there because you never know what tomorrow may bring. Enjoy it while you can.
