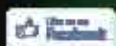

As I said at the start, it has been an enjoyable ride through the past 30-plus years and there are many people who assisted along the way. of the Free Press for curling info. His research also provided many of the first names of the earlier female champs.

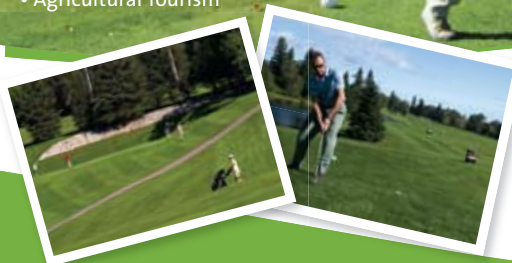

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Executive Director Report

In the ever-changing economic environment we are in, businesses have to adapt in a number of ways. Golf Manitoba is very fortunate to have a number of partners who assist us with delivering our many services, who support our needs and allow us to evolve with changes. We are continually aiming to achieve higher goals and would not be able to conduct business in the manner we do without the following organizations:

Sport Manitoba

Sport Manitoba is the lead planning, programming and funding agency for developing amateur sport in Manitoba. The primary focus of Sport Manitoba is on developing athletes, coaches, officials and volunteers. Golf Manitoba receives annual funding and guidance from Sport Manitoba. An example of the partnership between the provincial sport governing body and Golf Manitoba, as the provincial golf association, is the upcoming Manitoba Games. This joint venture, which includes a number of other sports, has allowed Golf Manitoba to establish Regional Training Squads and to have structured coaching for a group of young athletes to prepare for the July 2012 Manitoba Games in Swan River.

Golf Canada

Our partnership with the national governing body of golf has never been stronger. We jointly deliver programs such as the Handicap and Course Rating systems, coaching and player development initiatives, the National Golf in Schools program and CN Future Links. We receive annual funding to assist with this programming but Golf Canada also has a number of grant programs which the provincial golf associations can apply for and Golf Manitoba has been the beneficiary of a number of these.

This year, we received a \$15,000 grant from the Golf Canada Women's Fund to support women's initiatives that have a significant impact on women's golf in Manitoba and North West Ontario. The Women's Fund was established when the Royal Canadian Golf Association and the Canadian Ladies' Golf Association merged. These funds will assist with the Manitoba Games Program, our Junior Girls Nassau team as well as helping us support

our young female athletes preparing for the 2013 Canada Games.

Nott Autocorp

The premier pre-owned luxury car dealer in Winnipeg has been a supporter of Golf Manitoba for four seasons. Nott Autocorp President, **Trevor Nott**, provides Golf Manitoba with the vehicles we require to deliver our services in exchange for the naming rights to the Nott Autocorp Men's Amateur Championship.

The Golf Dome

Curtis Gray at The Golf Dome has continued to support Golf Manitoba's vision of year-round training for our young athletes. His world class facility has been a critical piece to long-term development and Golf Manitoba is very fortunate to have Curtis' support.

Without these organizations, Golf Manitoba would not be able to operate as we do. Please take the time to visit their websites, which are available on the Golf Manitoba website, to learn more about them as well as support their organizations when possible.

Golf Manitoba continues to evolve with changes that are taking place in the golf world. Some highlights are:

- The establishment of the new Manitoba Games program which includes training squads and coaching in all eight regions of the province.
- The growth and development of the National Golf in Schools program and CN Future Links.
- Educating the changes to the Equitable Stroke Control (ESC) and the new edition of the Rules of Golf.
- Modifying our Championships to appeal to competitors of all levels and maintaining efficiencies without jeopardizing the experience for the golfers

Changes for 2012 include:

The Women's Amateur Championship will now be contested with the Men's Mid-Amateur Championship July 9-11 at the Meadows at East St. Paul Golf Club. The Men's Mid-Amateur Championship was formerly a 72-hole event with a cut to the low 60 and ties for the final two rounds. It will now be a 54-hole event with no cut. The Women's Senior Championship will now be contested with the Men's Senior Championship July 30-August 1 at the Teulon Golf and Country Club.

The 2012 golf season began earlier than I can ever remember. I cannot recall a year where we had golf courses open on St Patrick's Day. Let's hope that Mother Nature co-operates for the rest of the summer and we are all able to play as much golf as we desire.

I would like to thank **Ralph Bagley** for his many years of leadership with the Golf Journal. Ralph's tireless efforts have made the publication a success and I am not sure it would have been possible without him. On a personal note, Ralph has been an absolute pleasure to work with and I wish him all the best. I know the magazine is in good hands with **Kirk Penton** taking over. Thank you Ralph!

2012 Manitoba Summer Games

Golf Manitoba continues to develop programs that align with the Long-Term Player Development Guide for golf in Canada. The significant changes that have been made to the format of the 2012 Power Smart Manitoba Summer Games are an example of that. The new format will use a Regional team competition, similar to the Western Canada Games and the Canada Games. All "Games" programs are viewed as long-term development and involve many sport science and coaching initiatives.

Eight regions will now compete in teams of four boys and four girls aged 15 and under. Training Squads have been developed in each region and eight Golf Professionals have been hired to oversee the program, conduct practices and assist in preparation of Training Squads. The coaches will also be responsible to administer the qualifiers and attend the 2012 Power Smart Manitoba Games in Swan River.

A coach's education seminar was held in January with National Men's Coach **Derek Ingram** as guest speaker. Derek shared information on his many coaching experiences with Golf Manitoba and Golf Canada.

Two additional seminars led by the coaches were also held in April involving all the players and parents. Topics included nutrition, preparation and managing emotions.

Regional practices are well underway with over 75 kids registered for the program.

CN Future Links

Golf Manitoba will continue to focus on four main areas within the CN Future Links program:

- 1) The National Golf in Schools Program
- 2) City of Winnipeg Camps
- 3) Mini U Camps at the University of Manitoba
- 4) Future Links programming and Mobile Clinics

A record 4,700 children participated in Golf Manitoba's 2011 Future Links programming. I've conducted Golf in Schools seminars at the annual SAGE conference for the past three years. Plans are underway to conduct a Future Links Leader seminar at the 2012 SAGE Conference. Currently, there are over 80 schools in Manitoba who have registered for the National Golf in Schools Program.

Glen Sirkis has done a tremendous job with the City of Winnipeg and Mini U camps for the past four years. The week-long camps feature instruction in the morning and golf in the afternoon. The program has different levels to accommodate all junior golfers and is an excellent opportunity to get young golfers involved in the game.

Junior Girls Nassau Team

The 2012 Junior Girls Nassau team will be comprised of girls who are involved in the 2013 Canada Games Training Squad. The Nassau League has proven to be a tremendous opportunity for young girls to play at different golf courses and to compete against the province's top amateur players. Fourteen girls participated on the 2011 Junior Team that capped a very successful season, winning the "B" Division. The team will get some valuable experience competing in the "A" Division in 2012.

Thank you to Non-Playing Captain **Brenda Prystayko**, who has been such an awesome, dedicated and passionate volunteer for the girls for the past three years. The team appreciates your support and the volunteer time you have put in for the team.

Junior Boys Mundie Putter Team

The 2012 Junior Boys Mundie Putter team will also be comprised of boys who are involved in the 2013 Canada Games Training Squad. Similar to the girls, the Mundie Putter league provides excellent competition and opportunities for the boys. Unfortunately the team just missed the playoffs last year and will compete in the "B" Division in 2012.

Thank you to long time Non-Playing Captain **Dennis Prystayko**. Dennis has been involved with the team for 10 years and has seen many juniors go through the program and on to successful amateur and professional careers. Golf Manitoba is very fortunate to have such committed volunteers like the Prystaykos.

University of Manitoba Golf Team

The University of Manitoba completed their spring season with an impressive sixth-place showing at the Canadian University Championship. The team was ranked eighth in Canada by the Post Secondary Golf Coaches Association of Canada.

The 2011 fall season saw the Bison team compete in seven tournaments, winning three tournaments and finishing runner up in two others.

In preparation for the 2012 Canadian University Championship at the end of May, the Bisons competed in two spring events including the University of San Francisco's "Triumph at Pauma Valley". The Division 1 event is excellent opportunity to compete against some highly rated teams in the United States.

2011/2012 MVP **Josh Wytinck** had a spectacular season. Josh was the individual winner on two occasions and tied two Bison Individual team records. Josh was twice chosen as "Smitty's Bison Athlete of the Week" and was also recognized as the "CKY's Sportstar of the Week".

I look forward to another successful season of player development initiatives! □

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Jesse Skelton named Manitoba Golfer of the Year

Winner of two provincial golf championships, **Jesse Skelton** of Breezy Bend Country Club was selected as the 2011 Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year. The award was presented at the Golf Manitoba annual awards dinner in October at Southwood Golf and Country Club.

Three other finalists were nominated for the honour — **Winnie Hyun** of Southwood Golf and Country Club, **Myles Sullivan** of Portage Golf Club and **Josh Wytinck** of Pine Ridge Golf Club.

Skelton won the Nott Autocorp Manitoba men's amateur championship for the first time and was also the winner of the Manitoba match play championship in 2011. He was a member of the provincial Willingdon Cup team, competed at the national men's amateur championship in Winnipeg and finished sixth at the Glencoe Invitational in Calgary.

He was a member of the Breezy Bend team that finished runner-up at the provin-

cial interclub championship and finished second in the individual division. Skelton is a member of the University of Manitoba Bison golf team and had three top five finishes in the fall schedule. He is currently ranked 13th on the Golf Canada national order of merit.

Hyun, a first-time nominee for the award, won the provincial junior women's championship and was fourth at the provincial women's amateur championship. She was a member of Manitoba's Western Canada Games team where she finished fifth individually and helped the team capture a bronze medal. On the national scene, she made the cut at both the national junior girls championship (62nd) and the national women's amateur championship (70th). She is currently ranked 76th on the Golf Canada national junior women's order of merit.

Sullivan is the 2011 men's junior champion and finished eighth at the Nott Autocorp men's amateur championship. He finished tied for sixth at the national men's junior championship and tied for eighth at the CN Prairie Future Links event. He is currently ranked 10th in the Golf Canada national junior men's order of merit and

28th on the national men's order of merit.

Wytinck was the runner up at the Nott Autocorp men's amateur championship and finished tied for 25th at the Canadian University championship, where he led after the first round. He is a member of the University of Manitoba Bisons golf team where he won the Concordia Invite and the Augsburg Invitational and assisted the team with two victories. He has also tied

two team records for low individual round (68) and low 36 hole total (139). For these Bison team accomplishments, Wytinck was awarded Bison Athlete of the Week twice as well as the CTV Sports Star of the Week. He is ranked 38th on the Golf Canada national order of merit.

Three players earned honourable mentions for their strong 2011 campaigns: **Aaron Cockerill** of Teulon Golf and

Country Club, **Mindy Lichtman** of St. Boniface Golf Club and **Jenna Roadley** of Glendale Country Club.

Cockerill, the 2010 Amateur Golfer of the Year, was fifth at the Nott Autocorp men's amateur championship and finished runner-up at the Glencoe Invitational in Calgary. He qualified for the Canadian Tour's Players Cup and made it to the second round of the match play championship.

Lichtman won the women's match play Championship and the City & District championship. She also finished third at the Manitoba women's amateur and made the provincial women's team.

Roadley was the runner-up at the women's amateur championship and the match play championship. She finished 32nd at the Canadian junior women's championship, fourth at the Prairie Future Links Championship and qualified for the United States junior girls championship.

The Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year Award dates back to 1975 and was presented for the 37th time. □

Rudy Boivin, a long-time member of Southwood Golf and Country Club, was honoured at the Golf Manitoba annual general meeting in October as the fifth recipient of the association's annual Distinguished Service Award.

The prestigious award was initiated in 2007 and the first winner was **Jerry Budyk** of Elmhurst Golf and Country Club, followed by **Don Forsyth** of Bel Acres Golf and Country Club in 2008, **Betty Grant** of Windsor Park Ladies Golf Club in 2009 and **Brian Gilhuly** of Selkirk Golf and Country Club in 2010.

Boivin began volunteering with the Manitoba Golf Association in 1980. He is a founding member of the MGA Golf Annual Magazine (now the Golf Manitoba Journal) and from 1980 to 1982 was chairman of the advertising committee for that magazine.

In 1982, he became a starter and scorer at MGA events and remains committed to that volunteer role today with Golf Manitoba. In 1983 he joined the MGA Board of Directors and was the chairman of the tournament committee in 1986/87 and the president in 1988. He also served as the non-playing captain for the Willingdon Cup Team in 1985, 1986 and 1987.

From 1989 to 1994 he was nominated by the Manitoba Golf Association for the board of directors of the Manitoba Sport Federation, elected for three terms and chair of marketing committee for four years.

He is a current member of the marketing and communications committee of Golf Manitoba.

He served on the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund board of directors from 1990 to 2010 and was president of that organization from 1999 to 2005. He was also a member of the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame board of directors from 2002 to 2007.

Boivin has been a member at the Southwood Golf and Country Club since 1966. He served on the board of directors from 1971 to 1978, was member of the year in 1976, president in 1977, club captain from 1990 to 1993 and honoured in 2003 as a life member. His devotion to amateur golf is extremely evident as he continues to be involved in committees and tournament activity after 31 years of dedicated service.

"Rudy Boivin has shown true passion for both the Manitoba Golf Association and Golf Manitoba" said Rob MacDonald, president of Golf Manitoba, as he made the presentation. "His long-term commitment is a true asset to our association and we are pleased to recognize him with the Distinguished Service Award".

Along with the Distinguished Service Award, Golf Manitoba also recognized all volunteers within the association for their years of service to the association. Recognition was given to those individuals reaching the five, 10, 15, 20 and 25- plus years of service benchmarks.

Recognized for 25-plus years of volunteer service was **Rick Thain**, a former Manitoba Golf Association president.

Those honoured for 20 years of service were **Gary Boden, Bob Fallis, Don Forsyth, Rob MacDonald, Clare Nesbitt, Paul Zeglinski** and **Brenda Prystayko**.

DEREK INGRAM

He had some success playing the game, but Derek Ingram made his big mark on the Manitoba golf scene through his passion for teaching and coaching.

Born in Winnipeg July 5, 1970, his love for the game began as a youngster around the Sandy Hook Golf Club and he competed in Manitoba junior events before deciding to get into the professional end of the business. He turned pro in 1992 and spent two years as an assistant at Niakwa Country Club and a year as assistant at Pine Ridge Golf Club before taking on the head pro post at South Interlake Golf and Country Club from 1995 to 1997.

Ingram had a two-year stint as a player on the Canadian Tour in 1998 and 1999 before deciding his career should focus on the teaching and coaching side. He has gained national respect in those areas.

On the playing side, he won 10 PGA of Manitoba tournaments, was the Player of the Year twice (2002, 2008) and was

winner of the PGA of Manitoba championship in 2008. In 1999, he and Garth Goodbrandson teamed as the co-coaches and founders of the University of Manitoba men's and women's golf program. In partnership with Dave McMillan, he opened the Golf Central training and practice facility in 2000, then sold it in 2006.

Ingram has been recognized as one of Canada's top golf coaches and teachers. He was winner of the PGA of Canada Teacher of the Year twice (2003, 2007) and also won the Jack McLaughlin Junior Leader of the Year in 2003, the only recipient to ever win both awards. He is the only person to win the PGA of Canada Teacher of the Year award twice. He was also a seven-time winner of the Manitoba PGA Teacher of the Year award and has been selected as one of the top 10 coaches in Canada and a top-50 teacher in North America.

In the fall of 2009, after nine years as a part of the Golf Canada national teams program, he was appointed head coach of the women's national team and was appointed head coach of the men's national team in 2011. He has mentored and coached many of Manitoba's and Canada's top young male and female golfers. When not active on the national scene, Ingram serves as head teaching pro at Elmhurst Golf and Country Club and operates Derek Ingram Golf from that location.

GARY KULLMAN

Born in Winnipeg July 9, 1953, Gary Lorne Kullman made his mark on the Manitoba golf scene in junior, amateur and mid-amateur divisions and made appearances on

14 provincial golf teams along the way.

Known to his buddies as Skinny, he played out of the Rossmere Country Club from 1964 to 1990 and again from 2005 to 2008 and was a member of Elmhurst Golf and Country Club from 1990 to 2005.

He won the Manitoba men's amateur championship three times (1971, 1973 and 1976) and was winner of the Jack Blair Memorial trophy as Manitoba match play champion twice (1978, 1979). He was the low amateur and winner of the Hal Eidsvig trophy at the Manitoba Open championship in 1991.

His Manitoba appearances began on the provincial junior men's teams in 1970 and 1971, then on five men's amateur teams (1976, 1982, 1983, 1984 and 1993) and seven mid-amateur teams (1993, 1994, 1997, 1999, 2002, 2004 and 2006).

He was a finalist in the voting for the Manitoba amateur golfer of the year award in 1976. Kullman was also a consistent performer in the annual North America Cup matches against Minnesota golfers, earning places on the Manitoba team eight times from 1993 to 2004 and in the annual Rural/City competitions in 1997, 1999, 2001 and 2003. He earned the most points in the former Manitoba Tour competition twice (1993 and 2001).

JUDI LIDSTONE

Judi Lidstone rebounded twice from bouts with breast cancer and has earned her place in the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame, winning four provincial women's senior championships and playing on 13 provincial teams along the way.



Born Dec. 17, 1951, she was an active member of Pine Ridge Golf Club from 1977 to 1992, then at Elmhurst Golf and Country Club from 1993 to the present.

She was the top Manitoba senior women's player four times (2002, 2003, 2006 and 2007) and also won the City and District title twice (1999, 2003). She was runner-up in the Canadian senior women's championship in 2004 and she was a finalist in voting for Manitoba amateur golfer of the year in 2003. She won the women's match play championship in 2003 and was winner of the Golf Manitoba club champions championship in 2003 and 2005.

As a team player, Lidstone represented Manitoba seven times on the amateur team (1996, 1997, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2005 and 2006). She was also on the provincial senior team seven times (2002, 2003, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2010 and 2011).

WALTER PERCHAYLO

Walter Perchaylo was involved in the golf course maintenance business for more than 50 years and earned a reputation as a mentor to many young superintendents as they started their own careers.

He was born in Skalat, Poland, on June 15, 1936, and emigrated with his family to Canada in 1939. He passed away after a battle with cancer in Winnipeg, August 13, 2008.

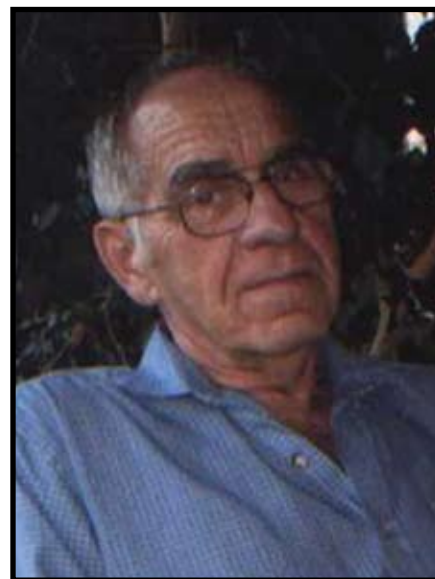
Perchaylo served as the golf superintendent at Pine Falls Golf Club from 1960 to 1966, then took over as superintendent at Pine Ridge Golf Club from 1967 to 1987. He was also superintendent at the neighbouring Elmhurst Golf and Country Club at the same time in 1968 to 1974.

In 1957-58 he was involved in the surveying and ground work when the Falcon Lake Golf Course was constructed and he also served as a mechanic at Niakwa Country Club from 1995 to 2000. He was the owner of Dew Drop Irrigation from 1987 to 1995 and he worked on course maintenance at the Wildewood Club from 2001 to 2008 and at Kingswood Golf and Country Club in 2005 and 2006. During the off-season, Perchaylo also served as the ice technician at the Heather Curling Club from 1970 to 1995.

Perchaylo served on the board of the Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association from 1962 to 1970 and was the president of that organization in 1969-70. He

was also a member of the Canadian Golf Superintendents Association from 1975 to 1987. He was named Manitoba Superintendent of the Year in 1986.

Well respected by his peers, Perchaylo was sought out by many in the industry for advice on such subjects as irrigation, equipment repair and innovative methods involved in golf course maintenance. □

New method in effect for Equitable Stroke Control

Golf Canada's Handicap and Course Rating Committee recently approved a change to the long-standing Equitable Stroke Control (ESC) method, bringing it into equivalency with current ESC calculations employed by the United States Golf Association (USGA). The new ESC method went into effect March 1, 2012, coinciding with the release of the 2012-2015 version of the Handicap Manual.

WHAT IS EQUITABLE STROKE CONTROL (ESC)?

Equitable Stroke Control (ESC) is the downward adjustment of individual hole scores for handicap purposes in order to make Handicap Factors more representative of a player's potential scoring ability. It sets a maximum number that a player can post on any hole depending on the player's Course Handicap.

HOW IT WORKS

Under the old Equitable Stroke Control system, golfers with 0 or plus handicaps could count a maximum one stroke over par on a hole; those with handicap of 1 to 18 could count a maximum two strokes over par; those with handicaps of 19 to 32 could count a maximum three strokes over par; and those with handicaps of 33 and over could count a maximum four strokes over par on a hole.

The new Equitable Stroke Control system now allows golfers with handicaps of 9 or less to count a maximum of two strokes over par on a hole; those with handicaps of 10 to 19 can count a maximum score of eight on a hole; those with handicaps of 30 to 39 can count a maximum score of nine on a hole; and those with handicaps of 40 and over can count a maximum score of 10 on a hole.

WHY THE CHANGE?

Golf Canada's Handicap and Course Rating Committee approved the change after commissioning statistical research that revealed the old Equitable Stroke Control (ESC) method caused differences in Handicap Factors that were not necessarily commensurate with a difference in ability, particularly for golfers in the higher half of each range of handicaps within the ESC table.

A golfer with a 1 handicap, for example, should not be subject to the same ESC score adjustments as a player with an 18 handicap when their abilities are so different. By reducing the size of the handicap ranges within the ESC table, those issues are mitigated. The new ESC method provides a more even distribution across a wide range of handicaps.

IMPACT OF THE NEW ESC METHODOLOGY:

Using maximum numbers (rather than adjustments being based on hole-par) facilitates simpler application and comprehension of the ESC procedure. It also mitigates the effect of courses not allocating the proper par to holes as per Golf Canada guidelines.

In the past, in a head-to-head match, the lower handicap player had a better than 50% chance of winning. The new ESC will bring the odds closer to 50%.

The new ESC brings a Golf Canada Handicap Factor and USGA Handicap Index into virtual equivalency – an important consideration with the number of 'snowbirds' playing golf in certain parts of the United States during the winter months.

Canada will continue to use 'Handicap Factor' as the proper terminology related to handicapping. □

The 2011 golf season was twice as much fun for Breezy Bend's **Jesse Skelton**.

The University of Manitoba commerce student was a two-time winner, capturing the Nott Autocorp Manitoba Men's Amateur Championship as well as the match play title for the first times in his career.

Those performances, along with strong showings in a few other events, led to Skelton being named the province's amateur golfer of the year.

Aaron Cockerill, Breezy Bend's **Eric Johnson** and Niakwa's **Scott Markham**, who was the top Manitoban with a 2-over 286 total. That was good for 19th overall.

The story was much the same for Skelton at the match play tournament in late May and early June. He placed third in qualifying with rounds of 72 and 69 at Winkler Golf Club, and then he started making his way through the field on his home track of Breezy Bend.

His first match was the toughest, as he squeaked past fellow Breezy Bend member **Justin McDonald** 1 up. He then eliminated St. Charles' **Derek East** 3 and 1, The Players' **Ryan Dirr** 6 and 4, and Breezy Bend's **Eric Johnson** 4 and 3.

That set up the final with another Breezy Bend member, **Todd Slatnik**, and Skelton cruised to a 9-and-7 triumph in the 36-hole final.

The 2012 Nott Autocorp Manitoba Men's Amateur Championship will be held July 23-26 at Winnipeg's Glendale Golf and Country Club. The national championship is slated for Aug. 7-10 at Camelot Golf and Country Club in Cumberland, ON. □

The St. Boniface golfer topped the 11-player field with rounds of 81, 84 and 82 for a 28-over 247 aggregate score. Minnewasta's **Karen Foster** (82-85-86) was second, six shots back, and Elmhurst's **Judi Lidstone** (89-85-81) placed third, eight strokes behind the champ.

Karen Saarimaki of Kenogamisis and St. Boniface's **Michelle Miyai** tied for fourth with 256 totals.

Gibson was in second place after the first round, two shots behind **Susan Wright-Cassan**, but she grabbed the lead after 36 holes thanks to a second-round 84.

Gibson took a two-shot lead over Foster into the final round. Foster actually took a two-stroke lead on the seventh hole, but the ninth proved to be a tournament-changing hole for both of them. Gibson birdied it, while Foster suffered a triple bogey. Gibson went from being one down to three up, and she never looked back.

Gibson was unable to participate in the Canadian senior women's championship, so Lidstone, Foster and Miyai represented Manitoba in Whitevale, Ont. The team ended up in sixth place with a



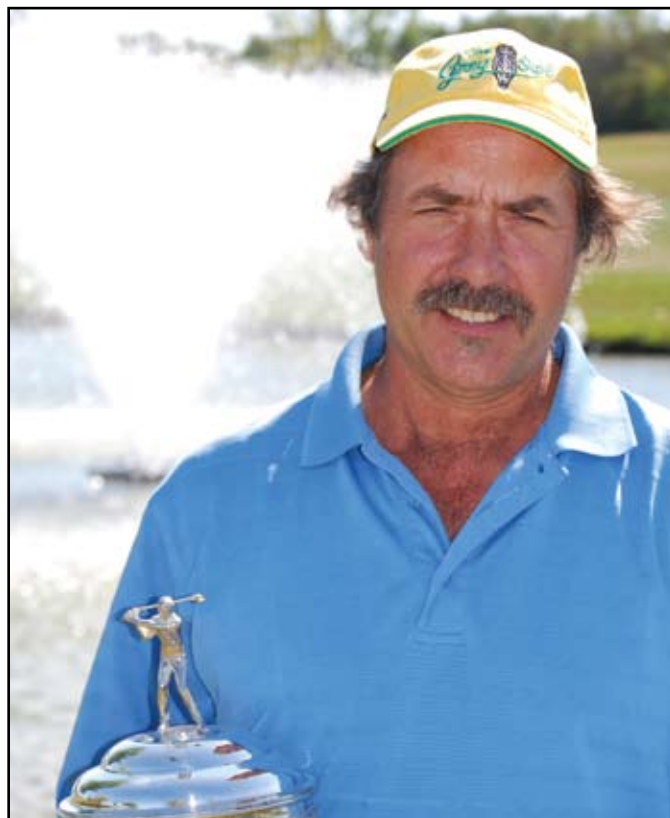

Tom Humniski wins Senior Men's title

Calling the Manitoba senior men's golf championship a roller-coaster ride for **Tom Humniski** would be putting it mildly. North and Wilson fell back after the second round with scores of 80 and 81 respectively, but Humniski shot into the lead thanks to a 1-under 70. He took a four-stroke lead over Berney into the final round.

Humniski was cruising along in the final round until he got to the eighth hole. That's where he started a bogey-bogey-double-bogey streak that cut into his lead. North, meanwhile, birdied 12, 14 and 15 en route to a closing 70 to put some heat on the leader.

Humniski birdied 12 and bogeyed four of his final six holes, but it was enough to hold on for the victory.

North was Manitoba's top finisher at the Canadian senior men's championship in Port Blanford, N.L., where he carded rounds of 77, 80, 80 and 75 to finish in a tie for 26th. Berney tied for 52nd after rounds of 83, 77, 76 and 90. Humniski (85-83) failed to qualify for the final two rounds.

Manitoba, meanwhile, finished eighth in the inter-provincial team competition with a 33-over total. That was 24 shots behind the winners from B.C.

The 2012 Manitoba senior men's championship will be held July 30 to Aug. 1 at Teulon Golf and Country Club. The Canadian championship is scheduled for Aug. 28-31 at Le Griffon de Sources in Mirabel, Que. □

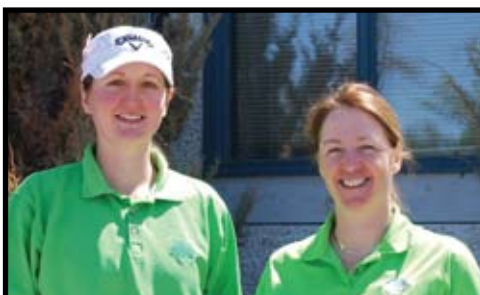
She finished five strokes better than McKenzie (74-76) and seven clear of Tokariwski (75-77). McKenzie was the event's two-time defending champ.

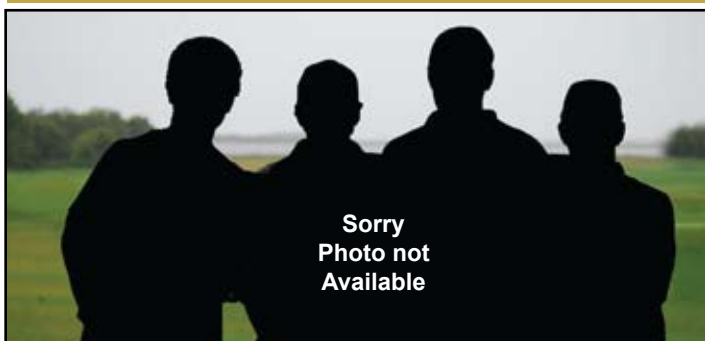

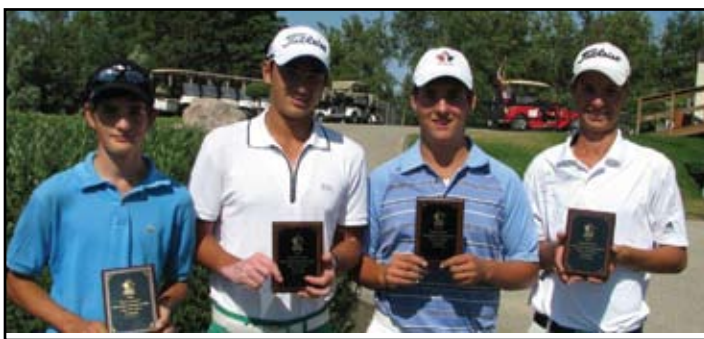

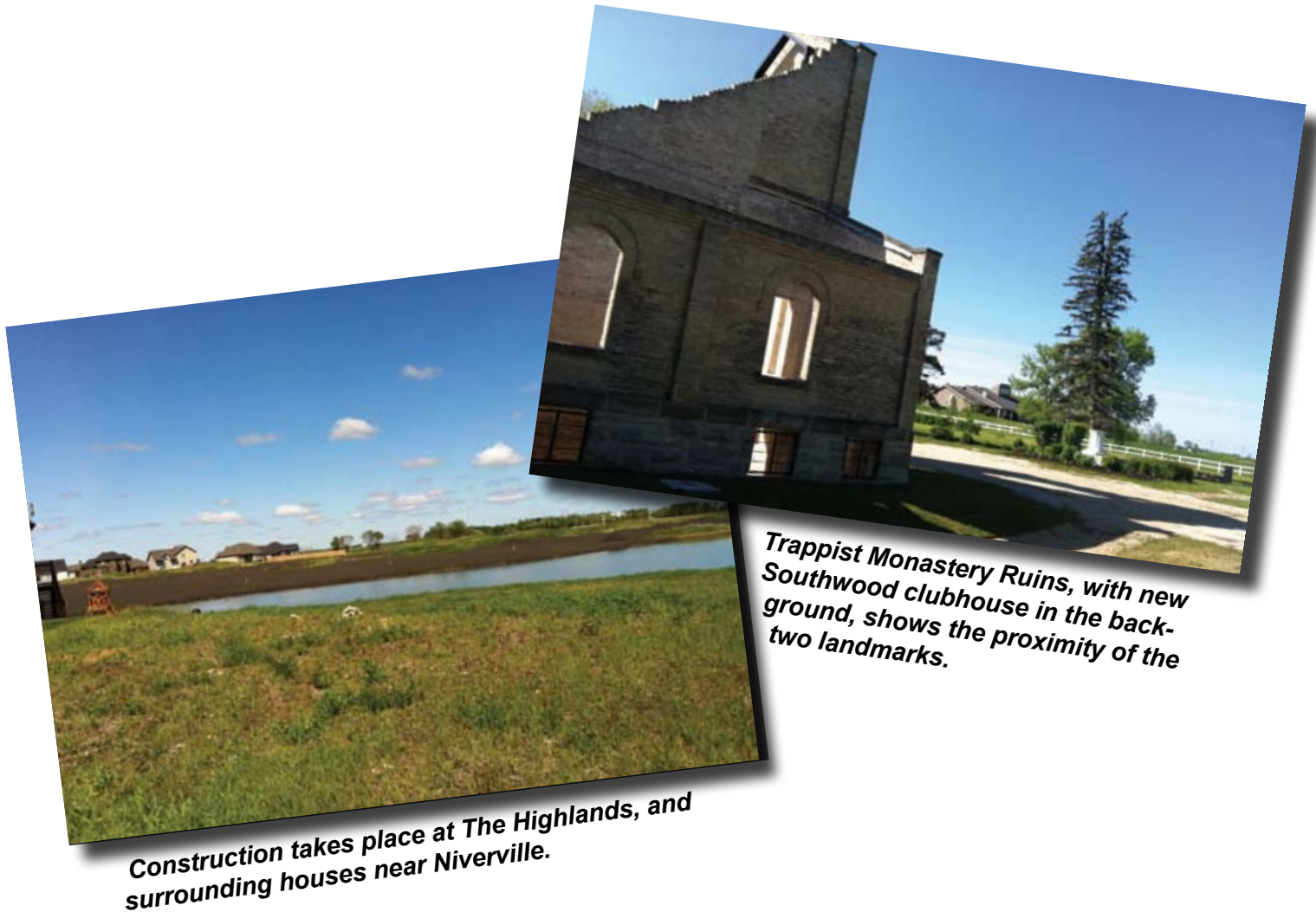

What's New on Manitoba Golf Scene

New golf projects in Manitoba, for a variety of reasons, are few and far between in 2012.

That doesn't mean it's completely quiet, however. One Winnipeg golf course is enjoying its first full year at its new site, while another project in rural Manitoba is being resurrected.

Here's a look at what's new in 2012 on the Manitoba golf scene.

...What's new

Tom Kinsman is glad he finally has just one place to call home.

Southwood Golf and Country Club is enjoying its first full year in its new home, adjacent to the Trappist Monastery Ruins in St. Norbert on the south end of Winnipeg. The former Southwood was located in Fort Garry, next to the University of Manitoba, and both courses were used during the 2011 golf season.

"It's nice to be here," Kinsman says. "We were back and forth last year, and it was a difficult environment both for the members and the staff. Everybody is just very happy to be here and starting the year here. It's a lot more comfortable for everybody."

The new 18-hole layout, which was designed by Canadian architect **Thomas McBroom**, is a links course that caters to nearly every kind of golfer. Featuring five sets of tees, the course can play as short as 5,200 yards to as long as 7,300.

The fescue was still trying to bloom on the front nine early in 2012, which "it didn't have much of a chance to do last year," Kinsman says. "It'll be caught up to the back nine probably by August."

The course doesn't feature many trees, so the typical windy day can make the new Southwood quite the test for the members.

"They just take some of the windy days as part of the course challenge and they adjust their tees accordingly," Kinsman says.

The new golf course isn't the only change at Southwood this year. Longtime superintendent **Ray Savard** retired at the end of 2011, and he was replaced by **Dustin How**, who spent the last three years working on the new course.

"That was a very beneficial hire, to bring him on," Kinsman says.

Southwood is hoping to partner with the Trappist Monastery Ruins when it comes to weddings and other social gatherings. Southwood is also interested in attracting patrons attending Shake

speare in the Ruins shows. The proximity of the two venues should allow that to happen easily, and they are prepared to host many weddings as well.

"We've got lots of outside interest," Kinsman says.

to be."

Peters told PembinaValleyOnline.com that part of the golf course will "hopefully" be operational by the summer of 2012.

"There will be some tweaking done over it," Peters said. "But the standard design as I understand it will continue to be developed as it originally was."

Sunset Estates is hoping the project will bring new life to the area.

"It's something that we certainly hope is going to have a lot of excitement in Niverville," he said. "And we're definitely looking forward to it as well. With the proxim-

ity to Winnipeg we just see this as a young, vibrant community where this sort of project just seems to really fit."

According to a source familiar with the project, the first seven holes of the golf course were completed, but they have been ignored for so long that it will take quite a bit of work to get them up to par.

NORTHWIND NARROWS

Golf course architect **David Grant** of Grant Golf reports the Northwind Narrows Golf and Country Club project is still reeling from the severe flooding in 2011.

Although the Narrows West website reports that their dream and vision "should be completed in 2012," Grant said in May 2012: "They were basically trying to get back to where we were about a year and a half ago, before the lake decided it wanted to move inland."

The 18-hole golf course is going to be located at the west side of the Narrows Bridge on Lake Manitoba. The flooding of 2011 left a large amount of water on what will be the front nine holes.

"They're looking at doing some protective diking there," Grant says. □

THE HIGHLANDS

A golf project that appeared to be dead in the water has been revived in 2012.

Crow Wing Development was supposed to be a golf course and a housing development in Niverville. The housing development went ahead several years ago, but the golf course stalled shortly after the project began.

A company called Sunset Estates Ltd., based out of Morden and Winkler, purchased Crow Wing in early 2012 and plans to not only finish the golf course, but add 100 housing lots over two or three new phases.

In addition, the area will no longer be called Crow Wing. It will now be known as The Highlands.

"After some deliberation and thinking over some possible names, we've decided on the name The Highlands," Sunset Estates vice-president **Len Peters** told PembinaValleyOnline.com. "We've chosen that to go along with the type of Scottish themed golf course, the Old Drovers Run, is going

WHEAT CITY GOLF COURSE

To say 2011 was frustrating for the folks at Brandon's Wheat City Golf Course might be the understatement of the year.

The golf course was directly in the path of a flood that experts said happens once every 350 years. The Assiniboine River spilled its banks — and then some — in the spring of 2011, leaving much of the 18-hole golf course under water.

The recovery process is well under way in 2012

"In the next couple years it'll be a premier course again back in southwestern Manitoba," says **Bryce Wilson**, Brandon's manager of recreation development.

Twelve fairways and 11 greens were under water in 2011, and in some places it was a whopping eight to 10 feet deep. Six elevated holes remained open, so

members had to play them three times if they wanted to get 18 holes in.

When the water finally went away, the fairways were toast but the greens mostly survived because they were protected, as they always are, at the end of 2010. That was just after the city had taken control of the golf course completely, and they were excited about what was to come.

"It was a real successful year (in 2010)," Wilson says. "We were looking forward to 2011, and the flood waters came so we're living with it now."

"In the long run it probably will be a blessing because a number of the projects that we want to do, like drainage because from the high water table being beside the Assiniboine River we've been able to correct those problems with the reconstruction."

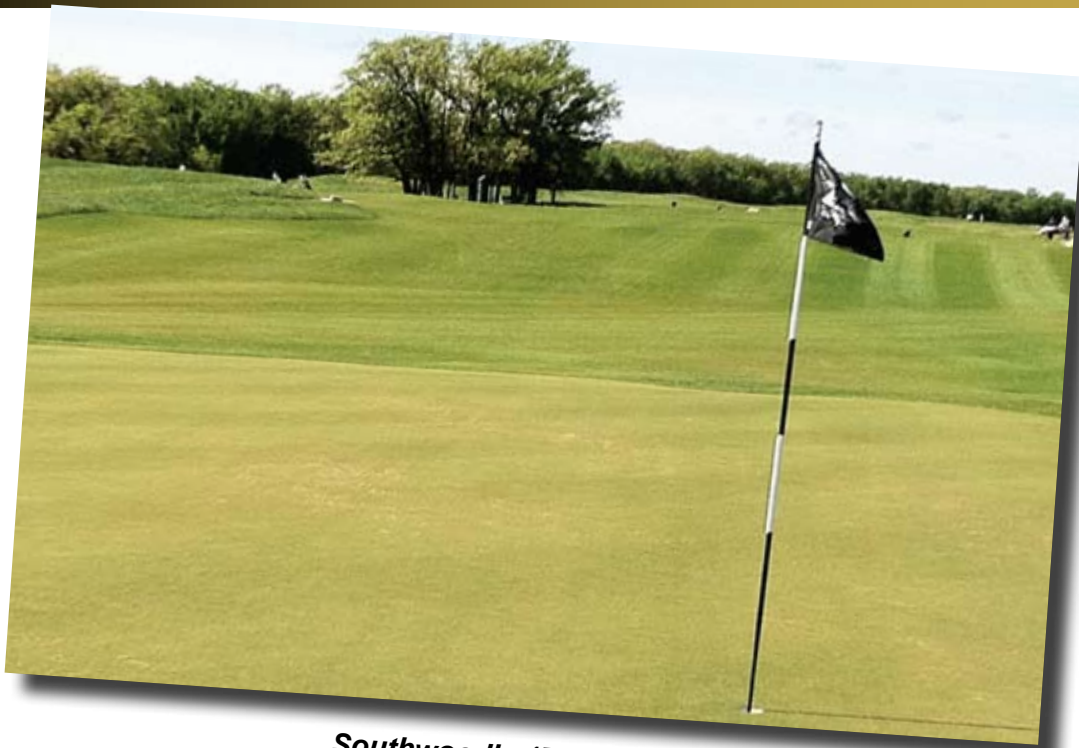

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Wilson said there's not much they can do to guard against another flood of Biblical proportions. If they build up the dike that lines the Assiniboine that would make it wider, which would cut into existing fairways. They plan to build up the dike in certain spots to make it stronger, but it won't be a massive overhaul.

"It's flooded over the dike every 15 or 16 years," Wilson says. "It's the ground water that's been an issue every year, just being so close to the dike ... seepage through the dike and so forth. A lot of the drainage projects that we've done, we feel we've corrected those problems and there's not a lot of water sitting around right now down below."

In 2012 course officials are hoping to have nine holes open by June, and all 18 up and running before the snow flies.

"Hopefully we can have 18 open by the end of the season," Wilson says, "just so people can come out and play them a few times and get excited for 2013."

THIS AND THAT

The clubhouse at Clear Lake Golf Course has been closed for financial reasons, although it may be opened for special occasions. The snack shack on the 10th tee will remain open, and there will be an area for food in the pro shops. Bar car service will also still be available ... Rossmore Country Club and Breezy Bend Country Club both had minor projects completed by Grant Golf in the spring of 2012 ... **David Grant** indicated many golf courses are wary about doing upgrades because of flooding that has hammered Manitoba in recent years. "A lot of people are waiting to see how this year shakes out," Grant says. □

Morden's Minnewasta club celebrates 50th anniversary

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AERATION ANGER?

Don't even think about it!

Imagine a world without aeration. It would be so grand.

Those dam Superintendents would stop ruining the greens right when they were running smooth and quick. There would be no more holes in the greens causing your ball to hop left or right. Sand on the greens and on your ball would be a thing of the past. The game of golf would be better off and greens would be perfect all the time.

Or would they?

The certainty of aerating greens annually (or even more often) is equalled by the predictability of golfer anger at this maintenance practice. So why exactly is this necessary and can this madness stop?

There is a wide variety of greens out there built with sand, sand/peat mixtures, or the good old "push up" greens. The term "push up" refers to the soil on the site being used. This material can vary in its texture but generally is some form of clay, otherwise termed "Manitoba Gumbo."

The same is true for the grass growing on them. Greens are seeded with many different varieties of Creeping Bent grass, but are quickly invaded by Annual Bluegrass or Poa. Many older greens are completely Poa with several varieties naturally existing and surviving. All of these grass species need air, water, and nutrients to survive and grow.

The greens get the most traffic from mowers, golfers, wildlife and ball marks. This

causes immense compaction and, in turn, a lack of oxygen in the soil. Sand is used to fill the aeration holes since it provides the most air and compacts the least. This is particularly important on "push up" greens. The compaction also prevents water from entering and moving through the soil.

Aeration provides air for roots to grow and for water and nutrients to be taken up by the plants. The sand applied after aeration will also smooth the putting surface by filling all imperfections caused by spikes, ball marks and general wear and tear.

The natural life cycle of plants growing and dying is accelerated by the intense maintenance of greens. As these plants die there is an accumulation of organic matter or "thatch" which causes greens to feel spongy. This spongy surface will slow green speed, cause poor quality of cut, prevent water and nutrients from entering the soil, and ultimately reduce the quality of the green.

Aeration and the removal of cores is the best method to control and reduce thatch. Aeration can also provide an opening to seed newer varieties of grass into existing greens. These newer varieties require less water and nutrients, and are better at surviving environmental stresses, such as extreme heat, cold, drought and disease.

This may seem like a lot of information but it is only the tip of the iceberg when it comes to the benefits and necessity of aeration.

The equipment used in aeration has improved exponentially in the last ten years. The work is completed in less time, is less invasive, and recovery time is reduced.

So the next time you see your friendly neighbourhood Superintendent out there aerating greens, instead of cursing and shaking your fist at them, give them a wave and a smile. You can rest assured that we are doing it for the health and survival of the greens, and to provide all golfers with a quality putting surface.

Question: *Do we really have to aerate greens?*

Answer: *Yes, if we want them to have grass.*

Greg Mitchell of Bel Acres is the new vice-president and the only newcomer to the board is **Dale Jackson** of Lorette. Remaining on the board are **Chris Spicer** of Elmhurst, **Darren Dundas** of La Verendrye and **Alan Haufek** of Even Spray. **Bob Hamm** of Steinbach is the association's executive director.

Schofield got his start in the superintending business in 1987, when he was involved with the development of the Netley Creek golf course and remained to work on the that course until he took on the job with Lakeland Golf Management in 1996.

It gives you a feeling you fit in even though you weren't originally from here and didn't go up through the system with a lot of these other guys. It's a pretty neat honour."

Dick first played in Winnipeg as a Canadian Tour member in the early 2000s. After returning to his native Sydney for a few years, he decided to give the Canadian Tour another crack. He loved Pine Ridge when he played it, and he liked the staff even more. He met and fell in love with an employee of the golf club, and now she is his wife. Dick started out as an assistant at Pine Ridge, and just one year later he became their head pro, in 2008.

"Everything's been really good," Dick said. "Everything's worked out great. It's hard being away from the family, but it's so busy through the summer here. That's a good thing for me. I don't need to be quiet with too much free time to think about what you're missing out on back home with family and that, but everything's been great here."

Dick is in his fifth year as head pro at the course northeast of Winnipeg, and his pride and joy is the private club's junior program. There were only two junior members when he got to Pine Ridge,

and they worked in the back shop cleaning clubs. They hardly played.

Fast forward five years, and the Pine Ridge junior program has 85 members and a waiting list to boot.

"Everyone was giving us the, 'You're too far out of town. You can't get juniors here.' **Jason (Ludke)**, the general manager, and myself sat down and sort of planned out what we thought would be our best chance to try and just even attract a few to give us a bit of strength going into the future," Dick said.

"The last couple years it's grown a lot. It's probably the best thing I've been a part of here throughout the years."



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Dean North named Pro Player of the Year for third time

Dean North didn't win every tournament on the PGA of Manitoba's competitive schedule in 2011.

It only seemed like it.

The Carman Golf and Curling Club head pro won three of eight events in 2011, including the prestigious Manitoba PGA Championship and the Callaway Fall Classic.

He was near the top in nearly every other tournament he played as well, losing in a playoff, and tying for third and fifth in three other events.

As a result, he was named the PGA of Manitoba's player of the year for the third consecutive season.

"At times I played very, very well," North said. "I just played pretty consistent most of the year I guess is the best way to describe it."

North also won the PGA of Manitoba Pro-Am at Niakwa on July 4. He lost in a playoff in the PING June Classic at Bel Acres, and he was one shot out of a playoff at the season-opening Callaway Open in Morden. He finished three shots behind winner Glen Mills, in a tie for fifth, at the August Challenge on his home course in Carman.

All in all, it was a dominant performance from start to finish.

"One of my strengths is my mental game," the Carman native said. "I don't get too uptight one way or the other about the results. Some guys get a little nervous, I would say, at times trying to do well. I don't worry about those things, so I think that gives me a bit of an edge."

North's most impressive showing of the season came in the Callaway Fall Classic at Pine Ridge, which he won by a whopping 16 strokes. North shot 67-68, and runner-up **Andrew Steep** of Glendale carded rounds of 73 and 78.

"I played really well, and the weather was poor," said North, who is in his third season as Carman's head pro. "... I was in full control of my swing and putting. It's nice to play well."

North used to play on the Canadian Tour, but his recent hot play doesn't have him pining for a return to the circuit.

"No, the circumstances don't allow me to ever think that way," he said. "I've got more important things than golf. There's times I certainly think, 'Gosh, I wonder how good I could've gotten with my game,' but they are few and far between. My family and my wife are most important." □

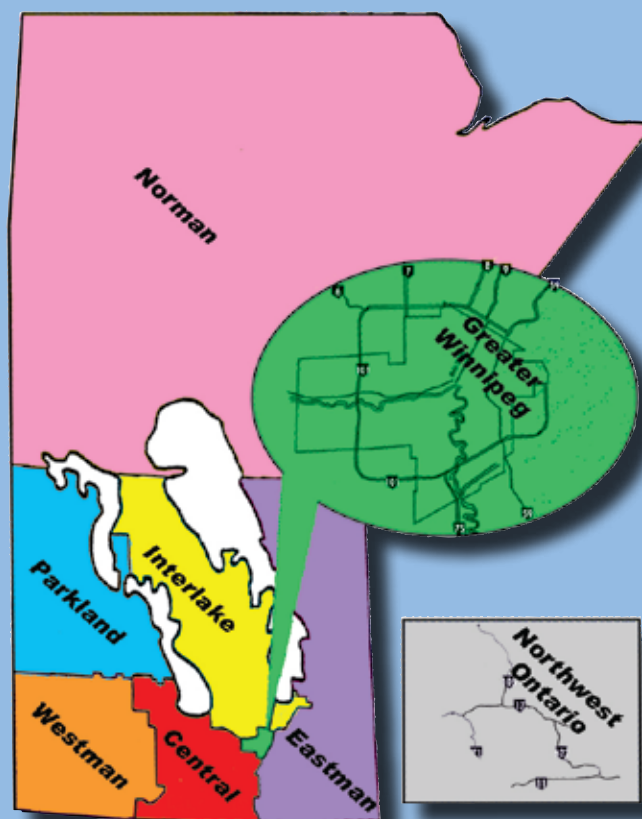

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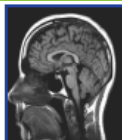
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
