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2014 SCHOLARSHIPS...

The Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund Inc. in 2014 awarded six scholarships to young golfers who have participated in the Manitoba golf community, demonstrated academic excellence and are pursuing their post-secondary studies at Canadian educational institutions. Since the inception of the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund, 165 scholarships have been awarded totalling \$167,000.

Dr. Dwight Parkinson Award

In 2013 the Dr. Dwight Parkinson Award was created which is a \$3,500 scholarship that has been made possible by Dave Hill of St. Charles recognizing Dr. Parkinson's long time commitment to the game of golf. It is awarded to the student entering their first year of studies at a post-secondary institution with the highest academic standing.

The 2014 recipient was Steven Young of St. Charles Country Club. Young was entering the University of Manitoba to pursue a Bachelor of Science degree, with future plans to pursue a degree in medicine. In 2013 he finished second at the Manitoba junior men's championship, and he made both the provincial team for the Canadian junior men's championship and Team Manitoba for the Canada Summer Games.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Dave Comaskey is in his 11th year as Golf Manitoba's executive director, and Manitoba Golfer recently sat down with the boss to look back on 2014, look ahead to a big year in 2015 and find out if he accomplished his mission of playing 20 rounds of golf last year.

MG: Let's get right to it, shall we? How was the 2014 season?

DC: It was good. We conducted a number of successful events, and had over 5,000 kids go through the Golf in Schools and Future Links program, which is wonderful. We track those numbers for a variety of reasons, but we had just over 5,000 kids go through that program again. That's either the second or third year in a row we've reached that plateau. That's one of the more subtle things we do. We get a lot of profile – and it's great – from our provincial championships, but from a developmental standpoint, when we have 5,000 kids touch a golf club, who knows the impact that's going to have down the road. That's one of our big successes from '14, '13 and '12, and that's the target again for '15.

MG: Are you starting to see any membership improvement from that, or is it too early?

DC: It's probably too early to say, because the Golf in Schools program is targeted from Grades 2 to 6. Whether we will or not, I don't know the answer to that. Nationwide this is going on. It's not isolated to Manitoba. There's a real collective effort among the provincial golf associations and the PGA of Canada and National Golf Course Owners Association. We're all doing a variety of initiatives, some collaboratively and some association driven. But the need is to get young people exposed to the game of golf. And some of those young people are going to hopefully become avid golfers. And usually it's the avid

golfer who becomes the competitive golfer. But it's critical to the future of the game.

MG: So how is membership going in Manitoba?

DC: When you talk about the '14 season, it's a concern is probably the best way to describe it. And I'm sure if you were to ask any golf club – not every one – but if it's not in immediate decline from 2013 to 2014, I bet you in the last four or five years they've seen declines. And when there's a decline in membership at golf clubs, we see that decline here in our office. They're saying that more people are playing the game casually, but less people are joining golf clubs. In turn that affects golf clubs, it affects us, and it affects a number of things. Having said that, there's been a lot of work done by Golf Canada and the provincial golf associations. We're in the very early stages of launching a new membership model. It's exciting. We've had to change. The membership model that we currently have has been in place since the '40s. The business of golf has dramatically changed. At that point, the vast majority of people who were playing golf were members of golf clubs. That's the opposite now. The vast majority of people who play the game are not members of golf clubs. So we need to make sure that we're servicing not only our member clubs, but be very relevant to the individual golfer.

MG: This is the 100th anniversary of Golf Manitoba. How big of a party are you going to throw for yourselves?

DC: It's huge for us. To say it's a one-in-a-hundred year occurrence is kind of an obvious statement, but it is that. It's an opportunity to recognize the history and look forward to another 100 years (more on the centennial celebration on page 32).

MG: I'm assuming the national championships last year in Manitoba, the Canadian university/college and Canadian men's amateur, were successes?

DC: Any time we can host national championships, it's extremely exciting and gratifying. Whenever we can showcase the golf facilities that we have in the province, it's a huge success alone. Then add on to that the fact that the University of Manitoba Bisons team wins the national championship on home turf, and then we had a number of great showings at the Canadian amateur, led by our golfer of the year last year, Bret Thompson, finishing in the top 10.

MG: You told us last year you hoped to play 15 to 20 rounds. Did you hit that total?

DC: I got to 23! After we talked I bumped that to 25 as my goal, and I got to 23. If we hadn't had a late start I think I would've got to the 25.



DIRECTOR OF PLAYER DEVELOPEMENT'S REPORT

Thanks to the Canada, Western Canada and Manitoba Summer Games, there is something substantial for the province's young golfers to shoot towards each year.

Those aforementioned Games are held every four years and back to back to back, so it allows Golf Manitoba's Garth Goodbrandson to set up a program to have players compete for spots on each team.

This year it's the Western Canada Summer Games, which will be held in Fort McMurray, Alta., in August. As a result, 10 boys and six girls under the age of 16 began preparations last fall to attempt to earn spots on their respective teams this summer.

"Those Games programs have really added a lot to programming for us," Goodbrandson said. "You want to give them a competitive carrot, which they get and they're motivated by it, and then you always want to build in lifelong memories for players, whether they make a team or not.

"It's a great way for people to develop passion for the game and great memories from the game."

Goodbrandson identified the 10 boys and six girls based on their play last year, and they spent the winter training once a week at

the Golf Dome in Winnipeg. They will take part in the Mundie Putter and Nassau leagues this year to get as much competition as they can.

"That's always been a great way for them to get experience playing different courses around Manitoba and against the top amateur male and female players," Goodbrandson said. "It's always good experience and exposure to play against those people. Then we'll have practices and a couple training camps throughout the year."

The boys' squad will be determined by each player's best six rounds among the following events: Manitoba men's match play qualifying (two rounds), special qualifier at Minnewasta (two rounds) and the Manitoba junior men's championship (four rounds).

The girls' team will be based on the best six rounds from these events: Manitoba women's match play qualifying (two rounds), Manitoba women's amateur (three rounds) and Manitoba junior women's championship (three rounds).

The real developmental part about this year's tryout process is the same group of players will be eligible to compete for the 2017 Canada Summer Games, which will be held in Winnipeg. It won't

necessarily be the exact same 16 players who get invited to try out, but they'll likely get a leg up by competing for spots this year.

"The nice thing about having a program like this is the kids who are on the team get a great opportunity to play in the Western Canada Games, but even the kids who don't necessarily make the team, they improve tremendously themselves," Goodbrandson said. "So it's good development for all the kids playing."

There will be a smaller program next year for the Manitoba Summer Games, which are for younger goalies, and then in the fall of 2016 Golf Manitoba will start gearing up for the Canada Summer Games on its own turf.

BRET THOMPSON NAMED MANITOBA GOLFER OF THE YEAR

When Bret Thompson returned to Winnipeg last spring after his sophomore season at Simon Fraser University, he wasn't happy with his golf game.

So he did what anyone in his situation would do: He quit practicing.

He did what now?

"I actually stopped going to the range so much," the Southwood Golf and Country Club member said. "That's one of the things I did. I was focused too much on what my swing looked like and not really focused on where the ball was going, and I was getting frustrated.

"So I stopped going to the range so much. I just played a lot of

golf, and it started coming back." Did it ever. Thompson won not only the season opening Manitoba men's match play championship in June, beating Eagles Landing's Wade Wetelainen in the 36 hole final, but he had a strong showing in the Nott Autocorp Manitoba men's amateur championship and then tied for eighth in the Canadian men's amateur at Elmhurst and Southwood.

He credits the match play victory as being the springboard to a 2014 season that ended with his being named Golf Manitoba's amateur golfer of the year.

"It just gave me a lot of confidence, being able to win a tournament like that playing against some of the guys who in previ-

ous years I considered ahead of me," Thompson said. "Being able to beat them and get the win was very, very good for my confidence."

There were still a few hurdles along the journey that still stand in his way today, like being able to close out rounds. Never was that more evident than at the Nott Autocorp Manitoba men's amateur at Niakwa and The Links at Quarry Oaks, where he got off to great starts but started thinking too much about shooting 62 instead of simply playing good golf.

"I kind of forced it a bit too much there, because the first round I was three under through ten and I shot one over," Thompson said. "The next round I was three under through four and shot even, and then at Niakwa I was four under through six and shot one under. I started thinking too much."

He tied for seventh overall, but his play in the provincial amateur actually paved the way to his strong showing at the Canadian am when he looks back on it.

"Even though I wasn't really happy with the result, I was able to take away a lot of positive things from that, knowing that I can go low when I'm kind of relaxed," he said. "I just have to learn to control the emotions and not get too high when you're playing well and not trying to force it too much."

He took that improved mindset into the Canadian amateur, which featured one round at his home course, although that was easier said than done.

"I was kind of nervous, because you want to do well on the big stage," he said. "My first couple holes of the tournament I made a couple bogeys. On my fifth hole I rolled in a seven-footer for par, and that's when I said, let's just settle down here."

Thompson more than settled down. He toured the Donald

Ross design in just 68 strokes and he knew he could score well the next day at Southwood. He put another 68 on the board and found himself in contention. Just like that he was warming up on the range and playing with some of North America's top amateur golfers, like Corey Connors, Adam Svensson and Lee McCoy.

"So it was pretty nice knowing that when I play well I can be there," he said.

He carded rounds of 72 and 71 in the final two rounds at Elmhurst and ended up just three shots

out of the three-man playoff in a tie for eighth. It was the best showing by a Manitoban since the tournament returned to stroke play nearly a decade ago.

"It was really good for my expectations," Thompson said. "I want to go pro after, so it was definitely a big confidence booster knowing I could get there. It kind of set the benchmark. I'm kind of in the process of: I know I can play there, so how can I get there consistently? I'm trying to just build off of it."

When he returned to school at SFU in the fall Thompson had chances to win but ended up tying for second and third in four events.

Thompson plans to have a busy 2015 season, adding elite amateur tournaments like Calgary's Glencoe Invitational and U.S. amateur qualifying to his schedule. He was the first alternate two years ago in Fargo, N.D., so he knows he can do it. He also gets an automatic entry into the Canadian men's amateur in Toronto thanks to his showing last August.

UP CLOSE

Favourite club in your bag?

I like all of them, but probably my putter.

Favourite Manitoba golf hole?

I really like 11 at the new Southwood. It's a downhill, 230-yard par-3 over water with fescue around it. It's difficult, but it's a really nice hole.

Favourite golf course outside of Manitoba?

PGA National, probably. I played the Junior Optimist there in 2012. I love that course.

Biggest influence on your career?

Probably my dad, Geoff. When I was younger he'd bring me out to the golf course, and he's always supported me.

Best career round?

I've gone 7 under four times. One of those was a 64, and three of them were 65. They had the MJT at the Meadows. I went 65-65. Then I shot two in qualifying out here. The 64 was at Marine Drive, and the 65 was at Richmond Golf Club.

What driver is in your bag?

Titleist 913 D3.

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The Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum held its 12th annual induction ceremony on Monday, Sept. 29, at Winnipeg's McPhillips Station Casino.

There were four inductees honoured during this year's event for their accomplishments on and off the golf course: Harry Brotchie, Lorraine MacLeod, Jack Cuthbert (posthumously) and Dean North.

Here is a look at their accomplishments:



HARRY BROTCHE



From a teenage involvement in competitive golf, Harry Brotchie went on to become one of the top builders and developers of the sport in Manitoba. His reputation extends beyond the province, and into national and international activities.

As a young amateur player, Brotchie emerged as a three-time winner of the John Blumberg municipal course championship from 1972 to '74 and two-time winner of the City of Winnipeg municipal championship in 1973 and '74. As a professional he won the Manitoba PGA assistants championship in 1975 and 1977, and placed fifth in the Canadian assistants championship in 1975. He won the Mani-

toba PGA title in 1975 and was the winner of more than 15 other Manitoba pro events.

His long list of accomplishments in the business and development of the sport earns him a place among the golf builders of Manitoba. Provincially, he developed and conducted junior golf camps and rural clinics for the Manitoba Golf Association and Manitoba Ladies Golf Association. He was president of the Manitoba PGA Assistants and later served as president of the Manitoba PGA in 1985 and '86. He was president of the Prairie Chapter of the National Golf Course Owners Association in 2013 and '14.

On the national scene, Brotchie was on the CPGA board of directors for 10 years and was a member of the executive committee for seven years. He served as chairman of several committees and became national CPGA president in 1993 for a two-year term. He is recognized as a CPGA Master Professional and is a director of the National Golf Course Owners Association. Internationally, he was non-playing captain of three Canadian World Cup teams, was honorary vice-president of the PGA of America in 1993 and '94, and was elected to membership in the British PGA.

As president of Lakeland Golf Management, Brotchie is in charge of the operation of nine public and resort golf courses in Manitoba and Saskatchewan: Tor Hill, Murray, Lakeview and Joanne Goulet courses in Regina; Harbour View and Tuxedo courses in Winnipeg; Grand Pines, Links at the Lake and Hecla courses in rural Manitoba.

LORRAINE MACLEOD



Years of dedicated service to golf in and out of the province have earned the right for Mabel Lorraine MacLeod to be recognized as a true builder of the sport in Manitoba.

It all started at the Winnipeg Canoe Club, where she served in executive positions (including a

term as president) from 1978 to 1982. She researched the history of WCC ladies golf, and presented an article and pictorial display. This was followed with the organization of Manitoba Ladies Golf Association records and later a full review of MLGA activities for the 75th anniversary in 1997. All material has been deposited into the provincial archives.

She starting serving on the MLGA executive in 1982, chairing several committees and becoming provincial president in 1987 and '88. She was instrumental in the development of golf clinics, target fitness, sport psychology and a winter golf school with members of the Manitoba PGA. She was on the board of directors of the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum from 2001 to 2008 and was on the selection committee from 2001 to 2003.

MacLeod was involved with the conducting of several Canadian Ladies Golf Association championships from 1981 to 2001, including chairing the 1991 Canadian Women's Amateur Championship at Glendale Golf and Country Club. She received in 2000 a CLGA Distinguished Service Award for outstanding contributions.

Other awards included most outstanding member from Winnipeg Canoe Club in 1986, MLGA outstanding volunteer award in 1989, Gal of the Year award from Southwood ladies section in 1996 and Volunteer Service Award for 25 years of service from Golf Manitoba in 2007.

JACK CUTHBERT



Jack Cuthbert was the first winner of the Manitoba men's amateur golf championship in 1919 and went on to become a dominant figure on the provincial golf scene through the 1920s.

He followed that 1919 victory with three more Manitoba amateur titles in 1921, 1923 and 1925, and added the Manitoba Open championship in 1924. He was a

member of Manitoba's first men's Willingdon Cup team in 1927.

Earlier, Cuthbert claimed the Saskatchewan Amateur honours in 1917, 1918 and 1919, and was the Saskatchewan Open winner in 1931. He also won the Alberta men's amateur championship twice, the Western Canadian Amateur title twice and the Western Canadian Open championship once.

He was born in Nairn, Scotland, on January 4, 1894, and came to Winnipeg in 1911. He worked with the Bank of Commerce and then was a sportswriter with the Winnipeg Free Press for four years, specializing in golf. He moved west to Moose Jaw, then on to Calgary and Edmonton. He became the golf professional at the Calgary Country Club in the 1930s and held that post for 33 years.

Along with his list of championship performances, Cuthbert had the honour of playing in exhibition matches with such noted golfers as Harry Vardon, Ted Ray, Gene Sarazen and Walter Hagen. In 1924 and '25, the Dominion Chocolate Co., Limited issued a trading card in his honour.

Jack Cuthbert passed away in Calgary in 1972 at the age of 78.



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DEAN NORTH



From the time he left the amateur ranks in 1994, Dean North has been an outstanding figure on the Manitoba professional golf scene.

His main claim to fame as an amateur was as a member of the winning Manitoba team at the Canadian junior interprovincial championship in 1991 along with Rob McMillan, Darren Magda and Brian Houston.

North moved out of the amateur picture and started his pro career as an assistant at Carman Golf and Curling Club in 1992 and 1993. North was an assistant at Pine Ridge Golf Club in 1994 and 1995. He then moved to St. Charles Country Club, where he was an assistant from 1994 to 2005. From 2006 to 2009 he served as head professional at Selkirk Golf and Country Club, then returned in 2010 to his home town of Carman, where he now serves as general manager of the Carman Golf and Curling Club.

North won the qualifying tournament for the Canadian Tour in 2000 and played as a member

of the Tour in 1998, 2001, 2003 and 2004.

On the local pro scene, North won the Manitoba PGA Player of the year honours in 1997, 1999, 2000, 2005, 2006, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2014; won the MPGA Championship in 2000, 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2012; and won the Fall Classic championship in 1995, 1999, 2000, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2011 and 2013. He has also claimed victories in many one-day tournaments and pro-am events over the years.

In 2004, North won the North Dakota State Open at the Fargo Country Club with a record 18-under-par total 198 over three rounds, including the current course record of 10-under 62. Also in 2004, North won the U.S. Open regional qualifier in Minneapolis using a rental set of clubs. He also is the holder of course records of 59 at Carman and 61 at Selkirk.

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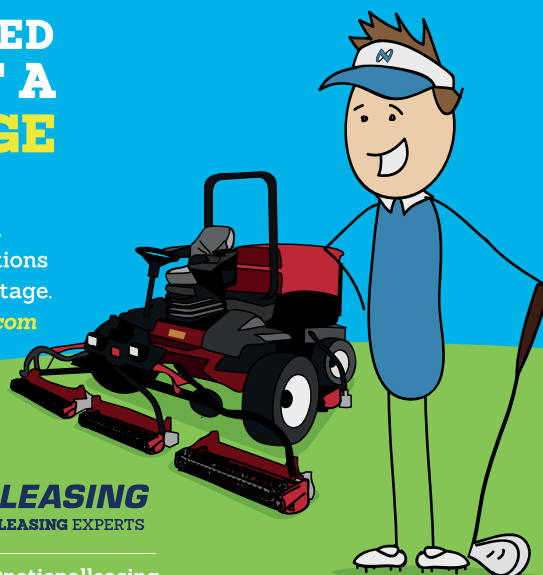
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UNIVERSITY CHAMPIONSHIPS

The University of Manitoba Bisons golf team was excited about hosting the 2014 Canadian University/College Championship because it was being played on its home course of Southwood Golf and Country Club.

That excitement turned out to be justified, because the Bisons were able to win their first national championship on their home turf in early June.

The Bisons won by 12 shots over the defending champion UBC Thunderbirds and were the only squad to shoot under 300 each of the four days.

"I'm very excited and very proud of this team," Bisons coach Garth Goodbrandson told reporters on the day of triumph. "They really deserve it, they've worked so hard, and it shows you that hard work does pay off."

Manitoba's winning team consisted of Josh Wytinck, Charlie Boyechko, Bryce Barr, Scott Mazur and Brodie Gobin. Wytinck (74-71-70-74) finished fourth individually, while Mazur (79-71-70-71) and Barr (73-73-73-72) tied for fifth. Boyechko (69-76-72-80) and Gobin (77-72-73-75) tied for 16th.

UBC's Scott Second won the individual portion of the tournament, firing rounds of 68, 65, 71 and 71. That was seven shots better than Victoria's Connor Gann.

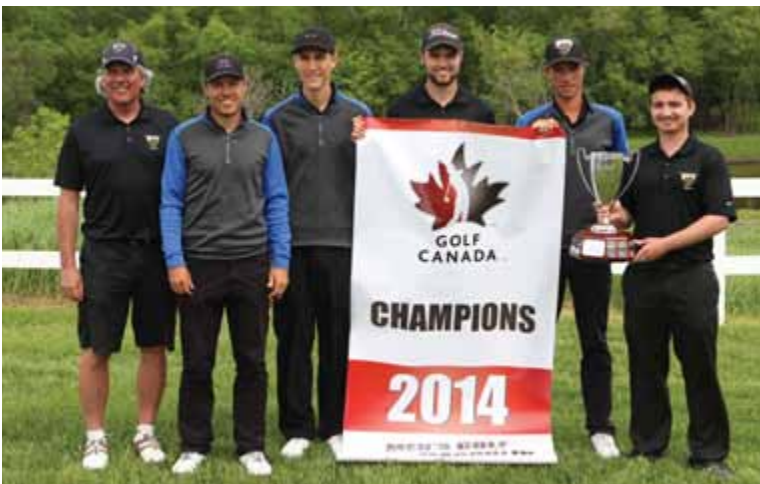
Victoria's Megan Woodland captured the women's individual title by one stroke over UBC's Kylie Barros. UBC easily won the women's team event, cruising to a 35-shot victory over the Montreal Carabins.

This year's Canadian University/College Championship will be held in Guelph at the end of May, and Mazur, Boyechko and Gobin will be back to help Manitoba try to defend its crown.

"Everyone's pretty excited by that," Goodbrandson said this spring.

Devon Schade, who is in his first year with the team, and fourth year Ryan Dirr are the other members of the Herd who will attempt to make it two in a row for Manitoba.

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TODD FANNING CLAIMS MEN'S AMATEUR HONOURS

All it took was one round for the Nott Autocorp Manitoba men's amateur championship to swing in Todd Fanning's favour.

Breezy Bend's Garth Collings had a two-stroke lead at the midway point of the event, thanks to back-to-back rounds of 67 at The Links at Quarry Oaks. Fanning, who shot 69 and 67, was two shots back.

The good news for Fanning, though, is the final two rounds were slated for his home course of Niakwa Country Club. He took full advantage.

Fanning fired a sparkling 68 in the third round while most everyone else couldn't break 70. Collings slipped to a 76, which gave Fanning, a former professional golfer, a six-shot advantage going into the final round.

Fanning withstood a tremendous charge from Southwood's Charlie Boyechko in the final round and won his first Manitoba amateur in 22 years and fifth overall. He carded a 74 that left him with a four round total of 10-under-par 278. Boyechko

came in at 8-under 280 (68-75-71-66).

"It was an incredible week," Fanning told reporters after his victory. "If you check my Twitter account, back in (early) July I said it would be cool to win 30 years after my first one. I'm pretty happy about that."

"Lots has happened (since 1984). I was 16 years old, and two years before that I didn't even know what the Manitoba amateur was and then I won. I had a pretty good career as a pro, and now I'm just happy to be back playing with the young kids. There are some guys here that have some serious game. It's enjoyable to play beside them."

Boyechko started the final round 10 strokes back of Fanning, but he had reduced that edge to just one stroke after 15 holes if you matched their cards. Boyechko, who was playing in the group in front of Fanning, bogeyed the 18th hole to end up two back of the champ.

Fanning, who got his amateur status back in 2008, represented Manitoba at the Canadian amateur



in Winnipeg along with Boyechko and Bryce Sholdice of Bel Acres, and the team tied for fourth in the Willingdon Cup competition.

Southwood's Bret Thompson was the top Manitoban at the amateur, tying for eighth, while St. Charles' Derek East tied for 18th. Other Manitobans who made the cut were Fanning (tied for 27th), Elmhurst's Scott Mazur (tied for 43rd), Pine Ridge's Josh Wytinck (tied for 58th) and Breezy Bend's Eric Johnson (tied for 64th).

JENNA ROADLEY CLAIMS WOMEN'S AMATEUR HONOURS

Bri-ann Tokariwski made it three wins in a row at the Manitoba women's match play championship, but Jenna Roadley decided it wasn't going to happen again in another major event.

Roadley, who plays collegiately at Bradley University in Peoria, Ill., prevented Tokariwski from winning her third straight women's amateur championship in 2014, cruising to a 12-shot triumph in the three-day event. Tokariwski ended up in second spot at St. Charles Country Club.

Roadley, who is a member at Glendale Golf and Country Club, won her first amateur crown with rounds of 70, 75 and 76, which worked out to a 5-over-par total over three days. Tokariwski, an Elmhurst member, never really threatened Roadley's romp to the championship, posting scores of 79, 75 and 79 to end up at 17 over par.

Roadley entered the final round with a comfortable nine stroke lead, and she made sure nobody

got close by playing her first 11 holes in even par.

Glendale's Camryn Roadley, who is Jenna's younger sister, finished third (78-78-79), and St. Boniface's Mindy Lichtman (83-75-79) was fourth, 16 shots back of the champ. Jenna Roadley's opening round of 2-under-par 70, which was the tournament's best, featured a bogey on the first hole but three birdies and 14 pars the rest of the way.

Tokariwski, Camryn Roadley and Lichtman represented Manitoba at the Canadian women's amateur championship in Woodstock, Ont., and they placed eighth among the eight teams with a 45-over total in the interprovincial competition.

Lichtman was the only Manitoban to make the cut and ended up in 77th spot after shooting 82, 82, 80 and 87. Tokariwski and Roadley missed the 36-hole cut.

This year's Manitoba women's amateur championship will take place July 6 to 8 at St. Boniface Golf Club.

The Winnipeg golfer, who attends high school in the U.S. to improve her golf game, turned in an 86 in the third and final round at Rossmere Country Club, yet she still won by five strokes over Selkirk's McKyla Poponick. Thunder Bay's Alexandra Demko was third.

The championship really turned in Vetesnik's favour in the second round, when she blistered the course with a 3-over-par 76 that turned a one shot deficit into an eight stroke advantage going into the final 18 holes. Vetesnik

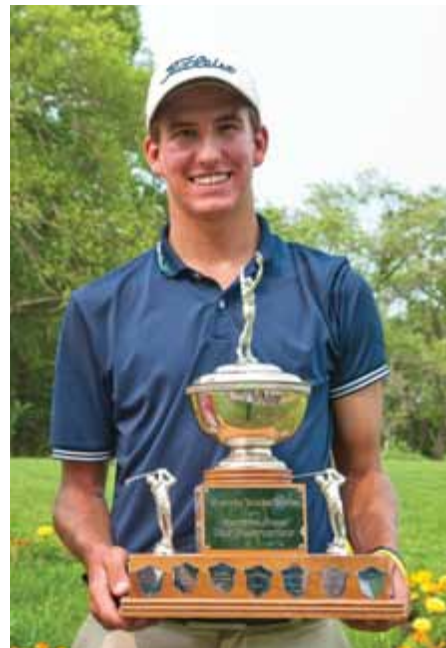
He had three bogeys on the front nine, but he bounced back with four birdies and only one more bogey to

RHONDA ORR CLAIMS WOMEN'S SENIOR HONOURS

Rhonda Orr was looking to win her second straight Manitoba senior women's golf championship on July 30, but it wasn't going to be easy.

The Southwood Golf and Country Club member went into the third and final round with a lead, but it was only by one shot over Diane Dolan of Ottawa's Hylands Golf Club and two shots over Diane Eyeford of St. Charles.

Orr decided she wasn't interested in an exciting finish, because she got right to work. Orr parred the first hole and birdied the second to give herself a quick four-stroke lead over the two Dianes, who were playing with her in the final group.

There was never much in doubt after that, and Orr ended up winning her second crown in a row by two shots over Eyeford without ever giving up the lead over the

last 18 holes at Larters at St. Andrews.

It was quite the logjam atop the leaderboard going into the final round of the Manitoba senior men's championship on July 30 at Larters at St. Andrews.

Collings was the top individual 'Toban at nationals, tying for 38th with rounds of 79, 75, 75 and 76. The other six Manitobans missed the cut.

CAMERON LOWDON CLAIMS MID AMATEUR HONOURS

Cameron Lowdon went into the final day of the Aberdeen Chiropractic Manitoba men's mid-amateur golf championship with his eye on his playing partner.

It turned out the man who almost took him down was playing five groups in front of him.

Lowdon, an Elmhurst Golf and Country Club member, went into the final round tied for the lead with Pine Ridge's Mike Tibbs, but he ended up winning the tournament by one stroke over Niakwa's Scott Markham and Hamiota's Chad Facey.

Lowdon ended up winning with an 11-over-par 227 total thanks to rounds of 74, 76 and 77. Markham (77-81-70) and Facey (76-77-75) came close at St. Charles Country Club, but they both finished at 12 over.

Lowdon, Markham and Rossmere's Rob Oliphant made up the Manitoba team that competed at the Canadian men's mid-amateur championship in Barrie, Ont., in September. They finished last in the 10-province tournament with a 27-over-par total. Lowdon was the top finisher of the three, tying for 54th spot with a 21-over 309 total, while Markham and Oliphant missed the 36-hole cut.

BRI-ANN TOKARIWSKI CLAIMS WOMEN'S MATCH PLAY HONOURS

Bri-ann Tokariwski in 2014 became the first women's golfer to win three consecutive Manitoba match play championships in more than a decade.

When Tokariwski put the finishing touches on her dominant 11 and 10 victory over fellow Elmhurst member Faye Zachedniak in the final at Bel Acres Golf and Country Club, it marked the first "three-peat" since Judi Lidstone accomplished the feat in 2003.

Tokariwski finished second in the qualifying portion of the event after shooting rounds of 76 and 80. That put her four strokes back of medallist Jenna Roadley, the Glendale member who fired 71-81 to finish on top of the 11-player field.

Tokariwski enjoyed a bye to the

second round thanks to her runner-up showing in the qualifying round, and she breezed past Maria Funston 6 and 5 in her first match to get to the semifinals. There she took care of Mindy Lichtman by a 4 and 3 score to set up the winner-take-all tilt with Zachedniak, whose road to the final was a bit longer.

Zachedniak qualified ninth among the 11 competitors with rounds of 82 and 89, but she edged Kathryn McKenzie 3 and 2 in the first round before upending Roadley 2 and 1 in her quarter-final match.

Zachedniak was feeling good by the time she got to her semifinal contest against Dana Todd, who enjoyed a first-round bye and then advanced once more without hitting a shot since her opponent was unable to play their quarter-final match.

In the quarter-final round Thompson eliminated Mark McNeilly 3 and 1, and then beat fellow Southwood golfer Charlie Boyechko 1 up to advance to the final.

Wetelainen's list of victims also included John Multan and Kody Fawcett, who were defeated in the first



and second rounds, respectively.

Cockerill won the medallist honours by shooting 65-72 for a 7-under-par 137 total on his old home course. That was seven strokes better than Pine Ridge's Josh Wytinck, who carded rounds of 69-75 to finish alone in second place.

This year's match play qualifier will take place at Winkler Golf Club on May 23 and 24, while the matches are slated for Pine Ridge Golf Club. The final is scheduled for June 7.

BRI-ANN TOKARIWSKI CLAIMS WOMEN'S CITY AND DISTRICT HONOURS

There was one prestigious Manitoba women's golf tournament that Bri-ann Tokariwski hadn't won going into the 2014 season.

The Elmhurst Golf and Country Club member took care of that in convincing fashion on June 22 at Maplewood Golf Club in St-Pierre-Jolys, capturing the Women's City & District Championship by four strokes over defending champion Mindy Lichtman of St. Boniface.

Tokariwski carded a 4-over-par 75 on Day 1 of the 36-hole event and took

a two-stroke lead over Lichtman into the second and final round. Tokariwski stretched that advantage to five shots by the time they got to the turn on Day 2 thanks to an even-par 34 on the front nine.

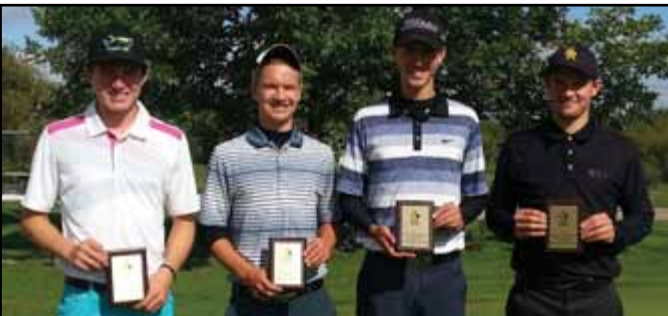

100TH ANNIVERSARY

You don't turn 100 years old every year, so Golf Manitoba is throwing itself one heck of a party this summer.

Golf Manitoba was formed exactly a century ago, in 1915, as the Manitoba Golf Association. Such an important milestone in the history of Manitoba golf was not going to be ignored.

There are two major events that will make up Golf Manitoba's 100th Anniversary Celebration, as it will be formally known throughout the summer. The first is a raffle, the magnitude of which has never been conducted by the province's governing golf body. The second is a special golf day at St. Charles Country Club in August that will include a very special guest.

The captain of the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, which has been in existence for 261 years, will be the keynote speaker at the dinner on Monday, Aug. 17. George Macgregor, a Scottish golfing great who was been awarded the Order of the British Empire, will travel to Winnipeg with his wife after attending the PGA Championship in Wisconsin the weekend prior.

"I don't know, and I've not checked, whether a captain of the R and A has ever spoken in Canada, other than perhaps with Golf Canada down east," said Wayne Leslie, the Golf Manitoba board member who is in charge of the organization's centennial celebration. "We're quite excited to have him come in, especially when you've got the transition now with women now playing members of the R and A. It's more than 250 years that the club's been in existence, so that's quite exciting."

Prior to Macgregor addressing the audience during the dinner, representatives from every golf course in Manitoba will enjoy lunch and then take part in a tournament at the prestigious Winnipeg private club.

"The theory is to have a full golf day to celebrate the hundredth," Leslie said.

They will also be trying to bring back some of the province's top golfers to share their mem-

ories of growing up with the game in Manitoba and where it took them. A major PowerPoint presentation about Golf Manitoba's history, featuring many fascinating photos from the past, is also on the agenda.

The other major initiative to celebrate the centennial is the raffle, which is already underway and has tickets available. The grand prize is one tee time, four green fees and the use of two power carts at a whopping 40 Manitoba golf courses, including private clubs like St. Charles, Elmhurst, Pine Ridge and Glendale. You name it, and that golf course is probably on the list.

A raffle ticket costs just \$50, and only 3,000 will be available for purchase. The value of the grand prize is worth well in excess of \$10,000.

"It's really been a great undertaking for us, and I really hope that it's as successful as we think it will be," Golf Manitoba executive director Dave Comaskey said. "We've had 40 golf clubs support us on it, which says volumes about those golf courses that are involved."

"I haven't seen or heard anything that's like it, so it is really unique."

Golf Manitoba is hoping to raise approximately \$125,000 in revenue from the raffle, which will then be dispersed to several great causes throughout the province. Half of the revenues will go back to Golf Manitoba to primarily enhance their various junior and youth programs, 20% will go to the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund, and another 20% will aid the University of Manitoba Bisons golf program.

Finally, everyone who buys a ticket can designate a club, facility or group in good standing with Golf Manitoba. If that person wins the grand prize, the club, facility or group he or she designated will get 10% of the revenues, which could be as much as \$12,500.

"That would be a great pickup for any club," Leslie said.

A full set of Titleist golf clubs will also be

given away as an early bird prize on June 30. Leslie hopes the raffle will be attractive for two reasons. First, the grand prize is pretty amazing. Secondly, “if nothing else, it’s a nice donation to make sure golf continues as the sport a lot of people in Manitoba enjoy.” Comaskey believes the raffle and this year’s celebrations will help Manitoba celebrate its first 100 years of golf and then let the organization hit the ground running for the next 100 years and beyond.

“We’re really hoping,” Comaskey said, “that the funds raised will create a legacy from the hundredth.”

GOLF MANITOBA’S HISTORY

The game of golf has a proud history in Manitoba. The first golf course in Canada west of Brantford, Ont., was laid out in Stony Mountain, Manitoba, in 1889, probably by the warden of the penitentiary, Lieutenant-Colonel Samuel Bedson. However, this course closed around 1894. The town of Virden opened a golf course in 1892. Portage la Prairie established a golf course in 1896. Brandon opened its first golf course in 1900.

In 1894 the first golf course in Winnipeg was opened: the Winnipeg Golf Club with a nine hole golf course located in Norwood. The golf course opened for play on July 14, 1894, with 73 members, one third of them women. The original site was abandoned later in 1894 for a better site off Portage Avenue and a second nine was added in 1896.

Other golf courses followed, with St. Charles established in 1905, Pine Ridge in 1912, Elmhurst in 1914 and Assiniboine in 1917. The 1920s are rightly called a “boom” period for golf in Manitoba; in 1919 Manitoba had nine golf courses, but by September 1926 there were 68 golf courses in operation. Sixteen of these were in Winnipeg, including Niakwa and Southwood, which both opened in 1923.

In 1916 the Winnipeg Parks Board approved the construction of an 18 hole municipal golf course. Kildonan Park Golf Course was opened in the spring of 1921 and was immedi-

ately popular. In its first season it rented out 55,000 sets of golf clubs. In order to meet this demand, another municipal golf course, Windsor Park Golf Course, was opened in 1925. Courses have been added over the years, and now there are well more than 100 golf courses throughout Manitoba, from the city of Thompson in the north to the U.S. border in the south.

Manitoba also had an impact nationally in the early days of golf in Canada. The Royal Canadian Golf Association was formed in 1895 by 10 golf clubs, one of which was the Winnipeg Golf Club. The first Canadian men’s amateur held outside of Ontario and Quebec was held at the Winnipeg Golf Club in 1921. The first Canadian ladies’ amateur outside of Ontario and Quebec was held at Elmhurst in 1926. The first president of the R.C.G.A. who was not from Ontario or Quebec was Charles Harvey of Elmhurst in 1929.

The Manitoba Golf Association was formed in 1915 with five clubs: St. Charles, Pine Ridge, Norwood, Winnipeg Hunt Club and Elmhurst. In 1922 the Manitoba Ladies’ Golf Association was formed. Effective March 31, 2004, the Manitoba Golf Association and the Manitoba Ladies’ Golf Association amalgamated to form Golf Manitoba.

Manitoba is also home to some of Canada’s finest golfers. George Knudson, arguably the best golfer Canada has ever produced, was born in Winnipeg in 1937, winning the Manitoba junior in 1954 and 1955 and the Canadian junior in 1955. Knudson joined the PGA Tour in 1958 but still came back to win the Manitoba Open in 1958, 1959 and 1960. Added to his eight PGA Tour victories were the low individual in the 1966 World Cup matches and winning the World Cup matches in 1968 when he was teamed with Al Balding.

Dan Halldorson of Brandon was on the PGA Tour for more than a decade and had two PGA victories along with four Manitoba Open championships. Glen Hnatiuk of Selkirk was also a member of the PGA Tour, while Gail Graham of Winnipeg played on the LPGA Tour for more than 10 years.

MGSA INDUSTRY ARTICLE

Being able to prepare and maintain the playing grounds for the 2014 Canadian men's amateur was a career highlight for me as a golf course superintendent! The event was staged in conjunction with our friends at Southwood Golf and Country Club, and together it gave us an incredible opportunity to showcase what Manitoba golf is all about!

Tournament conditions don't happen overnight. Preparations for such a showcase event really started some 10 years ago when Elmhurst elected to embark on a sympathetic restoration of its Donald Ross property. In order to properly present the golf course, we knew improvements were going to be required in many facets of the golf course structure and aesthetics. Critical upgrades would be needed in bunker quality, yardage and architectural integrity. Golf course architect and Donald Ross specialist Ron Prichard was ultimately engaged to make a master plan that would both recapture Elmhurst's architectural heritage, and provide a golf course that would challenge some of the best golfers in Canada and beyond. Restoration work began in 2009, and being associated with this astonishing work has certainly been a professional highlight and huge learning experience for me.

The Elmhurst restoration work comprised of what one would normally expect of any such endeavour: recapturing lost putting surfaces, traditional bunkers restorations, inserting crossing bunker locations, intelligent tree removal and under brushing, vista management, fairway widening, squaring of tee blocks, new tee constructions to add distance and strategy, and a commitment to encouraging growth of native grasses. It was interesting to see how such small changes in design, but at many levels, made such a dramatic improvement to the appearance and fabric of the golf course! Restoration of the golf course positioned Elmhurst well to host top-level

players and also provide improved conditions for our members moving forward.

A number of months prior to the event, we began a strong liaison with the representatives of Golf Canada. Guidance regarding golf course setup was provided, and this gave us plenty of time to achieve the types of conditions required. During the tournament, Golf Canada's critical eye for detail and the needs of the competitors did indeed help us put our best foot forward!

Maintenance during the tournament proper was actually surprisingly routine. One significant change would be grooming tasks being conducted on a more frequent basis. While this placed an



extraordinary burden and challenge on our equipment manager, he was up to the task! On the golf course, our biggest goal was to achieve consistency through all areas. Areas where consistency was required included putting green (and fairway) firmness, putting green moisture levels, bunker sand texture and firmness, bunker sand depths, and putting green speeds. Areas of extraordinary maintenance included increased frequency of greens rolling and reliance on hand watering key turf areas. Putting greens were stimping in the 12.0 range and definitely had the 'championship patina.' Bunker sand texture and depths were addressed with a minor in-house bunker renovation in the spring of 2014. This project provided a wonderful opportunity to improve our bunker sand.

Extra resources were definitely required to perform maintenance at a high level. Our maintenance team increased in size by some 40 percent for the event. There were also many member volunteers assisting in tournament maintenance. A real highlight for me was seeing Elmhurst members out tending and caring for their golf course and beaming with pride. We couldn't have done it without them!

Hosting an event of this calibre really let Elmhurst show both its architectural heritage and its true potential to challenge golfers. It also gave us a wonderful opportunity to reinforce the fact that properly maintained golf courses are sustainable entities that can utilize natural areas and native species, conserve precious water, and efficiently utilize nutrient/chemical. Being a good ecological steward and playing golf at the highest level are indeed compatible enterprises!

So many people had a hand in making the 2014 Canadian men's amateur a success. It was such a treat working together with a great Elmhurst professional staff in the pro shop and clubhouse in order to achieve a synergistic result. I also consider myself fortunate to be surrounded by the great volunteers, planning committees and a tremendous board of directors at Elmhurst. In particular, I would like to say a special thanks to equipment manager Darren Ryback, assistant superintendent Nevin Martens, and the rest of my grounds maintenance team that put their best foot forward and executed quality work at every turn.

The 2014 Canadian men's amateur proved to be a resounding success at Elmhurst. I feel very fortunate to be part of such a great management team and golf club!

If I have missed anybody I apologize for my oversight. The provincial pesticide ban went into effect this past January.

Although golf courses are exempt from the ban, we are now required to provide a detailed IPM plan and scouting sheets yearly. The MGSA and Manitoba Environmental Approvals Branch have developed a guide to assist in IPM planning and reporting. These reports are mandatory requirements to receive pesticide use permits each year.

The board is continually working with all government branches to improve the reporting process and the continuing education IPM points. Those golf courses that do not belong to the MGSA currently are encouraged to join our association. We are here to help guide you through all environmental concerns and licensing issues.

The MGSA and Red River College have completed year two of our four year study monitoring hourly temperature, relative humidity and gas levels under three different winter covering systems at five course throughout the province. Thank you to Elmhurst, Bel Acres, St. Charles, Boissevain and Pinawa for your support. Red River College has collected all the data from this past winter and will be compiling the results over the next month or so. We look forward to seeing the data.

For those of you that happen to read this message, please the next time you see your golf course superintendent, thank them for the work he or she does and all their staff. Without your course superintendent the golf course would not be what it is today. There are countless hours that as a golfer you don't see put into the course each and every day. Your superintendent doesn't just mow grass. They are accountants, public relation specialists, stewards of the environment, human resource managers and biologists. These are just a few of the traits that your local superintendent must master during his or her career.

Good luck this upcoming season, and may we all have the perfect growing conditions.

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PGA TOUR CANADA

Former two-time Manitoba amateur champ Jordan Krantz enjoyed some success on PGA Tour Canada in 2014, but it wasn't enough to get him status for 2015.

Krantz finished 73rd on the tour's money list, but only the top 60 get exempt status for the following year. The top 20 get Web.com Tour perks for their placing on the money list.

The Vermilion Bay, Ont., product played in 11 events last season, making the cut in six tournaments. He had a pair of top 25 finishes as well.

Krantz's best showing was a tie for 14th in the Forces and Families Open, which was held in mid-August in Ottawa. He shot rounds of 66, 69, 67 and 71 for an 11 under total. That earned him \$2,550.

Krantz earned \$6,676 during the season, which put him in 73rd position on the money list and left him 13 spots shy of earning his card for 2015.

Glenboro's Josh Wytinck, Stony Mountain's Aaron Cockerill and Neepawa's Brady Henderson are three Manitobans who were attempting this spring to become PGA Tour Canada members in 2015.

One of PGA Tour Canada's premier stops in 2015 will once again be in Winnipeg, where The Players Cup will be held at Pine Ridge Golf Club.

This year's tournament will run July 9-12 at the Ridge, where last summer Tim Madigan converted a fantastic two putt on the 72nd hole to win the \$150,000

event by one shot over Matt Hill and Ricky McDonald.

Madigan's approach shot on the 18th hole on Sunday landed on the green, but it was about 75 feet away from the hole. The Las Cruces, New Mexico, native lagged his birdie putt to about three feet and then calmly rolled in the par putt to clinch the victory.

"Once I saw the putt fall, it pretty much took my breath away," Madigan told reporters after the triumph. "I definitely felt I was due, but in no way was this given to me.

"This morning I was trying to picture what it was going to be like to win, have the interviews and stuff, and I never thought I was going to be this emotional."

CORY KARTUSCH NAMED PGA OF MANITOBA & CANADIAN GOLF PROFESSIONAL OF THE YEAR

Cory Kartusch wasn't only the PGA of Manitoba's professional of the year in 2014. No, the St. Charles Country Club head pro was Canada's professional of the year in 2014 as well.

It doesn't get much better than that.

"It's the greatest honour I've ever received in terms of being a professional," Kartusch said. "I was overwhelmed, honoured, humbled, and it's just unbelievable to be recognized by your peers in that sense." The last Manitoban to win the national award was none other than St. Charles' Jim Collins, who brought home the honour in 1988 and all the way back in 1976.

"To be mentioned in the same sentence as Jim Collins is a wonderful feeling," Kartusch said.

The 42-year-old, who has been the head man at St. Charles since 2003, isn't proud of one particular part of his job that might have grabbed the attention of those who determined last year's winner. He feels it was likely his all-around work that might have done it.

"There's a lot of professionals who would be deserving

of this award, so it's hard to think of me being singled out," Kartusch said. "I would just say I try my best every day to bring the entire package to our membership. Whether it's teaching, merchandise, member service, tournament organization or any of the things we do, myself and my staff give equal attention to each one, and I think that's what we do best."

When pressed for one aspect of his work that might go above and beyond, Kartusch mentioned his and his staff's focus on "continuing education." Kartusch is certified Titleist Performance Institute level three, TPI junior level two and Medicus 5 Simple Keys (5SK). This winter he travelled to get his certification for the Aim-Point green reading system. Three members of his staff are TPI certified, and two others were working on their 5SK certification as the 2015 golf season swung into gear. That kind of commitment takes time and money, but Kartusch and his staff want to be on the cutting edge for their members.

"All of the things that we do as a team to just stay as current as possible with the world of golf and golf instruction is something that I



think that we do that hopefully at least keeps up with what other operations are doing," he said.

A new St. Charles feature that Kartusch hopes has his members excited is the club's new performance centre, which opened last November and is located between the driving range and the first fairway of the south course. It's a 1,200 square foot building has hitting bays full of technology, a putting green and two 18-by-12 feet garage doors. "We roll those up, and the balls launch out into the driving range during the summer," Kartusch said. "Then you close the garage doors and hit inside in the winter time."

"We used it all winter, and it's been a lot busier than we expected, and it's going to be exciting to use it in a summer season of golf to see how our members respond to it."

DEAN NORTH PGA OF MANITOBA PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Somebody else won the Dean North Award in 2013, so Dean North went and took it back in 2014.

The award is not actually named after North, the golf pro at Carman Golf and Curling Club, but it likely will be one day after he won the PGA of Manitoba Player of the Year trophy for the fifth occasion in six years and for the 10th time overall thanks to his impressive play last summer.

Glendale's Andrew Steep was the province's top player in 2013, but North said having his four year reign come to an end was not his motivation for returning to the top of the heap last year.

"I don't try to motivate myself by what other people do," the soft spoken North said. "I just went to work on my own game and wanted to play well for myself. The things like the player of the year and stuff like that just kind of takes care of itself sometimes."

North played in all five tournaments for which he was eligible in 2014, and he finished in the top four in four of them. He won one and was the runner-up twice. His worst placing was ninth in the Titleist Footjoy PGA Championship at Breezy Bend Golf and Country Club

in late July.

What made North most proud about his year was how he played in the final tournament of the season, the Cobra Puma Golf Fall Final on Sept. 3, at Steinbach Fly-In. He was in a heated battle with Pine Ridge's Brad Kirton for top spot in the points standing, and he emerged victorious.

"Basically I had a heads-up match and played really well, shot four under in my round," North said. "That made me feel good, that the pressure was on and I responded."

"It was kind of fun, and it was an interesting experience."

North played in the PGA Club Professional Championship of Canada in Arizona last November and missed the cut for the first time. He also participated in the match play PGA Championship of Canada in Uxbridge, Ont., in June and lost in the second round. "I've never gotten past the second round in that," he said. His game may not be what it used to be, but it's still pretty good.

"I don't feel like my game is as strong as it was," he said. "When I came off the Canadian Tour and I was playing



and practising for 10 years in a row, when I got done doing that my game was really strong. So it's slipped from that point, but I still feel I can shoot a low score when I get my game going."

North plans to focus more on his game in 2015, even though he won't be competing in the PGA Championship of Canada in Inverness, N.S., in June because it would require too much time away from his course. He will play in all the Manitoba events once again, and he figures his new training partners will help him improve his game a notch or two.

"I'm going to go out with my sons (Reid, 9, and Kierson, 7), who are old enough to go out on the course with me," North said. "I'm actually going to play and practise with them hopefully a lot, try to get them into the game. And then that's going to get me going a bit more with the game, too."

PGA OF MANITOBA ROUNDUP

Five Manitoba club professionals entered the PGA Championship of Canada in Uxbridge, Ont., last June, but they managed only one victory among them in the match play event that brought together 64 of Canada's top pros.

Carman's Dean North beat Kevin Black of B.C.'s Seven Hills Golf and Country Club in the first round by a dominant 5 and 3 mark, but he fell 4 and 2 to Quebec's Louis-Pierre Godin in the second round.

On the opposite side of the draw, the other four Manitobans failed to make it past the first round. Minnewasta's Geoff Kehler fell 6 and 5 to Ontario's Reg Millage, while Carman's Scott Borsa suffered the same fate, dropping a 3 and 2 decision to Quebec's Vincent Cacchione.

In the Moe Norman bracket, Assiniboine's Glen Mills and Glendale's Andrew Steep both came home without a victory. Mills lost 5 and 3 to Quebec's Eric Landreville, while Steep pushed Ontario's Keir Smith to the 21st hole before bowing out.

Steinbach's Brian Guenther was Manitoba's top performer at the Titleist & Footjoy PGA Club Professional Championship of Canada last November.

Guenther tied for 42nd in the 109 player field at Sunridge Canyon in Fountain Hills, Ariz., firing rounds of 72, 81 and 78 for a three round total of 18-over-par 231. That finish earned Guenther \$400.

Two other Manitobans made the cut.

Assiniboine's Glen Mills tied for 66th (80-78-81), and Glendale's Andrew Steep (85-75-80) placed 68th. They won \$237 and \$230, respectively, for their efforts.

Carman's Dean North, Minnewasta's Geoff Kehler, Southport's Dennis Heimpel and St. Boniface's Troy Kapko all missed the 36 hole cut.

While Dean North was busy winning the pro player of the year award from the PGA of Manitoba, his assistant at Carman, Scott Borsa, was dominating his domain as well.

Borsa, who is originally from Selkirk, won the PGA of Manitoba's assistant championship, and he was also the top finisher at the national event.

Borsa took the provincial title with an opening 69 and a 73 in the second and final round at Bel Acres Golf and Country Club on June 15 and 16.

Brad Kirton of Pine Ridge Golf Club gave Borsa a run for his money, shooting 72-71 to end up one shot back. Quarry Oaks' Dave Lavalley was third (74-72) at 146, four shots back of the champ.

Borsa then had the best showing at the PGA of Canada Assistants Championship in the fall, tying for 27th after shooting 74-80-71 for a 9-over-par 225 total. He earned \$395 during the three-day tournament, which was held at The Ridge at Manitou in McKellar, Ont.

Southwood's Patrick Perrin ended up in 48th place after rounds of 78, 73 and 83,

while Niakwa's Justin Ford (81-75-82) tied for 51st. Southwood's Mark DiUbaldo also made the cut and ended up in 58th spot after rounds of 78, 82 and 86.

Elmhurst's Matt Lorenz missed the cut after opening with rounds of 91 and 79.

Quarry Oaks' Dave Lavalley won the PGA of Manitoba's senior championship in 2014, and he almost captured the men's event as well.

Lavalley easily cruised to the senior crown at Breezy Bend Golf and Country Club, shooting 71 and 70 for a two-round total of 141. That was only one stroke behind the men's champion, Carman's Scott Borsa.

Harbour View's Michel Pilon and Breezy Bend's Sandy Paterson were second and third, respectively, in the senior men's division.

Manitoba won the 2014 Titleist Cup in September on its home turf.

The Titleist Cup is a Ryder Cup-style event that pits 12 Manitoba pros against 12 Saskatchewan pros.

Last year's tournament was held at Morden's Minnewasta Golf and Country Club, and Manitoba prevailed for the seventh time in the last nine years.

The tournament is held every other year, so the next edition of it will be in Saskatchewan in 2016.

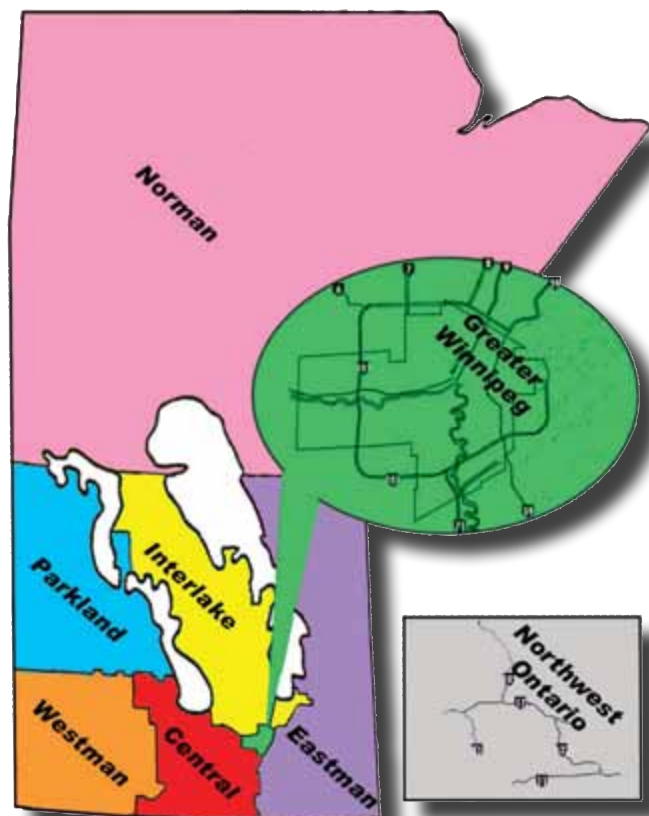
